P R E F A C E

The compilation and publication of District Census Handbooks has been a traditional feature of the Indian Census since 1951. However, in Jammu and Kashmir State, where no census was conducted in 1951 due to the unsettled conditions prevailing then, this work was taken up as a regular feature of census since 1961 with certain improvements and additions in the data content of the publication at the 1971 census, further enhancing its utility for the data users.

The 1981 series of the District Census Handbook which we have begun with the district of Punch will contain two parts each. Part A deals with Town and Village Directory and Part B consists of Town and Village Primary Census Abstract. In 1971 census there was also third part of the Handbook, published as a separate volume, comprising administrative and census statistics. However, in view of the considerable delay experienced then in getting the relevant administrative statistics pertaining to various departments, compilation of this volume has been given up at the 1981 census. It is expected that such statistics would be available to the data users in the usual publications of the State Directorate of Evaluation and Statistics.

The Town Directory of the Handbook consists of seven statements which are almost similar to those adopted for the 1971 census except that a few new columns have been added to facilitate analysis of the data. A significant addition is of class of town in every statement which has been done on the consideration that the infrastructure of amenities and facilities found in urban India can best be analysed with reference to this specific parameter. The addition of the column on civic administration status in statements III and IV and population in statements IV and V also serves the same purpose vis-a-vis the respective statements. Due consideration has also been given to the Minimum Needs Prog-

ramme of the Planning Commission. The columns on Scheduled Caste population in statement IV and adult literacy classes/centres in statement V are a sequel to this programme.

The Village Directory also follows the same pattern as in 1971 census except again for a few additional columns. The column on total population and number of households has been added to facilitate analysis of the other data in the Directory. The column on approach to village is to identify the number of inaccessible villages in the district. The column on number of households living in owned houses or possessing house sites in the village is again intended to cater to the Minimum Needs Programme of the Planning Commission.

It is hoped that with its present content the Handbook would, more than ever, serve as a useful reference publication, particularly for such administrators and data users as have to deal with planning, implementation and evaluation of development programmes, including the Minimum Needs Programme, at the grass-roots level.

The compilation of the Handbook would not have been possible but for the cooperation extended by the Revenue, Education, Medical, Public Health and other local authorities of the District in making relevant data available, for which we owe them our grateful thanks.

It must be stated here that the task of finalising and printing the present volume has fallen on me, since Shri A. H. Khan, IAS, Director of Census Operations, Jammu & Kashmir, under whose able stewardship the census operations of 1981 were carried out, retired from Government service by the time the volume could be taken up for compilation.

We are grateful to Shri P. Padmanabha, IAS, Registrar General and Census Commissioner of India and Shri N. G. Nag, Deputy Registrar General (Social Studies) whose detailed

instructions, guidance and advice were available all through.

The credit for compiling this Handbook, including analysis of data, belongs to Shri Abdul Gani, Joint Director, besides Shri H. L. Kalla, Deputy Director, Shri Shamus-ud-Din, Tabulation Officer & B. A. Shora, Computer who ably assisted the former in this task and deserve appreciation for their respective contributions.

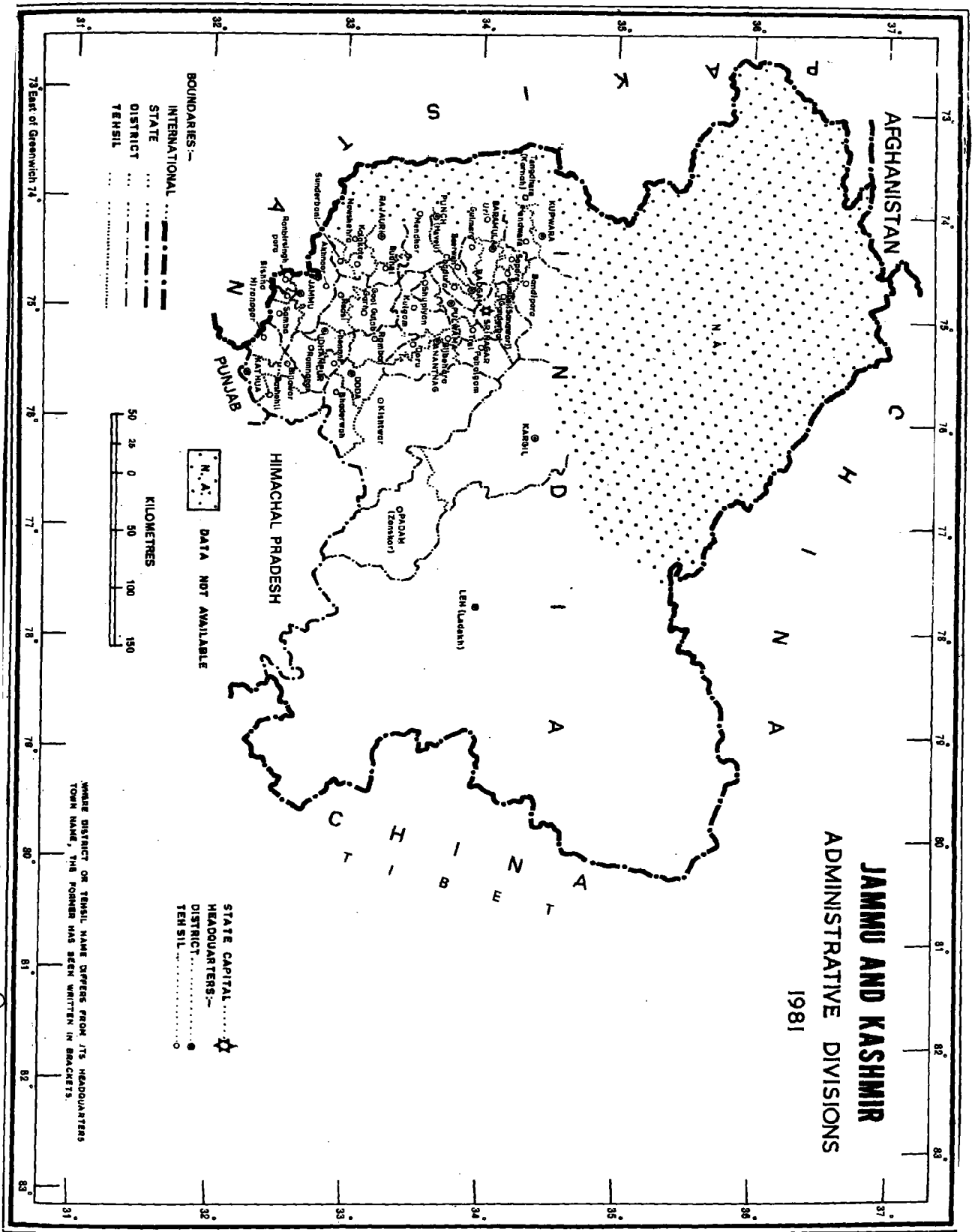
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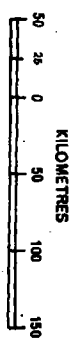

