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FOREWORD

The district census handbook (DCH), compiled by the Census Organisation on behalf of the State Governments, is one of the most valuable products of the Census. The DCH is constantly referred to by planners, administrators, academicians and researchers. It is *inter alia* used for delimitation of constituencies, formulation of local level and regional plans and as an aid to District Administration. The district census handbook is the only publication which provides Primary Census Abstract (PCA) data upto village level for the rural areas and wardwise for each city or town. It also provides data on infrastructure and amenities in villages and towns, etc.

The district census handbook series was initiated during the 1951 Census. It contained important census tables and PCA for each village and town of the district. During 1961 Census the scope of the DCH was enlarged and it contained a descriptive account of the district, administrative statistics, census tables and a village and town directory, including PCA. The 1971 DCH series was planned in three parts. Part-A related to village and town directory, Part-B to village and town PCA and Part-C comprised analytical report, administrative statistics, district census tables and certain analytical tables based on PCA and amenity data in respect of villages. However, in some states it was confined to district census tables and in a few cases altogether given up due to delay in compilation and printing.

While designing the format of 1981 DCH series some new features along with the restructuring of the formats of village and town directory have been attempted. At the same time, comparability with the 1971 data has also been kept in view. All the amenities except power supply in the village have been brought together in the village directory with the instruction that in case an amenity is not available in the referent village

the distance in broad ranges from the nearest place where the amenity is available may be given. The restructuring of the format of the village directory and incorporating more exhaustive data on infrastructure aspect particularly in relation to amenities and land-use pattern is expected to further meet the need of micro level planning for rural areas. It is expected to help not only in local area planning but regulating the provision of goods and services as well, so as to minimise the regional imbalances in the process of development. A few new items of information have also been introduced to meet some of the requirements of the Revised Minimum Needs Programme. Such new items of information as adult literacy centres, primary health subcentres, and community health workers in the village have been introduced in the village directory with this objective in mind. The new item on approach to the village is to have an idea about the villages in the district which are inaccessible. A new column, "total population and number of households" has been introduced to examine the correlation of the amenities with the population and number of households they serve. Addition of two more appendices listing the villages where no amenities are available and according to the proportion of scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population to the total population has also been made with this view in mind.

The formats of the town directory have also been modified to meet the requirements of the Minimum Needs Programme by providing information on a few new items. A new statement on civic and other amenities in slums in Class-I and Class-II towns (statement IV-A) has been introduced with this objective in mind. It is expected that this will help the planners to chalk out programmes on provision of civic amenities for the improvement of slums. The columns on Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes population in statement IV relating to civic and other amenities and

adult literacy classes / centres under educational facilities in statement V are also added *inter alia* with this view. A significant addition is class of town in all the seven statements of the town directory. The infrastructure of amenities in urban areas of the country can be best analysed by taking the class of towns into consideration. The addition of the columns on civic administration status and population in a few statements also serves this purpose.

The formats of the primary census abstract for the villages and towns has been formulated in the light of changes in the economic and other questions canvassed through the individual slip of 1981 Census.

In order to avoid delay in publication of 1981 DCH Series it has been so designed that Part-A of the volume contains village and town directory and Part-B, the PCA of villages and towns including the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes PCA upto Tehsil/ Town levels. At the beginning of the DCH a detailed analytical note supported by a number of inset tables based on PCA and

non census data in relation to the infrastructure has been introduced to enhance its value. The district and tehsil / Police Station / C.D. Block etc., level maps depicting the boundaries and other important features have been inserted at appropriate places, to further enhance the value of the publication.

This publication is a joint venture of the State Government and the Census Organisation. The data have been collected and compiled in the State under the direction of Shri A. H. Khan, IAS, Director of Census Operations, Jammu and Kashmir, Srinagar on behalf of the State Government which has borne the cost of printing. The task of planning, designing and coordination of this publication was carried out by Shri N. G. Nag, Deputy Registrar General (Social studies) of my office. Dr. B. K. Roy, Deputy Registrar General (Map) provided the technical guidance in the preparation of the maps. Data received from Census Directorates have been scrutinized in the Social Studies Division at the headquarters under the guidance of Shri M. M. Dua, Senior Research Officer, I am thankful to all who have contributed in this project.

P R E F A C E

The compilation and publication of District Census Handbooks has been a traditional feature of the Indian census since 1951. However, in Jammu and Kashmir State, where no census was conducted in 1951 due to the unsettled conditions prevailing then, this work was taken up as a regular feature of census since 1961 with certain improvements and additions in the data content of the publication at the 1971 census, further enhancing its utility for the Data Users.

The 1981 series of the District Census Handbook which we have begun with the district of Punch will contain two parts each. Part A deals with Town and Village Directory and Part B consists of Town and Villagewise Primary Census Abstract. In 1971 census there was also third part of the Handbook, published as a separate volume, comprising administrative and census statistics. However, in view of the considerable delay experienced then in getting the relevant administrative statistics pertaining to various departments, compilation of this volume has been given up at the 1981 census. It is expected that such statistics would be available to the data users in the usual publications of the State Directorate of Evaluation and Statistics.

The Town Directory of the Handbook consists of seven statements which are almost similar to those adopted for the 1971 census except that a few new columns have been added to facilitate analysis of the data. A significant addition is of class of town in every statement which has been done on the consideration that the infrastructure of amenities and facilities found in urban India can best be analysed with reference to this specific parameter. The addition of the column on civic administration status in statements III and IV and population in statements IV and V also serves the same purpose vis-a-vis the respective statements. Due consideration has also been given to the Minimum Needs

Programme of the Planning Commission. The columns on Scheduled Caste population in statement IV and adult literacy classes/centres in statement V are a sequel to this programme.

The Village Directory also follows the same pattern as in 1971 census except again for a few additional columns. The column on total population and number of households has been added to facilitate analysis of the other data in the Directory. The column on approach to village is to identify the number of inaccessible villages in the district. The column on number of households living in owned houses or possessing house sites in the village is again intended to cater to the Minimum Needs Programme of the Planning Commission.

It is hoped that with its present content the Handbook would, more than ever, serve as a useful reference publication, particularly for such Administrators and Data users as have to deal with planning, implementation and evaluation of development programmes, including the Minimum Needs Programme, at the grass roots level.

The compilation of the Handbook would not have been possible but for the cooperation extended by the Revenue, Education, Medical, Public Health and other local authorities of the District in making relevant data available, for which we owe them our grateful thanks.

It must be stated here that the task of finalising and printing the present volume has fallen on me, since Shri A. H. Khan, IAS, Director of Census Operations, Jammu and Kashmir, under whose able stewardship the census operations of 1981 were carried out, retired from Government service by the time the volume could be taken up for compilation.

We are grateful to Shri P. Padmanabha, IAS, Registrar General and Census Commissioner of India and Shri N. G. Nag, Deputy Registrar

General (Social Studies) whose detailed instructions, guidance and advice were available all through.

