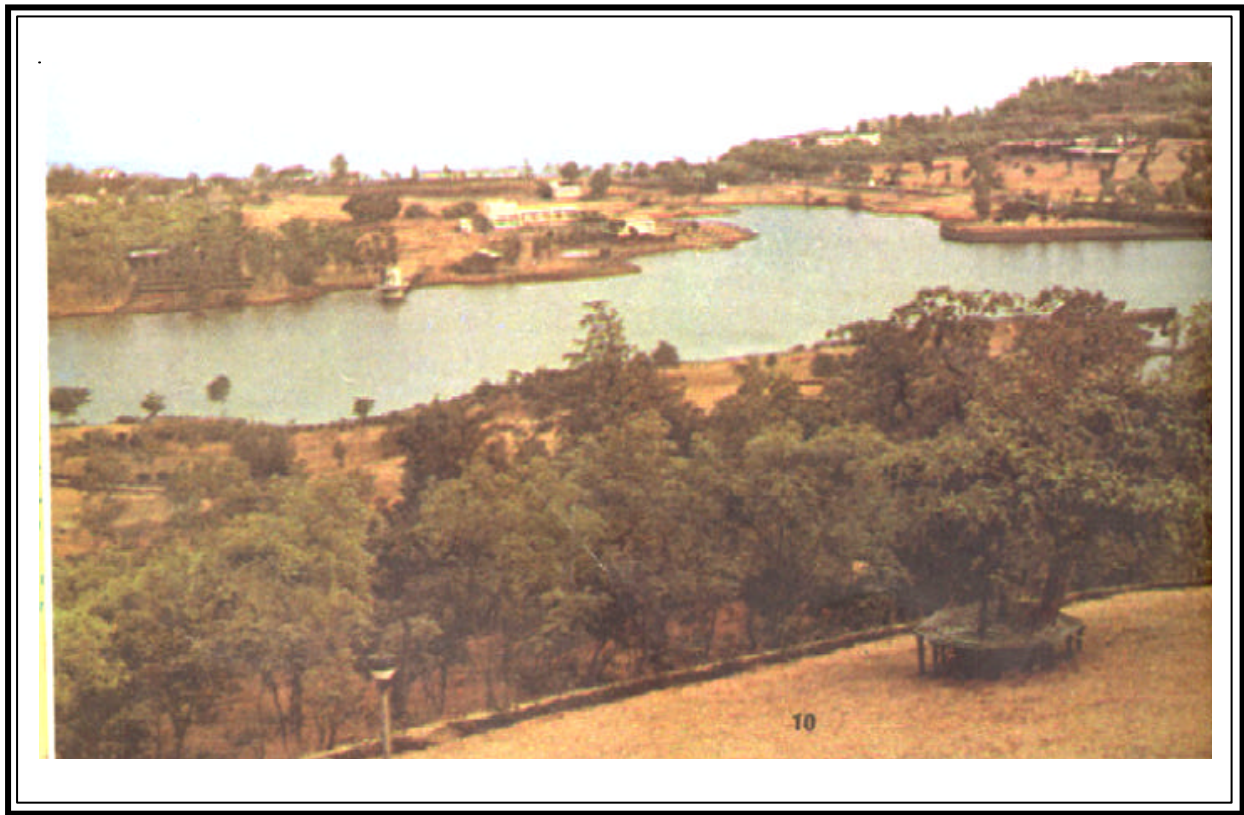
**VILLAGE AND TOWNWISE
PRIMARY CENSUS ABSTRACT**



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Natural Scene of Saputara

S A P U T A R A

Saputara is popularly known as Girinagar. It is a picturesque hill resort situated at an altitude of 875 metres on the second highest plateau of Sahyadri range. Saputara provides some good observation points to see sunrise and sunset. A ropeway ride straddles the valley to the sunset point. Visitors can climb or use the ropeway to reach sunset point. At the artist village, visitors are attracted by pretty pieces of pottery, jewelry, paintings and key chains, all made from bamboo chips and other local materials. There is also an echo point, Museum, Tribal memorial, Nageshwar Mahadev temple, Step Garden, etc. Climate is cool, brisk and clean round the year. On account of its location on a high elevation, dense forest and communication facility, it satisfies all requirements of a hill resort. The hill station attracts many tourists every year for its location, climate and Dang's culture.

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F O R E W O R D

The District Census Handbook (DCHB) published by Census Organisation since 1951 census, is one of the important publications in the context of planning and development at gross-root level. The publication, which is brought out for each district, contains several demographic and socio-economic characteristics village-wise and town-wise of the district alongwith the status of availability of civic amenities, infrastructural facilities, etc.

2. The scope of the DCHB was initially confined to a few Census Tables and Primary Census Abstract (PCA) of each village and town within the district. Thereafter, at successive censuses, its scope and coverage has been enlarged. The DCHB published at the 1961 census provided a descriptive account of the district, administrative statistics, census tables and a village and town directory including PCA. The 1971 census-DCHB series was in three parts: Part-A related to village and town directory, Part-B to village and town PCA and Part-C comprised analytical report, administrative statistics, district census tables and certain analytical tables based on PCA and amenity data in respect of villages. The 1981 census DCHB was in two parts: Part-A contained village and town directory and Part-B the PCA of village and town including the SCs and STs PCA up to tahsil/town levels. New features alongwith restructuring of the formats of village and town directory were added into it. In Village Directory, all amenities except electricity were brought together and if any amenity was not available in the referent village, the distance in broad ranges from the nearest place having such an amenity, was given. Information on new items such as adult literacy centres, primary health sub-centres and community health workers in the village were provided so as to meet the requirements of some of the Revised Minimum Needs Programme. Information on approach to the village was provided for the first time in the Village Directory so as to give the details on number of inaccessible villages in each district. In the Town Directory, a statement (IV-A) on slums was introduced to provide the details on civic and other amenities in the notified slums of Class I and Class II towns.

3. The 1991 census of DCHB, by and large, followed the pattern of presentation of 1981 census, except the format of PCA was restructured. Nine-fold industrial classification of main workers was given against the four-fold industrial classification presented in the 1981 census. In addition, sex-wise population in 0-6 age group was included in the PCA for the first time with a view to enable the data users to compile more realistic literacy rate as all children below 7 years of age had been treated as illiterate at the time of 1991 census. One of the important innovations in the 1991 census was the Community Development Block (CD block) level presentation of village directory and PCA data instead of the traditional tahsil/taluk/PS level presentation. It was expected that the presentation of village directory and PCA data at CD block level will help the planners in formulation of micro level development plans, CD block being lowest administrative unit.

4. The present series of 2001 census DCHBs have been made more informative and exhaustive in terms of coverage and content. The Village Directory has been enlarged in scope by including a number of other facilities like banking, recreational and cultural facilities, newspapers and magazines and 'most important commodity' manufactured in village. Income and expenditure of gram panchayat, wherever possible, has been provided. Apart from these, more details on distance(s) at which basic amenities are available (if not available in the village), are given. This includes educational facilities (namely primary and middle schools and college), medical facilities (viz. Allopathic Hospital, Maternity & Child Welfare Centre and Primary Health Centre), drinking water, post & telegraph (post office and phone),

communication, bank, credit societies and recreational facilities. In Town Directory, the statement on Slums has been modified and its coverage enlarged by including details on all slums in instead of 'notified slums'. The information is given in case of all statutory towns irrespective of their class, against only Class I and Class II towns in the 1981 and 1991 Censuses. The basic amenities available in the villages and towns are analysed in depth with the help of a number of cross-classified inset tables and statements. Two other significant additions in the publication are inclusion of 'motif highlighting significant characteristic of the district and analytical notes as annexures. The analytical notes on (i) fertility and mortality and (ii) various measures of fertility and mean age at marriage are prepared based on 1991 Census. Whereas, in the notes relating to (i) percentage distribution of migrants by place of birth/place of last residence, (ii) main religions, (iii) marital status of population, (iv) age, sex and education, and (v) distribution of spectrum of mother tongue, nature and extent of changes occurred in the district in its basic socio-demographic features during the decade 1991-2001 are analysed. The eight digits permanent location code (PLCN) to all the villages and towns have been assigned keeping in view the future needs.

5. The village and town level amenity data have been collected, compiled and computerised in prescribed record structure under the supervision of Shri Jayant Parimal, Director of Census Operations, Gujarat. Thereafter, efforts have been made to ensure comparability of the information with that of 1991 census data and the information brought out by the respective state governments in their annual reports and statistical handbooks for various years after 1991. The task of planning, designing and coordination of this publication was carried out by Shri R.G. Mitra, Deputy Registrar General (C&T) and Dr. I.C. Agrawal, Senior Research Officer of Social Studies Division. Dr. R.P. Singh, Deputy Registrar General (Map) provided the technical guidance in the preparation of maps. Whereas, Shri Anil Kumar Arora, Deputy Director of Data Processing Division who worked under the overall supervision of Shri Himakar, Addl. Director(EDP) helped in preparation of record structure for computerisation of village and town directory data and the programme for the generation of Village Directory and Town Directory statements including analytical inset tables. The draft DCHB manuscripts received from the Census Directorates have been scrutinised in the Social Studies Division under the guidance of Shri S.L. Jain, Deputy Director and Shri R.K. Mehta, Assistant Director. I am thankful to all of them and others who have contributed to make this publication possible.

P r e f a c e

Census is being conducted in the country every ten years as per the programme laid down by the Government of India. In these day and age of information technology, an individual has access to a variety of information covering a Kalidoscope of interest and fields. Availability of relevant information is very vital for planners, policy makers and researchers.

The Five Year Plans have come to stay in the country and whatever development is achieved as a result of implementation of planning from the bottom level such as development of infrastructure facilities as well as basic amenities, etc. is reflected in the District Census Handbooks and they give to the readers a searching eye whether the development over the years in villages/talukas/districts is lopsided or upto the mark. This is the basic requirement of this type publications and an attempt has been made to show whether the census handbooks reasonably fulfill these aspirations/requirements.

These district Handbooks are thus useful to planners in planning from bottom as well as to administrators, researchers, educational institutions including universities and other socio-economic research centres as well as students conducting research in demography, social and economic studies as well as to the local bodies like Panchayats, Municipalities and Municipal Corporation etc.

District Census Handbook of Gujarat is a joint venture of the Government of Gujarat and the census organization of the Government of India. In the preparation of the DCHB, the role played by the census organisation is that of Census data collection, scanning of collected information, analysis of PCA. DCHB Unit of the State Government collected the basic non-census information on availability of amenities relating to infrastructure in the villages of the district presented in the part A of this book. The cost of this publication is borne by the State Government. In accomplishing this task we had the ready and whole hearted co-operation of the staff at various levels of different department of the State Government. Most of the data supplied by the various departments have been cross-checked and an attempt has been made to reconcile the discrepancies as well.

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District Highlights - 2001 Census

The Dangs

1. The Dangs district is the smallest district in terms of population in the State.
2. The Dangs has no urban area. In 1991 Census Ahwa and Waghai were Census towns but for 2001 census they are declassified and considered as census villages.
3. In terms of density, population per sq. km. is 106.
4. The Dangs district is the 24th dense district in the State.
5. The Dangs district shares top position in sex ratio alongwith Amreli district with sex ratio figure of 987.
6. Village Ahwa is the most populated having 13,722 persons and Ambur and Bokadmal villages are the least populated with 16 and 75 persons respectively.
7. The economy of the district is basically dependent upon agriculture. 86 per cent workers are engaged in primary sector.
8. There is a decrease of 12.2 per cent in the population of main workers and increase of 9.1 per cent in marginal workers of the district in the decade.
9. The Dangs district has only one taluka having 311 villages in it.
10. Diwan Tembrun Village has the largest area of 5,062.4 hectares and Bhurbhendi village has the smallest area of 38.5 hectares among the villages of the district.

- iii) A density of population of at least 400 per square kilometer (1,000 per square mile).

ANALYTICAL NOTE

ANALYTICAL NOTE

(i) History and Scope of the District Census Handbook :

Before the 1951 Census, the Census figures were published in a booklet known as 'Village Handbook', which contained only village-wise population figures. These books were prepared and published by the Directorate of Census Operations of the State.



The Directorates introduced the District Census Handbook for the first time in 1951 Census. It comprised the village wise primary census abstract figures and information on available amenities. It also contained several tables relating to the district. It varied in content and size from State to State depending upon the resources offered by the respective State Governments.

In 1961 Census, a uniform pattern of District Census Handbook was adopted throughout the country. The Directorate of Census and the State Government jointly executed the project. In addition to the English version, it was published for the first time in Gujarati language also. The District Census Handbook 1961 was published in three parts. Part I related to Introductory Note i.e. general and economic information for the district and a brief gazetteer of place names. Part II pertained to census tables, village wise list of industrial establishments, tables on handicrafts and departmental statistics. Part III consisted of village directory covering the amenities and primary census abstract data combined in one statement. It also covered district and taluka maps.

It is worthwhile here to note that the State Government has created a separate unit for preparing and publishing the District Census Handbook since 1971 Census onwards. In the 1971 Census, the contents of District Census Handbook were modified. In the preceding censuses, the data on amenities and primary census abstract were covered in one statement whereas in 1971 Census, the data on amenities and primary census abstract were separated into two

different parts. Thus, the coverage of amenities data was extended and the land use data were introduced for the first time from 1971 District Census Handbook. Moreover, a separate portion known as 'Town Directory' was also incorporated for the first time in the District Census Handbook. The 1971 District Census Handbook was published in three parts. Part A contained the village and town directory. Part B contained village and townwise primary census abstract data and Part C contained official statistics, besides full count census tables, urban census tables and analytical report on census and related statistics socio-economic and cultural tables (Rural areas) and housing tables. Part A and Part B were combined and published in one volume.

The District Census Handbook –1981 was brought out in two parts, Part-A and Part-B. Part-A contained the village and town directory whereas Part-B included the primary census abstract data, for both General population and Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes. Both parts were published in one volume. Part C brought out for 1971 Census was dropped in 1981 Census. However, official statistics and some portion of analytical notes of part C of 1971 Census were included in the 1981 District Census Handbook also.

For the 1991 Census, the District Census Handbooks were prepared more or less on the same lines of the preceding 1981 Census. In 2001, the scope of both Part A & B has been enlarged by giving several additional information which got possible because of large scale computerization.

The District Census Handbook has been prepared after scanning and processing of data collected through Houselist Schedule and Household Schedule. Several innovations have been introduced at almost all the stages of the Census of India, 2001, right from the preparatory efforts of the data processing and dissemination stage. This includes certain fundamental changes in the form and contents of the Houselist and Household schedules, while maintaining the

continuity and comparability of the basic housing and population characteristics with the earlier census. For the Census of India 2001, a system of Permanent Location Code Number (PLCN) has been adopted by assigning to each village within the State/UT a continuous series from I to N. Each village has been assigned an eight-digit code. The last two digits being '00' are kept for accommodating future changes in case of split of an existing village or creation of new villages etc. Since the permanent Location Codes have been assigned to each village, theoretically tracing the precise location of village on account of future jurisdictional changes in the boundaries of various administrative areas within the state should not pose a problem. It is imperative that under this scheme, the PLCN assigned to villages at the Census of India, 2001 are adopted for future censuses also to ensure the comparability of the data at the village and other administrative levels over a long time series.

- At the 2001 Census age at marriage was collected for males also, while it was collected for only ever-married females until the 1991 Census.
- The type of educational institution attended by a person was enlarged to include school, college, vocational institute.
- The scope of the definition of 'work' was expanded in the Census of India, 2001, it includes production of milk for domestic consumption. In the 1991 Census, cultivator of certain crops even for self-consumption was treated as economic activity. The scope of the term 'Cultivation' was expanded in 2001 Census to include certain other crops such as tobacco, fruits, all types of flowers, roots and tubers, potatoes, chilies and turmeric, pepper, cardamom, all types of vegetables and fodder crops etc. This meant that activities related to production of all the above mentioned crops for domestic consumption have been treated as work. Only five crops viz. tea, coffee, rubber, coconut and betel nuts have been classified under 'Plantation' in the Census of India 2001.
- At the 1991 Census, the question on seeking/available for work was canvassed for only non-workers. At the Census of India 2001, this question was asked from the Marginal Workers

also. A question to elicit information on secondary work canvassed at the 1991 Census was dropped.