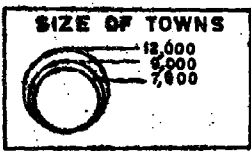
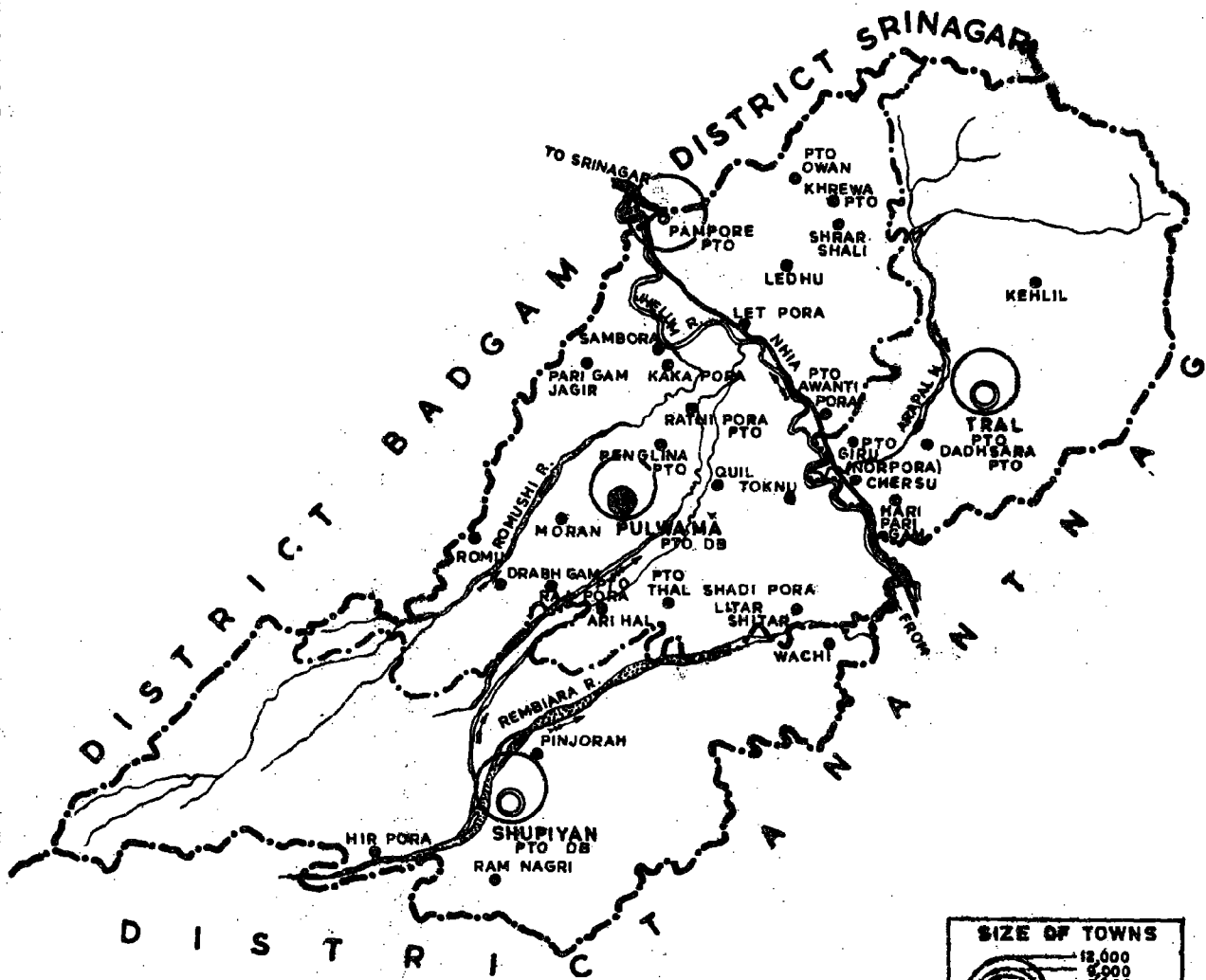

ANALYTICAL NOTE

A description of the various concepts used at the 1981 Census and a broad appraisal of the administrative statistics vis-a-vis the history of the district, the social and cultural changes witnessed by the district during the last ten years particularly in relation to economic resources, social, cultural and developmental activities and a brief description of the places of historical and religious importance in the district is given in the following pages :-

Rural/Urban classification

For the 1981 census the classification of urban areas have been based on the following criteria :-

- a) All places with a municipality, corporation or cantonment board or notified town area committee.
- b) All other places which satisfied the following tests :
 - i) A minimum population of 5000
 - ii) At least 75 per cent of male working population engaged in non-agricultural (and allied) activity
 - iii) A density of population of at least 400 per Sq. Km. (1000 per sq. mile)

The places which satisfied the criterion (a) above were treated as statutory towns while those as were not statutory towns but satisfied the tests laid down in criterion (b) above were treated as census towns. All other places which did not satisfy either of the above two criteria were classified as rural. Areas which qualified to be treated as towns under criterion (a) & (b) above were further classified by population ranges in the following order :-

Census House

A census house was defined as a building or part of a building having a separate main entrance from the road or common courtyard or staircase etc. used or recognised as a separate unit. It may be occupied or vacant. It may be used for a residential or non-residential purposes or both.

Census Household

A household for purposes of the 1981 census has been defined as a group of persons who commonly live together and would take their meals from a common kitchen unless the exigencies of work prevented any of them from doing so. There may be a household of persons related by blood or a household of unrelated persons or having a mix of both.

Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe

In Jammu & Kashmir State there are no scheduled tribes. However, the following 13 castes stand notified as scheduled castes under the State constitution :-

1. Barwala
2. Basith
3. Chamar or Ramdasia
4. Batwal
5. Chura
6. Dhyar
7. Doom or Mahasha
8. Gardi
9. Jolaha
10. Megh or Kabirpanthi
11. Ratal
12. Saryara
13. Watal

At the 1981 census only those persons who returned themselves as belonging to any of the 13 castes specified above were treated

as Scheduled Castes.