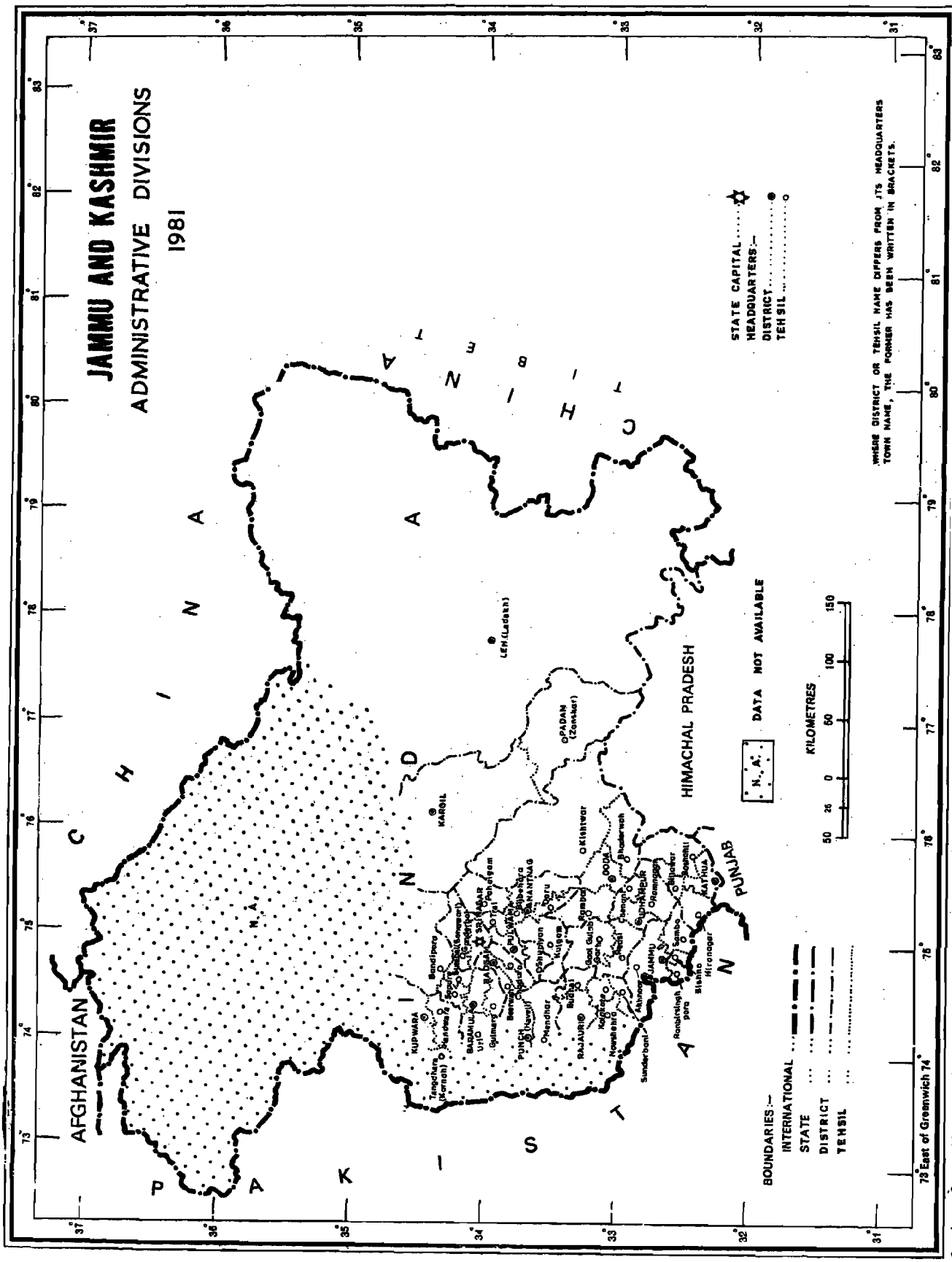

ANALYTICAL NOTE

A description of the various concepts used at the 1981 Census and a broad appraisal of the administrative statistics vis-a-vis the history of the district, the social and cultural changes witnessed by the district during the last ten years particularly in relation to economic resources, social, cultural and developmental activities and a brief description of the places of historical and religious importance in the district is given in the following pages :

Rural/Urban classification

For the 1981 census the classification of urban areas have been based on the following criteria :

- a) All places with a municipality, corporation or cantonment board or notified town area committee.
- b) All other places which satisfied the following tests :
 - i) A minimum population of 5,000.
 - ii) At least 75 percent of male working population engaged in non-agricultural (and allied) activity.
 - iii) A density of population of at least 400 per Sq. Km. (1,000 per Sq. mile)

The places which satisfied the criterion (a) above were treated as statutory towns while those as were not statutory towns but satisfied the tests laid down in criterion (b) above were treated as census towns. All other places which did not satisfy either of the above two criteria were classified as rural. Areas which qualified to be treated as towns under criterion (a) and (b) above were further classified by population ranges in the following order :

Census House

A Census house was defined as a building or part of a building having a separate main entrance from the road or common courtyard or staircase etc. used or recognised as a separate unit. It may be occupied or vacant. It may be used for a residential or non-residential purposes or both.

Census Household

A household for purposes of the 1981 census has been defined as a group of persons who commonly live together and would take their meals from a common kitchen unless the exigencies of work prevented any of them from doing so. There may be a household of persons related by blood or a household of unrelated persons or having a mix of both.

Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe

In Jammu and Kashmir State there are no scheduled tribes. However, the following 13 castes stand notified as scheduled castes under the State constitution :

1. Barwala
2. Basith
3. Chamar or Ramdasia
4. Batwal
5. Chura
6. Dhyar
7. Doom or Māhasha
8. Gardi
9. Jolaha
10. Megh or Kabirpanthi
11. Ratal
12. Saryara
13. Watal

At the 1981 Census only those persons who returned themselves as belonging to any of the 13 castes specified above was treated as scheduled caste.

Literacy

For purposes of Census a person was treated as literate if he/she could read and write in any language with understanding power. A person who could merely read but was not able to write was classified as illiterate. For a person to be treated as literate it was not necessary that he/she should have received any formal education or should have passed any minimum educational standard.

Workers/Non-workers

For the 1981 Census a person was treated mainly as a worker if he/she had participated in any kind of economically productive work during the major part of the reference year i.e. at least 6 months or 183 days or more prior to the date of enumeration. A person who claimed to have participated in any kind of economically productive work for less than six months prior to the date of enumeration was treated as marginal worker. However, persons who did not participate in any kind of economically productive work during the whole period of the reference year were treated as non-workers.

Introduction

Like most of the districts of the State, Srinagar is named after its headquarter town which is also the summer capital of the State Government. The district occupies the central sector of Kashmir valley and its boundaries extend from Baltal in the east to the mountain ranges about 16 kms. beyond Wangat in the north and to Toshmaidan in the south west. It is intersected by the national highways connecting Pathankot with Jammu, Srinagar and Ladakh. The district is bounded in the north by tehsil Sonawari of District Baramula, in the north-east and east by district Kargil, in the south by district Pulwama and in the south-west and west by tehsil Chadura/Beerwah of Badgam district and tehsil Baramula of Baramula district.

Brief history of the district

Mr. Stein in his book has observed that the history of Kashmir has always been reflected as it were in that of its capital which has not changed its site for more than

13 centuries. Hiun-Tsiang, who visited this capital in about 631 A.D., found it already in position where most of the present city of Srinagar is situated. He describes it as situated along the bank of a great river, i.e., the vitasta now known as Jehlum. The two and a half miles represented by the Chinese measurement of 12 or 13 li, as described by Hiuen-Tsiang; agree accurately with the length of the city within its ancient limits along the right bank of the vitasta. The estimate of its breadth at some-what less than one mile (4 or 5 li) is equally correct. He has referred to it as the new city to distinguish it from the old capital which was situated at Pandrethan, a village about 3.2 kms. to the south-east of Srinagar. According to Kalhana, Pandrethan which then known as Puranadhisthana (meaning the old capital) or Srinagar was founded by Ashoka the Great at the south foot of a mountain spur which rises with bold slopes to a height of some 3000 feet above the village. According to him though Puranadhisthana had sunk to non-importance already in Hindu times, extensive remains of ancient buildings can still be traced on the terraced slopes rising immediately to the north and north-east of Pandrethan. Those to the north extend close to the gap, known as Aitgaj, between the Takhti-sulaiman and the hills east to it. The advantages of Pandrethan as the site for a great city cannot be compared with those offered by the position of Srinagar. Yet the close vicinity of the Vitasta (Jehlum) coupled with the security from floods which the near hill-slopes afford, must have been appreciated in an early period when probably the riverine flats of the valley were less drained. The name Srinagar which means the city of Sri or Lakshmi appears to have been assigned to the capital to commemorate the Buddhist Monastery built by Ashoka between Pandrethan and the nearby steep hill side at a distance of 2 miles from Pandrethan.

It is, however, said that the new city was founded by king Pravarasena II some times about the middle of the 6th century. Kalhana has referred to it as Pravarapura, an abridged name for Pravarasenapura. Since the city was practically contiguous to the older Srinagari and existed for centuries side by side, it could not retain its official name for long and was

thus known by the old familiar name i.e., Srinagar, exactly in the same way as the several new cities founded by successive kings in the vicinity of Delhi continued to be known simply by the name of Delhi, though each of them was originally intended to bear the distinctive name of its founder. Kalhana has cited an interesting legend which led to the demarcation of the site of the new capital. It is said that when the king returned from his victorious expeditions, he decided to build a new capital which was to bear his name. He set out at night from his palace in Puranadhisthana to ascertain in a supernatural way the proper site and the auspicious time for laying the foundation of the new city. He reached a stream and found a demon of terrible form on the other bank. The demon promised him the fulfilment of his desire, subject to the condition that the king crossed over to his side by the embankment which the demon offered to provide for the purpose. The king agreed and the demon stretched his knee causing thereby the water of the stream to part on either side of the embankment. The king drew out his dagger and cut with it steps into the flesh of the demon's leg and crossed over to the other side. The demon then indicated to him the auspicious time and advised him to build the capital at the place where he would find the measuring line laid down on the following morning. Next day the king discovered the line at the village of Saritaka where goddess Sarika and the demon Atta resided. Here he is believed to have founded the city and built the first shrine known as Siva Pravaresvara. It is clear that the stream referred to in the legend is the canal known as Tsunth-kul which flows the Dal lake into Vitasta (Jhelum).

Village saritaka has since been completely wiped out and is no longer traceable. Its position is however still identifiable due to its association with goddess Sarika, a form of Durga which is being worshipped since times out of mind on the hill now known as Hariparbat.

The city of Srinagari was confined in the beginning to the right bank of river Jhelum but later on it was extended to the left bank also, so as to include the portion enclosed by

the canal known as Kut-Kul which takes off from the river below Shergari and joins it again near the 7th bridge. The royal palace was for the first time, transferred to the sector during the reign of king Ananta (1028-63 A.D.).