- From among the categories of non-workers adopted at the 1991 Census, the category 'Inmates of institutions' has been dropped and 'Retired Persons and Rentiers' has been replaced by the category 'Pensioners'.
- A new response category 'Moved after birth' was included in the question on reason for migration to bring out additional migration patterns. Natural calamities or distress migration as a reason for migration for last residence migrants included in the 1991 Census was covered under category of 'Other'.
- Number of children born alive to currently married women during last one year was collected for male and female children separately.

Besides the above modifications, the following new questions were canvassed at the 2001 Census.

- A question on total disability was canvassed in the 1981 Census. In the 1991 Census, no question on disability was included. At the Census of India, 2001, a question to elicit information on total or partial disability was canvassed. The five types of disability on which information is collected are - in seeing, in hearing, in speech, in movement and mental.
- A new question on 'Travel to place of work' is canvassed mainly for workers engaged in non-agricultural activities. Information on distance from the residence to place of work and mode of travel to place of work was collected under this section.

The mode of presentation of DCHB in 2001 will by and large be same as that of 1991. The uniqueness of Census 2001 is that single record (Household Schedule) has been processed as against two records viz. Individual Slip and Household Schedule in the previous Censuses. Apart from this some deviation has been made this time by incorporating analytical notes on migration, fertility & mortality, education, marital status, age structure etc. pertaining to 1991 Census of the respective district in the DCHB in the form of Annexure II to VIII. Similarly Tables based on Houselist data pertaining to Census 2001 have also been included in DCHB.

(ii) Brief History of the District :

The sources of history of The Dangs district are few and far between. This is presumably because of its dense forests, hilly and inaccessible terrain and stern tribal population. In the district territory, there are no ancient monuments of historical archaeological importance, ancient temples and forts that may point to a particular period of history. There are very few direct references to the history of The Dangs. The Dangs territory was not treated as a separate political entity from the Khandesh district of Baglan area comprised in the adjacent Nasik district or the Songadh area of the Gaikwad. The history of The Dangs, therefore, requires to be pieced together from the fragmentary historical data relating to the districts adjacent to it.

**Dandakaranya :**

The area of The Dangs is believed to be the well-known 'Dandakaranya' where Rama and Sita spent ten years of their exile.

The Dangs under the British :

The history of The Dangs takes a definite shape only after the British established contact with The Dangs territory subsequent to the acquisition of Khandesh from the Peshwa in 1818. The original possessors of The Dangs were Bhils. The name of The Dangs Bhils struck terror in the hearts of the people. The Bhils as a race, are illiterate, poor and improvident. They are suspicious of civilization and superstitious in beliefs. But they are brave to a fault, no enterprise is too daring for them. They are acquainted with every hills path refuge, retreat and forest. It is their sturdy spirit of independence and intolerance of any external interference in their traditional habitat. They considered their Dangs forests as their heaven.

The territory of The Dangs was formerly covered by small principalities presided over by 4 Chiefs and 10 Naiks. Among them, 4 Chiefs were educated whereas 10 Naiks were uneducated. All of them were Bhils and follow farming for subsistence. Most of them were given lands by the Government. They get political pension from Government.

The Dang Darbar :

The origin of The Dang Darbar may be traced to a period just following the execution of the forest leases by the British in 1842. A Darbar was held by the Chiefs and Naiks.

The main object of holding the Darbar was to collect all persons at one place. The Darbar was a very colourful function to conjure with.



All the Chiefs and their Bhaubhandhs came to the Darbar in their picturesque dress and made merry for two or three days. The Rajas considered it a great honour to receive payments from the hands of the European Political Agents. The tradition of holding a Darbar is still continued.

After The Dangs came under the jurisdiction of the East India Company, efforts were made to stamp out the scourge of The Dangs Chiefs who loved liberty and freedom much more than anything else in life. The British primarily took care of their interests in forests. The forest leases were executed by the British with the main objective of obtaining timber for the shipping yard in Bombay and to get thereby a foothold in the administration of The Dangs territory. British maintained a modicum of administration for law and order in The Dangs. The Chiefs and Naiks got a fixed annual subsidy from the forest leases from the British. In short, the forest leaseholders became the 'de facto' rulers of The Dangs. The Gaikwad could not produce any documentary positive proof, historical evidence or sanad in support of his claim as sovereign power as successor Government to the Peshwa in The Dangs jurisdiction. Hence, the British did not accept the Gaikwad's claim that his rights in The Dangs were the result of his sovereign status, but accepted certain rights in the co-shared villages only.

The Status of The Dangs :

The question about the legal status of The Dangs, first cropped up when The Dangs forests were proposed to be demarcated into reserved and protected forests in the seventies of the last century. The Government of Bombay constituted a committee to prepare a scheme for the demarcation of the forests in The Dangs and to consider the question about the

transfer of the political charge of The Dangs from Khandesh to Surat. The Committee sought the opinion of the Legal Remembrance Mr. J R Naylor before taking a decision in the matter. As per Mr. Naylor's opinion, the British Government treated The Dangs as a foreign territory and administered it under the Foreign Jurisdiction (India) Order in Council.

Forest Administration :

For practical purposes, the Forest Administration in The Dangs commenced with the execution of forest leases in 1842. But the Forest Administration in the legal sense, however, commenced from 1902-03, with the appointment of Collector, Surat as Political Agent and Divisional Forest Officer, Surat as Assistant Political Agent, Dangs, with magisterial powers. During the period from 1903 to 1943 the Divisional Forest Officer and The Dangs Diwan managed all affairs of the territory with the modicum of administrative machinery at their disposal.

Transfer of The Dangs to Government of India in 1933 and its merger in Bombay :

Before the new Constitution under the Government of India Act 1935 came into force, Government of India appointed Colonel Wilberforce Bell as Officer on Special Duty in connection with the transfer of the Bombay State to the Government of India. Col. Bell recommended inter alia that along with other state, The Dangs state should also be taken over by the Government of India. With effect from 4th November, 1933, the charge of Dangs was transferred from the Political Agent, Dangs to the newly created Gujarat States Agency. The question of rights and privileges of the Chiefs and Naiks was decided in 1954 and the Chiefs and Naiks of Dangs ceased to be 'rulers' and became political pensioners under the new dispensation.

The Dangs district is a newly created district, formed after the merger of The Dangs States of the former Gujarat States Agency with the province of Bombay in 1947. On the creation of the new district of The Dangs 4 villages were transferred from it to Surat district and 3 villages from Surat district were included in it. In November 1956, the States were reorganized and the bigger bilingual State of Bombay

was formed with Vidarbha, Marathawada, Saurashtra and Kachchh regions. The Dangs district along with the other districts formed part of the bigger bilingual State. Lastly, the Bombay State was bifurcated on 1st May, 1960 and separate state of Gujarat and Maharashtra were formed. The Dangs district became a part of the Gujarat State and placed under the administrative control of the Collector of Surat immediately. Shortly, thereafter, it was constituted as a separate district of only one taluka.

(iii) Administrative Set-up :

With a view to run the administration of the State smoothly, it has been divided into Districts, which in turn have been further sub-divided into Talukas (Tahsils). In the State of Gujarat, the community development blocks are co-terminus with the Talukas. The Talukas contain large number of villages and possibly several towns. The villages have Village Panchayats to run the local administration. A Village Panchayat may constitute of one revenue village, several revenue villages or a part of a large village. Similarly, the towns have Municipality or Municipal Corporation as the seat of local self-government.

In the State of Gujarat, as on December 1999 ~~there were 25 districts and 226~~ Talukas, against 19 districts and 184 Talukas in 1991 Census.

The District Collector looks after the general administration, maintenance of collection of land revenue and settlement of law related disputes, civil supplies, district planning, mid-day meal scheme, etc at the district level. The functions of administration of law and order and control and investigation of crime are done by the Superintendent of Police of the district with the help of Police Stations working under him. For the purpose of maintaining law and order there are 2 police stations and 4 out-posts as per the statement below.

During the period 1997 to 1999 there was an addition of one outpost, but the police station remained unchanged at 2. The out-posts are situated at Chinchli, Subir, Saputara and Kalibel villages and police stations are in Ahwa and Waghai villages.

At the Taluka level, Mamlatdar looks after the land development and revenue collection and law and order.

The Panchayati Raj institutions are fairly strong and most of the development works have been transferred to the District Panchayats and its subordinate bodies. The District Panchayat has an elected President and District Development Officer appointed by the Government works, as its Secretary, who looks after day-to-day work related to the development. Similarly, at the Taluka level, Taluka Panchayats have been constituted which have an elected President. The Taluka Development Officer, placed by the Government as Secretary of the Taluka Panchayat and he conducts the regular administrative work. Likewise, an elected President heads the Municipality and the Chief Officer works as the Secretary of the Municipality, who looks after the day-to-day work. In case of the large cities, the State Government has constituted Municipal Corporation, which are headed by an elected Mayor and the Municipal Commissioner, appointed by the Government, looks after the routine work. At the Village level, the Sarpanch is the elected Chief and the Talati (Village Mantri) works as the Secretary to the Village Panchayat and looks after the day-to-day work. In view of the expanding role of the public administration in a state like Gujarat, the Government has taken-up many activities and has set up several offices. Such offices which came into the existence are as under:

- (1) Education
(Primary and Higher Education)
- (2) Agricultural and Research
- (3) Animal Husbandry and Poultry
- (4) Forest and Environment
- (5) Roads and Building, Bridges
- (6) Co-operation and Co-operative Societies
- (7) Industries, Small and Large as well as Cottage

- (8) Health and Medical Services, Medical , Education and Research, Family Welfare and Nutrition
- (9) Information Department
- (10) Irrigation Minor and Major
- (11) Social Welfare and Social Defence

The functions of above offices are managed and controlled by concerned Head of Departments and in some cases also by District and Taluka Panchayats. The task of providing primary education in rural areas has been entrusted to District Panchayats. The functions related to Government of providing primary education is assigned to District Primary Education Officer of District Panchayat who works under District Development Officer. The secondary education is looked after by District Education Officer of Education Department. Primary education as well as higher secondary education of all types is governed by District Education Officer.

Agriculture activities have been delegated to District Panchayat to a large extent and District Agriculture Officer is in-charge of looking after agricultural produce including crops and vegetables. Similarly Animal Husbandry is also a Panchayat activity and routine work is controlled by the Deputy Director (Animal Husbandry) who sits in District Panchayat taking care of animals and poultry farms. Besides, District Agriculture Office in Panchayat Offices such as Deputy Director(Agriculture) and other officials look after various aspects of agriculture for developing the sector as well as to extend necessary assistance to farmers at district level.

Besides Director, animal husbandry officer of Panchayat offices such as Deputy Director (Animal Husbandry) Special Officers at Veterinary Offices etc. in state government animal husbandry department also monitor activities of the sector at district level.

Public Health in rural area is assigned to the District Panchayat under the Chief District Health Officer who looks after epidemics, malaria control, water borne diseases and district level administration of Public Health Centres. District and Talukas Hospitals and Referral Hospitals are being looked after by the District Civil Surgeon of medical services in the State, while Medical Colleges and Research

activities attached with the respective Civil Hospitals are controlled by Medical Education and Research Wing.

Family welfare activities are also monitored by the District Health Officer. Chief District Health Officer is also functioning as District Registrar of Birth and Death of the district and Talati cum Mantri is also Registrar of Death and Birth for the respective villages. Anaemic mothers and children upto to the age of 14 are looked after by Nutrition Officer under the Nutrition Programme.

District Ayurvedic Officer looks after the Ayurvedic dispensaries and hospitals. They also take care of the Ayurvedic plants and medicines and gardens. The District Food and Drugs Officer generally looks after the quality of the food and drugs in the district. Labourers and workers who are working in registered units are covered under the Employees State Insurance Scheme.

The rural roads have been transferred to the District Panchayats and their maintenance is done by the Executive Engineer, Roads and Buildings Department. Minor irrigation works are transferred to the District Panchayat and Executive Engineer (Panchayat) of the Panchayat's irrigation office looks after water harvesting and check dams.

The Roads and Buildings Department of State Government looks after the maintenance of roads, buildings, bridges and government multi-storey buildings etc. Besides Panchayat officials, major district roads and the state highways are looked after by the Executive Engineer (Roads & Buildings). The large multi-purpose irrigation projects are controlled by State Government directly through its Executive Engineers.

District Industries Centre is functioning to develop the small and village industries, handloom industries and the scope of industrial growth in the district. Besides, other departments are working for the rights of the industrial workers and rural labourers engaged in agriculture and others sectors.

Social welfare activities relating to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Castes and Other Backward Communities in the District are

organized by the District Welfare Officer. Generally the schemes under Tribal Area Sub Plan and Special Component Plan are organized by the District Welfare Officer.

In each District Panchayat, District Statistical Officer of Directorate of Economics and Statistics looks after co-ordination of different development programmes. He is also Member-Secretary of District Planning Board. Similarly in every Collector Office, District Planning Officer looks after development work of various Government (State & Centre) sponsored programmes.

Co-operative Societies i.e. Co-operative Milk Societies, Agricultural Produce Market Societies, Co-operative banking and other co-operative societies are controlled by the District Registrar Co-operative Societies.

During the reorganization of districts and talukas, this district was not affected and has only one taluka viz. The Dangs. There were 2 towns formed in the 1991 Census but declassified and treated as villages in 2001 Census. These two declassified towns treated as villages have been given below.



(iv) Physical Features :

The Dangs district is situated between the parallels of latitude 20° 33' and 21° 5' and the meridians of longitude 73° 27' and 73° 57'. The length from north to south of this territory is about 59 kms (36.7 miles) and from east to west about 50 kms (30 miles). It is bounded in the North by Surat and Dhule district of Maharashtra State, in the east by Nasik district of Maharashtra State and west by Valsad district. The area covered by the district is 1,764 sqkm. The rank of this district is 25th in area of the State.

**Physiography :**

- (i) The Dangs district is a part of the Eastern Hilly Region and is subdivided into two sub-micro regions, namely, Lower Dangs and Upper Dangs on the basis of physiography climate, geology, soils and natural vegetation. 
- (ii) Physiography of Lower Dangs region is characterized by low hills with an altitude ranging from 560 and 590 metres above M.S.L. The entire water of this region is drained by Gira, Purna, Khapri and Ambika rivers with their tributaries. The region has a thick vegetation cover. The geological structure of this region is composed of Deccan Trap. The region contains Orthents-Ochrepts formed and Orthents-Rock-Outcrops types of soils.
- (iii) Physiography of Upper Dangs region is a hilly tract having thick forest cover. The elevation of this region varies between 675 and 1290 metres above M.S.L. The main rivers of this region are Gira, Purna, Khapri and Ambika. The geology of this region is formed of Deccan Trap. Soils found in this region are black rock-outcrops, shallow black, brown and alluvial soils of recent origin.
- (iv) The Dangs district is essentially a mountainous tract covered with dense forest which occupy 53 per cent of its total area of The Dangs starts from the rugged chains of the Sahyadris in the east and descends on the Western side extending

to the edge of Plains of Gujarat State. It starts in the east with chain of rugged mountains running up to about 1,100 meters (3,500 ft). Most of the areas in The Dangs lies in elevation between 300 to 700 meters above mean sea level.

Drainage :

The district of The Dangs has good drainage network .The important rivers Ambica and Purna originate from The Dangs district and flow through Valsad district to meet the Arabian Sea in the west.

