INTRODUCTORY.

Past and Present Censuses.—The Census of 1921 was the fifth enumeration of the population of the Ratlam State taken simultaneously with the rest of India and the third in which exactly the same information was collected as in British India and the same tables were prepared for the State. This Census was taken on the night of the 18th March 1921 except in the hilly tract of Bajna Tahsil and for the travellers in running trains.

2. *Preliminary arrangements.*—The General Village Register, which is the ground work for the Census was prepared as soon as intimation was received that a decennial Census should be taken. The Darbar thereafter appointed Pandit Tribhuvannath Zutshi, Home Member of the State Council, as the State Census Officer and authorised him to correspond direct with the Provincial Superintendent of Census. In June 1920 along with two others he joined the class the Provincial Superintendent opened at Sehore and received training in house numbering, preparation of house lists and filling up of the different columns of the Schedule. On return to Ratlam he opened, at convenient centres, schools for the training of Charge Superintendents, Supervisors and Enumerators and imparted theoretical and practical instructions. For the training of the railway staff, who were charged with Census duties, a similar class was opened at the Ratlam Railway Station. The Census Code, the Manuals of instructions for Charge Superintendents and Supervisors and instructions on the Enumeration book covers in English and Hindi supplied by the Provincial Superintendent of Census proved most useful. These were read and explained and all doubtful points settled. The Enumerators were made to number a few houses, prepare the Block List and fill up entries for persons in a few houses. Any difficulty found was removed on the spot. Their knowledge of the duties they had to perform was tested from time to time with a view to maintaining their efficiency to the last. Supplementary instructions, issued from the Central India Census Office, were distributed stylographed in Vernacular, to the Charge Superintendents for their information and distribution to the staff working under them. The next step taken was the division of the State into Charges. The State was divided for Census purposes into four Charges. On this occasion the Census of the entire railway lands and trains passing through the State was, under the orders of the Government of India, entrusted to the State. The Ratlam Station, which has extensive premises, was constituted a fifth Charge under the Executive Engineer, Morwani Station under the Traffic Inspector, Ratlam and Nowgawan and Namli Stations under the direct supervision of the State Census Officer. These Charges were sub-divided into 62 Circles which were again sub-divided into 781 Blocks. The average number of houses per Charge, Circle and Block was respectively 3,638, 342 and 30. Maps for all Charges, Circles and Blocks were prepared and supplied to all concerned. The Charge Superintendents and most Supervisors were State Officials from the Revenue, Municipal, Police and Educational Departments. A few were pleaders and respectable traders, while in the case of the railway the Census staff from the Charge Superintendent down to the Enumerators were all railway officials. The Enumerators in the State were Patwaris, School Masters, Policemen, Municipal and State Clerks, Local Shop-keepers, Senior schoolboys and others of the literate public. Officials received travelling expenses while non-officials gave their services gratuitously.

3. *House Numbering.*—The numbering of houses was taken in hand about the end of September. At first *kachcha* numbers were written up with dry chalk which, after careful check, were made *pakka*, red ochre mixed with oil being used everywhere. By 30th November this process was completed and the House List was finished and extracts (Block Lists) had been given to every Enumerator.

4. *Preliminary Enumeration.*—Every Enumerator was in possession of his Block List, Map and Enumeration Book by 1st January 1921 and Supervisors of their Manuals of instructions, all Enumeration forms, maps of the Circle and House Lists. The interval between this date and the 15th January, fixed for beginning of the Preliminary Enumeration was utilised in studying the instructions, particularly the entries to be made in columns 4, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 of the schedule and in making themselves thoroughly acquainted with their duties. Special instructions were issued by the Provincial Superintendent to local Missionaries to make over to each of their converts a ticket giving the correct name of their Sect or Christian denomination. The Preliminary Enumeration was commenced on the 15th February in rural areas and on 1st March in the Ratlam City and completed in the first week of March. The State Summary of the Preliminary Enumeration was then submitted to the Provincial Superintendent of Census on 11th March 1921. The original entries were made on loose schedules. After careful check by the Supervisors they were copied into the Enumeration Book forms.