Literacy

For purposes of census a person was treated as literate if he/she could read and write in any language with understanding power. A person who could merely read but was not able to write was classified as illiterate. For a person to be treated as literate it was not necessary that he/she should have received any formal education or should have passed any minimum educational standard.

Workers/Non-Workers

For the 1981 Census a person was treated mainly as a worker if he/she had participated in any kind of economically productive work during the major part of the reference year i. e; at least 6 months or 183 days or more prior to the date of enumeration. A person who claimed to have participated in any kind of economically productive work for less than six months prior to the date of enumeration was treated as marginal worker. However, persons who did not participate in any kind of economically productive work during the whole period of the reference year were treated as non-workers.

Brief history of the district

District Pulwama came into existence on July 1st, 1979. Earlier on, the district was part of Anantnag district. This district is bounded by Srinagar and Badgam districts in north-west and by the district Anantnag in the east and south-east. The district, more or less, enjoys similar climate as other districts in the valley except that the areas situated at higher altitudes are cooler in Summer and inaccessible in winter due to heavy snowfall. The average height of the district is 1,638 metres (5,372 feet) above the sea level.

Brief history of District Census Handbook

The District Census Handbooks were published for the first time in 1951 as a

part of the Census publication programme in almost all States of India except Jammu and Kashmir State where due to the disturbed conditions prevailing in the wake of tribal invasion of 1947-48 no census could be undertaken and as such no data was collected for the decade 1941-1951. The publication of District Census Handbook series fulfilled a long felt need. These gave out not only the data contained in Primary Census Abstract according to new classifications but included a sufficient account of the district and its people and a vast magnitude of other data covering such topics as communication, education, public health etc. in respect of each town and village of the district. Consequently, these have been found to be of immense help to all the departments of the State Government for planning and development at the grass-root level. With the introduction of single line administration at the district level, the utility and importance of these publications for constant use and reference by District Development Commissioners has increased enormously. The present hand-book is proposed to contain even more comprehensive data than in the past so as to meet also the requirements of minimum needs programme set forth by the Planning Commission. The publication will, besides the basic population data emanating from the 1981 Census, contain comprehensive information pertaining to amenities and land-use Pattern and other infrastructural statistics in respect of each village and town of the district so as to serve as a ready reference material for planners and administrators for assessment of past achievements and formulation of new programmes of development at the grass-root level.

Town Directory

The Town Directory covers information at town level and includes items such as status of administration, growth of population, growth pattern since 1901, physical aspects

and location, civic finances, civic and other amenities, medical, educational, recreational and cultural facilities, trade, industry and commerce, banking facilities etc.

In addition, demographic data like sex-ratio, number of households, density of population and position of civic and other amenities in notified or recognised slums of class I & II towns have also been introduced. Considering the increasing employment of women in urban areas and the consequent housing need of single working woman, it has been felt necessary to indicate in the town directory also such information as the number of working women hostels with number of seats.

A broad appraisal of the data incorporated in the seven statements of the town directory is attempted in the following paragraphs :

Statement—I gives information on civic administration status as in 1980, growth history of towns from 1901 to 1981, sex ratio of towns from 1961 to 1981, density and area in sq. kms.

Statement—II gives the physical as well as locational aspects of towns of the district. Under the physical aspects data on annual rainfall (in cms.) and maximum and minimum temperature (in centigrade) have been highlighted. The statement also gives information on distance of the town from the nearest city with a population of one lakh and above, distance from the State, district and tehsil hqrs., from the railway station and bus route. It also provides information on the existence of river/canal, if any, within 10 kms.

Statement—III provides the budgetary statements pertaining to the financial year 1978-79. The statement has been apportioned into the receipt and expenditure heads. Under the receipt head information has been given on such items as "receipt through taxes, revenue derived from municipal properties and power apart from taxation, government grants, loans, advances and other sources". Expen-

diture head shows expenditure on general administration, public safety, public health and conveniences, public works, public institutions and others.

Statement—IV depicts civic and other amenities available in the towns of Pulwama district and gives information on such items as length of the road in the town, system of sewerage, number and type of latrine, method and disposal of night soil, source and capacity of drinking water and fire fighting services. The statement also highlights the pattern of electricity consumed in the town and indicates the number of connections under sub-heads like domestic, industrial, commercial, road-lighting and others.

Statement—IV-A which is meant to depict civic and other amenities available in the notified slums of class I and II towns has no relevance for Pulwama district.

Statement—V gives medical, educational, recreational and cultural facilities as were available in the towns of Pulwama district in 1979. Under medical facilities are indicated the type of medical institutions and the number of medical beds available. Likewise, different types of educational institutions available have been covered under educational facilities. Information regarding the number of cinema houses, stadia, auditoria/drama halls and public libraries have also been incorporated in the statement to bring out the extent of availability of recreational and cultural facilities. In addition, information about number of working women hostels has also been given in the statement. If a medical or an educational facility was not available in the town, the name of the nearest place where it is available has also been given in the statement.

Statement—VI gives the facilities of trade, commerce, industry and banking available in the towns in 1979. Besides, the number of credit cooperative societies operating, the details of three most important commodities imported, exported and manufactured in the towns have also been indicated.

Village Directory

The village directory portion of the handbook depicts particulars of amenities available in each village of the district in the field of education, medical care, power supply, drinking water, post and telegraph, communication, besides information about land-use and places of religious, historical and archaeological importance in the village. In case where a particular amenity is not available within the village, distance at which such a facility is available even in the most modest form has been indicated in three broad ranges viz; —5kms., 5—10kms., and 10+kms. If there are composite schools, like middle schools with primary classes or secondary schools with middle classes, these have also been included in the number of primary and middle schools respectively. For example, if in a village or a town there were two primary schools and one middle school with primary classes, in the village/town have been given as three and that of middle school as one even though there are only three educational institutions. So also in case of secondary schools.

The village directory also carries the following four appendices :—

- Appendix—I It gives the abstract of educational, medical and other amenities available in the tehsils of the district.
- Appendix—II It furnishes the land utilisation data in respect of census towns. This appendix, however, is not relevant to Pulwama district.
- Appendix—III This is a list of villages where no amenities, other than drinking water like education, medical, post and telegraph, communication, power supply are available.
- Appendix—IV It provides a list of villages according to the proportion of

scheduled caste population by ranges.