Other river, the Khapri rises in Bhegu valley and meets Ambica river near Borkhal village in The Dangs. The river Gira flourshing from direction of Malangdev Ota situated in Maharashtra and passing from The Dangs district and meets river Mindhola in the Songadh Taluka of Surat District. The drainage pattern follows the slope gradient of the topography. Hence radial pattern of drainage is not seen in this district.



The river Dhodhad is rising in the Davad hills of the Western ghats and it finally empties itself in river Purna near Lavchali. The Sarpgana river is rising in the Western Ghats and passing through Saputara village proceeds in the direction of the Nasik district of the Maharashtra State.

Climate :

The climate of this District with a hilly terrain, is characterized by general dryness except during the monsoon season.

The year may be divided into four seasons. The cold season from December to February is followed by the hot season from March to May. The period from June to September constitutes the South-West monsoon season. October and November may be termed the post monsoon or retreating monsoon season.



a) Temperature :

The temperature begins to increase from about the latter half of February. June was the hottest month with maximum temperature about 36.4° C in the year 1995-1996 and minimum temperature at 23.1° C. January is the coldest month with maximum temperature of about 31.4° C and minimum temperature of about 11.6° C. Thunderstorm occasionally occurred in the later half of the summer and monsoon season.

b) Winds :

Winds are generally light with some strengthening in force during the later part of the summer and monsoon seasons. In May and in the south-west monsoon season winds are generally from directions between south and west. In the post monsoon season winds are variable in direction in the mornings and north-east to east in the afternoons. In the winter and early part of the summer season winds are from directions between south-west and north-west, with northerly and north-easterly winds blowing on some afternoons.

c) Rainfall :

The annual rainfall in the district is 3,111 mm. in the year of 1999. The rainfall in the district decreases from the West towards East. About 95 per cent of annual rainfall in the district is received during the South-West monsoon months June to September, July being the rainiest month.

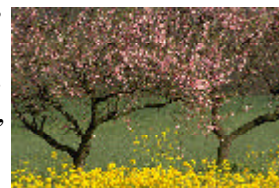
Economic Resources :

Economic resources are an important means of subsistence for the working people of the district. The details about economic resources of important sectors are given here under in brief.

(1) Forestry :

The Dangs district abounds in forest, which occupies 53 per cent of its total area. The Dangs is rich in timber as most of trees are of teak of high quality. The total Area under forest is 915 Sq.kms. The protected forest has been subjected to intermittent and rotational cultivation, in reserved forests areas neither lopping nor timber cutting is allowed. The tree growth has obviously disappeared due to cultivation and lopping.

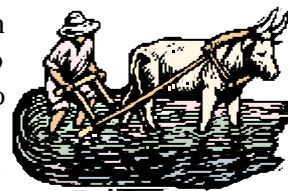
The Dangs produces important natural product like timber, firewood, charcoal, industrial wood, bamboos, gum, fruits, flowers, honey, herbs and medicinal plants.

**(2) Minerals and Mining :**

In the absence of any geological Survey, no factual information about mineral resources is available. The district is not known for its mineral production. The minor minerals available in the district are building stones, murrum, brick earth, sand and road metal. The geology of the region i.e. The Dangs district is characterized by the Deccan Trap formed in the Cretaceous-Eocene era. The elevated land forms and the thick forest cover are indicative of presence of minerals in the region. Total production of minor minerals is 12,633 metric ton in the year 1998-99.

(3) Soil and Cropping pattern :

The Soil in The Dangs has good drainage quality and as such is most suitable for fruit crops. The soils range from red to black. Red soil is found along the lower parts of the Valley and black soil in the plains of the western Dangs. Soil fertility is poor and lands are subject to erosion on slopes and terraces. In the entire district the soil is somewhat acidic and becomes hard after rain. Known as lateritic soils, they are generally formed due to silting of the soil-particles. In some parts, medium loam to sandy loam, soil is also found. The Dangis mainly cultivate food crops as it produce for self consumption



and not for sale. For this reason percentage of cash crops cultivated in The Dangs has always been quite negligible. The crops grown in the district at present are nagli, rice, vari, mag, udad, etc. and inferior millets like banti and kodra. The most important crops are

ragi and paddy. There are no garden crops but cultivators have been inspired to take up fruit crops like mango, guava, kagdi lime etc. Some have taken to vegetable crops on river banks. The total area under fruits and vegetables in district is only few hectares.

(4) Land and Land use pattern :

The total land in the district was 176,400 hectares during 1999-2000. The land classification according to the different uses for the rural areas of the district for the year 1999-2000, is given below on the basis of information collected for the Village Directory.

(5) Tenancy :

There was no separate Act on tenancy in the former Bombay State before 1939. There were provisions of Section 83 of Land Revenue Code and Mamlatdar Court law only. The tenant was not secured of his tenancy rights in the Act. This tenancy lease was considered yearly and had to pay tenancy as per tradition or according to the agreement made with the land owner. In order to protect the tenants, the Bombay Tenancy Act, 1939 came into force in the erstwhile Bombay State. With the independence of the country, it was necessary that the country is self-sufficient in agricultural production. It can be done only when the tillers of the land should have some definite rights over the land. With a view to effect control on efficient utilization of agricultural land and also to protect the tenants further and also to accept a definite policy and view for the country on agricultural land, The Bombay Tenancy and Agricultural Land Act, 1948 was enacted and it was brought into force since then. The Act of 1948 was amended five times. An important provision of 'Farmer Day' was inserted in the Act on 1-8-1956. According to this provision, if any person legally tilled the land of other person on 01-04-

1957, he was entitled to purchase the said land. Even though Gujarat State was bifurcated from Bombay State in 1960, the said act applied to it also as well.

Tenant means the person who held land on lease viz.

- (1) Tenant as per Section 4;
- (2) Protected tenant
- (3) Permanent tenant
- (4) The person who continued to possess the land with or without the consent of the land owner after appointed date and upto specified date or it is considered that he continued the possession of the land.

In all 1,049,056.4 hectares of land have been released and distributed to total 1,278,125 beneficiaries permanently by now under The Bombay Tenancy and Agricultural Lands Act, 1948 in entire Gujarat. Among the beneficiaries 177,171 were from Scheduled Castes, 258,132 from Scheduled Tribes and 842,872 were others. In Dangs, out of total 49 beneficiaries, 43 were of Schedule Tribes and 6 were others with allotment of 55.8 and 2.4 hectares of land respectively.

(6) Agriculture :

(a) Area under Major Crops :

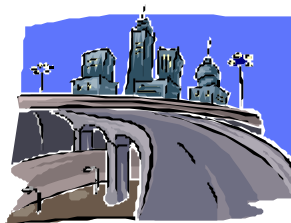
(12) Transport and Communication :

Transport and Communication facilities are considered an administrative necessity as well as public convenience. Moreover, a well knit transportation system is a pre-requisite for the social and economic development of any district.



a) Road :

The linking of one place with other by road is very essential to provide good transport system. The information regarding roads available in The Dangs district for the years 1998-99 to 2000-01 are given in the statement below. This statement includes the information of National and State highways, district



roads and village roads. The National/State highways, district roads and the village roads remained the same during the years 1998-99 to 2000-2001. This indicate that no new roads were constructed during the period, though these were maintained by the authorities concerned. In The Dangs, according to 1991 census, 133 villages and 2 towns were connected with pucca roads and 176 villages were connected with kachcha roads. According to 2001 census, 185 villages are connected with pucca roads and 126 villages are connected with kachcha roads.

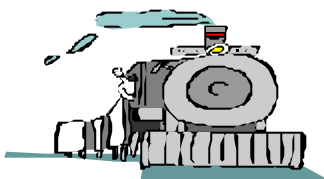

(13) Electricity :

Electricity is the chief necessity for the economic development of the district. The main source for power supply in the district is Gujarat Electricity Board. All the villages are electrified.

**(14) Gram Panchayats, its composition, jurisdiction and role in the Development of Village and its Economy**

The system of Panchayati Raj was introduced in the year 1963 in Gujarat State. Under this set up, the 3 tier system was introduced namely, The District Panchayat, The Taluka Panchayat and The Gram Panchayat.

Gram Panchayat is an important institution of self-government. The Gram Panchayat is formed for a village or a group of villages. The Gram Panchayat is constituted for a local area with the population of less than 10,000. Such local area may be revenue

village or a group of revenue village or hamlets forming part of a revenue village or such other administrative unit or part of thereof. The number of members of Gram Panchayat varies from 9 to 15. The tenure of Gram Panchayat is of five years. The people of village elect Sarpanch and Vice-Sarpanch (Up-Sarpanch) and other members of the Panchayat. Various Committees like, Social Justice Committee and Standing Committee are formed. In the year 1993 Government of India enacted an 73rd Constitutional Amendment regarding provisions of Panchayati Raj and implementation of this act in Gujarat started from 15th April, 1994. By this constitutional amendment, Panchayats are given constitutional status. Regular and timely election, participation of women and backward classes, formation of separate State Election Commission and rotation system in electing the heads of the various committees are other significant amendments in the act. Decentralised planning process and active participation of people is the soul of the Panchayati Raj Act. The powers for decentralised planning, implementation and development are delegated to the Panchayats.

The primary functions of the District/Taluka Panchayats are providing facilities for primary education, health, drinking water, electricity, constructions and maintenance of roads, bridges etc., maintenance of Gauchars, organising relief work at the time of scarcity and drought situation, sanitation and social welfare. Arrangements for housing facilities for below poverty line people and rural development schemes are implemented by panchayats. Gram Panchayats also implement important programmes like, 'food for work' and other programmes beneficial for the local people. Thus, Panchayats play an important role in the development of village and its economy. There are 13,761 Gram Panchayats in Gujarat State. Out of 311 villages in The Dangs district there are 66 group Gram Panchayats and 4 independent Gram Panchayats. The Galkund is having maximum 11 group Gram Panchayats.

(v) Census Concepts :

Building :

A 'building' is generally a single structure on the ground. Sometimes it is made up of more than one component unit which are used or likely to be used as dwellings (residences) or establishments such as

shops, business houses, offices, factories, workshops, work sheds, schools, places of entertainment, places of worship, godowns, stores, etc. It is also possible that buildings which have component units may be used for a combination of purposes such as shop-cum-residence, workshop-cum-residence office-cum-residence, etc.

Usually a structure will have four walls and a roof. But in some areas the very nature of construction of houses is such that there may not be any wall. Such is the case of conical structures where entrance is also provided but they may not have any walls. Therefore, such of the conical structures are also treated as separate building.

Permanent Houses :

Houses, the walls and roof of which are made of permanent materials. The Material of wall can be anyone from the following namely Galvanized iron sheets or other metal sheets, Asbestos sheets, burnt bricks, stones or concrete. Roof may be made of from any one of the following materials namely tiles, slate, galvanized iron sheets, metal sheets, asbestos sheets, bricks, stones or concrete.

Semi-permanent Houses :

Houses in which either wall or roof is made of permanent materials and the other is made of temporary material.

Temporary Houses :

Houses in which both wall and roof are made of materials, which have to be replaced frequently. Wall may be made from any one of the following temporary materials namely grass, thatch, bamboo, plastic, polythene, mud, unburnt bricks or wood. Roof may be made from any one of the following temporary materials, namely, grass, thatch, bamboo, wood, mud, plastic or polythene.

Dwelling Room :

A room is treated as a dwelling room if it has walls with a doorway and a roof should be wide and long enough for a person to sleep in, i.e., it should have a length of not less than 2 meters and a breadth of at least 1.5 meters and a height of a 2 meters. A dwelling room would include living room, bedroom,

dining room drawing room study room, servant's room and other habitable rooms. Kitchen, Bathroom, latrine, Store-room, passage-way and verandah which are not normally usable for living are not considered as dwelling rooms. A room used for multipurpose such as sleeping, sitting, dining, storing, cooking, etc., is regarded as a dwelling room. In a situation where a census houses is used as a shop or office. etc., and the household also stays in it then the room is not considered as a dwelling room. But if a garage or servant quarter is used by a servant and if she/he also lives in it as a separate household then this has been considered as a dwelling room available to the servants household tent or conical shaped hut if used for living by any household is also considered as dwelling room.

A dwelling room which is shared by more than one household has not been counted for any of them. If two household have a dwelling room each but in addition also share a common dwelling room. Then the common room has not been counted for either or of the household.

Census House :

A 'Census House' is a building or part of a building used or recognized as a separate unit because of having a separate main entrance from the road or common courtyard or, staircase, etc. It may be occupied or vacant. It may be used for a residential or non-residential purpose or both.

In certain peculiar situations, the manner in which buildings and census houses were identified for numbering in the field by the enumerators is described hereunder.

Sometimes a series of a different buildings are found along a street which are joined with one another by common walls on either side looking like a continuous structure. These different units are practically independent of one another and are likely to have been built at different times and owned by different persons. In such cases, though the whole structure with all the adjoining units apparently appears to be one building, each portion was treated as a separate building and its constituent units as separate census houses.

On the other hand, one may come across cases, particularly in large cities of multi-storied ownership flats. In these cases while the structure looks like one building, different persons own the flats. In case of such multi-storied structures, having a number of flats owned by different persons, the entire structure was treated as one building and each flat as a separate census house.

If within a large enclosed area, there are separate buildings owned by different persons then each such building is treated as a separate building. There can be a situation where within an enclosed compound there are separate buildings owned by an undertaking or company or even government that are actually in occupation of different persons. For example, Indian Oil Corporation colony where the buildings are owned by the Corporation but these are in occupation of their employees. Each such building was treated as a separate building. But if in any one of these buildings there were flats in occupation of different households, each such flat was reckoned as a separate census house.

Sometimes it becomes difficult to apply the definition of census house strictly in certain cases. For example, in an urban area, if a flat has five rooms, each room having direct entrance from the common staircase or courtyard. By definition, this has to be treated as five census houses. If all these five rooms are occupied by a single household it was not realistic to treat them as five census houses. In such a case, 'singleness' of use of these rooms along with the main house should be considered and the entire flat was treated as one census house. On the other hand, if two independent households occupy these five rooms, the first household living in 3 rooms and the second household occupying 2 rooms, then considering the use, the first three rooms together were treated as one census house and the remaining rooms as another census house. But if each room was occupied by an independent household, then each such room was treated as a separate census house.

In case of hostels, hotels, etc., even if the door of each room in which an inmate lives opens to a common verandah, staircase, courtyard or a common room, as it happens almost invariably, the entire hostel/ Hotel building was treated as one census house. but if such hostels/ hotels have out- houses or other

structures used for different purposes or the same purpose, then each such structure attached to the main hostel/hotel was treated as a separate census house.

In some parts of the country, in rural areas, the pattern of habitation is such that a group of huts, located in a compound, whether enclosed or unenclosed, is occupied by one household. While the main residence may be located in one hut, other huts may be used for sleeping, as a kitchen, bath room, baithak, etc. Though each of the huts was a separate structure, they form a single housing unit and therefore, have to be treated collectively as one building and one census house. If some of the huts are used by one household and the others by a second household as residence, then the two groups of huts were treated as separate census houses. However, if there were also other huts in the compound used for other purposes and not as part of the household's residence such as, cattle shed, work shed, etc., these were treated as separate census houses.

On the other hand, in urban areas, where more than one structure within an enclosed or open compound (premises) belonging to the same person, e.g., the main house, the servant's quarter, the garage, etc., only one building number was given for this group and each of the constituent a separate census house number.

Only cases where a structure with roof and pillars has come up was treated as a building.

Village :

The basic unit for rural areas is the revenue village, which has definite surveyed boundaries. The revenue village may comprise of one or more hamlets but the entire village is treated as one unit for presentation of data.

In unsurveyed areas, like villages within forest areas, each habitation area with locally recognized boundaries is treated as one village.

Town/Urban Area :

The following areas are treated as towns/urban area :

(a) All places with a municipality, municipal corporation, cantonment board or notified town area committee, etc.