5. *Inspection.*—Inspecting Officers and Officials who had previous experience of Census work were also invited to check house numbering and the preliminary entries made by the Enumerators.

6. *Warning.*—After the Preliminary Enumeration was finished the people in the City were warned by proclamation and beat of drum and in villages through the Patwaris and headmen that all should remain in their houses after 5 P.M. on the 18th March and not come out and loiter about until the Enumerator had visited them and had checked the entries of the Preliminary Enumeration.

7. *Non-cooperation.*—There was no difficulty experienced during the operation for want of co-operation in the enlistment of Census officials. The attitude of the people was most favourable even in the hilly tract of Bajna as the Bhils no longer regard the Census with any suspicion. Previous Censuses have familiarised the people with the work and hence no difficulty arose. The people in the City and districts willingly assisted the Enumerators and readily gave replies to the several questions put to them.

8. *Final Census.*—For the Final Census all the public offices and schools in the State were closed on the 18th March to enable all State servants to carry out Census work. The Final Enumeration or the Census was taken on the 18th March 1921. It commenced at 7 P.M. and was completed about midnight. Factories and Bazars were closed at 5 P.M. Two guns as previously announced were fired. The first as a warning to the public in the City as well as the Railway Station to close all shops, etc., and to be in their houses and the other to indicate the commencement of the final counting. Each Enumerator went round his Block with his Enumeration Book, and pen and ink and brought the record up to date by striking out entries for persons dead or left and entering particulars of all newcomers or newly born children. In Bajna Tahsil owing to the rugged nature of the country and the danger from the wild animals the final Enumeration was taken during the day and was finished before 6 P.M. on 18th March. All travellers in running trains who could not produce evidence of having been already counted on the previous night were enumerated at Ratlam Station at 6 A.M. on the 19th March. All household schedules issued on the previous night to First and Second class passengers were also collected here.

9. *Important Fairs.*—There were no large fairs, religious gatherings or social assemblages held in the State on or about the 18th March. Ratlam being an important junction station people from all sides had to pass and change trains here, *en route* to Ujjain for the Simhasht Fair which occurs every twelfth year and fell in 1918. For this reason there was a great congregation of pilgrims at Ratlam on the Census night. The Enumeration of these persons was most creditably conducted by the Railway Census agency assisted by an extra staff of Enumerators sent from the City.

10. *Provisional Totals.*—Arrangements were made with the Charge Superintendents and Supervisors to send their summaries by special sowars. The remotest villages are not more than 35 miles from Ratlam City hence no necessity arose for the use of this special facility. Charge Superintendents and Supervisors and selected Enumerators were instructed to come to the office of the Census Officer at Ratlam on the morning of the 19th March with all their Enumeration Books. Here the Enumerators' Abstracts and Circle and Charge Summaries were prepared and carefully checked. The figures for the State as a whole were compiled by the afternoon of the 20th and Provisional Totals were wired to the Census Commissioner for India at Simla and the Provincial Superintendent of Census at Indore on the morning of the 21st March 1921. According to the Provisional figures the total population was 85,496 or 7 less than the figures eventually arrived at after tabulation. The difference between the two totals was thus practically nil against 58 persons in 1911 which was most creditable to the Census Officer and the subordinate staff.

11. *Tabulation of results.*—All the Enumeration Books after a thorough examination were arranged and checked according to instructions and despatched to the Central Office at Indore on the 31st March 1921 with Mr. Nathusingh who was deputed as Supervisor with 7 clerks for abstraction and tabulation work. The Ratlam staff worked excellently there. The work of one of the clerks beat all past records and he was granted a special bonus by the Darbar.