All these appendices appear after the main village directory.

Primary Census Abstract

The Primary Census Abstract part of the publication is exclusively based on the 1981 census data. It provides information in respect of each village and ward/mohalla of a town at tehsil level in respect of its area, number of residential houses, number of house-holds, total population, scheduled caste population, literate and educated persons and working population by sex in four broad industrial categories viz; (i) cultivators, (ii) agricultural labourers, (iii) household industry-manufacturing, processing, servicing and repairs and (iv) other workers besides non-workers as a separate category.

Special PCA on Scheduled Castes

It is for the first time that a special Primary Census Abstract has been introduced in the District Census Handbooks for the Scheduled Caste population. The special PCA provides information pertaining to scheduled castes in respect of number of residential houses and their population, literates, main workers classified by cultivators, agricultural labourers, workers in the household industry and other workers, marginal workers and non-workers classified by sex. This PCA is also presented for District, Tehsil and Town levels.

Physical Aspects

As already stated, the district came into existence in July 1979. The district was carved out by transferring three tehsils viz; Pulwama, Shupiyan and Tral encompassing 558 villages and three towns from Anantnag district. At present the district comprises 554 villages and four towns viz; Pulwama, Shupiyan, Tral and Pampore, four villages having been formed into the newly created Pulwama Notified Area. However, of the 554 villages, only

536 villages are inhabited. The geographical area of the district is 1,398 sq. kms.

Major characteristics

Agriculture is the main source of livelihood in the district, there being 0.73 lakh hectares of land available for cultivation. Development of agriculture and irrigation facilities is receiving adequate attention in the process of plans and programmes initiated and executed by Government Agencies. Diversification of crops and use of improved agricultural practices are steadily catching up as a result. This includes thrust on vegetable cultivation which commands an area of 670 hectares in the district. Plantation, which spreads over an area of 11,000 hectares is also receiving adequate attention. In 1981-82 alone 170 hectares have been taken up for plant protection.

With the incentives and encouragement provided by the Government, Mushroom cultivation is also picking up. At present there are 160 entrepreneurs providing 45 to 50 tonnes of mushrooms annually.

On the side of horticulture, the district has a good potential for the growth and development of such fruit as apples, walnuts and almonds. There are 50,475 acres of land under fruit plantation, of which 28,520 acres produce dry fruits. Different schemes are under implementation to improve the quantity and quality of fruit production. These include plant protection scheme for hilly areas, intensive fruit production scheme, ambri production scheme etc.

The live-stock in the district consists of 3.13 lakh animals and 2.32 lakhs poultry. There are 78 veterinary units and dispensaries for the treatment of the animals including 3 live-stock development centres. 1.4 lakhs of animals were treated in these institutions and 1.44 injections were dripped to the animals in the year 1981-82 alone. In addition, 4.34 lakhs of poultry injections were used for poultry animals.

There are four sheep husbandry units in the district to look after its stock of more than 1.50 lakh sheep which in 1981-82 alone have contributed 1.43 lakh kg. of mutton and 0.71 lakh kg. of wool as their share to the economy of the district.

Fisheries development also holds a promise in the district with special financial assistance in terms of cash and loan being granted by the Government to those engaged in this occupation.

Pulwama is industrially a backward district. However efforts are in progress to give fillip to small scale industries and as a result more than 659 small scale industrial units have been established. With the establishment of District industries centre, Pulwama was a good beginning in this behalf which is playing a significant role in enthusing and encouraging the unemployed youths to establish such units and supports them with financial and technical assistance. The centre has been able to penetrate even into far flung villages creating employment opportunities for a large number of educated unemployed youths of the district.

At the instance of the District Industrial Centre, Central banks have also been contributing a good deal in building up the industrial climate in the district. In 1980-81 loans to the tune of about Rs. 11 lakhs were advanced by them to 38 Industrial Units in the district. During 1981-82, 214 small Industrial units were established in the district giving employment to 707 persons. The year, signified the setting up of two printing centres, one wire-netting units, one brick kiln, 14 units of corrugating tin sheets and 4 units of photo stat, besides 10 centres of carpet weaving and 2 centres of weaving. During the same year, sixty four industrial unit holders and entrepreneurs received bank loans to the tune of Rs. 58.45 lakhs at the instance of the District industries Centre. In addition, 30 unemployed graduates received a stipend of Rs. 24,000 under the technocrat

scheme, while two graduates were sent for technical training outside the State. Development of handloom and handicrafts is also receiving good attention. In 1980-81 there were 5 training centres, for imparting training to boys and girls in the field of handicrafts and two handloom centres, one each for blankets and garment weaving in the district. Given the momentum the district is thus well-set on the threshold of industrial environment and growth.

Like other districts the Integrated Rural Development Programme is in progress in Pulwama district also. In 1981-82 alone 153 cows were distributed among low income, group 152 demonstration plots were cultivated for different crops under improved agricultural practices to encourage development of agriculture, 120 demonstration plots were put up for Saffron cultivation and a number of small zamindari khuls were repaired as irrigation schemes. The scope of the programme is becoming bigger and broader.

By 1981-82 end all the 4 towns and 160 out of 536 villages in the district had been provided with the facility of protected water supply. With the completion of other schemes in progress additional 311 villages are likely to be covered under this facility.

The district has total road length of 702 km. of which 561.00 kms. are surfaced and 141 kms. are unsurfaced.

It is gratifying indeed that electricity stands already extended to 518 villages of the district.

By end of 1980-81 there were 658 educational institutions in the district of which 27 were high schools, 130 middle schools and 475 primary schools, 26 Makhtabs, Pathshalas and adult literacy centres. About 45 thousand of boys and girls were on roll in these schools under the guidance of 2,312 teachers. During 1980-81 itself 5 new primary schools were opened and 4 primary schools

were upgraded to Middle standard while one middle school was upgraded to a high school. In addition 60 adult literacy centres were opened and 18 new teachers were appointed for these schools in the same period.

On the side of health care there were 62 rural health institution in the district including 11 primary health centres, 46 dispensaries and 5 family planning centres. The total bed strength in these institutions was 70. During 1981-82 5 new dispensaries were opened and 2 sub-centres were up-graded to medical aid centres.

Places of Historical importance

The district is reported to be one of the pretty spots on earth, because of its congenial climate, innumerable springs, streams, waterfalls, fragrant flowers, delicious fruits, fertile soil, caves, pastures and other natural sceneries. It should be enough to mention only a few spots of historical importance here.