The exceptional position of Srinagar can be safely attributed to the great natural advantages of its site. Occupying a place close to the true centre of the valley, Srinagar enjoys facilities of communication which no other site could offer. Before the advent of road transport, the river along which the city is built, provided at all seasons the most convenient route for trade and traffic both up and down the valley i.e. from Khanabal in Anantnag town to Khadanyar in Baramula district. The lakes viz. Dal and Anchar, which flank Srinagar, furnished an abundant supply of products which materially contribute towards the maintenance of a large city population.

Brief history of District Census Handbook

The district Census Handbooks were published for the first time in 1951 as a part of the Census publication programme in almost all States of India except Jammu and Kashmir State where due to the disturbed conditions prevailing in the wake of tribal invasion of 1947-48 no census could be undertaken and as such no data was collected for the decade 1941-51. The publication of District Census Handbook series fulfilled a long felt need. These gave out not only the data contained in Primary Census Abstract according to new classifications but included a sufficient account of the district and its people, and a vast magnitude of other data covering such topics as communication, education, public health etc. in respect of each town and village of the district. Consequently, these have been found to be of immense help to all the departments of the State Government for planning and development at the grass-roots level. With the introduction of single line administration at the district level, the utility and importance of these publications for constant use and reference by District Development Commissioners has increased enormously. The present handbook is proposed to contain even more comprehensive data than in the past so as to

meet also the requirements of minimum needs programme set forth by the Planning Commission. The publication will besides the basic population data emanating from the 1981 Census, contain comprehensive information pertaining to amenities and land-use pattern and other infrastructural statistics in respect of each village and town of the district so as to serve as a ready reference material for planners and administrators for assessment of past achievements and formulation of new programmes of development at the grass-roots level.

Town Directory

The Town Directory covers information at town level and includes items such as status of administration, growth of population, growth pattern since 1901, physical aspects and location, civic finances, civic and other amenities, medical, educational, recreational and cultural facilities, trade, industry and commerce, banking facilities etc.

In addition, demographic data like sex-ratio, number of households, density of population and position of civic and other amenities in notified or recognised slums of class I & II towns have also been introduced. Considering the increasing employment of women in urban areas and the consequent housing need of single working woman, it has been felt necessary to indicate in the town directory also such information as the number of working women hostels with number of seats.

A broad appraisal of the data incorporated in the seven statements of the town directory is attempted in the following paragraphs :

Statement-I gives information on civic administration status as in 1980, growth history of towns from 1901 to 1981, sex ratio of towns from 1961 to 1981, density and area.

Statement-II gives the physical as well as locational aspects of towns of the district. Under the physical aspects data on annual rainfall (in m.m.) and maximum and minimum temperature (in centegrade) have been highlighted. The statement also gives information on distance of the town from the nearest city with a population of one lakh and above, distance from the State, district and tehsil

Hqrs., from the railway station and bus route. It also provides information on the existence of river/canal if any within 10 kms.

Statement-III provides the budgetary statements pertaining to the financial year 1978-79. The statement has been apportioned into the receipt and expenditure heads. Under the receipt head information has been given on such items as "receipt through taxes, revenue derived from municipal properties and power apart from taxation, Government grants, loans, advances and other sources". Expenditure head shows expenditure on general administration, public safety, public health and conveniences, public works, public institutions and others.

Statement-IV depicts civic and other amenities available in the towns of Srinagar District and gives information on such items as length of the road in the town, system of sewerage, number and type of laterine, method and disposal of night soil, source and capacity of drinking water and fire fighting services. The statement also highlights the pattern of electricity consumed in the town and indicates the number of connections under sub-head like domestic, industrial, commercial, road-lighting and others.

Statement IV-A is meant to depict civic and other amenities available in the notified slums of Class I & II towns.

Statement-V gives medical, educational, recreational and cultural facilities as were available in towns in 1979. Under medical facilities are indicated the type of medical institutions and the number of medical beds available. Likewise, different types of educational institutions available have been covered under educational facilities. Information regarding the number of cinema houses, stadia, auditoria/drama halls and public libraries have also been incorporated in the statement to bring out the extent of availability of recreational and cultural facilities. In addition, information about number of working women hostels has also been given in the statement. If a medical or an educational facility was not available in the town, the name of the nearest place where it is available has also been given in the statement.

Statement-VI gives the facilities of trade, commerce, industry and banking available in the towns in 1979. Besides, the number of credit cooperative societies operating, the details of three most important commodities imported, exported and manufactured in the towns have also been indicated.

Village Directory

The village directory portion of the handbook depicts particulars of amenities available in each village of the district in the field of education, medical care, power supply, drinking water, post and telegraph, communication, besides information about land use and places of religious, historical and archaeological importance in the village. In case where a particular amenity is not available within the village, distance at which such a facility is available, even in the most modest form has been indicated in three broad ranges viz. —5 kms., 5—10 kms. and 10+ kms. If there are composite schools, like middle schools with primary classes, or secondary schools with middle classes, these have also been included in the number of primary and middle schools, respectively. For example, if in a village or a town there were two primary schools and one middle school with primary classes, in the village/town the number have been given as three and that of middle school as one even though there are only three educational institutions, so also in case of secondary schools.

The village directory also carries the following four appendices :

- Appendix-I : It gives the abstract of educational, medical and other amenities available in the tehsils of the district.
- Appendix-II : It furnishes the land utilisation data in respect of census towns. This appendix, however, is not relevant to district.
- Appendix-III : This is a list of villages where no amenities other than drinking water like education, medical, post and telegraph, communication, power supply are available.

Appendix-IV : It provides a list of villages according to the proportion of scheduled caste population by ranges.

All these appendices appears after the main village directory.

Primary Census Abstract

The Primary Census Abstract part of the publication is exclusively based on the 1981 census data. It provides information in respect of each village and ward/mohalla of a town at tehsil level in respect of its area, number of residential houses, number of households, total population, scheduled caste population, literate and educated persons and working population by sex in 4 broad industrial categories viz. (i) cultivators, (ii) agricultural labourers, (iii) household industry, manufacturing, processing, servicing and repairs and (iv) other workers besides non-workers as a separate category.

Special PCA on Scheduled Castes

It is for the first time that a special Primary Census Abstract has been introduced in the DCHBs for the scheduled caste population. The special PCA provides information pertaining to scheduled castes in respect of number of residential houses and their population, literates, main workers classified by cultivators, agricultural labourers, workers in the household industry and other workers, marginal workers and non-workers classified by sex. This PCA is also presented for District, Tehsil and Town levels.

Physical Aspects

The valley of Kashmir has been spoken of as an emerald set in pearls, a land of lakes, clear streams, green turfs, magnificent trees and mighty mountains. This description is particularly true of the territory falling within the jurisdiction of Srinagar district. The grim mountain Harmukh (16,903 feet) which guards the valley of Sindh, stands in the east. Further south is Mahadeo, which seems to almost look down on Srinagar. Toshmaidan (14,000 feet) lies in the north and the Snowy Kazi-Nag (12,125 feet) in the north-west. The

area enclosed by these mountains is a flat valley interwoven with rivers, streams, nallahs and springs. River Jehlum cuts the district diagonally from south-east to north-west. Important among the streams are Sindh Nallah, Dood Ganga Nallah, Shadi Ganga Nallah, Flood Channel, Tsunth-Kul and Kut-Kul. The famous Dal Lake is situated in the east and Anchar Lake in the north-west of Srinagar city. The famous Mughal gardens viz. Cheshmashahi, Nishat and Shalimar attract thousands of visitors every year. These are splendidly situated on the hill slopes in the east of the city.

During the inter-censal period the district has undergone notable jurisdictional changes. The area of the district which stood at 3,103 sq. kms. in 1971 census has shrunk now to 2,228 sq. kms. This is because in the intercensal period the old district of Srinagar was bifurcated into two districts (a) Srinagar comprising tehsils of Srinagar and Ganderbal and (b) Badgam comprising the other three tehsils viz. Chadura, Badgam and Beerwah. In addition, six villages and three ghats of Sonawari tehsil of Baramula district were merged with the jurisdiction of Srinagar district. There are now 175 villages in the district as against 706 in 1971, which includes nine boat blocks and seven un-inhabited villages.

Major characteristics

Srinagar district is predominantly urban in character. As per 1981 Census urban population constituted a proportion of 80.50% of the total population of the district. Back in 1961 this population was 66.31% only. 77.30% of the population of Srinagar M.C. falls in Srinagar district, the rest being in Badgam district. Similarly 79.21% of the Srinagar Urban Agglomeration which comprises Srinagar M.C., Badamibagh Cantonment and eight villages constituting urban outgrowth falls in Srinagar district.

Srinagar attracts most of the tourism into the valley whether it is from the rest of the country or from foreign countries and as such it has developed all the characteristics of tourist paradise, with a mushroom growth and development of handicrafts and cottage

industries, hotels, houseboats, Guest houses and tourist transport. Tourism is thus the major industry in the district and its promotion and development has a direct bearing on the avenues of livelihood and prosperity of a large sector of the districts population.