All obligatory and optional Tables prescribed were compiled. Tables I—VI give statistics for the State as a whole, and for Tahsils, the City and alienated land holdings, VII.—XXI for State as well as the City and XXII for the Industrial Establishments in the State. Along with the Census of population the Darbar collected additional information about cattle, ploughs, wells, etc., for which a special schedule was printed locally and issued to officials concerned. These statistics have been compiled and form Table XXIII.

12. *Acknowledgments.*—The care and industry with which Pandit Tribhuvannath Zutshi carried out the operations are most praiseworthy. The enumeration of persons living within railway premises and of the passengers in the running trains was a very troublesome task. It is most gratifying that his tact and the friendly relations maintained with the Loco. Superintendents of the B. B. & C. I. and R. M. Railways overcame all difficulties and produced such successful results.

I must express my indebtedness to His Highness Maharaja Colonel Sir Sajjan Singh, K. C. S. I., K. C. V. O., and the Senior Member of Council Khan Bahadur D. F. Vakil, for their cordial support in the work. To the Census Officer Pandit Tribhuvannath my warm thanks are due for the thorough training given to the officials and the care with which the Provisional Totals were compiled. My thanks are also due to Mr. Nathusingh whose hard work as Head Clerk of the State Census Office was specially noticed by the Census Officer. As Supervisor of the Ratlam section in the Central Abstraction and Tabulation Office he showed great care and intelligence and controlled his subordinates admirably. He also helped in the compilation of the Agency figures in addition to his own duties.

CENSUS REPORT

OF THE

RATLAM STATE

1921.

I. General.—Ratlam is a mediatised State in the Malwa Political Charge. The territory which lies between 23° 6' and 23° 33' North Latitude and 74° 31' and 75° 17' East Longitude is inextricably intermingled with that of Sailana.

II. Area.—The area of this State, ascertained from the latest survey, is 693.25 square miles comparable with that of the Nimach Pargana of Gwalior State, 672 square miles. In the Census of 1911 the area found from the topographical sheets was 643 square miles. Before this an estimated figure of 902 square miles was adopted in all records. More than one-half of the area is alienated in *jagirs* and other grants, about 44 per cent. being Khalsa land directly held by the State. Besides this an approximate area of 228 square miles, composing sixty villages, is held by the Rao of Kushalgarh in Rajputana on payment of a Tanka.

III. Boundaries.—Generally speaking the State touches the territories of Jaora and Partabgarh (in Rajputana) on the North and Gwalior in the East, Dhar, Kushalgarh (in Rajputana), and parts of Indore on the South and Kushalgarh and Banswara (in Rajputana) on the West.

IV. Climate and Rainfall.—The climate of the State is healthy except that in the hilly district greater extremes of heat and cold are met with. The average rainfall during the decade was 32.21 inches, the highest fall was 50.33 inches in 1916, the lowest 10.52 inches in 1918 when there was a failure of crops and acute scarcity of foodstuffs throughout the State. The normal rainfall required in the State for drinking and cultivation is about 30 inches. In this decade only in the three years, 1911, 1915 and 1918 was the rainfall below the normal.

V. Administrative and Natural Divisions.—For administrative purposes the State is divided into two Tahsils, viz., Ratlam Sadar and Bajna. The whole territory is typical of the Malwa Plateau except the Bajna Tahsil which is hilly.

VI. Density.—Appendix I shows the mean density of the population per square mile as well as statistics relating to cultivation and crops. The density of the State is 123 persons per square mile against 119 in 1911. The total area of the State in acres is 443,737, in 1911 the cultivated area was 95,612 acres which rose to 1,02,287 acres in the last decade due mainly to the replacing of poppy with cotton which is now grown on a far larger scale by the cultivator as it fetches a high price in the market.