Springs

Mahapadmanag is what originally was a spring in Tral but which now looks like a marshy area. Hindu historians believe that the fountain head of the spring represents the spot where the city of sanadmatnagar once existed. The legend has it that the whole city got submerged in the water of the spring and was converted into a huge lake now known by the name of Walur.

Ainul-Afunat is a spring located near Awantipora in tehsil Pulwama and is reported to contain sulphur.

Dudsar is a spring which lies on the top of Kazagil range of Pir Panjal and is also a place of recreation. It is situated in tehsil Pulwama.

Temples

The village of Awantipora, which once a large town is situated at a distance of 30 kms. from Srinagar on Srinagar-Jammu

National Highway. The town is said to have been founded by king Avanti Verman (855-883 A. D.) who had established his capital here. Avanti Verman built two temples at Awanti pora, one before accession to throne and the other during the course of his reign. The two temples which are at a distance of three quarters of a mile, are said to have been dedicated to Vishnu and Shiva. They have now reduced into shapeless masses of ruins, but the gate-ways are still standing. Excavations carried out at Awantipora by the Archives department are reported to have traced out the remnant of buildings and sculptures of the time of King Avanti Verman.

Jwalamukhi temple An important festival is Jwalamukhi fair which is held in village Khrew, tehsil Pulwama. The temple is situated on the top of a small hillock and is known as Jwalamukhi.

The festival falls on or about 16th July and is celebrated by Hindus as well as Muslims. About 250 to 300 stalls are set up by Muslim peasants for the sale of different kinds of commodities. Confectionery shops and such other stalls in which earthen trays with ghee and a cotton wick are available for sale are run by Hindu shopkeepers. The devotees purchase earthen trays and burn cotton wicks while worshipping the deity.

The Kapalmochan festival is held in village Degam in the south of Shupiyan. On this occasion people perform Shradas of their minor deceased children and give away clothes, utensils etc. in alms in their name.

Shrines

Important shrine of the district is the tomb of Khawaja Masood in Pampore town. The Khawaja is said to have initially been engaged in business, but later on gave up all worldly connections and took shelter in a cave where he meditated for three months continuously. Many stories of the miracles performed by Khawaja Masood are cited by

the people of the district. He passed away in 1021 Hijra corresponding to 1611 A. D.

A Khankah has been built in Tral by Mir Syed Mohammad Hamdani, the great saint and scholar of Iraq as a result of whose preachings masses of the people of Kashmir embraced Islam. The shrine is known by the name Khankah Alla which is also the chronogram of the year of its construction viz ; 868 Hijra corresponding to 1469 A. D. Two festivals are held in the shrine, one on the 6th of Zilahaj and the other on 17th of Rabi-ul-Awal to celebrate the death anniversaries of Mir Syed Ali Hamadani and his son respectively. Thousands of people from many parts of Pulwama and Anantnag districts assemble at the shrine to pay homage to the saints of these festivals.

Rainiur is a pasture situated in the south of Shupiyan town near Hapatkud hill. It bounds in flowers of different colours. Bakerwals from Rajouri stay in this pasture for the whole of summer alongwith their herds.

The district has a vast potential for tourism. The scenic spots of Aharbal, Kung-waltan, Dubjan and Kounsernag of Shupiyan area are too well known as spots for mountainering and trekking. The shikargah area in Tral presents a very beautiful abode for wild life. Development of these places as tourist-cum-health resorts and construction of requisite infrastructure around them can indeed add to their importance and tourist value.

Brief analysis of P. C. A. data

Part-B of this publication contains data collected during the 1981 Census in respect of each village and ward/mohalla of a town in the district on such aspects as, area, number of residential houses, number of households, total population with sex-wise break-up, scheduled caste population, literate and educated persons and sex-wise break-up of working population categorised into main workers, marginal workers and non-workers.

The information based on the Primary Census Abstract has been summarised in various inset tables giving an insight into the demographic structure of the population of the district at tehsil level. A brief analysis of data incorporated in these tehsils has been attempted hereafter so as to highlight the various demographic changes that have taken

place in the rural and urban areas of the district at tehsil level, particularly during the decade 1971-81.

The sub-joined table No. 1 gives an account of the distribution of population at tehsil level :

It will be seen that as a result of the bifurcation of the erstwhile Anantnag district into two districts viz; Anantnag and Pulwama, the 1981 jurisdiction of Pulwama district consisted of three tehsils made up of four towns and 554 villages, of which 18 are uninhabited. The total population returned by all the three tehsils of the district at the 1981 Census is 404,078 persons made up of

213,093 males and 190,985 females.

Pulwama tehsil tops all other tehsils both in the size of population and number of villages and towns within its jurisdiction followed by Shupiyan tehsil. All the tehsils have a small urban component.

Table No. 2 below depicts the decennial changes in the distribution of tehsil-wise population in the district :

The table reveals that the district has registered a growth rate of 28.62 percent in its population in the decade 1971-81 which is lower than the growth rate for the State as a whole which stands at 29.69 percent. Amongst the tehsils, however, Pulwama stands out with a rate of population growth higher than even the State rate. The growth rate in Pulwama urban is much more phenomenal due primarily to the creation of Pulwama town comprising of four analogous villages during the intercensal period.

From the above table it is evident that out of 536 inhabited villages in the district as many as 216 villages or 40.30 percent have population in range of 500-1999 persons while 38.62 percent have it in the range of 200-499 persons. Villages with population less than 200 constitute 15.67 percent while those with population of 2,000 or more persons form 5.22 percent of the total inhabited villages of the district. There is only one village having returned a population of more than 5,000.

It will be seen that the density ranges of 21-50 and 51-100 persons per sq. km. together claim 470 or 88% of the total villages of the district, the share of each of these two ranges being 63.25% and 24.44% respectively. Of the remaining 66 villages 36 fall in the density range of 11-20 persons per sq. km. The share of lower ranges of density is indeed negligible. One village shown in the table with density range unspecified is actually a forest block not recognised as a revenue village as such but accorded separate identity during 1981 Census enumeration.

It will be seen that out of the 536 inhabited villages in the district, there is only one village where Scheduled Castes constitute an element of the village population and that also just in the range of 5% or less.