Handicrafts of Srinagar have distinct reputation for ages. They have reached most corners of the world and fascinated the aesthetic and sophisticated tastes of customers from UK, USA, Canada, Australia, East Africa, Middle East, West Germany etc.

Mention may particularly be made of the following crafts of Srinagar :

1. Embroidery
2. Shawls
3. Woollen articles
4. Silks
5. Silver Crafts
6. Jewellery
7. Furs
8. Wood work
9. Papier machie
10. Numdahs (Felts)
11. Rugs (Chain stitched)
12. Carpets
13. Willow
14. Leather work (embroidered)

There are not many large scale industries in the district, particularly in the public sector but the small scale sector enjoys a place of pride in Srinagar. This sector has emerged in a big way and has made considerable contribution to the economic advancement of the district. 186 units in the field of food products, mushrooms, hosiery, leather, wood and wood products, paper products, chemical products and electrical products etc. are flourishing under the medium sector. Only two units viz. HMT watch factory and Indian Telephone Industry are in the central sector while one unit has been set up in the joint sector. The other units are either in the State public sector or in the private sector. Some

of the new schemes in Industries sector in the district, include an export oriented silk weaving factory, Rajbagh a twelve hundred spindle worsted plant at Bemina Srinagar and enhancement of spindlage of the Nowshehra mill to 6,000 from 3,600, the woollen Mills, Joinery Mills etc.

Industrial areas are being set up at Baghi-Ali-Mardan Khan, Ganderbal, Zainkoot, Rangreth, Khonmoh and Shalteng in the district. 270 small scale units have been granted permanent registration and 210 temporary registration under D.I.C. programme of the industries department in the year 1981-82. Young boys and girls have been trained in various handicrafts and as a follow-up programme some of them are being organised into co-operative societies.

Medical aid has been made available even in the remotest corners of the district. A number of diseases such as typhus, small pox, cholera have almost been eradicated. There are 144 different medical aid centres in the district such as 11 hospitals, 1 primary health centre, 35 allopathic dispensaries, 72 child welfare centres, two T.B. centres, 15 family welfare centres besides Nursing homes and other institutions.

The year 1981-82 marked the opening of 4 big medical institutions in Srinagar. These are the Sher-i-Kashmir Medical Institute, Bone and Joint Hospital, Barzulla, Lal Ded Hospital for women and children hospital at Lal Mandi. The opening of these hospitals constitutes a big leap favoured in the progress of the district in the field of medical care.

In the field of electricity although it will take quite some time to ensure adequate and stable power supply throughout the year, the available power supply has been extended even to isolated villages and far-flung areas, in-as-much as 159 out of a total of 160 villages stood electrified in 1981-82.

Provision of protected water supply to needy areas and augmenting the supplies in areas where it is inadequate is one of the important items in the minimum needs programme receiving the attention of the Government.

The city of Srinagar with its fast growing population however, is faced with shortage of drinking water and old and inadequate distribution system. Masterplans are under execution to remedy the situation.

The importance of road transport in the district with its peculiar geographical situation is evident. Water transport is very much limited in the district and the people have predominantly dependent on the road system. The total road length under State PWD was 392 kms. in 1980. This does not include the roads maintained by Beacons, Forest and Irrigation departments.

The achievements of the district in the field of education are not as poor as for the other valley districts. As against a literacy percentage of 26.67% for the State in 1981, the literate population of district constitutes 33.90% of its total population. The number of schools from primary to higher secondary level in the district stand at 696.

In 1981-82, 20 schools were upgraded, which consisted of 18 primary schools upgraded to middle standards and two middle schools upgraded to high schools.

There are 8 colleges in the district including 5 boys colleges, besides one university, one Medical college and one Engineering college.

Live-stock rearing is one of the important occupation in the district. About 5.25% of the working force is engaged in this pursuit. Animal husbandary and sheep breeding are receiving special attention of the Government. A planned programme has been initiated in the district for production of various hybrid varieties of sheep and other animals. According to live stock census the total number of animals recorded in 1977 is 0.55 lakh, out of which about 0.33 lakh milching cows were in the district. Under rural development programme, 700 units of Jersey Cows were distributed among cow rearers. Farmers get 25% subsidy to promote and develop the production of live-stock, which has helped augment the production of milk, meat, wool etc. substantially. In 1981-82 the production of milk was estimated to have

gone upto the level of about 270 thousand litres while that meat was estimated to have gone up to the level of 79 lakh kilograms. Likewise wool is also estimated to have crossed the production level of 19.30 lakh kilograms.

Under the National Rural Employment programme launched during the year 1981-82 185 schemes of construction work were taken up which included construction of 25 school buildings, 14 panchayat ghars, roads in rural areas and irrigation kohls. Under the programme great emphasis is being given to the development of minor and medium irrigation projects. The construction works on these projects have provided employment avenues to hundreds of unemployed youths. 240 unemployed youths have already been trained in various technical jobs. Saffron cultivation has also been successfully experimented in various parts of the district and shows a good prospect for expansion.

Srinagar district has a total area of 0.35 lakh hectares of which 0.25 lakh hectares of land is used for agricultural purposes including 0.03 lakh hectares which are sown more than once in a year. Rice and Maize are the main crops of the district with 75% land having been brought under irrigation.

The high yielding varieties programme which covers 173 hectares of area has been brought under a package programme in the district. Ten exhibition plots of rice known as variety No. 332 have been developed in 11 villages for production of potatoes.

Horticulture development is also receiving attention in the district. The estimate of production of fruit in the district has been recorded at 40 thousand metric tonnes. One Apple Centre has been opened in Shalimar where investigations are made for the development of better varieties of apple and other facilities.

Important places and fairs and festivals

Kashmir owes its superb gardens principally to emperor Jehangir and his queen Noor-Jehan and to his son Shah Jahan. These gardens represent an abiding contributions of the culture of Iran and central Asia to Kashmir.

The plan of Mughal gardens, as they are known, follows a regular and easily recognisable pattern. The shape is invariably rectangular and each garden is enclosed by a high wall with a central entrance and several subordinate gates at different places. The ground is arranged in terraces and from the level of one terrace to that of another water flows in a cascade down a sloping stone chute called as 'Chaddar' which is carved in various designs, such as waves and shells.

All the gardens grow irises, daffodils and tulips in spring and roses, carnations, holly hocks, delphinium etc., in summer. Chinars imported from Persia (Iran) have also been planted in the gardens and provide most comfortable shady places in mid-summer. Thousands of tourists visit these gardens in summer season. The gardens are however closed during winter season.

Shalimar :

According to Tarikh-i-Hasan Shalimar was the place of residence of a pious Brahmin, named Sogram Swami, who lived during the regime of Raja Parvarsen. As the Raja used to call on the saint frequently, he built a dignified building at the place for his occasional stay. The building was decorated by paintings and drawings of gods and goddesses and of ancient Rajas who ruled Kashmir. He is said to have named it as Shalimar which is a composite Sanskrit word meaning a beautiful house. With the passage of time the building dilapidated and was reduced to ruins. In 1029 Hijri, Corresponding to 1629 A.D., Emperor Jehangir built a garden at the site which according to Dr. Sofi, the author of 'Kasheer' was assigned a Turkish name Shalimar meaning comfort. The Tourism department has arranged a light and music show which is being enjoyed by the visitors daily in summer season. A play related to Mughal Emperors is an essential part of the show.

Nishat :

The garden which occupies an area of about 50 acres, has been laid at the foot of Zabarwan hill bordering Dal Lake in the east. It was built by Aasafjah, elder brother of queen Noor-Jehan and was later renovated by Emperor Shah Jahan. The garden can be

reached from Srinagar both by road as also by Shikara. Nishat is the best preserved of all gardens in the State and commands a splendid view across the whole of Dal Lake. It is built of 10 terraces, each consisting of lawns, flowers, beds, fountains and waterfalls. The State Government have of late been taking several measures to maintain the beauty of the garden. The garden is famous for its chinara trees which give a very charming look especially from western side at Dal Lake river. A number of apple, pear and other fruit trees add to its beauty besides providing a source of income to the Tourism Department.

Cheshma Shahi :

This is the smallest garden when compared with Nishat and Shalimar and is also situated very near to bank of Dal Lake. It has been laid on the foot of a small hill, round a copious spring which is widely reputed for its sweet and digestive waters. The garden was raised in 1632 by Ali Mardan Khan, the Mughal Governor of Kashmir during the regime of Emperor Shah Jahan. It consists of two terraces only which are sharply separated from each other by a height of 18 feet. The pavilions date from the period of Afghan rule, but fountains, water channels and reservoirs were constructed when the garden was built. It has been renovated and some old balconies reconstructed.

Dal Lake :

In Kashmiri Dal means a lake. It is a huge expanse of water situated in the east of Srinagar city. A boulevard has been constructed by the State Government along the southern and eastern bank of the lake which has immensely enhanced its beauty.

The lake has been divided into two sectors by a bund connecting Nishat garden with Naidyar, one of the eastern localities of Srinagar city. Two small isles one known as Sona Lank (Golden Isle) and the other called Ropa Lank (Silver Isle) have been built by Mughal emperor in southern and northern sectors of the lake respectively. Both are artificial masses of masonry, one measuring 40 and the other 50 yards on each side.