(b) All other places which satisfy or are expected to satisfy the following criteria simultaneously :

- (i) A minimum population of 5,000,
- (ii) At least 75 per cent of the male working population engaged in non-agricultural pursuits; and
- (iii) A density of population of at least 400 per square kilometer. (1,000 per square mile).

City :

Towns with population of 1,00,000 and above are called cities.

Urban Agglomeration :

An Urban Agglomeration is a continuous urban spread constituting a town and its adjoining urban outgrowths (OGs) or two or more physically contiguous towns together and any adjoining urban outgrowths of such towns. In some cases railway colonies, university campuses, port areas, etc., may come up near a city or statutory town outside its statutory limits but within the revenue limits of a village or villages contiguous to the town or city. Each such individual area by itself may not satisfy the minimum population limit to qualify it to be treated as an independent urban unit but may deserve to be clubbed with the town as a continuous urban spread.

For the purpose of delineation of Urban Agglomerations during Census of India 2001, following criteria are taken as pre-requisites:

- (a) The core town or at least one of the constituent towns of an urban agglomeration should necessarily be a statutory town; and
- (b) The total population of all the constituents (i.e., towns and outgrowths) of an Urban Agglomeration should not be less than 20,000 (as per the 1991 Census).

With these two basic criteria having been met, the following are the possible different situations in which Urban Agglomerations would be constituted:

- i) a city or town with one or more contiguous outgrowths;
- ii) two or more adjoining towns with their outgrowths; and
- iii) a city and one or more adjoining towns with their outgrowths all of which form a continuous spread.

Household :

A 'household' is usually a group of persons who normally live together and take their meals from a common kitchen unless the exigencies of work prevent any of them from doing so. Persons in a household may be related or unrelated or a mix of both. However, if a group of unrelated persons live in a census house but do not take their meals from the common kitchen, then they are not constituent of a common household. Each such person was to be treated as a separate household. The important link in finding out whether it was a household or not was a common kitchen. There may be one member households, two member households or multi-member households.

Institutional Households :

A group of unrelated persons who live in an institution and take their meals from a common kitchen is called an Institutional Household. Examples of Institutional Households are boarding houses, messes, hostels, hotels, rescue homes, jails, ashrams, orphanages, etc. To make the definition more clearly perceptible to the enumerators at the Census 2001, it was specifically mentioned that this category or households would cover only those households where a group of unrelated persons live in an institution and share a common kitchen.

Houseless Household :

Households who do not live in buildings or census houses but live in the open on roadside pavements, in hume pipes, under flyovers and staircases, or in the open in places of worship, mandaps, railway platforms, etc., are treated as Houseless Household.

Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes :

Article 341(1) of the Constitution provides that the President may, with respect to any State or Union territory, specify the castes, races or tribes or parts of or groups within castes, races or tribes which shall for the purposes of the Constitution be deemed to be Scheduled Castes in relation to that State or Union territory. Article 342(1) similarly provides for specification of tribes or tribal communities or parts of or groups within tribes or tribal communities, which are to be deemed for the purposes of the Constitution to be Scheduled Tribes in relation to the various States

and Union territories. In pursuance of these provisions, the list of Scheduled Castes and / or Scheduled Tribes are notified for each State and Union territory and are valid only within the jurisdiction of that State or Union territory and not outside.

It is important to mention here that under the Constitution (Scheduled Castes) Order, 1950, no person who professed a religion different from Hinduism was deemed to be a member of a Scheduled Caste in addition to every member of the Ramdasi, Kabirpanthi, Majhabi or Sikligar caste resident in Punjab or Patiala and East Punjab States Union were in relation to that State whether they professed the Hindu or the Sikh religion. Subsequently, in September 1956, by an amendment, the Presidential Order of 1950 and in all subsequent Presidential Orders relating to Scheduled Castes, the Hindu and the Sikh religions were placed on the same footing with regard to the specification of Scheduled Castes. Later on, as per the amendment made in the Constitution (Scheduled Castes) Order 1990, the Hindu, the Sikh and the Buddhist were placed on the same footing with regard to the recognition of the Scheduled Castes.

Language and Mother Tongue :

As per the census concept, each language is a group of mother tongues. The census questionnaire collects information on the mother tongue of each person and mother tongue is defined as the language spoken in childhood by the person's mother to the person. If the mother died in infancy, the language mainly spoken in the person's home in childhood will be the mother tongue. In the case of infants and deaf mutes, the language usually spoken by the mother is considered as mother tongue. It is not necessary that the language spoken as mother tongue should have a script. The mother tongues returned by the respondents in census are classified and grouped under appropriate languages according to their linguistic characteristics.

Literate :

A person age 7 years and above who can both read and write with understanding in any language is taken as literate. A person who can only read but cannot write is not literate. It is not necessary that to be considered as literate, a person should have received any formal education or passed any minimum educational standard. Literacy could also have been achieved through adult literacy classes or through any non-formal educational system. People who are blind and can read in Braille are treated as literates.

Literacy Rate :

Literacy rate of the population is defined as the percentage of literates in the age group seven years and above. For different age groups the percentage of literates in that age group gives the literacy rate.

Educational Level :

The highest level of education a person has completed.

Work :

Work is defined as participation in any economically productive activity with or without compensation, wages or profit. Such participation may be physical and/or mental in nature. Work involves not only actual work but also includes effective supervision and direction of work. It even includes part time help or unpaid work on farm, family enterprise or in any other economic activity. All persons engaged in 'work' as defined above are workers. Persons who are engaged in cultivation or milk production even solely for domestic consumption are also treated as workers.

Reference period for determining a person as worker and non-worker is one year preceding the date of enumeration.

Main Worker :

A person who has worked for major part of the reference period (i.e. six months or more during the last one year preceding the date of enumeration) in any economically productive activity is termed as "Main worker".

Marginal Worker :

A person who worked for less than six months of the reference period (i.e. in the last one year preceding the date of enumeration) in any economic activity is termed as 'Marginal- worker'

Non Worker :

A person who has not worked at all in any economically productive activity during the reference period (i.e. last one year preceding the date of enumeration) is termed as 'Non worker'.

Cultivator :

For purposes of the Census a person is classified as cultivator, if, he or she is engaged in cultivation on land owned or held from government or held from

private persons or institutions for payment in money, kind or share. Cultivation includes effective supervision or direction in cultivation.

A person who has given out her/his land to another person or persons or institution(s) for cultivation for money, kind or share of crop and who does not even supervise or direct cultivation in exchange of land, is not treated as cultivator. Similarly, a person working on another person's land for wages in cash or kind or a combination of both (agricultural laborers) is not treated as cultivator.

Cultivation involves ploughing, sowing, harvesting and production of cereals and millet crops such as wheat, paddy, jowar, bajra, ragi, etc., and other crops such as sugarcane, tobacco, ground-nuts, tapioca, etc., and pulses, raw jute and kindred fiber crop, cotton, cinchona and other medicinal plants, fruit growing, vegetable growing or keeping orchards or groves, etc. Cultivation does not include the following plantation crops – tea, coffee, rubber, coconut and betel-nuts (area).

Agricultural Labourer :

A person who works on another person's land for wages in money or kind or share is regarded as an agricultural labourer. She/he has no risk in the cultivation, but merely works on another person's land for wages. An agricultural laborer has no right of lease or contract on land on which she/he works.

Household Industry Worker :

Household industry is defined as an industry conducted by the head of the household herself/himself and or by the members of the household at home or within the village in rural areas and only within the precincts of the house where the household lives in urban areas. The larger proportion of workers in household industry should consist of members of the household including the head. The industry should not be run on the scale of a registered factory which would qualify or has to be registered under the Indian Factories Act and should be engaged in manufacturing, processing, servicing and repairs of goods.

It does not include professions such as a pleader, Doctor, Musician, Dancer, Waterman, Astrologer, Dhobi, Barber, etc. or merely trade or business, even if such professions, trade or services are run at home by members of the household.

Other Worker :

A person who has been engaged in some economic activity during the reference period but not as a cultivator or agricultural laborer or in Household Industry is termed as an 'Other-Worker (OW)'. The type of workers that come under this category of 'OW' include all government servants, municipal employees, teachers, factory workers, plantation workers, those engaged in trade, commerce, business, transport, banking, mining, construction, political or social work, priests, entertainment artists, etc. In effect, all those workers other than cultivators or agricultural laborers or household industrial workers, are 'Other Workers'.

Work Participation Rate :

Percentage of workers (main + marginal) to total population

Population Density :

Population density is the number of persons inhabited per square kilometer of the area.

Age :

Age is measured in terms of the completed number of years.

Sex Ratio :

Numbers of females per 1000 males in a population.

(vi) Non-Census Concepts :**Improved Drinking Water :**

If the household had access to drinking water supplied from a tap, hand pump, tube well or well (protected or covered) situated within or outside the premises, it is considered as having access to improved drinking water.

System of Sewerage :

Generally, a sewerage system would mean a network of mains and branches of underground conduits for the conveyance of sewerage to the point of disposal. Sewers that carry only household and industrial wastage are called separate sewers; those that carry storm water from roofs, streets and other surfaces are known as storm water drains, while those carrying both sewage and storm water are called combined sewers. However, in some towns, which are, not provided with such underground sewerage

system, it is served by open surface drain, box drain, silk pattern drain, etc., in these towns.

Type of Latrine and Method of Disposal of Night Soil :

There are three prevalent systems of disposal of human wastes, viz.(i) underground sewerage, (ii) sanitary water flush latrines with individual disposal systems, like septic tank, leaching cess pool and collecting well, and (iii) dry type of latrines with manual scavenging.

The system of underground sewerage provides for the street sewerage with which are connected the sanitary latrines constructed in the houses having water closets and fitted with flushing cistern (or hand flushing). Through this sewer the faecal matter is transported without the need for scavenging. This system generally exists in cities and big towns.

Where the streets sewer does not exist these sanitary water flush latrines are connected to a local septic tank with a sub-soil dispersion system or a leaching pit. Here the liquid wastes from the water closet is disposed of locally in leaching pit, a septic tank with a soil dispersion system is constructed. This dispersion requires an optimum travel through the pores of the soil, which renders the harmful liquid bacterially innocuous by the slow process of filtration through the soil traversed.

Where the soil is impermeable, collecting wells are constructed and the sanitary water flush latrines are connected with them. These wells are cleaned at periodic intervals by a suitable device. The dry type of latrines are of service type latrines from where human excreta is removed by scavengers from house to house, in most cases carrying it on their heads or shoulders or in baskets with handle or wheel barrows. These are then collected in bullock carts or trucks or tractors and trolleys for being carried to the dumping grounds.

Fertility :

In demography, the word fertility is used in relation to the actual production of children or occurrence of births specially lives births. Fertility is a measure of rate at which population adds to itself by births and normally assessed by relating the number of births to a full or part of the population, such as number of

married women or number of women of child bearing age. The definitions of the terminology used in computing different fertility rates are mentioned below.

Crude Birth Rate (CBR) :

Ratio of the numbers of live births in a year to the mid year population. (normally expressed per 1,000 population).

$$\text{CBR} = \frac{\text{Numbers of live births during the year}}{\text{Mid -year Population}} \times 1,000$$

Crude Death Rate (CDR) :

Ratio of the numbers of deaths in a year to the mid year population, normally expressed per 1,000 population.

$$\text{CDR} = \frac{\text{Numbers of deaths during the year}}{\text{Mid-year Population}} \times 1,000$$

Natural Growth Rate (NGR) :

Natural Growth rate is obtained as the difference between crude birth rate and crude death rate in the absence of migration.

Age-Specific Fertility Rate (ASFR) :

Number of live births in a year to female population in any specified age group normally expressed per 1,000 women.

$$\text{ASFR} = \frac{\text{Numbers of live births in a particular age group}}{\text{Numbers female population of same specified age group}} \times 1,000$$

Age-Specific Marital Fertility Rate (ASMFR):

Number of live births in a year to married female population in any specified age group normally expressed per 1000 married women.

$$\text{ASMFR} = \frac{\text{Number of live births in a particular age group}}{\text{Mid-year married female population of the same age group}} \times 1,000$$

General Fertility Rate (GFR) :

Number of live births per 1,000 women in the reproductive age-group (15-49) years in a given year.

$$\text{GFR} = \frac{\text{Number of live births in a year}}{\text{Mid-year female population in the age-group (15-49) years}} \times 1,000$$

General Marital Fertility Rate (GMFR) :

Number of live births per 1,000 married women in reproductive age-group (15-49) years in a given year.

$$\text{GMFR} = \frac{\text{Number of live births in a year}}{\text{Mid-year married female population in the age group (15-49) years}} \times 1,000$$

Total Fertility Rate (TFR) :

It is obtained as the total of the age specific fertility rates (number of children born per woman of the particular age) for the entire reproductive age span. It provides the average number of children that will be born to a woman under the fertility levels indicated by the age specific fertility rates assuming that there is no mortality of women till the completion of reproductive period.

Total Marital Fertility Rate (TMFR) :

Average number of children that would be born to a married woman if she experiences the current fertility pattern throughout her reproductive span (15-49) years assuming that there is no mortality of women till the completion of reproductive period.

Age-Specific Mortality Rate (ASMR) :

Number of deaths in a particular age and sex group per 1000 population of the same age group.

$$\text{ASMR} = \frac{\text{Number of deaths in a particular age group}}{\text{Mid-year population of the same age group}} \times 1,000$$

q1 :

Probability of dying between birth and age 1. This can be used as approximate value of Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) which gives the ratio of number of deaths in a year of children aged less than one year to the number of births in that year.

q2 :

Probability of dying between birth and age 2.

q5 :

Probability of dying between birth and age 5. This indicator is also known as Under Five Mortality Rate (q5MR)

Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) :

Ratio of the number of infant deaths (deaths of children below one year) in a year to the number of live births in that year.

Infant mortality rate comprises of two parts, viz., Neo-natal mortality rate and Post neo-natal mortality rate. The neo-natal mortality rate also comprises of two parts viz., early neo-natal mortality rate and late neo-natal mortality rate. These are defined as :

Neo-natal Mortality Rate (NMR) :

Number of infants dying within the first month of life (28 days or under) in a year per 1,000 live births of the same year.

$$\text{NMR} = \frac{\text{Number of infant deaths aged 28 days under during the year}}{\text{Number of live births during the year}} \times 1,000$$

Early Neo-natal Mortality Rate (ENMR) :

$$\text{ENMR} = \frac{\text{Number of infant deaths of less than 7 days during the year}}{\text{Number of live births during the year}} \times 1,000$$

Late Neo-natal Mortality Rate (LNMR) :

$$\text{LNMR} = \frac{\text{Number of infant deaths of 7 days to less than 29 days during the year}}{\text{Number of live births during the year}} \times 1,000$$

Post Neo-natal Mortality Rate (PNMR) :

$$\text{PNMR} = \frac{\text{Number of deaths of 29 days to less than One year during the year}}{\text{Number of live births during the year}} \times 1,000$$

Peri-natal Mortality Rate (PMR) :

Number of stillbirths plus deaths within 1st week of delivery per 1000 births in a year.

$$\text{PMR} = \frac{\text{Number of stillbirths and infant deaths of less than 7 days during the year}}{\text{Number of live births and stillbirths during the year}} \times 1,000$$

Stillbirth Rate (SBR) :

$$\text{SBR} = \frac{\text{Number of stillbirths during the year}}{\text{Number of live births and stillbirths during the year}} \times 1,000$$

Maternal Mortality Rate(MMR) :

Number of deaths of women in the age group 15-49 while pregnant or within 42 days of termination of pregnancy from any cause related to pregnancy and childbirth per 100,000 live births in a given year.

$$\text{MMR} = \frac{\text{Number of maternal deaths to women in the age group 15-49}}{\text{Number of live birth}} \times 100,000$$

Eligible Couple (Couples per 1000 population):

Number of currently married females in the age group 15-44 years per 1,000 persons of all ages.