It will be seen that villages in the population range of 500-1,999, 2,000-4,999 and 5,000-9,999 are better placed in the matter of literacy level than those in the lower range of population. However, considering the fact that the average rural literacy rate

for the state as a whole as returned at the 1981 Census is 21.63% which itself is no satisfactory level, it is only the single village falling in the population range of 5,000-9,999 which can be treated as possessed of a reasonably satisfactory literacy rate, the position being lower than even the State average in case of the other three specified ranges.

Table No. 7 below indicates the urban literacy rates in the district.

It will be seen that while all the four towns in the district fall below the State average urban literacy level of 45.56%. Shupiyan and Tral are placed better than the other two towns with a literacy rate of 41.43 and 34.73 respectively. Pampore stands at the bottom with a corresponding rate of 31.15 only.

We have already seen that both in the matter of rural as well as urban literacy the district has to make a large leeway even to come up to the level as obtained for the State as a whole. Down at the tehsil level the position is still worse in respect of Shupiyān and Pulwama tehsils where the literacy rate has been returned at 17.82 percent and 20.21 percent respectively, corresponding to 20.47% for the district as a whole. Trāl which is a smaller tehsil in the district in population, is however, better placed with both total and rural literacy being higher than for the district as a whole. As between the two sexes, male literacy level far outweighs the female literacy level in all the tehsils. The differential is, however, far greater in rural areas than in the urban areas. Percentage of main workers to total population as reproduced in cols. 11-13 shows that male work participation rate in urban areas generally trails behind that in rural areas. The differential is, however, marginal in all the tehsils. In the case of female participation rate which though very low in all the tehsils, the position as between the rural and urban components is just the reverse in all the tehsils. Amongst the tehsils the highest rural participation rate for males has been returned by Shupiyān at 54.06% corresponding to 52.91% reported for the district. In case of female rural participation rate, Trāl has returned a rate of 4.46 which is higher than the corresponding rate of 2.52% returned for the district. Except for Pulwama the urban participation rate in respect of both sexes is also higher in all tehsils than for the district as a whole. Marginal workers as will be noticed from cols. 14-16 of the statement constitute 21.66% of the total population of the district. At the tehsil level, this proportion varies from 20.58% in Pulwama tehsil to 24.86% in Trāl tehsil. It is, however,

significant to note that in all tehsils predominal proportion of the marginal workers are claimed by the female population of the rural component. It is a traditional feature of the rural economy that the female folk though primarily engaged in household activities contribute their bit by marginal participation in seasonal economic activities like agricultural operations and household industries. It will thus be seen that proportion of rural marginal female workers to total rural female population varies from 41.74% in Pulwama tehsil to 48.23% in Trāl tehsil. Even in urban areas where marginal workers claim relatively much smaller proportion in both sexes, the proportion of females outweighs the male proportion in all the tehsils of the district.

The proportion of total workers made up of main workers and marginal workers put together is brought out in col. 17-19 of the table. It will be seen that in the case of male population the proportion of workers outstrips the proportion of non-workers in all tehsils both in rural and urban parts. In the case of female population, however, the rate of non-workers is higher than that of workers except in tehsil Trāl. In the case of Trāl this position occurs because it has returned 48.23% of its rural female population as marginal workers which is the highest position recorded for any tehsil.

Analysis of village directory data

The data collected from the revenue and other Government agencies regarding availability of various amenities has been tabulated in the main village directory statement. The salient features of this data in broad aggregates is brought out below in the form of inset tables.

The position of availability of various amenities at district/tehsil level is indicated in the following table :

The table reveals that of the total 536 inhabited villages in the district, 385 accounting for 71.83 percent villages have one or the other type of educational institutions like middle, high, higher secondary schools located within the villages and this amenity is almost evenly distributed in all the three tehsils.

As regards medical facility, however, only 58 villages have either a dispensary or primary health centre or a hospital which makes a meagre proportion of 10.82 percent of the total villages. Inter-tehsil comparison shows that the proportion of villages covered under this basic amenity is 9.78 percent in Shupiyan tehsil, 11.21 percent in Pulwama tehsil and 12.66 percent in Tral tehsil.

Drinking water facility is, however, available to all the villages in the district from one source or the other. However, protected drinking water supply is available to 160 villages which form just 30% of the total number of villages which makes a poor position indeed. In the matter of Post & Telegraph facilities while the proportion of villages covered is 15.11

percent at the district level, Shupiyan and Pulwama tehsils fall below this level with a corresponding proportion of 13.78% and 14.66% villages respectively covered under this facility. On the other hand Tral fares better with a proportion of 20.25% villages covered. In communications Shupiyan tehsil has to make a large leaway even to reach the level of Pulwama and Tral tehsils in as much as the proportion of villages covered there is only 29.78 percent as compared to 47.41 and 64.56 percent in Pulwama and Shupiyan tehsils respectively. As regards approach by pucca road again Shupiyan lags far behind other two tehsils in the district, the proportion of villages covered being 33.78 percent against the corresponding proportion of 49.57% and 67.09% in Pulwama and Tral respectively. The progress is by far the most significant in the matter of rural electrification with 518 villages out of a total of 536 in the district covered under this amenity. Down at tehsil level the coverage is 100.00 percent in Tral and Pulwama tehsils and 92.00 percent in Shupiyan tehsil, a satisfactory position indeed.

The table No. 10 below highlights the availability of various amenities in terms of proportion of population served by each :

It will be noticed that the position is relatively brighter in terms of the population served by various amenities even in fields like medical care, post and telegraph offices and communication than what came out in the earlier table in terms of the proportion of villages both for the district as a whole as also at the tehsil level. Of course the proportion of population benefitted is nearly full or substantial only in the fields of education and power supply. However, even in respect of other amenities a better position emerges in all the tehsils.

Distribution of villages not having certain amenities arranged by distance ranges from the places where these are available are indicated in table No. 11 below :

This table makes rather an encouraging reading. It will be noticed that more than 90 percent of the villages where medical care, communications or post & telegraph facilities are not available within the village fall within a distance of less than 5 kms. from the place where these facilities are available. Even for the bulk of the remaining small proportion these facilities are available within a distance of 5-10 Kms. As regards education all but 5 of the 151 villages where this amenity is not available also fall within a distance of less than 5 Kms. Out of remaining 5 villages where this facility is not available 4 villages fall within a distance of 5-10 Kms. and 1 village within a distance of 10+Kms. It is thus clear that practically all the basic amenities are available to most of the rural population of the district within a distance of less than 5 Kms. of their village of residence if not within the village itself and the proportion of population which has to walk a distance of more than 10 Kms. to avail of any particular amenity is negligible indeed.