These delightful tourist resorts are thronged in summer by picnic parties who move about in lake in boats which they tie-up here in order to refresh themselves under the cool and breezy shade of the chinars. The lake is otherwise also important. The floating gardens which grow fruits and vegetables constitute one of its attractive features. Other parts of the lake are strewn in summer with beautiful lotus flowers which present a glamorous scenery. The lotus stalk called 'Nadru' is used as a vegetable of which several thousand maunds are brought into the city and disposed of by public sale. The lake also produces sufficient quantity of different varieties of vegetables and fish which are brought to Srinagar. A Rs. 20 crore plan for beautifying the Dal Lake is under implementation. The programme would be executed under various phases over a number of years.

Pari Mahal or Fairies Palace :

The building was constructed by prince Dara Shikoh for being used as a school of astrology for his tutor Mullah Shah. The building which was, however, in ruins for a pretty long time has been renovated and reconstructed by the State Government before some years and a beautiful garden has been laid around it.

Sonamarg :

This pasture is situated at a distance of 58 miles in the north-east of Srinagar on Srinagar-Leh road and is known after Sonamarg, a village of tehsil Ganderbal. The pasture is a beautiful undulating grassy plain stretching to about 3 miles along the left bank of a branch of Indus known as Sind. During summer, graziers, particularly Bakarwals from different parts of Jammu province concentrate in the pasture with their huge flocks and herds.

As Sonamarg is a favourite tourist resort in summer, a Dak Bungalow equipped with arrangements for catering and lodging has been provided at this place.

FESTIVALS

Shabi Barat :

This is celebrated on the night falling on 14th of month of Shaban the 8th lunar month of Hijri year. Muslims keep awakening for

whole night in mosques and shrines, offer prayers, recite the holy Quraan and invoke the blessings of the almighty Allah and perform other religious rituals. Large congregations are held in big mosques and shrines like Jamia Masjid, Hazratbal, Khanqahi - Maulla etc. where ulemas also deliver religious speeches.

Shabi Qadr :

This is observed on 26th of Ramzan (the month of fasts) the 9th lunar month of Hijri year. Muslims offer special prayers called 'Taraveeh' in the night, recite the holy Quraan and invoke God's blessings for the whole night. Large congregations take place in Jamia Masjid, Hazratbal shrine, Khankahi Mualla and other big mosques. Muslim preachers and reputed ulemas deliver religious lectures in the mosques.

Jumat-ul-Vida :

The last Friday of month of Ramzan, most commonly called as 'Jumat-ul-Vida' is celebrated with great sanctity, tradition and piety. Muslims assemble in Jamia Masjid, Shahi Masjid (Pather Masjid), Hazratbal and other big mosques to offer Friday prayers. Preachings are performed and religious lectures viz. 'Waazkhani' delivered by reputed ulemas and molvis in the mosques.

Id-ul-Fitr :

This famous festival is celebrated with great enthusiasm and traditional rites alongwith other Muslim brethren of the country after completing the fasts in the month of Ramzan, the 9th lunar month of Hijri year. Id prayers are offered at different Id - Gahs especially in big Id - Gah of the city of Srinagar. Muslims all over the city and other towns assemble in large numbers there to offer Id prayers. Dishes in varieties especially from mutton are cooked at this happy occasion. Feasts are held and guests invited to share meals and it is thus the Muslim community rejoice on this day. Women folk sing 'Rouf' songs together and new and costly clothes are worn especially by women and young children. Poor and needy people are offered special alms so as to enable them to celebrate the event with same joy and happiness and join other Muslim brothers.

Id-ul-Zuha :

This is also known as Baqr Id. The festival is celebrated with same traditions and rituals as Id-ul-Fitr. But the special event performed on this occasion is slaughtering of sheep and goats by well-to-do class to mark the memory of great sacrifice (Qurbani) as offered by Hazrat Ibraheem and his son Hazrat Ismaeel the renowned prophets of God. The former was born more than 2,000 years before the Prophet of Islam - Hazrat Muhammad. The slaughtered meat is divided in three portions and distributed among relatives, neighbours and poor people.

The festival is celebrated for three consecutive days and slaughtering takes place after Id prayers till mid of the 3rd day viz. the 12th of Zilhaj.

Id-e Milad-un-Nabi :

This most auspicious occasion of Prophet Muhammad's birthday is celebrated in a very sanctimonious way on 12th of 3rd lunar month—Rabi-ul-Awwal. Milad congregations and religious meetings are organised in mosques, shrines and other places where religious leaders and molvis deliver speeches especially highlighting the Prophet's pious and sacred life and depicting his commandments and directives to lead the path of piety, purity and service to mankind. Largest congregations take place at Hazratbal shrine, Jamia Masjid and other mosques of the city of Srinagar. The Muslims inhabiting the Srinagar city also attend special prayer meetings from evening time to early midnight for twelve consecutive sacred nights at Hazratbal shrine. The ceremonies conclude by Friday following Milad when prayers are offered at Hazratbal shrine and "Deedar" the exhibition of holy relic of the Prophet is held after the prayers in which lakhs of devotees participate and invoke the blessings of God and the Prophet.

Shab-i-Meraj :

This is celebrated in the night falling on 26th of Rajab, the 7th month of lunar year. It is celebrated to commemorate the ascent of Prophet Muhammad to heavens in this holy night in 12th year of his prophethood. The Muslims assemble in mosques, shrines and offer prayers and recite holy Quraan to mark the

sanctity of this holy event. Largest congregations are held at Hazratbal shrine where exhibition of holy relic of the Prophet is also witnessed by thousands of Muslims after every prayer and also on Friday following Meraj.

Aashoora :

The word Aashoora means the 10th and implies the 10th day of Muharram (first lunar month) when Imam Husain, the grandson of Prophet of Islam, was assassinated at Karbala, a suburb of Iraq, while fighting against the army of Yazeed, the usurper caliph of Arabia. Two huge mourning processions to commemorate the martyrdom are taken out on the morning of 10th of Muharram by two organisations of Shias of Srinagar city. The mourners numbering many thousand recite elegies, while beating their breasts and some times causing even serious injuries to their persons. The central figure of the procession is Zuljinah the mark of the horse which Imam Husain rode while fighting in Karbala. The procession ends at Hasanabad and Zadibal where Imam Baras, which are used for mournings, have been built.

First Navratra :

The festival is also known as Kashmiri Pandit's New Year Day. This is the first day of Luikika or Saptrisi year, an era which was being followed till the beginning of the twentieth century not only by the Brahmins of Kahmir but also by the people inhabiting the areas in the south-east of the State, namely Chamba, Kangra, Mandi etc.

It is obvious that the festival does not fall on the same date every year though the variation is limited to a week or so only. On this occasion about 15,000 Kashmiri Pandits assemble at the shrine of Sharika Devi and offer their homage to the goddess. Others who are unable to reach the shrine attend the neighbouring temples.

The plain area at the foot of the slope on which the shrine is situated and which is known as 'Devi Aangan' or the compound of Sharika Devi is occupied by stall holders most of whom run confectionery and tea shops. Other stalls deal in the sale of hosiery articles, bangles, toys etc.

Baisakhi :

The festival falls on the first of Baisakhi and is a day of rejoicing to celebrate the ushering in of new Bikrimi year. On this day Hindus assemble at Ishbari, a locality about half a mile away from Nishat Garden and take baths in the sacred water of Guptganga spring. Like first Navratra, the Baisakhi festival is also celebrated during the spring season and the devotees avail of the opportunity to relax in Nishat garden which is situated close by. Some of the pilgrims engage doongas on a day ahead of the festival and after the performance of the religious rituals at the springs spend whole day in recreation. It is estimated that besides non-Hindus who also visit the Mughal gardens on this day, the number of people participating in the festival is over 30,000. The entire space in front of the garden is occupied by stall holders engaged in the sale of confectionery, tea, fruits, hosiery, cigarettes and similar other articles.

Ram Navmi :

The festival which falls on the 9th day of moon in the month of Chaitra is celebrated to commemorate the birthday of Shri Ram Chandra who defeated and killed Ravana, the king of Ceylon and the chief of Rakshas. The devotees assemble on this day in Ramji's temple which has been built near the Exchange Road in Srinagar city. As the temple is situated in a densely populated sector, no less than 20,000 people participate in the festival and offer their prayers. Like other Hindu festivals, tea shops and confectioners are seen in large numbers in the precincts of the shrine.

Mela Sharika Bhagwati :

The shrine of Sharika Devi in whose honour the festival is celebrated lies on the western slope of Hariparbat hill. There is no regular temple at this place but the site where the goddess is believed to have revealed herself is pigmented and held in high esteem. For the convenience of pilgrims steps made of chiselled stones have been built right from the foot of the hill to the site of the shrine which would otherwise involve a tiresome uphill journey of several hundred feet.

The festival is celebrated on the 9th of lunar month corresponding to June. The number of people participating the festival is estimated at about 20,000.