Child Woman Ratio (0-4) :

1. Number of children in the age group 0-4 years per 1,000 women in the age group 15-49 years.

Child Woman Ratio (5-9) :

2. Number of children in the age group 5-9 years per 1,000 women in the age group 15-49 years.

Migration :

Migration is the third component of population change, the other two being mortality and fertility.

A person is considered as a migrant by place of birth if the place in which he/she is enumerated during the census is other than the place of his/her birth.

Similarly a person is considered as a migrant by place of last residence if the place in which he/she is enumerated during the census is other than his/her place of immediate last residence outside the village or town and not simply in another house or locality in the same village or town.

Certain aspects concerning temporary movement/migration of people has been explained below as these are important components concerning migration :

(i) Migration of persons in search of job is high in the country. In many cases such migrants are only seasonal in nature. People migrate to other places for work in a particular season and come back again to their usual place of residence after three or four months. All such workers are treated as migrants. Similarly, if a person moved to any other place for attending short term vocational or educational course that lasted for only few months of a year, she/he too were considered as a migrant.

(ii) Where a person had merely gone out to another place or had been shifting from one place to another purely on tour, pilgrimage, visit to hospital for treatment or for temporary business purposes, such persons are not deemed to have had another residence different from the place where she/he or her/his family normally resides. She/he is not considered as migrant.

(iii) A woman temporarily moves into a hospital or to her parents or other relative's house for delivery and if the hospital or the parents/relatives houses is in a place different from usual place of residence, the place where the hospital or parents/relative's house is the place of last residence of the child but not of the mother.

A new response category 'Moved after birth' was added in Census of India 2001 in the question on 'reasons for migration' to bring out additional migration patterns. Natural calamities or distress migration as a reason for migration for last residence migrants included in 1991 Census, is covered under category of 'Others'. The reason for migration has been

determined as applicable at the time of migration and not in reference to any point of time after that. For example, if a person had moved from the place of her/his last residence for the purpose of education and subsequently at some point of time got employment there only, the reason for migration would be 'education' and not 'work/employment'.

Internal and International Migration :

The migrational movements are of three types

- (i) Migration within the state itself with its components
 - (a) Migration within the district of enumeration (intra district migration)
 - (b) Migration from one district of state to another district of state (inter district migration),
- (ii) Migration from one state to another State of the country (inter-state migration),
- (iii) Migration from one country to another country.

The first two streams together constitute internal migration, while the last type of movement is called international migration. The present name of the country, state or district and not the name by which they were known at the time of her/his birth or last residence were recorded.

Rural-Urban Components of Migration :

Rural or Urban status in respect of migrants had been determined as applicable at the time of migration and not with reference to any point of time after that.

The flow of migrants consists of four streams viz. rural to rural, rural to urban, urban to rural and urban to urban.

Civic Status of Urban Units :

Civic Status of a town/city is determined on the basis of Civic Administrative authority of the town e.g., Municipal Corporation/Corporation, Municipal Committee/Municipal council, Municipality etc.

Size Class of UA/Town :

Size-class of UA/Town is based on the population size of the UA/City/Town. UAs/Towns with 100,000

and above population is classified as Class I UAs./towns. These Class I UAs./towns are now further sub classified in to seven sub classes namely M1 to M7 depending on the population size of UA/City/Town. These are M7(5,000,000 and above); M6(2,000,000 to 4,999,999); M5(1,000,000-1,999,999) M4(500,000-999,999); M3(300,000-499,999), M2(200,000-299,999) & M1(100,000-199,999). towns with, 50,000 to 99,999 population are classified as Class II towns, 20,000 to 49,999 population are Class III towns, population with 10,000-19,999 are Class IV towns, population with 5,000 and 9,999 are Class V towns and towns with less than 5,000 population are Class VI towns.

Slum Area :

The Slum Areas (Improvement and Clearance) Act, 1956 which was enacted by the Central Govt. defined slums as a) Areas where buildings are in any respect unfit for human habitation; or b) are by reasons of dilapidation, overcrowding, fault arrangement and design of such buildings, narrowness or faulty arrangement of streets, lack of ventilation, light or sanitation facilities, or any combination of these factors, are detrimental to safety, health or morals.

Mega City :

The concept of 'Mega city' is a recent phenomenon in the Urban Sociology and is defined in term of metropolitan city in the form of large size, problem of management of civic amenities and capacity to absorb the relatively high growth of population. Indian Census in 1991 treated the population size of 5 million and above as the cut off point to identify a place as the mega city. Whereas, for the purpose of inclusion in Centrally Sponsored Scheme for Infrastructure Development in Mega cities the Ministry of Urban Affairs and employment, Department of Urban Development adopted the criteria of 4 million and above population as per 1991 Census for Mega Cities. In 2001 Census, cities with 10 millions and above population have been treated as Mega cities.

(vii) 2001 Census Findings – Population and its Distribution :

(a) Distribution of Population in Rural-Urban Areas :

According to the 2001 Census, the total population of The Dangs is 1,86,729 comprising 93,974 males and 92,755 females. This population of the district forms 0.4 per cent of the state population and ranks at 25th place among the districts of state. The Dangs has totally rural area and only one taluka. The Dangs have 311

villages and all the villages are inhabited. The concentration of villages are mainly along the valleys of rivers and streams as well as on undulating slopes.

(b) Size class and Status of Towns, Population growth, Density, Sex Ratio, Work Participation Rate, Details of Literacy, availability of University Education in the District :

According to 1991 census, Ahwa and Waghai were census towns but they are declassified as rural in 2001 census.

The population of the district was 144,091 as per 1991 census and has gone upto 186,729 persons in 2001, adding 42,638 persons during 1991-2001. The growth rate revealed by the district is 29.6 per cent.

The density of population in The Dangs district is 106 persons per sq.km. against the State average of 258 persons. The Dangs district has one taluka and totally rural area. So there is no variation among them.

There are 987 females for every thousand males in The Dangs district while for the State it is 920. It is higher against the State average. The sex ratio in age group 0-6 comes 974 and 883 females per thousand males in The Dangs district and in the State respectively.

The work participation rate is defined as percentage of total workers to total population. In the same way it is defined for main workers and marginal workers. According to 2001 census, the total workers including Main and Marginal workers constitute 49.8 per cent of the total population of the district. Of the total workers the share of the main workers is 36.7 per cent and the Marginal workers is 13.1 per cent. The remaining half of population belongs to the category of non-workers. As per 2001 census among the main workers Male participation rate in the district is 46.2 per cent and corresponding proportion of females is 27.2 per cent. Male and female marginal workers account for 6.2 and 20.0 per cent respectively. The proportion of female Marginal workers is substantially higher than males as the females are attending to one or more economic activities in addition to their house duties to improve the family income.

A person who can read and write in any language with understanding is taken as literate in census. All children of age below 7 years are treated as illiterates. As per 2001 census, The Dangs district reported 89,586 persons as literates constituting 59.6 per cent of the total population. The proportion of

male and female literates in the district is 70.7 and 48.5 per cent respectively. The literacy rate of males is much higher than that of females. The difference of males and female literacy rate is 22.2 percentage points in the district.

Availability of University Education in the District :

The Dangs district is totally rural having 311 villages even though there is college education facility. There is only one Government College in the district situated in Ahwa and 309 villages are having primary schools.

Religion:

Religion forms an integral part of Indian Social system. In the pre-Independence census reports, the data on religion was being presented for 9 major religions viz. Hindu, Muslim, Tribals, Christian, Sikh, Jain, Buddhist, Parsi, Jew and others. However, since the 1951 census the data on religion has been presented for 6 major religions viz. Hindu, Muslim, Christian, Sikh, Jain and Buddhist. Besides, the minor religions have been classified under the category of 'other'. The data on religion collected and presented by the Indian Census is the basic data of immense use for the researchers, anthropologists, sociologists, demographers, administrators, planners and even for common man.

In 2001 the Indian Census collected the religion data in question number 7 of the Household Schedule and recorded the same under the six major religions. Other religions were recorded in actual as returned by the respondent and classified under the category of 'others'. Religions not stated have been added for those persons who have not stated their religion at the time of canvassing the status of religion.

The comparative data of the State and The Dangs district is presented in the above Statement. It reveals that in 2001 Census among the major religions, Hindus are returned on the lower side with over 0.5 per cent less than the State average. Muslims recorded nearly 7.6 per cent less whereas Christians proportion is higher by nearly 9.0 per cent than the State average. There are 88.6 per cent Hindus, 1.5 per cent Muslims and 9.6 per cent Christians in The Dangs district as against 89.1 per cent Hindus, 9.1 per cent Muslims and 0.6 per cent Christians in Gujarat State. As regards other three major religions viz. Sikh, Buddhist and Jain, their percentage to total population in The Dangs district is negligible, against the State figure of 0.1 percent, 0.0 percent and 1.0 percent for these three religions.

The pattern of distribution of the population of major religious communities between rural and urban areas of The Dangs is as under according to 2001 Census.

Table 4 shows distribution of villages by population density. The population density in the rural areas of the district is 108. There are 311 inhabited villages in the district, which have been distributed by population density in 8 different ranges of population density. The maximum number of villages i.e. 126 accounting for 40.5 per cent of total villages with the highest population proportion of 32.4 per cent are in the density range of 101-200. As many as 77 (24.8 per cent) villages with 19.8 per cent population are in

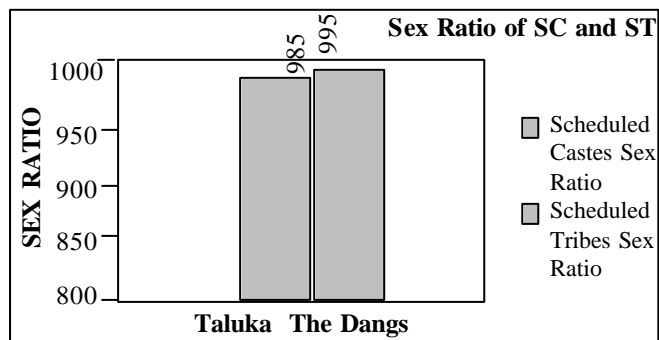

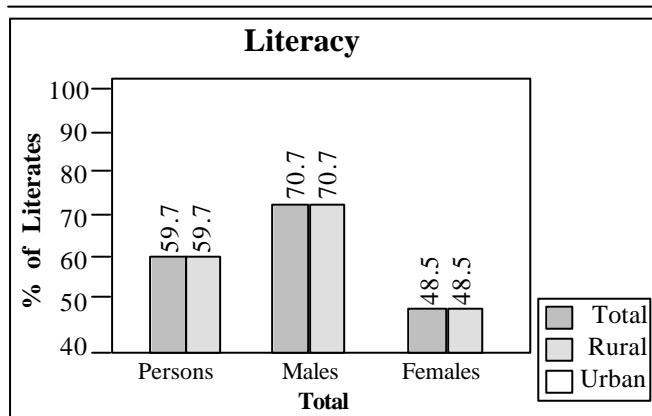

Table 23 shows distribution of villages in 12 different ranges of literacy rate in the district. There are no villages in the ranges of 0, 1-10, 91-99 and 100. The maximum number of villages i.e. 101 (32.5 per cent) having the highest population proportion of 31.4 per cent are in the range of 51-60. Table 29 shows distribution of villages by 12 different literacy rate ranges for Scheduled Tribes population in the district. There is no village in the literacy rate range of 0, which indicates that there is at least one Scheduled Tribes literate in all the villages. Similarly there is no village in the range of 100 per cent suggesting that there is no village in the district where all the Scheduled Tribes population is literates. There is also no village in the literacy rate ranges of 1-10 and 91-99. There are 99 (31.8 per cent) villages having maximum Scheduled Tribes population of 32.3 per cent in the range of 51-60 per cent. There are 66 (21.2 per cent) villages with 19 per cent of population

which are in the range of 61-70 per cent followed by 60 (19.3 per cent) villages having 14.8 per cent of Scheduled Tribes population in the range of 41-50 per cent. There are 35 (11.3 per cent) villages with 9.6 per cent population in the range of 31-40 and 33 (10.6 per cent) villages with 13.5 per cent population in the range of 71-80. 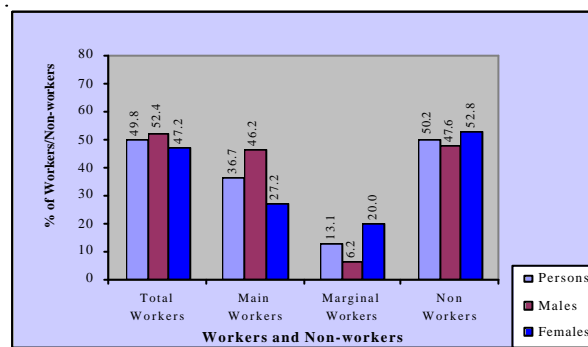

Table 34 shows distribution of workers by sex in four categories of economic activity. It can be seen that total workers in the district are 49.8 per cent of the total population. As much as 57.8 per cent of these total workers are cultivators and 28 per cent are agricultural labourers. Thus it can be understood that 85.8 per cent working force is engaged in agricultural activities. Only 1.3 per cent of total workers are household industry workers and 12.9 per cent are other workers. The sex wise break up shows that 59.2 per cent of total male workers are cultivators. As much as 21.1 per cent males are agricultural labourers 1.5

per cent are household industry workers and 18.2 per cent are other workers. As regards female workers, 56.3 per cent of female total workers are cultivators, 35.9 per cent are agricultural labourers, 1 per cent are Household Industry workers and 6.9 per cent are other workers. It is observed from above details that male participation is higher as cultivators, household Industry workers and other workers than the female work participation. Only in case of agricultural labourer the female work participation is higher than that of male work participation.

Table 40 gives detail of villages according to the distance from the nearest statutory town and availability of different amenities. Out of 311 villages 4 villages are at a distance of less than 5 km from the nearest town. All these 4 villages have Educational facilities, 3 villages have Medical and Transport/communication facilities and only 1 village has Approach by pucca road. Other facilities such as Post Office, Telephone, Banks and Agricultural Credit Societies are not available to any villages in this range. As many as 16 villages are at a distance of 5-15 km

from the nearest statutory town. All these 16 villages have Educational facility and 12 villages have facilities of Medical and Transport/communication; 11 villages in this range have Approach by pucca road; 5 have Post Office; 3 have Telephone; 2 have Banks and only one village has Agricultural Credit Societies. Out of 311 villages of the district, maximum number of villages i.e. 265 are situated at a distance of 16 to 50 km from nearest town. As many as 25 villages are in the population range of 1,000-1,999. Education, Improved Drinking Water and Power Supply facilities are available in all 25 villages while Medical, Post Office, Telephone facilities are available in 20, 15 and 5 villages respectively. As many as 21 villages avail facility of Transport Communication, 3 villages avail

Banking facility whereas 6 villages avail facility of Agricultural Credit Societies. There are 111 villages in the population range of 500-999 and Education as well as Power Supply facilities are available to all these villages. Out of 111 villages 100 villages have Medical facility of one or another kind, 109 villages have drinking water facility, 37 have Post Office, 9 have Telephone, 83 have Transport/Communication, 16 have Agricultural Credit Societies and 75 have Approach by pucca road facility. None of the 111 villages has banking facility.

Out of 311 villages 170 villages are in the lowest population range of 1-499. Only Power Supply facility is available to these 170 villages. (viii) Major social and cultural events, natural and administrative developments and significant activities during the decade

In tribal area of Dangs, at Ahwa, a pharmacy is being run on co-operative basis and it supplies 30 per cent of the total requirement of the Government hospitals and dispensaries. A large number of the tribal people get employment through this pharmacy. With the increasing speed of development in the field of science and medicine, Ayurved has also made a tremendous progress. In the field of preparation of Ayurvedic medicines, many well established and highly reputed private pharmacies are working very nicely and satisfactorily in the field. The Government has decided to spend 10 per cent of the grant of medicine on certain scheduled patent medicines.