VII. Variation.—The inset shows the variation since 1881. There has been an increase during the past decade, due mainly to the rise in the

population of Ratlam City partly caused by passengers from different parts of India *en route* to Ujjain for the Simhasht fair. Compared with the figures of adjoining States and districts as shown in the inset the density of the State appears low except for Sailana which is hilly. The reason for this low figure is the sparsely populated hilly tract of Bajna Tahsil inhabited by Bhils. If Bajna figures are deducted the density of the State at once rises to 141, the territory round the City being black cotton soil producing rich crops of wheat, gram, cotton, etc. Excluding the City the State gives a density of 79 persons per square mile.

VIII. Towns and Villages.—For Census purposes a Town included every municipality and every other continuous collection of houses inhabited by not less than 5,000 persons and such other places of less than 5,000 inhabitants as are centres of trade or have historic associations or have really urban characteristics. There is only one town fulfilling the above conditions, viz., Ratlam, the capital. The population of this place at successive Censuses has been:—1881—31,066, 1891—29,822, 1901—36,321, 1911—27,957 and 1921—30,133. In the first decade a fall of about 4 per cent. took place, in the second the population rose by 22 per cent. due probably to the influx of famine stricken people who resorted to the railway

works, then in full swing on account of the Godra-Muttra line then under construction. In the period 1911—1911 a fall of 23 per cent. took place. This heavy decrease was mainly the result of the plague epidemic which prevailed in the town continually from 1902—1910. This City being an important junction, passengers from Bombay, Gujarat and Rajputana change trains. During the epidemic period these people coming in contact with indigenous people spread the disease resulting in loss of life. Other large numbers of people also visit this place for trade. This has declined in recent years due to the extension of railway lines which have diverted traffic in other directions. *Satta* transactions which once raised the Town to importance have almost died out. This has also contributed to diminish the population. The town has a municipality, a high school and a large hospital as well as various opportunities for the labouring classes which naturally attract people from adjoining areas. In the last decade the population rose by 8 per cent. due to the rebound. The population of the Ratlam City is 35 per cent. of the total population of the State. The inset compares the percentage of urban population with other States. Ratlam shows a very high figure indicating its prosperous condition.

A village for Census purposes is generally a *Mauza* with its attendant hamlets or a revenue unit. A cluster of tiled mud huts half buried in creeping plants constitutes an ordinary village. But it is a very different thing in the hilly tract of Bajna. Here we find small wattle and grass huts sparsely situated and inhabited by Bhils.

There are in all 237 villages including the villages in possession of the guaranteed Thakurs, as compared with 232 in 1911. The increase in the number of villages is due to the rise in Bajna Tahsil where a large number of villages which had become depopulated in the famine of 1900 were reinhabited.

As usual villages of "under 500" population predominate, 28,618 persons or some 34 per cent. of the total population living in them. The next most populous group is that of villages with 500—1,000 inhabitants with about 12,996 persons.

The inset compares the village population of the four groups with the past Census.

There has been practically no change in the figures. The average village population is 235, the same as in 1911. The inset shows the figures of the other States in the Malwa Political Charge, not only the mean density of Ratlam does not unfavourably compare with those of other States but that it has stood the same for the whole of the decade is somewhat noticeable.

IX. Houses and Families.—The same definition of the house as that of 1911 was adopted on this occasion also, i.e., any building inhabited by one or more families living together and eating from the same *chulha* constituted a house. Only inhabited houses were counted in the present Census. There were in all 21,228 houses in the State against 20,865 in 1911. The number of persons per house is the same as in 1911, viz., 4, the number of houses per square mile being 30 in this as well as in the past Census.

Houses vary in their appearance with the material of which they are constructed and those again vary with the locality. In Ratlam City most houses are of more than one storey and are constructed of stone and bricks. The more important villages which are the residences of local Thakurs usually have two storeyed houses. For the rest small huts of two or three rooms with frames of bamboo or the commoner kinds of wood either roofed with country tiles, or thatched form the houses of the agricultural population. In Bajna Tahsil the Bhil huts are usually built of bamboo and the commonest wood plastered with clay and roofed with leaves and straw.