Raksha Bandan :

This festival is celebrated in the middle of August when pilgrims from within and outside the State visit the holy cave of Amarnath in thousands for getting a darshan of the Ice lingam of Lord Shiva. As the cave is situated at a height of 12,729 feet above the sea level and is reached after undertaking an arduous journey for about four days, people who cannot stand the strain of travel, assemble in the temple built at the top of Shankracharya hill. Even here they have to perform an uphill journey about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the main road. The temple is known after the name of Shankracharya, a great apostle of Monism who came to Kashmir from Travancore to revive Hindu religion which had been eclipsed by Buddhism.

Before attending the temple, brothers and sisters reaffirm the relationship between them. The sister usually ties a holy thread on the right wrist of her brother who in turn pays her some money or offers some present to symbolise the pledge of his relations with her.

On the day of the festival, confectioners and tea sellers occupy the entire space outside the temple at the top of the hill. Due to the irksomeness of the journey the stalls are crowded and even people observing fast, take some fruits.

Mela Rishi Peer :

The festival is known after Rishi Peer or Peer Pandit Padshah who was a disciple of Krishnakar. Rishi Peer is famous for the numerous miracles performed by him. He was popular both among Muslims and Hindus and preached tolerance and mutual co-operation.

The festival is held in the third week of the lunar month corresponding to the month of Baisakh. On this occasion about 7,000 people assemble in a small temple near Aali Kadal in Srinagar City.

Mela Khir Bhavani :

The shrine of Khir Bhawani which is situated in village Maheshwarpora of tehsil Ganderbal is held sacred by Kashmiri Pandits all over the State. It is celebrated on the 8th day of first lunar fortnight of the month of Jeth (June) which is supposed to be the date on which goddess Khirbhawani or Ragniya Devi revealed herself for the first time. The number of pilgrims paying homage to the deity is estimated in the neighbourhood of 20,000. A mass congregation is held in the evening which stands in a devotional mood and concentrates on the image of the goddess and seeks to merge itself in the premodial energy pervading the universe. The devotees wave burning candles fed with ghee and burn dhupa (incense). The priests ring the bells and recite religious hymns.

The festival has an economic impact on the inhabitation of the locality, almost all of whom are Muslims. They put several hundred stalls for sale of dhupa, ghee, rice, flowers, milk and other eatables. The sale of meat, eggs, onion etc, is, however, strictly prohibited on religious grounds. Many people avail of the occasion to establish new social contacts during relaxation in the lawns and open areas attached to the shrine.

Chhatti Padshahi :

This is the principal shrine of Sikh community in Srinagar district. It is situated at a distance of 6 kms. from Lal Chowk at Kathi Darwaza, one of the gates of the wall built around Hari Parbat hill by Emperor Akbar. Two important festivals, one to celebrate Guru Nanak Ji's birthday and the other known as Guru Hargobind Sahib's birthday, are celebrated in the shrine on 28th November and 4th June respectively. On these occasions, thousands of Sikhs assemble at the shrine and engage themselves in the recitation of Guru Granth Sahib. As the shrine is at a stone's throw from the Srinagar - Hazratbal road, the pilgrims travel by cars, buses, cycles and other conveniences. The management of the shrine distribute puddings among the pilgrims which they regard sacred and distribute among all the members of their families. Stall holders sell cold drinks, toys, hosiery articles and religious literature

which occupy the entire space in the premises of the shrine as also a part of the adjoining road. The number of people participating in each of these sacred days is estimated at about 20,000.

Shivratri or Haerath :

Shivratri festival is as old as Vedas, the oldest scriptures of Hinduism, but other later Tantras also throw light on the importance and significance of this holy festival. Among many Hindu festivals observed in Jammu & Kashmir, Shivratri is celebrated with greatest enthusiasm by Kashmiri Pandits. In fact to a Kashmiri Pandit Shivratri or 'Haerath', as they generally call it, is the chief festival in his calendar year and he celebrates it in his own traditional manner distinct from other Hindu sects. The festival is celebrated in other parts of the country also but with a different significance and lesser importance than it commands among Kashmiri Pandits.

The festival is celebrated on the 13th day of the 1st dark fortnight of Phalgun which corresponds to the month of February-March of the Christian calendar.

Different legends are given in the Shastras to explain the origin of Shivratri.

One of the legend recorded in Vidya Purana says that once Lord Shiva and his consort Parvati were in a play-ful mood and in that process Parvati closed both the eternal eyes of Lord Shiva with her two hands. This plunged the whole universe into complete darkness. Light disappeared even from the Sun, the Moon, fire and other planets. All animate and inanimate existence came to thaw. Grief and terror stricken Vishnu and other gods sought protection of the Lord Shiva, who with his supernatural power, then created one more transcendental eye on his forehead. Simultaneously Parvati also lifted her hands from his two eyes. Thus disappeared the darkness that had be-fallen the universe. In other words, the night of darkness which constituted a dooms night for all the three worlds was made luminous by the creation of the eternal third eye. This 'kal-ratri' or dark-night is now known as Shivratri in the changed form.

According to local beliefs, it is the night when Shiva and Parvati were married and hence Shivratri is celebrated to commemorate this marriage. It is also believed that golden snow flakes fell on that night.

Whatever the legends and tales behind the observance of Shivratri, it constitutes by far the most important festival for the Pandits of Kashmir. Locally it is known as 'Haerath' which seems to be a corrupt form of 'Harratri'. Since 'sh' in Sanskrit is translated as 'ha' in Kashmiri, it appears Shivratri might have been translated into Harratri, assuming gradually a shorter form as 'Haerath' by which name it is most familiarly known now.

The ritualistic aspect predominates in the celebration of the festival. The rituals commence from 1st Phalgun of dark fortnight according to custom followed in each family. The ceremonies and rituals both religious and customary are performed with meticulous care in accordance with the tradition set by fore-fathers in each family as any neglect or negligence in their observance is believed to bring the displeasure and wrath of Lord Shiva.

The distribution of local consecrated wal-nuts immersed in water and bread among relatives and neighbours is carried on from the 1st to the 10th of the bright fortnight of Phalgun.

Kashmir has, from times immemorial, been the home of gods and goddessess, renowned mystics, lamas, sadhus, pandits, rishis, peers and faqirs. The numerous caves, monastries, temples and mosques, which have survived the ravages of time and inclemencies of weather, are living testimonials to corroborate this truth. It is for this reason that many historians have named Kashmir a 'Rishivari' or 'Peer-e-Vaer' the abode of Pandits and Peers. Majority of these shrines are concentrated in Srinagar district which has been the capital of the State for more than 2,000 years in the past. A brief description of important fairs and festivals which are associated with these shrines is given in the following paragraphs :—

Khankahi Bulbul Shah :

This is the first Khankah built in Kashmir by Renchan Shah, the then ruler of Kashmir (1225-1237 A.D.). The Khankah is known after the name of Syed Shareif-ud-Din Bulbul, at whose hands Renchan Shah was converted to Islam. It was built in Mohalla Bulbul-Lanker on the bank of river Jehlum.

Hazratbal :

The shrine is situated on the western bank of Dal-lake about 6 miles to the north-east of Srinagar. It can be reached both by boat as also by tarred road connecting Srinagar with Naseem garden. The shrine in which the holy hair of Prophet Muhammed has been deposited is most sacred to the Muslims all over Kashmir. The site of the shrine was a garden owned by one Sadiq Khan after whose name it was then known. The relic was secured by one Khaja Noor-ud-Din from Sayyid Abdullah, the exiled custodian of the shrine of Prophet of Islam at Madina and was dedicated to the Muslim community of Kashmir.

The holy hair has been deposited in a casket and is displayed on several days in a year particularly on the occasion of Id-Milad, Shabi Meraj and its following Fridays and the anniversaries of the four Caliphs. Each of these festivals is attended by about half a million people from all rural parts of the valley as also from Srinagar and other towns. Thousands of temporary stalls are put up by the business community of Srinagar and of rural areas and sales to the tune of several lakhs of rupees are effected on each occasion.

Towards the end of November, 1963, the holy relic was surreptitiously removed from the shrine causing an unprecedented commotion all over the valley. Shops remained closed, black flags hoisted and mourning processions taken out, demanding the immediate recovery of the relic and a deterrent action against the culprits and this continued until the holy relic was again surreptitiously repositioned to the relief and of all aggrieved. The identity of culprits could not, however, be ascertained, nor could the purpose of the mischief be unearthed. Eventually the shrine was, newly constructed providing enough space in and outside

the shrine for pilgrims. A white tomb made of white marbles was erected in the shape of the Prophet's tomb built in Madina. The construction and renovation work was undertaken under the stewardship of late Sheikh Mohd. Abdullah in his capacity as the president of Jammu & Kashmir Muslim Auqaf Trust, the organisation which holds the responsibility of maintaining assets and renovation/construction of waqf property in the State.