In pursuance of the recommendations made in the National Seminar on Medicinal Plants & Traditional Medical Knowledge and Workshop on Management of Incurable Diseases like AIDS held on February 12 and 13, 1999 at Saputara (Dangs), it was resolved that a Drug Testing Laboratory for I.S.M. drugs should be established. Gujarat Ayurved University, Jamnagar had prepared a project report for such a lab at Ahwa in Dangs district and Govt. has sanctioned it in year 2000-2001. It will encourage the co-operative societies for medicinal herbs in tribal area and will provide the employment to the tribal people. This Laboratory was to be under the direct administration of Gujarat Ayurved University, Jamnagar.

Ahwa, the headquarters of the one taluka district of The Dangs, is situated about 1800 feet above the sea level. The Christian Mission manages a missionary church that was established here. The Mahadev temple is located here. Poisonous snakes from here are sent to the Haffkine Institute, Bombay for preparing injections.

Waghai is called so because of abundance of tigers in former days. It serves as a gateway to The Dangs district. It is situated 32 km away from Ahwa. Gira waterfall is 5 km away from Waghai.

Giridurg is the only fort of architectural nature at The Dangs of 17th century. The Fort Songadh was built by the founder of Gayakwad royal family Pilajirao Gayakwad in 1721 and Songadh was made the capital

city. But Damjirao, the son of Pilajirao selected Vadodara as a capital. When Gayakwad Government ruled or administered with Salher Mulher fort, then they were going out by this fort. There was a water tank covered in stone on this fort, and there were stores for ammunitions and grains.

In the north there was secret stream of water. Beneath this, a temple of Hanumanji is situated. Beside it there lies a broken gun. It is very pleasant to see landscape of Kalibel village from the fort. Parking the vehicle at Popatbari, one can go to fort in one hour and while coming down through north side can visit Hanumanji temple.

From Ahwa to Navapur Road near Chinchli this historical place called Lashkari Amba is situated. In the year 1829 A.D. the British Army entered The

Dangs with the orders of the collector of Khandes. In leadership of the English Capt. Outram, a group of 10,000 *bhil* soldiers entered The Dang from the Navapur road. At that time because of the thick forest, bad climate and pestilence many soldiers died on their way to Dangs. At that time the captain along with the remaining soldiers encamped near the mango tree at a distance of 2 km from Ahwa where the Raja of Gadhvi opposed with the *bhils* at his command. The Gadhvi Raja, Silpatsingh was arrested and his men dispersed. Because of the encampment of Outram's army near the mango tree, this place is still known as Laskari Amba. This is a pleasant place to visit.

(Sabrimata Memorial Trust)

It is said that during the Ramayana time the area of Subir was known as Sabriwan, and the place called Bardipada is known as the garden of Ber. At that time the tribal Goddess Sabri was a resident of this forest. Some scholars believed that when God Rama and Sita came for *vanvas* they went to this village called Subir and also visited some of the areas nearby.

A trust is set up which is planning to build a temple of Ram-Sita, Laxman and Sabrimata, which will be a very important place for worship.

(Gira fall)

The real beauty of Gira-fall is to be seen when we visit in the monsoon season. A village called Girmal is situated at a distance of about 8 km in the western direction either on the road from Ahwa to Singana or Navapura to Singana. Near Girmal the Gira river flows where the water falls from great height onto the deep stones that can be measured as the height of 75 feet. The fall creates a lot of sprinkling of water which produces a foggy atmosphere. At that time the atmosphere becomes very exciting. It really wins the hearts of the visitors.

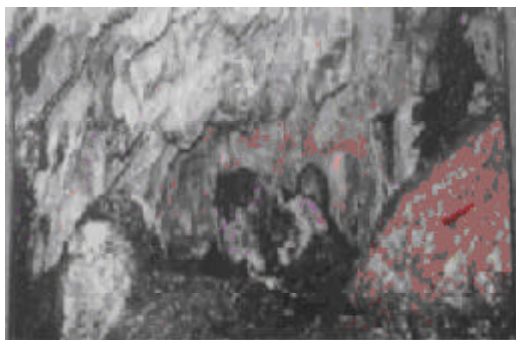

(The Den of Pandva)

The village Pandva is situated on Ahwa -Chinchli road at distance of 27 km in the southern part of Atal hill located near Salher. At the foot of hill the village Pandva is located. At a height of 3 km from the village this den is located which has its own historical significance. There are five parts in the den therefore it is believed that the village is named Pandva. The den is about 20 meters long & 7 feet in height. There are five pillars in this den due to which the den could be divided into five parts. This den is in dilapidated condition as researchers had tried to dig out this den and have left it into a broken condition. These dens can be visited during daytime.

(Den of Mayadevi)

On the bank of the river Purna in southern direction there is a small village called Kakarda near Bhenskatri, where there is a delightful place called Mayadevi. It is an important religious centre. In monsoon, river Purna passes from a natural canal. It is pleasant sight to see. At the first sight one thinks it goes into the canal but as one looks downwards one can see it taking a 'U' turn. This place is on the way from Vyara to Ahwa.

(God of Narda)

This is a place of religious importance. Tribals consider the God Narda as their helper/well wisher in their happy/bad time. They take vows in the name of this God. After recovery from their sickness or having a blessed family life, people visit this place on Saturdays to Sundays to relive the vow. A simple orally performed ritual relives these vows.

(Saputara)

Saputara is situated right in the heart of The Dangs district and about 45 km from Ahwa. After transfer of Mount Abu to Rajasthan State, the State Government thought of developing Saputara as the first full-fledged hill station. There is a picturesque hill resort at an altitude of 875 metres on the second highest plateau of the Sahyadri range. The place is popularly known as Girinagar and the climate is cool, brisk, clean and bracing round the year. On account of its location on a high elevation, dense forest and transport communications, it satisfies all requirements of a hill resort. Overlooking the lush green valley and surrounded by several hills, Saputara provides some fine observation points to see the sunrise and sunset. There is also an echo point. A beautiful lake provides an opportunity for boating. Museum, tribal hero stone, Nageshwar Mahadev temple, steps garden, rose garden and botanical garden are other attractive places for the tourists. Well planned Government bungalows, cottages, dormitories and a good canteen have been provided here. The hill station attracts many tourists every year. Tourism Corporation of the State has considered this place for eligible growth center for tourist.

(x) Major characteristics of the district, contribution of the district in the form of any historical figure associated with the district

The Dangs district is a one-taluka district. Population of the district mainly comprise of Bhils, Kunbis, Varlis, Marchis, Gamits etc. The Dangs like Kachchh has a distinguished character among all the twenty-five districts of Gujarat. The Dangs is unique and isolated in many ways. It is the only district in whole of the country where four of its kings and ten of its headman still receive Privy-Purses.

Tribals live in The Dangs district, located in the hills of Sahyadri. Bhil, Kunbi and Varli are the main castes among the tribals of The Dangs. The main occupation of the people of The Dangs is agriculture. They speak a typical language which is a combination of Gujarati and Marathi.

The houses in The Dangs are made of wood and bamboo. The strips of bamboo are woven in cross-shape and the mixture of dung and clay is daubed on

it to make the wall. Every family is equipped with the fish-catching instruments.

The marriage customs and rituals of The Dangs are strange and unique. The parents of a bridegroom go to the parents of the bride and demand her hand for marriage. A jaggery packet is given to the parents of the girl, if both parties agree to the marriage proposal. The very exchange is called *bol*. The whole ritual is known as *bol-pen* and the marriage is called *moti-pen* or *big pen*.

The people of The Dangs believe in number of Gods and deities as well as ghosts and other superstitious inhibitions. They worship tiger, cobra and the Sun as Gods.

Majority population depends on forest produce for their livelihood in absence of development of agriculture, animal husbandry or any other economic activities. Majority population of district speaks Dangi language/dialects, which is primitive and has no script. Whatever literature the Dangi language has is oral. The Dangi people take three meals a day, in the early morning, afternoon and at night, as they are engaged in hard manual labour. Nagli, maize, jowar and rice are the food grains mainly consumed by them. Rice of coarse variety is eaten some times and on auspicious occasions. The special dish consists of rice, dal, vegetable, fish and meat.

All tribes of The Dangs dress themselves alike and it is difficult to mark any difference in their dressing. Native Dangi men are used to wear small loincloth. While other wear dhoti or Pajamas. They also wear a half-sleeved tunic called *bandy* resembling a waistcoat over a shirt. Now-a-days, loincloth is replaced by Dhoti and Kurta. The traditional dress of Dangi women consist of a *Sari* made from 5-6 yards of cheap cotton cloth worn with a *Kachhota* with the front pleats tucked behind. The *choli* is a button less blouse, the lower corners of which are tied in a knot above the waist in front. But now buttoned *choli* or blouse has become very common. Dangi women are very fond of ornaments like nose-rings, bangles, ear-clips, necklace etc. made in typical tribal designs. Among main festivals and fairs of The Dangs, the fair, which deserves specific mention is The Dangs Darbar fair held at Ahwa.

There are many schools and a college in The Dangs district. Though the books are in Gujarati, the teachers have to use the Dangi language as a medium of teaching.

A fair is held on the eve of the Holi. The people from whole district, merchants and tourists from outside participate in The Dangs Darbar fair. Merchants from neighbouring district of Surat, Valsad and Nasik district of Maharashtra put up stalls to sell utensils, toys, cutlery, readymade garments, brass and copper vessels and silver ornaments which provide an opportunity for shopping to Dangis. The folk-dances are performed which are very common among the tribals.

Chhotubhai Nayak played a very important role in The Dangs district and welfare of tribal people of the district. Very soon after the Independence Shri Chhotubhai Nayak came to Ahwa in 1948 without any familiarity of Dangi people. He awakened the tribal people against various social evils like poverty, illiteracy, blind faith etc. At that time many amenities, which are considered, as a minimum needs were not available. Shri Chhotubhai settled in The Dangs district and campaigned for creating awareness among the people. Shri Chhotubhai Nayak established an institution namely The Dang Swarajya Ashram at Ahwa, which is famous in whole Gujarat.

The Dang Swarajya Ashram initiated the basic work of education. This Ashram gained popularity among the people in a very short time and became the most important institution in the field of education and welfare activities.

He had taken vital task of opening schools in many villages of The Dangs and he also implemented Gandhiji's thought of Spinning Wheel. He had given fight for the supplement of the people of The Dangs. He had taken part in local board election for the development of The Dangs and in the interest of The Dangs. Shri Chhotubhai Nayak became the President of local Board and many development works were executed under his leadership. He had done works of basic needs of people, viz. drinking water well, road construction. He also undertook the work of reforming, leveling and surfacing of land. The works undertaken by him are continuing today.

(xi) Scope of Village Directory & Town Directory :

As mentioned earlier, the District Census Handbook is brought out in two parts-Part A and Part B. Part A covers the non-census data of village directory and town directory whereas part B covers the primary census abstract data of 2001 Census. The scope of village directory and town directory is discussed below.



Scope of Village Directory :

For the census work, the villages in the district have been arranged taluka wise and within the taluka they are shown location code wise. Each village is assigned a location code number for the purpose of identification. In 2001 Census, all the villages have been given unique 8-digit code number, which will remain constant across the census, and shall make it easy to do comparative study. Eight digit code's last two digits are especially provided to take into account exigencies arising due to jurisdictional changes of villages by partition, amalgamation etc. This time it has been kept '00'. Prior to the village directory information, a map and alphabetical list of villages for each taluka is given in Part A. Village directory contains the non-census data of each village. It gives the village wise basic information relating to infrastructure and amenities available in the sphere of education, medical, drinking water, power supply, post and telegraph, communications, approach road to village and distribution of land use area. In addition, it contains information about total area of each village, total population and number of households and the nearest town and its distance from the village. The information on number of households and total population has been included with a view to examine the co-relation of amenities with the number of households and population they serve. If an amenity is not in existence in the referent village, the distance in broad ranges from the nearest place along with name, where the amenity is available is given. The broad range are (-5 kms), (5-10 kms.) and (10+ kms.). Some additional information has been added viz.(1) Number of Banks, (2) Credit Societies, (3) recreational and cultural facilities, (4) Receipt of Newspaper / Magazine, (5) Income & Expenditure of the village and (6) Name of the three most important commodities imported, manufactured/ produced &

exported. One information has been deleted this time, i.e., Market & Hat facility.

The village directory also carries the following appendices.

- Appendix-I It gives the taluka wise abstract of educational, medical and other amenities available in the villages of the district.
- Appendix-I-A Indicates number of villages Taluka wise having one or more primary schools.
- Appendix-I-B Indicates number of villages Taluka wise having primary, middle and secondary schools.
- Appendix-I-C Shows number of villages Taluka wise with different sources of drinking water facilities.
- Appendix-II Indicates the list of villages with 5,000 and above population which do not have one or more important amenities.
- Appendix-II-A Indicates list of Census Towns which do not have one or more amenities.
- Appendix-III It gives the land utilization data in respect of Census Towns/non-municipal Towns.
- Appendix-IV Taluka wise list of inhabited villages where no amenity other than drinking water facility is available.

Scope of Town Directory :

Town Directory covers the non-census data for each town. It presents important and useful information like civic and other amenities available in all the towns of the district. The information in town directory is covered in following seven statements, viz. statements I to VII.

- Statement-I Town wise class, name, civic administrative status of the town, its area, growth rates, density and sex ratio.
- Statement-II Physical aspects of each town.
- Statement-III Income and expenditure of each town.
- Statement-IV Civic and other amenities in respect of each town.
- Statement-V Availability of medical, educational, recreational and cultural facilities in each town.
- Statement-VI Trade, commerce, industry and banking activities in each town.
- Statement-VII Civic and other amenities in slum areas of each town.

In all the Statement except VII the towns are arranged in the alphabetical order within the district. The details of these statements are given in the analytical portion of the town directory. In addition to the above statements, an appendix showing the towns with their outgrowths with population , is also given after the town directory statements.

(a) NOTE EXPLAINING THE ABBREVIATIONS USED IN THE VILLAGE DIRECTORY

The “Village Directory” is one of the traditional compilations of the Census. It gives the list of villages, their location numbers, their area, population, number of households, amenities such as educational, medical, drinking water, post and telegraph, commercial and co-operative banks, agricultural non-agricultural and other credit societies, recreational and cultural facilities, communication, approach to village, nearest town with a distance, power supply availability of newspaper and magazines, most important commodity manufactured and land use of each village.

Village is a statutory recognized unit having a definite boundary and separate land records. In case, a complete village is treated as an outgrowth of urban agglomeration, data on amenities for that village, have not been given in the Village Directory but shown along with the urban component. The villages which are consider as a Census Town, the amenities data are shown in the Town Directory. For those villages which have partly merged in an outgrowth of U.A., the amenities data are shown in the Village Directory for that particular village.

The ‘un-inhabited’ villages (villages with no population) have been indicated as such after furnishing details in columns 1 to 3 i.e., Serial number, Name of village & location code number and area of the village against column no. 4 to 18. The land use data for such villages are shown in col. 19 to 23.

The Village Directory format has 23 columns and the details given under each column are for the village are as follows:-

Columns 1 : Serial Number

Self explanatory. All the villages within the Taluka/ C.D. Block are presented serially in the ascending order of their location code number.

Columns 2 : Name and Location Code Number of Village.

The name and location code number of the village are shown against these columns. This also includes the forest and uninhabited villages.

Column 3 : Area of the Village

The area of the villages in hectares are given. Wherever the area figures was not furnished by the concerned department the column is left blank.

Column 4 : Total Population

The total population of the village as per 2001 Census is given against this column.

Column 5 : Number of Households

The number of households as per 2001 Census is given in this column.