X. Population and Variation.—Table II deals with the population at successive Censuses with variation since 1881. The total population including the villages held by the guaranteed Thakurs has been:—1881—87,314, 1891—89,160, 1901—85,216, 1911—82,497 and 1921—85,489.

The inset gives the percentage of variation for each decade for the whole State. The population rose by over 2 per cent in the first decade. In the second and third it decreased owing to the severe famine of 1900 and a visitation of plague. An increase took place in the last decade, principally owing to the pilgrims *en route* to Ujjain Simhasht fair. Plague and Influenza played havoc in 1917 and 1918 respectively with loss of 7,000 lives. There were only three ginning cotton factories in the State in 1911, two printing presses and one Abkari distillery. During the past decade the two cotton ginning and pressing factories and electric supply company, general engineering and foundry company and a spinning and

weaving mill were established. All these concerns are working except the spinning and weaving mill which is still under construction and is approaching completion.

Distributed between the Urban and Rural areas the population shows 35 and 65 per cent. respectively, a proportion exceeding that in any other Central Indian State.

XI. General Condition during the decade.—The general condition of the country on the whole remained satisfactory. Public health was good. During the period under review plague appeared thrice and was severe in 1917 when 1,380 deaths were recorded. In 1918 the State was visited by Influenza. This epidemic lasted for about two months and 5,172 deaths were reported. In the same year, on account of deficient rains, the crops also failed causing a deficit of foodstuffs. The distress was much aggravated by the short sighted policy of the adjoining States which imposed restrictions on the export of wheat and other food grains. To cope with this, large quantities of foodstuffs were purchased from the Punjab and other places. Appendix II shows the number of deaths reported in the State during the decade but the return is certainly not complete.

XII. Movement of Population—In the State the chief causes of movement are trade, marriage and the return for their first confinement of females to their parent's house. Ratlam being an important trade centre in Malwa, people from all parts visit it. Reciprocal migration appears most common. The statistics given in Table XI bear out the facts. Out of the total population of 85,489 as many as 64,020 or 75 per cent. were born in the State leaving 25 per cent. for outsiders. 10 per cent. of the outsiders came from States within the Agency of which Sailana, as might be expected, sent over 3 per cent.; of other States Jaora, Dhar and Indore sent most. Of the remaining 15 per cent. who come from States and Provinces beyond Central India, Gwalior which forms the eastern boundary of the State contributes 6 per cent., the Rajputana States 6 per cent., of which Banswara and Udaipur sent just over 1 per cent. each. States and Districts in the Bombay Presidency sent about 1 per cent., the remaining Provinces and States showing insignificant numbers.

The inset shows the effect of migration. On the whole the State has gained 2,523 persons. The growing demand for labour on account of Railway works and the development of industries in the Ratlam City are the main causes for an ingress of foreigners to the City. Immigration from the contiguous States and Districts of States is mainly due to marriage and other social customs.

The figures recorded for Ratlam City show that the majority of the immigrants is found in it, two-thirds of its population being State born. Of the remaining one-third 36 per cent. were from States within Central India and 54 per cent. from Provinces and States beyond the Agency. Of the total immigrants to the State the City shares most, Bombay sending about all its visitors there, Rajputana, the United Provinces and Central Provinces each over half their number.

The natural population, that is, the total number of persons born in the State wherever enumerated amounts to 82,966 or less by 2,523 than the Census total.

XIII. Religion.—The information dealt with in this section was recorded in column 4 of the schedule in which each man's religion, and the sect of Christians only, were entered. The Tables connected with this subject are VI, VII, XV and XVI. The main religions returned in this State are Hindu, Jain, Animist, Musalman and Christian. Of these Hindus and Animists are the most numerous. It is, however, difficult to distinguish between Hindus and Animists. The only local Animistic tribes are Bhils and Minas. Some members of these tribes have pretensions to Hinduism and return themselves as such. These tribes, therefore, appear both among Hindus and Animists. Those who live near and associate much with regular Hindu communities soon pick up Hindu ideas; it is only those who live in wilds that are still Animists. Out of the total population nearly 48,000 are Hindus and 23,000 Animists.