Urs Dastgir Sahib (Khankahi Dastgir)

This relates to the death anniversary of Syed Abdul Qadir Gilani, a top ranking Muslim saint of Bagdad, whose reputation for piety and spiritual attainments travelled for and wide all over the world. The saint never visited any part of the sub-continent but his sanctity brought him so much of reputation that people of all countries and communities hold him in high esteem and invoke his blessings. On the occasion of the festival which falls on the 11th of Rabi-ul-Sani the 4th lunar month of the Hijri year and its following Friday, a hair of Sheikh Abdul Qadir Gilani is exhibited from the balcony of the large Khankah at Khanyar, Srinagar where it has been deposited.

The relic is said to have been brought into Kashmir by a tourist from Kabul in 1802 A.D. It was acquired from him by Sardar Abdullah Khan, the then Governor of Kashmir, who presented it to a local saint for being displayed to the people. About one lakh people participate on the day of the festival and attend the Friday prayers at the shrine.

Sheikh Abdul Qadir Gilani is known by a number of names. Most popular among these are Piri Dastgir, Gawsul-Aazam, Shahe Bagdad and Kahnoav. Pir Dastgir means the saint who holds out his hand to help others and the Kahnoav stands for one who is known by eleven names.

The festival lasts for about 15 days, beginning from the 1st of Rabi-ul-Sani. People assemble at the shrine in evenings and mornings and recite verses from Holy Quraan and invoke blessings of the saint. Almost the entire road length from Rainawari junction to Nowhatta, distance of about 3 furlongs is occupied by tempo-

rary stalls put up for the sale of vegetables, fruits, books, confectionery, garments and other articles.

Urs Shahe Hamdan and Khanqahi Mualla :

The oldest Muslim festival, known as Urs Shahe-Hamdan, is held on 6th of Zilhaj (1st week of 12th lunar month). The festival is celebrated to commemorate the death anniversary of Mir Syed Ali Hamdani a renowned mystic, scholar and poet who hailed from Khatlan in Iran and visited the State thrice in connection with the propagation of Islam. He succeeded in bringing about mass conversion and changing the social and cultural complexion of millions of people inhabiting the valley. Among the principal shrines, which are known after his name, the most important is the mosque of Khankah-i-mualla situated on the right bank of river Jehlum between the 3rd and 4th bridges of Srinagar city.

The Khanqah was founded in 1372 A.D. by Mir Sayyed Ali Hamdani, and was completed by his son Mir Sayyed Mohammad Hamdani in 1396 A.D. It got burnt twice thereafter and was as is inscribed on its main gate, rebuilt in 1493 A.D. by Saliha, wife of Mohammad Shah the then ruler of Kashmir. In 1731 A.D., the Khankah which is all built of deodar timber again caught fire and was finally reconstructed in 1733 A.D. The site at which the mosque has been built was previously occupied by a large temple which was after the conversion of its proprietors and other devotees, dismantled. A small room in the mosque, known as 'Hujrai-e-Khas' which lies in its north western corner was used by the saint for meditation and is held in high esteem by Muslims to this day. A rectangular repository fitted with glass panes is installed at the outer gate of Hujrai-e-khas. Its contents include among other sacred things, the banner of the Prophet of Islam and a wooden pillar against which he usually reclined in his tent. Both these relics were brought by Shah-i-Hamdan to Kashmir and deposited in the mosque.

The holy banner and the pillar are not removed from the repository except on occasions when the people face some calamity like epidemics, famine, draught etc. The two relics are then taken out in a procession to Id-Gah,

a distance of 3 miles where prayers are held for the whole day. In the evening the relics are again brought back in a procession and deposited in the shrine. The festival is celebrated on 6th of Zilhaj when Shah-i-Hamdan passed away at Pakhli in Hazara district while on his way to home from Kashmir. On this occasion, over 50,000 people assemble in the mosque and its premises and recite verses from Quraan and invoke the blessings of the saint. Besides the festival which lasts for 6 days beginning from 1st of Zilhaj, people assemble in very large number at the shrine on the occasion of Shabi-Qadr, Id following Ramzan and Baqr-Id.

Jamia Masjid :

This is the largest mosque in the State, measuring about 120 yards (360 feet) on each side. It was founded by Mir Syed Mohammed Hamdani, Son of Mir Sayyid Ali Hamdani who, like his father, devoted his life to the propagation of Islam. The Mosque was previously the site of a large temple known as Mahashuri which was dismantled by Sultan Sikandar, the then ruler of Kashmir. The roof of the mosque is supported by 372 deodar pillars of which 32 have a height of 90 feet and a width of 12 feet.

Congregational prayers are held in the mosque on the last friday of Ramzan. It is estimated that more than one lakh people participate in the prayer.

Jamia Masjid has a history of its own. Sir Walter Lawrence believed that the mosque stood on a land which was sacred to Buddhists of Ladakh. They gave it their own name Tsit-Sung Tsublak Kang and the mosque until 19th century was called Bodo Masjid and not Jamia Masjid. According to some historians, it was a Buddhist temple on the ground that the walls bore pictures of Buddhist saints. A few others say that the Bodo Masjid was called Bota Masjid and was somewhere below the 'Castle hill of Srinagar'. In Kashmir Bota means Lamic or Buddhistic applying to Baltistan and Ladakh.

After the death of Sultan Sikandar his son and successor Sultan Zain-ul-Aabidin made additions and alterations in the mosque. He opened and constructed grand Seminary to the

north of it probably in Gojiwara locality where persian, arabic and sanskrit could be taught. Qazi Mir Mohd. Ali of Bukhara was appointed its Principal and the revenue of four villages was assigned to the schools for its up-keep and maintenance. To make it more magnificent and beautiful a canal named Zaina Khul, afterwards Lachmi Khul, was constructed whose source and head regulator was Sindh Nalah at Ganderbal and the water was brought to the mosque through the eastern entrance which fed the large tank in the internal compound. The canal fell into disuse after 1903 A.D. when Srinagar Water Works Department was instituted by Partap Singh Dogra's Government. Its (Lachmi Khul) embankments are still existent near Medical Institute at Soura.

Jamia Masjid passed through many vicissitudes. Sultan Zain-ul-Aabidin constructed four tall minars and the inner compound of the mosque 254' wide and 334' long planting the chinar trees around it. (The tradition assigns these changes to his grand son Sultan Hassan-Shah in 1476 A.D.). During his reign there occurred a serious conflagration in the neighbourhood of Jamia Masjid in Nowhatta (Sikandarpur) and it could not escape from the calamity. Sultan Hassan Shah reconstructed the mosque but unfortunately he died before completing the work. After his death his son Sultan Mohd. Shah resumed the construction in 1485 A.D. and completed some portion of it in three years. The Chief of the Kashmir Army Staff Malik Ibrahim Magrey, built the roof and walls around it out of his own private purse in 1488 A.D. He decorated the inner compound and planted chinars and removed the houses around it to a distance of 100 feet in order to keep it safe from conflagration. From 1561 A.D. to 1586 A.D. (period of Chakks) political condition in Kashmir were marked with confusion, bitter rivalries and instability. Jamia Masjid was neglected except during the reign of Yaqub Chak, when the repairs were carried out by Qazi Musa, a renowned religious scholar of the time out of his private purse. After the annexation of Kashmir by the Mughals in 1586 A.D. Akbar summoned two hundred artisans from Central Asia to execute the work of renovation and beautification of the mosque. In 1620 A.D.

(1029 A.H.) again, a great fire broke out in Nowhatta and Jamia Masjid was burnt just on the day of Idi-Ramzan (Idul Fitr). Emperor Jehangir, who was visiting Kashmir at that time ordered its immediate reconstruction under the able guidance and supervision of historian architect Rais-ul-Mulk Haider Malik of Chadura which was carried out in 17 years. Jehangir appointed Mulla Jafri as its perceptor (Pir) with adequate emoluments at his disposal and ordered the construction of a tank in the middle of the compound. This was completed in seven years.

During Aurangzeb's time again in 1754 A.D., Jamia Masjid was gutted along with twelve thousand houses in its neighbourhood starting from Mohalla Kavadara. Aurangzeb heard of the accident. He enlisted the services of all bricklayers and masons in the city and had the mosque completed within three years. It is evident from the structure itself as well as from the historical records that the Mughals adhered to the plan of original mosque of the Sultan Sikandar. Aurangzeb decorated the minars with silver crests and it cost him five thousand dinars. He simultaneously ordered the erection of a ladder of seventy five steps which lead to Minars. Houses all round the mosque were pulled down so that there could be no recurrence of fires. From Aurangzeb's time down to 1914 A.D., the structural history of the mosque forms a record of decay.