Amenities :

In column 6 to 23, availability in respect of different amenities such as education, medical, drinking water, post, telegraph, banks, credit societies, communication, power, approach road etc. in each village has been depicted with appropriate codes against the column concerned. Wherever the amenities are not available in the village, a dash (-) is shown in the column and next to it in brackets the distance in broad ranges viz.< 5 kms., 5-10 kms. and 10+ kms of the nearest place where the facility is available is given. Column wise details are given below :

Column 6 : Educational

Classes upto class VII included in Primary School. This will include nursery school, kindergarten school. Pre-basic school, pre-primary school, junior basic school upto class VII. Classes from VIII to X included in Higher secondary school. Classes XI and XII are included in senior secondary school. 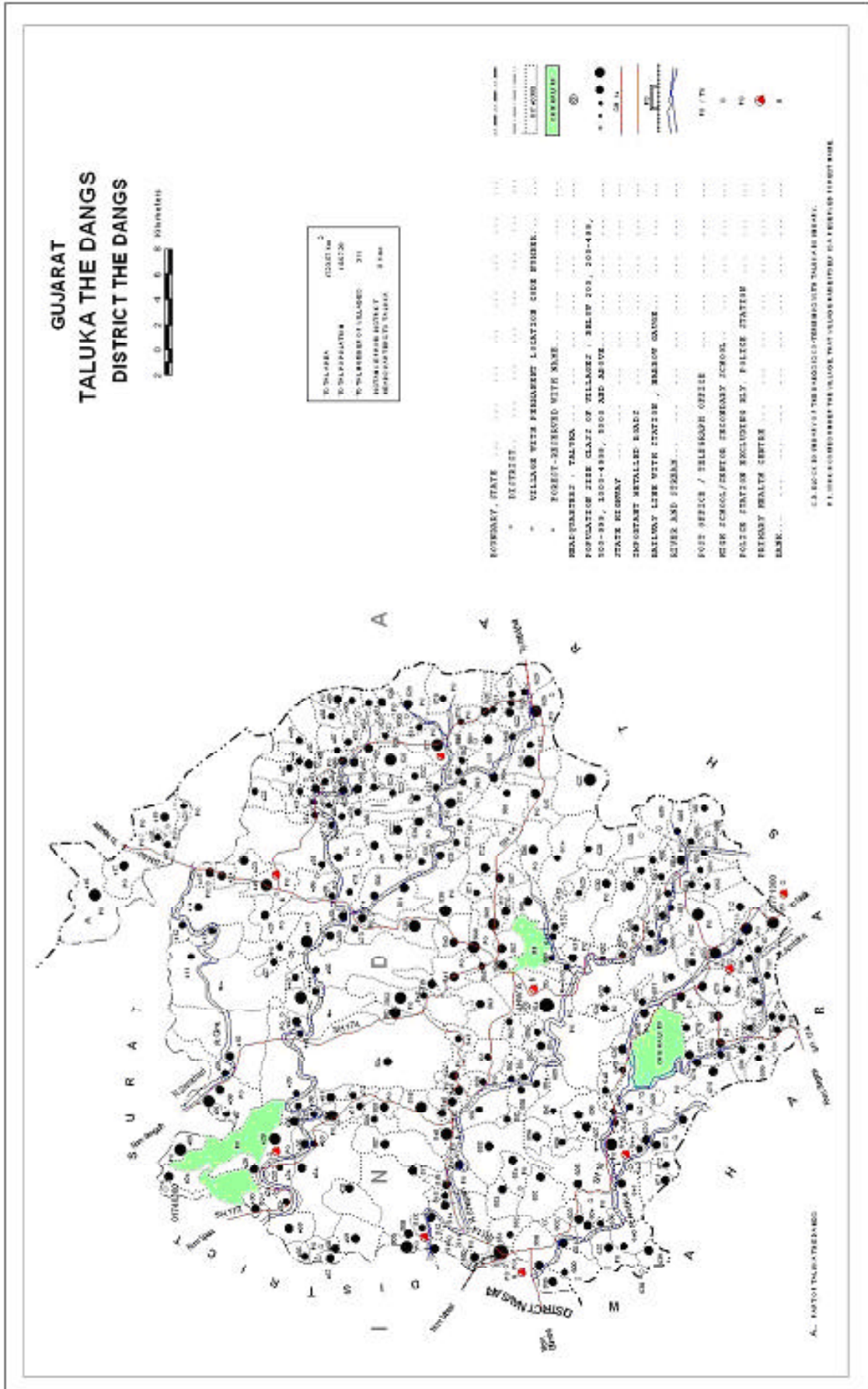

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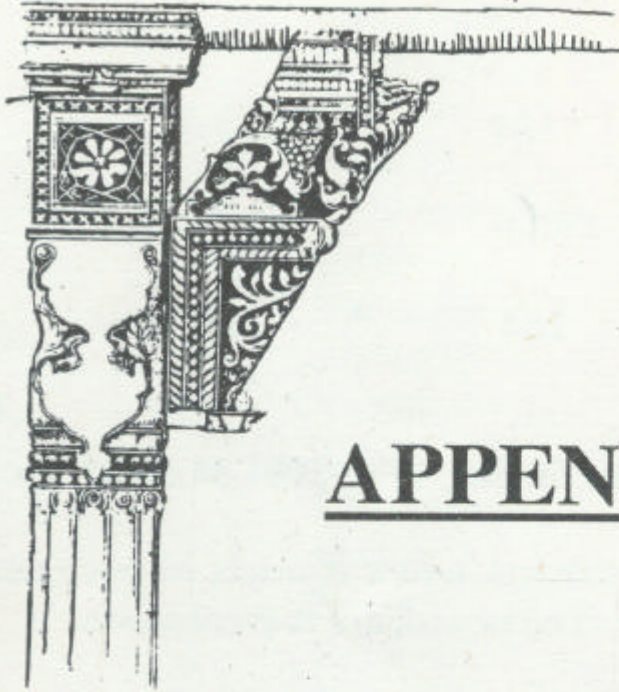

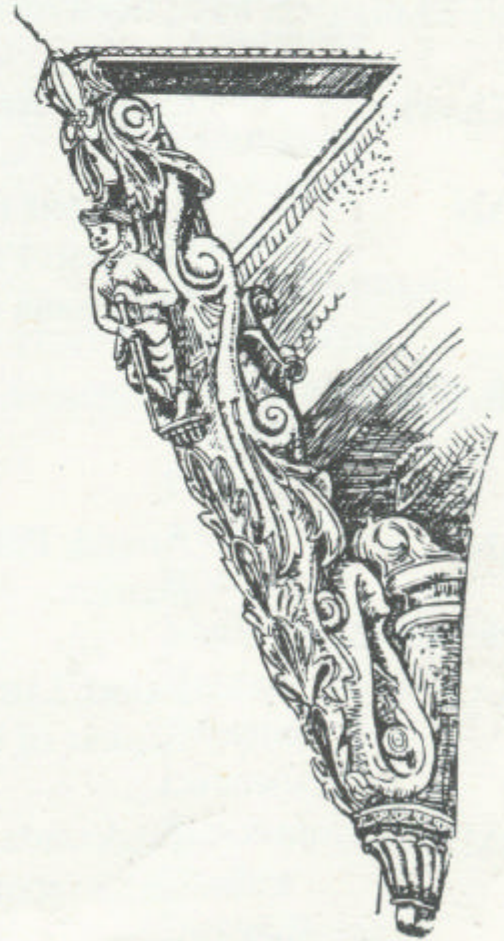

PRIMARY CENSUS ABSTRACT

Primary Census Abstract

Brief note on Primary Census Abstract :

The first census of the third millennium and twenty first century the Census of India, 2001 was the 14th continuous and uninterrupted Indian census since 1872. Thus, 2001 Census will provide data on population and its characteristics marking transition from one century and millennium to another.

The gigantic operation of Population Enumeration (considered by many to be the single largest and complex peace time administrative exercise in the world) was made possible due to the door to door universal canvassing of the Household Schedule by about 2 million enumerators and supervisors covering 593 districts, 5,463 sub-district, 5,161 towns and 638,588 villages. The comprehensive Household Schedule which replaced the individual slip had three parts and two sides A and B. Part I contained the Location Particulars; Part II related to the Individual Particulars and Part III contained questions for Household engaged in cultivation/Plantation. The part II of the Household Schedule had 39 columns and 23 questions all of which were universally canvassed and no sampling was resorted to during enumeration.

Data Processing

A quantum leap was made in the technology front while processing the Census 2001 data both for Houselisting and Population Enumeration. The Census schedules for both the phases were scanned through high speed scanners in fifteen data centers across the country and hand-written data from the schedules were converted into digitized form through Intelligent Character Reading (ICR) software for creation of ASCII records for further processing. The designing and formatting of the Household Schedule had to be done very carefully using specialized software so as to ensure uniformity, which was an essential pre-requisite for scanning. The selection of appropriate state-of-art technology in data processing has made it possible to produce all the Houselisting as well as Population Enumeration tables on full count basis for the first time in the history of Census. For Census 2001, about 202 million schedules consisting

of about 1,028 million records were scanned and processed within a span of only 10 months starting October, 2002.

Task Force on Quality Assurance

After the data is processed, it is expedient on the part of the data producing agency to satisfy itself about its quality before putting the same in public domain. This has to be done mainly through the process of internal consistency, comparison with similar data in the past and also through validation with like-wise data if available, from external sources. Quite often the local knowledge and perception has to be brought into play to understand both the existing and the new emerging trends of population distribution and characteristics. The other very important aspect of the data quality is to ensure complete coverage of all geographical areas especially for the population enumeration phase where the data is disseminated right up to the village level in the rural areas and the ward level in the urban areas. Thus ensuring the complete coverage and correct geographical linkage of each enumeration block was one of the major planks of the quality control, specially for small area population statistics.

A very comprehensive check and edit mechanism was put in place to objectively examine the preliminary Census 2001 Population Enumeration results and finally clear them for use. The responsibility of the final clearance of data was with the Task Force on Quality Assurance (TFQA), headed by the Registrar General and Census Commissioner, India. The other members of the TFQA were the Heads and senior officers of the Census Division, Data

Processing Division, Map Division, Demography Division and Social Studies Division. The Directors of Census Operations were co-opted as members whenever the TFQA discussed the data for their States/Union territories. The Directors and their senior officers were required to make detailed presentations of data for their own state both in respect to the quality and the coverage and only after the full possible cleared.

There has been a major departure in Census 2001 from the past in respect of the procedure followed for finalization of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes population. In the earlier censuses, the total Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes populations were finalized at the time of the manual compilation of the Primary Census Abstracts (PCA) at the Regional Tabulation Offices which were specially set up for this purpose. The individual Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes population for each state was finalized much later based on manual coding done by the coders. In 2001 Census, each individual Scheduled Caste and the Scheduled Tribe have been coded directly on the computers by the Data Entry Operators through a process known as Computer Assisted Coding (CAC) and taken up along with the processing of PCA data. The CAC process involves pulling down, from the relevant dictionary of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, on the computer screen and coding from the dictionary by referring to the image of the specific individual entry in the Household Schedule appearing on the screen. The CAC of the response on Religion wherever required, was also undertaken along with the processing of PCA. This is because the Scheduled Castes status had to be determined in relation to the religion of the individual. Two Special Task Forces, one on Religion and the other on Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes were constituted for scrutiny and appropriate classification of these responses.

The main task of the Special Task Force on Religion was to appropriately merge or group the new responses encountered and code it into the appropriate religious community based on available literature and local knowledge. The Special Task Force on Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes examined the different Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes entries encountered and classified these into appropriate category of the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes principally based on the Presidential Notification and the available literature. Thus a very systematic and scientific mechanism was operationalised to firm up the individual religion and the individual Scheduled Castes/Tribes returns. The Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes population in 2001 Census, is thus being finalized by aggregating the population data for individual Scheduled

Castes and the Scheduled Tribes at appropriate geographical levels.

The entire work relating to the data validation and scrutiny was completed by all the States/Union Territories under the overall supervision and monitoring of the Census Division of the Office of the Registrar General, India with active cooperation and support of the Social Studies Division, Data Processing Division, Data Dissemination Division and Map Division.

Primary Census Abstract

The Primary Census Abstract which is yet another important publication of 2001 Census gives basic information on Area, Total Household, Total population, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes population, Population in the age group 0-6, Literates, Main workers and Marginal workers classified by the four broad industrial categories, namely (i) Cultivators, (ii) Agricultural labourers (iii) Household Industry Workers and (iv) Other workers and also Non-workers. The characteristics of the Total population includes Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Institutional and Houseless population and are presented by sex and rural-urban residence. This data is presented at different levels, namely India, State/Union Territories, Districts and Cities, Urban Agglomerations (Population 100,000 and above) in three different tables. In addition, the Appendix of said publication provides Houseless and Institutional Households and their population by residence and sex for 2001 for India, State and Union territory.

Apart from the India and State/Union Territory volumes for Primary Census Abstract, the District Census Handbook contains District Primary Census Abstract, Appendix to District Primary Census Abstract, Primary Census Abstract for Scheduled Castes, Primary Census Abstract for Scheduled Tribes, Village Primary Census Abstract and Urban Primary Census Abstract of the concerned district in the state.

It was for the first time at the 1981 Census that the Primary Census Abstract (PCA) was brought out for the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes separately on the pattern of General Primary Census Abstract. This practice was continued in 1991 also. In the 1961 and 1971 Censuses, such data were made

available in Table C-VIII-Social and Cultural table and to some extent in the series 'Special Tables for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes'.

The format of Primary Census Abstract has been restructured slightly in the 2001 Census as compared to that of 1991 Census. The nine-fold industrial classification of main workers given in the Primary Census Abstract of 1991 Census has been discontinued and its place, four-fold industrial classification of both 'main workers' and 'marginal workers' are included. In 1981 census only main workers were presented in to four categories. One of the novel features of the primary census abstract of 1991 census was the presentation of data of the population of age group 0-6 is continued in 2001 Census also. This will help the data users in better analysis and understanding of this literacy data.

Level of presentation in District Census Handbooks:

The Primary Census Abstract data in different PCAs are presented at different levels. The level of presentation of Primary Census Abstracts are as under:

The PCA Data for villages was presented C.D. Block wise for the first time in 1991 Census. This practice is continued in 2001 Census also. The data for each C.D. Block is presented both for rural and urban areas separately. All the villages within the C.D. Block constitute the rural portion and the Census Towns and Outgrowths are shown under the urban portion of the C.D. Block. In case a C.D. Block is spread over two or more districts, than portion which falls within the district is presented, the data pertaining to remaining portion of the C.D. Block is presented in the concerned District Census Handbook. The data in the Urban Primary Census Abstract for each town as well as for town with outgrowths in the district are presented. The data for all the wards and the outgrowths of the town(s) are also presented separately below the concerned town(s).

The District Primary Census Abstract is presented in 59 columns. The Primary Census Abstract for Scheduled Castes and Primary Census Abstract for Scheduled Tribes are presented in 52 columns. The Village Primary Census Abstract and Urban Primary Census Abstract are presented in 58 columns.

The concepts and definitions used in the column heading are explained under the sub heading 'Census Concepts' in the Analytical Note. The term 'Total Population' includes the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes, the Institutional and the Houseless populations. The explanation regarding area figures presented at various level in the Primary Census Abstracts are as follows:

Area Figures

The area figures supplied by local revenue authorities of the district in respect of tehsils, Police Stations and by the local bodies in respect of towns are given in square kilometers. The area figures of the villages supplied by the Tahsildars in acres have been converted and shown in hectares. The area figures of the C.D. Block is the total of the village areas coming under each C.D. Block. The area figures for the district are the same as adopted by the Surveyor General of India to maintain uniformity at the national level. The total area figures of all the tahsils/ C.D. Blocks within the district may not tally with area figures of the district because former represents land use area only. Similarly, the total of all the villages may not tally with the entire rural of Police Station/Tahsil. The difference may be due to the fact that while the area covered by hills, forests and rivers etc, have been accounted in the Tahsils and P.S. level the same may not be covered under the area of the villages. Apart from this it may also differ due to varying methods of computation adopted at different levels.