The inset table compares the proportion of each main religion for 1921 and 1911.

Comparison with the figures of earlier Censuses is not possible due to the fact that the figures for the guaranteed Estates which were then treated separately are not available. The most noticeable point in these figures is that the Animists have risen by 22 per cent. while Hindus have fallen by 2 per cent. This is mainly due to more accurate recording of the

religion in all parts of the State. The Musalman population has fallen by 2 per cent., an unimportant variation: Jains have fallen by 18 per cent. due largely to the effects of Influenza which seriously affected the trading classes in the City. Christians number 749 as compared with 338 in 1911 showing a rise of 93 per cent. The figure is raised by the increase in the population of the railway colony and of the Canadian Presbyterian Mission at the capital.

XIV. Christian Sects.—Special precaution was taken to get a correct record of the sect. All missionaries were supplied with tickets with instructions to hand these over to the members of their congregation, entering on the tickets the name of the sect to which they belonged. This was shown to the Enumerator at the preliminary and final enumeration, for the entry in column 4. There are in all five different denominations recorded. Presbyterians are the most numerous, Roman Catholics come next, while the Church of England and Wesleyans come last. Comparison with the previous Census is not possible as figures are not available.

XV. Age, Sex and Civil Condition.—**Age.**—Table VII gives the distribution of the whole population by religion, age, sex and civil condition for 19 age-periods and Table XIV gives similar statistics for selected castes. These statistics were recorded in columns 4—8 of the schedule.

Of all the statistics collected at the Census those of the age are the least reliable. The inaccuracies prevalent in the age return are well known. These are mainly due to the use of conventional expressions such as *do-tin*, *chhe-sat*, *sola-satra* and the preference for quinquennial and decennial expressions. Real ignorance also of the year of birth is very general among the uneducated classes and those who are literate also often do not remember it accurately. The enumerators were instructed to enter in column 7 the number of years which each person had completed on the Census day. For infants of less than one year the word *bachcha* was to be entered. A man when he knows his age, however, always gives the current year and not the completed year. Again a child is called *bachcha* as long as it is at the breast which usually exceeds one and even two years. Moreover, in all cases no allowance is made for the period which intervenes between the Preliminary Census and the Actual Census night. Women's ages are perhaps occasionally concealed especially if an unmarried girl is getting on in years, while there is also a difficulty in obtaining the correct age of females and hearsay statements have often to be accepted without check as the enumerators are unable to press for information regarding females and have to enter whatever is given. Young men understate their ages while young mothers overstate theirs. Old people as a rule exaggerate their age.

Finally the Shastras require a Hindu to conceal his age as being one of the nine things he must not disclose or it may lead to a reduction in the span of life.

आयुर्विस्तं गृहच्छिद्रं । मंत्र मैथुनं मेघजम् ॥
दानं मानापमानं च । नव गोप्यानि यत्नतः ॥

"A man should keep concealed these nine things, viz., age, wealth, defect in the household, incantation (*mantra*), dalliance, medicine, charity, honour and insult."

The inset gives the number of females to 100 males at selected age-periods by main religions. At 0—5 the Hindus show 107 females while Animists show a higher proportion. The abnormally high figure for Animist females at 15—30 is noticeable and may be due to plurality of wives. The other periods do not call for any special remarks. To every 100 males Hindus show 93 females and Animist 100.

Animists showing respectively 93 and 100. The inset gives a comparison of other localities. The three contiguous States give an equal ratio for all religions, Hindu and Animist showing slight variation. Piploda gives a higher ratio for all religions and for Animists but a lower figure for Hindus.