It will be seen that distance from the nearest town does not seem to have any major effect on the provision of various amenities in the village except for medical care, post & telegraph and to some extent communication and approach by pucca road facilities where the villages placed at a distance of 15 Kms. and above seem for good reasons to have received relatively better attention than those placed nearer a town.

However, the difference in the proportion is not as substantial as one should have expected and this might possibly be so due to a relatively less proportion of population inhabiting the more distant villages.

Below mentioned table gives the distribution of villages according to population ranges and amenities available to them :

As will be observed the population size of the villages has a direct bearing on determining the position of various amenities with more populated villages expectedly attracting more attention than less populated villages. The highest beneficiaries are obviously the villages with a population of 2,000 and more in the field of practically each basic amenity and the least proportion is of those with a population of 500 or less, particularly in the field of post & telegraph and medical care facilities where the coverage of such villages is less than 4 percent.

It will be noticed that practically all the tehsils of the district are more or less evenly placed both in terms of the proportion of cultivable area to total area as in the proportion of irrigated area to total cultivable area. The relatively bigger tehsils of Pulwama and Shupiyan do not differ much in the proportion of the cultivable area to total area from the tehsil of Tral which is relatively much smaller. In every tehsil irrigated area makes a proportion of more than 40% to 50% of the total cultivable area which is significant indeed.

Brief analysis of Town Directory Data

Separate data in respect of urban population structure, civic finance, the availability of various amenities has been compiled in the main town directory table I to VI. For facilitating a brief commentary and assessment of the progress made by urban population some of the urban statistics have further been sub-divided in table Nos. 16 to 21.

The sub-joined table No. 16 indicates the figures relating to urban population, its percentage variation density and sex-ratio :

As can be seen from the table Pulwama district lags behind the State as a whole in its progress towards urbanisation, the position having been consistently so during the last three decades. The district thus continues to be predominantly rural in character, the proportion of urban population having increased only to 8.98 percent in 1981 as against 4.67 percent in 1961. The corresponding proportion for the state as a whole has increased to 21.05 percent in 1981 as against 16.66 percent in 1961. The pace of urbanisation during the decade 1971-81 has also been much lower in the district as compared to the State although in the preceding decade, the position seems to have been vice-versa. As regards density of population, in the absence of area figures for the State urban for 1961 and 1971, comparable picture is available only for 1981 indicating that urban density of population per Sq. km. in Pulwama district is only 1998 as against the State density of 2146 per Sq. km. In the urban sex-ratio, however, the district compares favourably with the State, both showing steady increase since 1961, the pace in the case of Pulwama

district, being even slightly better than that for the State, although in both cases it still continues to be adverse to females.

It will be seen from the above mentioned table that over the last ten years Pulwama N.A. has come to be recognised as one of the towns of the district while there has been no declassification of any town previously recognised as such. In this way the number of towns in the district has gone up to 4 in 1981 as against 3 in 1971.

It will be seen that both in per capita receipt as well as expenditure Pampore town is ahead of other towns in the district. The other town which is relatively better placed than Pulwama and Tral is Shupiyam town. However, the per capita receipt in Pampore and Shupiyam towns comes from taxes and other sources and good proportion of per capita expenditure similarly goes in general administration in both the towns. The total per capita receipt and expenditure in Tral and Pulwama towns are lower than in other towns.

It will be observed from the table that towns with smaller population have been better provided for in terms of schools of various levels than those with larger population, the chief consideration probably having been to equip these towns with such facilities

regardless of whether they deserve these at all in relation to their population.

It will be seen that Shupiyan town with a total population strength of 30 hospital beds is placed better than any other town with 3.11 beds per 1,000 population. Pulwama and Tral are the other towns which though far behind than Shupiyan with a strength of 1.29 and 1.24 beds per 1,000 of total population respectively have still an edge over the town of Pampore which has a strength of 0.92 beds per 1,000 population and is on the lower side of the district strength which stands at 1.65 per 1,000 total population.