An appendix to District Primary Census Abstract has also been furnished showing urban enumeration block-wise particulars on Total Population, the Scheduled Castes Population and the Scheduled Tribes Population for each town.

ANNEXURE – II

FERTILITY AND MORTALITY-1991 CENSUS

Fertility Level:

Population is a dynamic variable and keeps on changing. Increase due to birth and decrease due to death affect the population size of an area. Thus the birth and death are the two most important vital events. Natural increase is the excess of population by births over decrease of population by deaths at a given point of time. The births have direct correlation with the fertility.

The data on fertility levels and trends as revealed by the fertility indices of the 1991 Census like Crude Birth Rate (CBR), Age Specific Fertility Rate (ASFR) and Total Fertility Rate (TFR) are presented and analyzed below. The Definitions and concepts of fertility indices frequently used have already been explained in Analytical Note.

Death Rate:

Death process in demographical terminology is called as mortality. The rate at which death events occur reveal about the standard of living and state of health. Statistical data on causes of death help us in controlling the spread of diseases and suggests new curative methods to medical authorities.

Child Mortality:

Information about questions on children ever born and children surviving canvassed for all ever married women was tabulated by age of the mother. From this, estimate of child mortality have been worked out by using Brass technique.

The Annexure III shows various fertility indicators of all the districts and the State as per 1991 Census. It can be seen that Crude Birth Rate of The Dangs district was 39.2 which was the highest among all the districts as per 1991 Census. As per 1991 Census data the Total Fertility Rate (TFR) of The Dangs was 5.0, Total Marital Fertility Rate (TMFR) was 6.5, General Fertility Rate (GFR) was 166 and General Marital Fertility Rate (GMFR) was 201. The fertility indicators like CBR, TFR, TMFR, GFR and GMFR were higher in The Dangs district in comparison to fertility indicators of the State as a whole. It indicates that as per

the various indicators of fertility rates the fertility in The Dangs district was higher than almost all the other districts of the State.

Mean age at marriage means age (in completed years) at which the woman was married. In case a woman was married more than once the age at which she was married first was recorded. The mean age at marriage in The Dangs district in 1991 Census was 19.2 and for Gujarat State it was 19.0. Thus the mean age at marriage in The Dangs district was slightly higher as compared to mean age at marriage in the State.

Migration

Migration is a factor in changing the size and structure of the population. The migration process affects the areas to which migrants have moved and areas which they have left. Migration is a form of geographical mobility between one geographical unit to another, involving a change of residence from the

place of origin/birth to the place of destination or place of new settlement from the last residence. A person is considered as a migrant by place of birth if the place in which he is enumerated during the Census is other than the place of birth. Similarly a person is considered as a migrant by place of last residence if the place in which he is enumerated during the Census is other than his place of immediate last residence.

Internal and International Migration

The migration movements are of four types –

1. Migration within the district of enumeration (intra-district migration)
2. Migration from one district to another but within the State

3. Migration from one state to another state of the country (inter-state migration) and
4. Migration from one country to another country.

The first three together constitute internal migration while the last type of movement is called international migration.

Migration by place of birth:

The Dangs district and the State at 1991 and 2001 Censuses are as following.

As per 1991 census there were 13,572,140 migrants in Gujarat whose place of birth was different than the place of enumeration, this number increased to 18,810,592 in 2001 census. Out of such migrants in 1991 census, 58.0 per cent were born

elsewhere in the district of enumeration, 30.1 per cent were born in other districts of the state, 11.2 per cent were born in other states of India and 0.7 per cent were born in other countries. There were 4,170 migrants in 1991 who were classified as

“Unclassified” while no migrant was reported under this category in 2001. As per 2001 census 56.9 per cent were born elsewhere in the district of enumeration, 29.2 per cent were born in other districts of the state, 13.4 per cent were born in other states of India and 0.4 per cent were born in other countries.

It can be seen that as per 1991 census in The Dangs district there were 41,418 migrants whose place of birth was different than the place of enumeration, this number increased to 56,212 in 2001 census. Out of such migrants in 1991 census, 64.4

per cent were born elsewhere in the district of enumeration, 21.2 per cent were born in other districts of the state, 14.4 per cent were born in other states of India and only 20 migrants were born in other countries. There were only 10 migrants in 1991 who were classified as “Unclassified” while no migrant was reported under this category in 2001. As per 2001 census in The Dangs district, 70.8 per cent were born elsewhere in the district of enumeration, 16.8 per cent were born in other districts of the state, 12.3 per cent were born in other states of India and only 28 were born in other countries.

The above statements show migration in Gujarat and in The Dangs district from other states as per 1991 and 2001 censuses. It can be seen that as per 1991 census there were 1,520,421 persons in the state who were born in other states of India, this figure rose to 2,520,676 in 2001 census. In 1991 out of such persons 34.4 per cent were born in

Maharashtra while in 2001 only 29.2 per cent were born in Maharashtra. In 1991, as much as 22.2 per cent of inter state migrants were born in Rajasthan and 16.6 per cent in Uttar Pradesh whereas in 2001 the proportion born in Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh was 18.7 and 20.6 per cent respectively. As per 1991 census out of total inter state migrants 6.1 per

cent were born in Madhya Pradesh, the proportion of the same, in 2001 census, was almost equal at 6.3 per cent. The remaining 20.7 per cent were born in other states of India in 1991 census while in 2001 census 25.2 per cent were born in other states of India.

As regards The Dangs district it can be seen that there were 5,943 migrants in this category in 1991 which increased to 6,940 in 2001. The state-wise distribution reveals that as per 1991 census 87.5 per cent of migrants and as per 2001 census 84.2 per cent of migrants were born in Maharashtra. In 1991 the proportion of migrants born in the states of

Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh was 2.0 per cent and 2.5 per cent respectively while the same for 2001 census stood at 3.0 per cent and 5.0 per cent respectively. The proportion of migrants born in other states was 7.2 per cent in 1991 which decreased to 5.8 per cent in 2001 census.

There were 13,664,201 migrants by place of last residence in Gujarat according to 1991 census and as per 2001 census there were 19,221,602 migrants in the state in this category. The proportion of male and female migrants whose place of last residence was elsewhere within the district of enumeration was 45.4 per cent and 65.1 per cent respectively in 1991 and the respective proportion was 52.4 per cent and 69.8 per cent in 2001 census in the case of Gujarat state. The reason for higher proportion of female migration is marriage. As per 1991 census, out of total migrants, 59.1 per cent of migrants were residing elsewhere in the district of enumeration, 29.6 per cent were those whose last residence was in other districts of the state while last residence of 10.7 per cent migrants was in other states of India and only 0.6 per cent were such whose last residence was in other countries. There were 3,810 migrants in the category titled "Unclassified".

In Gujarat as per 2001 census, 63.7 per cent migrants were residing elsewhere in the district of enumeration, 24.6 per cent were such whose last residence was in other districts of the state while last residence of 11.4 per cent migrants was in other states of India and only 0.3 per cent were such whose last residence was in other countries. There were no migrants in the category titled "Unclassified".

There were a total of 41,698 migrants by place of last residence in The Dangs district as per 1991 census. Out of total migrants, 67.5 per cent of migrants were such whose last residence was in the district of enumeration, 19.5 per cent were such whose last residence was in other districts of the state while last residence of 12.9 per cent migrants was in other states of India and only 0.1 per cent were such whose last residence was in other countries. There were no migrants in the category titled "Unclassified".

In the district, as per 2001 census, there were 57,663 migrants by last residence. Out of total migrants, 78.8 per cent of migrants were residing such whose last residence was elsewhere in the district of enumeration, 13.2 per cent were such whose last residence was in other districts of the state while last residence of 8.0 per cent migrants was in other states of India and only 15 migrants' last residence was in other countries. It can be seen from the data given above that the main reason for the migration was "Work/employment". As much as 30.3 per cent of migrants moved due to work or employment as per 2001 census. As per 1991 census also, the highest proportion of 25.8 per cent of migration took place due to the same reason. In 2001, this was followed

by 26.5 per cent of migration which was due to the reason of "Moved with household" and also in 1991 it was followed by 24.0 per cent of migration due to the same reason which was then titled as "Family Moved". In 2001, the proportion of migration due to marriage was 17 per cent while the same was comparatively higher at 22.5 per cent in 1991 census.

ANNEXURE – V

BRIEF ACCOUNT OF MAIN RELIGIONS IN THE DISTRICT AS PER 1991 AND 2001 CENSUSES

Religion is the basic cultural characteristics of the population. In secular country like India several religions have thrived and every decennial Census provides an interesting picture of the religious persuasions of the people. The data on religion yielded by the Census are of immense use for the Anthropologists, Sociologists, Demographers, Administrators, Planners and also for laymen.

The six main religions i) Hindu, ii) Muslim, iii) Christian, iv) Sikh, v) Buddhist, and vi) Jain were recorded. In respect of 'Others', the actual religion returned was recorded. If a person said that he has no religion, it was recorded accordingly and if any person refused to state his religion it was recorded as 'religion not stated'.

The statement above gives the details of distribution of population for Gujarat state and The Dangs district by six major religions as per 2001 census. The 2001 census data reveals that the proportion of Hindus was 89.1 per cent in the state of Gujarat against 88.6 per cent recorded in The Dangs. In comparison to 1991 data a decline of 0.4 per cent is registered in proportion of Hindus at state level while in the district the proportion of Hindus has decreased by 4.3 per cent.

The proportion of Muslims has almost remained same as compared to 1991. The proportion of Muslims was 8.7 per cent at state level and 1.5 per cent at

district level in 1991 census whereas in 2001 census at state level this proportion was 9.1 per cent and in district it was 1.5 per cent. The proportion of Christians in the district has increased in 2001 as compared to 1991. As per 1991 Census proportion of Christians was 0.4 per cent in total population of the state which in 2001 Census increased to 0.6 per cent. At district level the proportion of Christians was 5.4 per cent in 1991, which rose to 9.5 per cent in 2001, showing an increase of 4.1 per cent during the decade. The proportion of Jain, Sikh, Buddhists, and people following other religions and of people who did not state any religion was negligible in The Dangs in 1991 as well as in 2001 census.

The above statements show marital status by sex in the state as well as in the district. As per 2001 census the number of married persons was 24,222,087(47.8 per cent) in Gujarat and 86,157 (46.1 per cent) in The Dangs. A comparison of the same with 1991 data shows that in Gujarat the proportion of married persons was 46.2 per cent while in The Dangs the same was 46.3 per cent. As per 1991 census the proportion of never married persons was 49.7 per cent in Gujarat State and 51.1 per cent in

The Dangs district. As per 2001 census the same has come down to 47.6 per cent in Gujarat and 50.5 per cent in The Dangs. In comparison to 1991 in 2001 the proportion of married females has shown decrease of 1 per cent in the district while the same for males has increased by 0.7 per cent. The proportion of widows and divorced/separated has not shown any significant changes in 2001 as compared to 1991 census for the state as well as for the district.

As the statement shows there is no urban area in The Dangs as per 2001 census. It can be seen that proportion of never married persons was higher at 50.5 per cent in the district as compared to 47.6 per cent recorded in Gujarat state as per 2001 census. In 1991 in rural areas the proportion of never married persons was 49.2 per cent in Gujarat and

50.8 per cent in The Dangs. As per 2001 census the proportion of married persons was 47.4 per cent in rural Gujarat and 46.1 per cent in The Dangs, while as per 1991 census, in the rural areas of Gujarat, this proportion was at 46.4 per cent and 46.6 per cent in The Dangs.

ANNEXURE – VII

AGE, SEX AND EDUCATION IN THE DISTRICT AT THE 1991 AND 2001 CENSUSES

Literacy has occupied an important position in Indian Census in one form or the other from the very beginning. The definition of literates as adopted is “A person who can both read and write with understanding in any language is to be taken as literate”. A person who can merely read but can not write was not treated as literate. It is not necessary that a person who was literate should have received any formal education or should have passed any

minimum educational standard. All children below the age 7 are treated as illiterate. While processing the literacy data population of age group 0-6 is excluded.

The following statement gives the distribution of literates and illiterates by broad age groups and sex in the district as well as the State at the time of 1991 and 2001 Censuses:-

It can be seen from the statement that the highest proportion of 83.6 per cent literacy rate in Gujarat state is registered in age group of 7-14 years followed by 77.6 per cent in 15-29 years age group. The same trend can be observed in The Dangs district where the highest proportion of 84.2 per cent is registered in the age group of 7-14 years followed by 69.1 per cent in the age group of 15-29 years. The lowest proportion of 39.5 per cent in state and

12.6 per cent in The Dangs district is found in the age group of 60 + years. As per 2001 census the female literacy rate was lower than that of males in each and every age group in the state as well as in The Dangs District. A comparison with the 1991 data shows that literacy rate has increased for each and every age group in the state and also in the district except for the category titled "Age not stated".

The above statement shows number and percentage of literates in nine different education levels.

In the state, as per 2001 census, there were 286,886 (1 per cent) literates who have no formal education. This proportion was only 0.2 per cent in 1991. In The Dangs 1,047 (1.2 per cent) literates have no formal education while in 1991 only 180 (0.3 per cent) literates were in this category. As per 2001 census, 27.1 per cent literates have below primary level of education in the state, the same proportion was also recorded for primary level of education, while as per 1991 census 41.2 per cent literates had attained primary level of education. In The Dangs as per 2001 census 43 per cent have below primary level of education and 28.5 per cent have primary level of education, whereas in 1991 census these proportions stood at 12.1 per cent and 62.2 per cent respectively. In 1991 census higher secondary level of education was attained by 4.3 per

cent of literates in the state and by 2.3 per cent of literates in The Dangs district, while as per 2001 census, 8.1 per cent literates in the state and 3.8 per cent literates in The Dangs have attained higher secondary level of education. The proportion of literates having graduate and above level of education was 4.8 per cent and 1.6 per cent in 1991 census for the state and The Dangs respectively. The proportion of literates in this category increased to 6.3 per cent in the state and 2.5 per cent in The Dangs district in 2001. The proportion of literates having technical diploma or certificate not equal to degree has also increased in the state as well as in the district in 2001 as compared to 1991. The numbers and proportions of literates having non- technical diploma has decreased in 2001 as compared to 1991 in state as well as in The Dangs district.

The above data reveals that as per 1991 census, in Gujarat State 91.5 per cent persons have returned Gujarati as their mother tongue. At the second place, only 2.5 per cent persons have returned Hindi as their mother tongue. In Gujarat State 1.4 per cent had returned Marathi, 1.3 per cent had returned Urdu and 1.1 per cent had returned Kachchhi as their mother tongue as per 1991 census.

As per 2001 census in Gujarat State 84.4 per cent persons have returned Gujarati as their mother tongue. At the second place, only 4.1 per cent persons have returned Hindi as their mother tongue. In Gujarat State Marathi as well as Bhili/Bhilodi each was returned by 1.5 per cent population, 1.1 per cent had returned Urdu and 1.3 per cent had returned Kachchhi as their mother tongue. In the state, the proportion of other languages as mother tongue is not as much significant in both the censuses.

The mainly spoken mother tongue in the district is Dangi as 74.9 per cent of population had reported it as their mother tongue in 1991 whereas in 2001 the same is returned by 67.8 per cent of population. In 2001, next to Dangi is Konkani which is returned by 12.9 per cent, followed by Gujarati which is reported by 4.3 per cent of population. In 1991 next to Dangi was Gujarati as it was returned by 16.9 per cent of population. In 2001, Bhili /Bhilodi is reported as mother tongue by 4.0 per cent, Gamit/Gavit by 3.5 per cent, Marathi by 1.8 per cent and Hindi as well as Varli are reported as mother tongue by 1.0 per cent each of population. In 1991, Bhili /Bhilodi was reported by only 53 persons, Gamit/Gavit by 2.9 per cent, Marathi by 2.8 per cent and Hindi was reported by 0.9 per cent of population as their mother tongue. The proportion of other languages as mother tongue is not as much significant in the district in both the censuses.