Civil Condition.—The instructions to the enumerators were: Enter each person, whether infant, child or grown up as either married, unmarried or widowed. Divorced persons should be entered as widowed if they have not married again no doubts are likely to occur as regards Civil Condition.

Marriage is a part of every human being's duty, a duty enforced among Hindus by strong religious sanctions which have existed from time immemorial. As a natural corollary a daughter must never reach puberty unmarried.

The marriage of widows is forbidden to Hindus of higher castes. The custom governing the age of marriage and remarriage of widows depend principally on local usage.

The Hindu, Jain, Musalman and Christian show preponderance of widows. The figures for the first two require no explanation. Those of the Christians are rather curious but the excess is probably due to the influx of the Indian Christians who visited Ratlam about this time in connection with a religious celebration.

XVI. Education.—The record of Education is found in columns 14 and 15

of the schedule, the Vernacular tongue a person could both read and write being given in 14 and knowledge of English in 15.

Statistics for education are given in Tables VIII and IX. The former shows literacy as distributed by four age-periods, sex and religion and the latter among selected castes.

Of the total population there are 6,908 persons (6,021 males and 887 females) or 8 per cent. literate. Of these 3,972 or about 8 per cent. are among Hindus, 1,445 or about 40 per cent. among Jains, 1,002 or 10 per cent. among Musalmans, 425 or about 57 per cent. among Christians, 55 or about 60 per cent among Parsis, the Animists showing none. Of the total literates as many as 5,873 or 7 per cent. of the population are found exclusively in the City of Ratlam. Or in other words, 19 per cent. of the City population is literate. Education is chiefly confined to the capital, the presence of higher educational institutions and of traders almost all educated, Hindus, Musalmans, Christians and Parsis raising the figure.

Of the literates 927 (825 males and 102 females) or over 1 per cent. of the total population have also a knowledge of English as shown in the inset. These literates almost exclusively belong to the City.

A comparison with the figures of the adjoining States shows that there is a rise of 3 per cent. in Ratlam due to the liberal support the education receives from the Darbar.

The State maintains one high school, 58 primary schools for boys and girls and 1 Sanskrit school, attended by 2,569 pupils. Besides these the Canadian Presbyterian Mission has a Primary school in the City with 135 students all Christian converts. Detailed statistics are given in the inset.

The principal castes resorting to these institutions are:—Brahmans 691, Baniyas 500, Rajputs 173, other Hindus 280, Musalmans 649 Christians 297, and Parsis 14.

XVII. Language.—Table X gives the record of dialects. The instructions to the enumerators were to enter in column 13 of the Schedule the language or dialect actually spoken by a person in the bosom of his family.

The record of languages as returned does not appear satisfactory as with the spread of education and close association of the public with every caste and creed the mother tongues are gradually acquiring a common form. In the City the educated speak the local dialects with their womenfolk only, but when they come in contact with the public they employ mutilated Persian words very freely.

There is a popular saying to the effect that a dialect changes at every 12 Kos ; but a man's qualities (good or bad) do not change even if he travelled over 100,000 Kos. बारा कोस में बोली पलटै लखन न पलटै लाखी ।

Small variations are thus met with in the speech of persons in different localities even not very far apart, but no difficulty is felt by people in understanding each other's speech.

Among students, junior officials and menial classes Urdu, Hindi, Marathi, Gujarati and English words are freely mixed with their vernacular in conversation.

Hindi is the official language in the State but is mingled with official terms from Urdu.

The dialects proper to the State are Malwi and Bhili. The former is spoken by 63 per cent. and the latter by 23 per cent. of the total population ; Gujarati and Urdu are spoken by 3 per cent. each ; Hindi, Marwari, Purbi and Hindustani by 1 per cent. each ; the other figures are insignificant. Foreign tongues are only met with in the City.