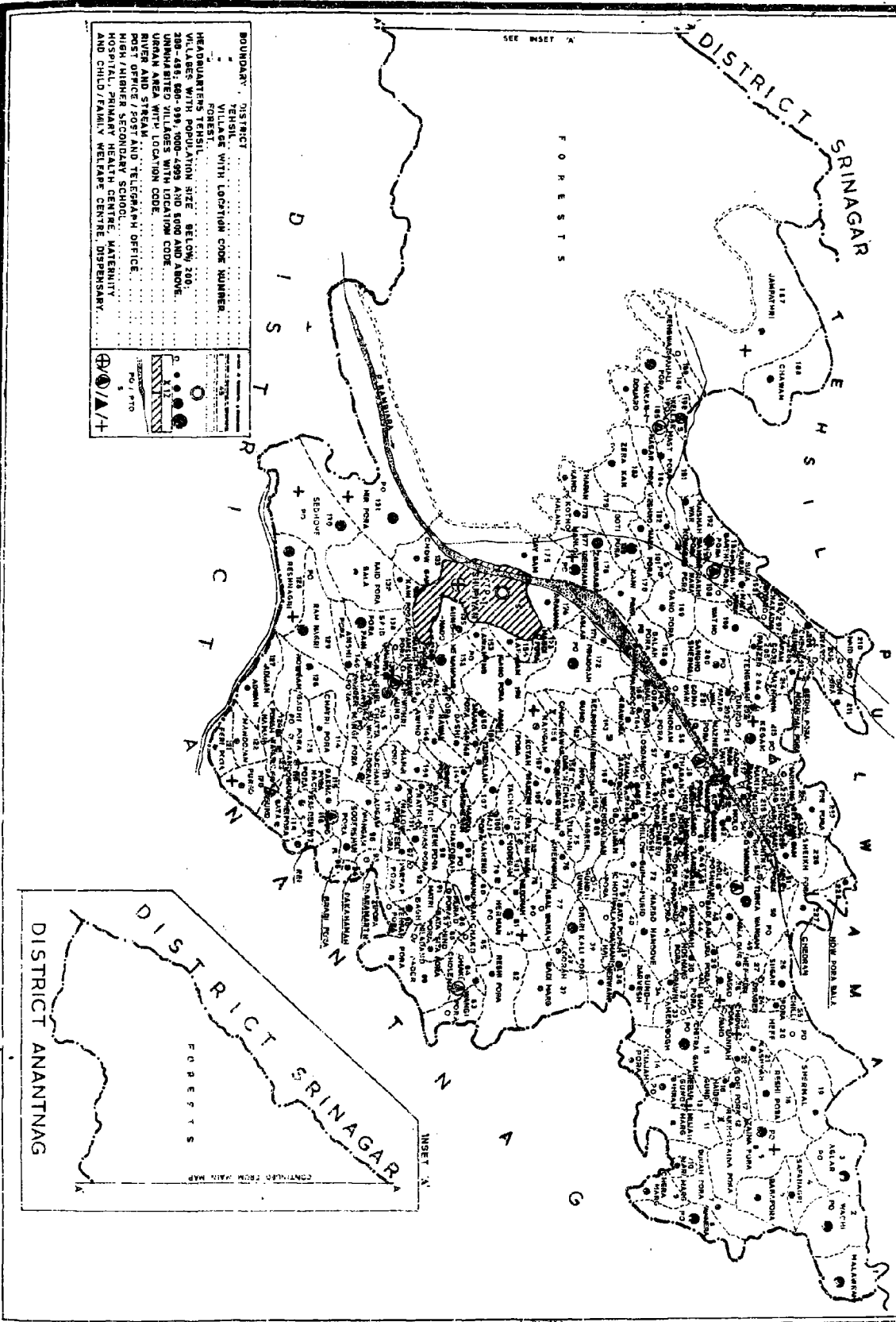

While the table speaks for itself, it will be observed that the most important commodity of manufacture in each town is one or the other item of handicrafts, be it furniture carpets, namdass or woollen blankets. On the export side, however, the most important commodity in case of Pampore town is Saffron, while in the other three towns it is fruit, though not of the same type in each case. As regards imports it is indeed difficult to precisely identify which particular commodity is the most important, the range of imports into the town being very wide practically of equal importance. Even so the most important commodity into the town has been reported as food in case of Pampore and cloth in respect of the other two towns.

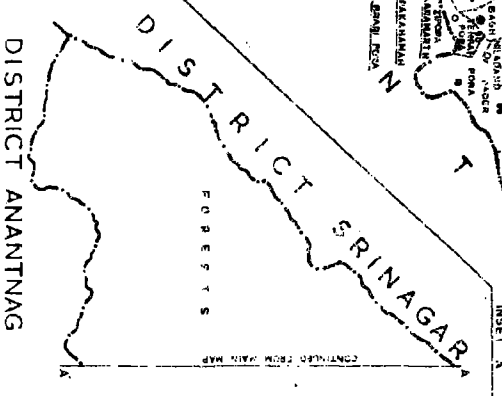

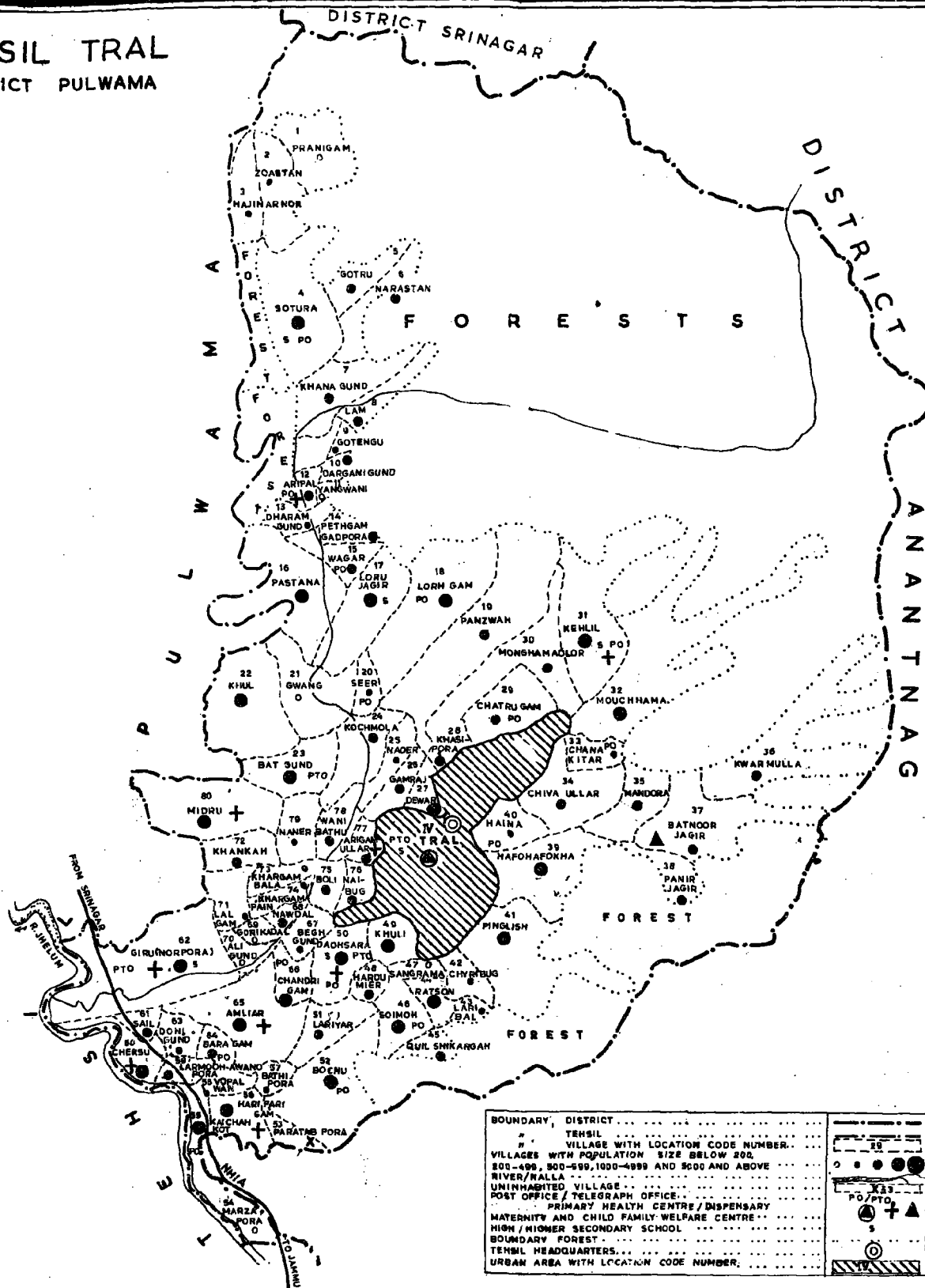