XVIII. Infirmities.—The information with regard to the four kinds of infirmities, viz., Insanity, Deaf-mutism, Blindness and Leprosy, recorded in the Census was entered in column 16 of the schedule and the statistics are given in Table XII. The desire for concealment is not so strong as regards males as for females. This sex is apt to conceal diseases while the enumerator has no alternative but to enter what he is told.

The total figures for the whole State were 185 persons (94 males and 91 females), of whom 89 (45 males and 35 females) were found in the City. Blindness as usual shows preponderance in the State as a whole as well as in the capital. The details for the diseases are given in the inset. The record appears to be fairly satisfactory.

XIX. Caste, Tribe or Race.—The statistics for caste, tribe or race will be found in table XIII. The greater part of the population is Hindu, the aboriginal tribes coming next. Musalmans, Jains, Christians and Parsis form minor groups.

The most predominant castes and tribes are:—Bhil 28 per cent., Brahman and Rajput 6 per cent. each, Kunbi 4 per cent., Bania, Chamar and Balai 3 per cent. each, Gujar, Jat, Dhakar, Kumhar, Teli and Hazuri, 2 per cent. each, Bairagi, Sutar over 1 per cent., the rest giving small numbers.

The following castes, etc., are found in greatest proportion in the City:—Bantias, Bansphor, Bari, Dakshni, Kanaujia, Nagar and Shrimali Brahmans, Darzi, Gaoli, Kayasth, Khatik, Koli, Luhar, Mali, Maratha, Mehtar, Sunar, Bohra, Mughal, Pathan, Sayyad, Christian and Parsis.

The real agricultural castes are Dhakar, Gujar, Jat and Kunbi. Other castes, such as Rajputs, Brahmans, Chamars, Balais, etc., also have recourse to this pursuit to certain extent. Among the Rajputs only those who are not connected with any Thakurs or a family of some status actually cultivate land.

XX. Occupation or Means of Livelihood.—The statistics for occupation are given in detail in Tables XVII—XXII.

The scheme of classification of occupations adopted on this occasion is the same as that employed in 1911. This system aims at making the result comparable with those of other countries. All occupations are divided into 5 Classes, 12 Sub-Classes, 56 Orders and 191 Groups. Separate figures have been recorded for actual workers, whether males or females and dependants.

The inset gives the percentage of State and City population supported by different kinds of occupation. As is to be expected agriculture is the principal occupation supporting the majority of the people while Industrial Establishments, Transport, Public Force, Public Administration, Professions, Domestic Service, are the principal means of support of people in urban areas.

and Animists, as is to be expected, follow agriculture, forming 97 per cent. of the agriculturists. Industry is shared by Hindus and Musalmans. Trade is followed by the majority of the Jains who are City dwellers. Christians are found taking part to a certain extent in Professions. Baniyas are the only castes which follow their traditional occupation. Probably many castes are abandoning their traditional occupation as they can no longer maintain themselves by it.

Female occupation.—There are 490 female workers to every 1,000 male workers in the State. As a whole Females are most numerous among Field Labourers, being 2,070 to 1,000 males. Other occupations favoured by the females are Basket-making, Rice-pounding, Flour-grinding, etc., Music, Midwifery and Nursing, Domestic and Menial service and Begging. These occupations are by nature suited to Indian women who have to earn a living.

Factories.—Statistics relating to factories are exhibited in the various parts of Imperial Table XXII. In 1911 information was collected regarding factories employing 20 or more workers, but on the present occasion they were collected in respect of industrial establishments employing 10 persons or more. Four cotton ginning factories, 2 printing presses and one distillery have been returned. These give employment to 318 persons of whom 129 are females and 18 children. The four ginning mills work only for a few months in the year, while the other three concerns work throughout the year. Most of the workers are local people or come from neighbouring places. The gins are of course worked by power (steam), but the printing presses are worked by hand. In the last Census there were only 3 gins, 1 carpet and rug making factory and 1 distillery. The carpet making industry has died out during the last decade, while a new gin has been opened.