The mosque was slightly repaired by Haji Karim Dad Khan, Afgan governor in 1776 A.D. after the annexation of Kashmir to Afgan Empire in 1754 A.D. and the second time by Subedar Aazad Khan in 1789 A.D. During the sixty nine years of Afgan (Pathan) rule Jamia Masjid was neglected and when repair work was taken in hand, this was executed out of rents received from the shopping complex around it. In 1819 A.D. Kashmir was annexed by Ranjit Singh, the ruler of Punjab. The mosque was closed and the doors blocked for 25 years under the order of Diwan Moti Ram, a Sikh governor in 1820 A.D. Its Jagirs were confiscated and subsidy stopped. Azan (Call to prayers) was prohibited here. Later on a deputation of Kashmiri Muslims was led under the leadership of Moulvi Amir-ud-Din and Moulvi Nasir-ud-Din who submitted a

memorandum to Sher Singh who ordered the governor Sheikh Gh. Mohi-ud-Din to open the mosque and hand it over to the Muslims. The Sheikh initiated repairs spending a lakh of rupees on the same. After the treaty of Amritsar in 1846, Gulab Singh Dogra ordered the affairs of Jamia Masjid to be put off indefinitely. His successor Ranbir Singh allowed opening of the mosque only on Fridays. A construction committee consisting of Kh. Rahim Shah and Gafoor Shah Naqshbandi was formed who collected a huge amount for its repairs and Ranbir Singh Dogra granted six thousand rupees. But due to Shia-Sunni conflict in 1872 A.D. (1289 A.H.), the plan of mosque was kept in abeyance and some of the members of the committee were arrested and deported to Jammu Jails. In 1891, Kh. Rahim Joo approached Ranbir Singh Dogra for further grant who sanctioned nine thousand rupees and out of this grant Lachmi Khul was repaired. In the beginning of this century a construction committee was reconstituted under the chairmanship of Bakshi Parmanand with late Mirwaiz Rasul Shah and late Kh. Samad Joo Kakroo of Baramula as its members who donated thirteen thousand rupees. However, process of decay could not be arrested. It had fallen into disrepair, but thanks to the efforts of late Sheikh Muqbul Husain, formerly Revenue Minister of the State, it was restored by the subscription raised among the zamindars of the valley along with the revenue known as Masjid Fund and on the technical advice from Archaeological Department, Government of India. Sir George Marshall gives credit for Jamia Masjid's renovation to Col. H.A.D. Fraser, then State Engineer and to Mr. Thad Avery, the contractor who took in hand its reconstruction. The grandeur of Jamia Masjid lies in its four cloisters each about 120 yards in length supported by pillars of deodar wood of great height and its spacious quadrangle. The lofty pillars in the proflons, the details of the spires and the uniformity of the whole design prove that the builders knew that they were reproducing of which they were masters.

The mosque is one of those distinct and lasting legacies which have come down to the Muslims of the valley from their forefathers. It is a monument worth preserving and a great

symbol of human skill and understanding directed towards a unique spiritual end.

Aali Masjid :

Mir Syed Mohamad Hamdani purchased a large area in the north of Srinagar city and dedicated it for being used for Id-prayers. Later, in 1398 A.D. Ali Shah, the then ruler of Kashmir, built a mosque in the centre of Id-Gah and named it as Aali Masjid. It got burnt in 1880 A.D. when a prominent citizen Gul Mohamad Khan rebuilt it. Maharaja Ranbir Singh later ordered for the execution of its repairs.

The mosque and the vast area attached to it are still being used by the Muslims for Id-prayers. On these occasions about 2 lakh people from the city and its suburbs assemble here and offer prayers. In addition, hundreds of temporary stalls are installed in the open space for the sale of fruits, books, garments and variety of other goods. On the day of Id-ul-Zuha thousands of sheep are seen in small flocks moving about in Id-gah ground and are sold to devotees for sacrificial slaughter - a religious ceremony which is obligatory on all those who can afford to pay for the animal.

Aishan Saheb :

The festival is the anniversary of Sheikh Yaqub Sarfi, an eminent scholar, writer, poet and a renowned mystic. The shrine is situated near the left bank of river Jehlum in the close vicinity of the 4th bridge of Srinagar city.

Sheikh Yaqub preached Kubrawia cult of mystics in which he was indoctrinated at Khawarizm now a part of Uzbek Socialistic Soviet Republic. He is popularly known as Aishan Saheb, a title said to have been conferred on him in a vision by the Prophet of Islam in recognition of his piety. The saint is also called as Imam Aazam 'Sani' after Imam Abu Hanifa (Imami Aazam), a renowned religious personality in the Islamic world.

The festival is celebrated on 12th of Ziqad (11th month of lunar year) and is attended by about 3,000 people from the city of Srinagar. The congregational prayers are held in the evening and last till about midnight.

Khankahi Naqashbandi : Naqashband Saheb :

This was built in 1631 A.D. by Khawaja Kawand Mohmood a Muslim saint. The festival is celebrated on the 3rd of Rabi-ul-Awal, the date on which Khawaja Syed Baha-ud-Din Naqashband, a renowned saint and mystic of Bukhara (Central Asia) passed away. The saint did not visit Kashmir at any time, but the Naqashbandia cult of mystics, which he founded, was embraced by many people in all Muslim countries, including Persia, Afghanistan and India. A mausoleum of Khawaja Moieen-ud-Din, one of the decendents of Khawaja Baha-ud-Din has been built in the premises of Khankah where people assemble for the performance of religious rituals and for invoking the blessings of the great saint. About 30,000 people offer congregational prayers in the Khankah and its premises in the afternoon of the day of the festival.

Makhdoom Saheb :

This shrine in which Mukhdoom Sheikh Hamza a leading spritualist of Sunni Muslims is entombed is held in high esteem by the Muslims of Kashmir. Being an ardent follower of Suhrawardi sect of mystics, he is known as Mukhdoom Saheb. He conducted a vigorous campaign against spreading of Shiaism and advocated the cause of Sunni Muslims as a result of which he was deported by the then Shia ruler to village Beru, about 20 miles from Srinagar. Sheikh Hamza, who came from a family of Chandra Bansi Rajputs, which was converted to Islam, was born in 902 Hijri and passed away in 984 Hijri at the age of 82 years. He was buried in his resort of meditation on the slope of Kohi-Maran (Hari Parbat hill). Emperor Akbar built a mausoleum on the tomb of the saint in 1001 Hijri which was renovated in 1124 Hijri by Nawab Inayat-ullah Khan the then Governor of Kashmir,

The shrine having been built at a fairly good height on the southern slope of Hari Parbat hill, the proprietors have constructed series of steps made of chiselled stone to facilitate the upward journey to the tomb of the saint.

The Urs or death anniversary of the saint is celebrated on 24th of Safar the 2nd lunar month of Hijri every year and thousands of pilgrims from villages and all over the city visit the

shrine to pay homage to the famous saint, and invoke his blessings.

Like other important Muslim festivals, hundreds of stalls are put up during the days of the celebration of the anniversary of the saint all along the one mile route from Khanyar to the site of the shrine.

Batmalu Saheb :

Sheikh Dawood was a Muslim saint and disciple of Sheikh Hamza Makhdoom. He himself cultivated his lands and it is said that he would every day carry a large caldron full of boiled rice to his fields where he distributed the same among all people who happened to pass by that side. It is because of this that he is known as Batmaloo or 'father who feeds other with cooked rice'. According to another version, Kashmiri Pandits had great faith in the piety of the saint and attended on him in large numbers every day. For this reason, he was named as Batmaloo or the 'father of Battas' (Kashmiri Pandits).

Batmaloo is held in great veneration by the people of the city and its suburbs. About one lakh people assemble at the shrine on the day of his anniversary which is celebrated in the month of Chet every year.

Meeshah Saheb :

The actual name of this saint with whom the festival is associated is Abdul Rehman. While leading the life of a spiritualist, lost control of his wits and turned a mendicant. By his miraculous performance, he won the confidence of members of both Hindu and Muslim communities who held him in high veneration and pay homage to him. His festival is celebrated in the month of Poh (9th Bikrimi month) and is attended by thousands of Hindus and Muslims.

Khawaja Habib-ullah Nowshehri :

The festival relates to the death anniversary of Khawaja Habib-ullah, a great saint, poet and a musician of Kashmir. He was a prominent disciple of Sheikh Yaqub Sarfi and preached the Kubrawia cult. His shrine which is situated at Nowshehra in the north of Srinagar, is attended by several thousand people on the 19th and 20th of Zilhaj, the date of his death anniversary.

Urs Khwaja Habib-ullah Attar :

Khwaja Habib-ullah, a mystic of high order of Kubrawia sect of Sufis, came from the family of Ganis a leading business class of Kashmir during the 17th century. Mirza Kamil Begh, referred to below, was his principal disciple and successor. The miracles performed by the saint are quoted extensively by many people who are associated with the shrine. The festival is organised in connection with his death anniversary and is celebrated on the 2nd and 3rd of Rajab (7th lunar month). Prayers are held on both the days at his mausoleum where ample space has been provided to accommodate the devotees.

Urs Syed Qamar Saheb :

Syed Qamar Shah was one of the immigrants from Iraq who accompanied Mir Syed Mohammad Hamdani to Kashmir and settled in Salora, a village of tehsil Ganderbal. He was a great saint and scholar and engaged himself in the propagation of tenets of Islam.

The festival is celebrated on the 2nd Thursday and Friday of August (Bhadoon). The Urs of the saint is the occasion of great festivity and people regard it more as a social than a religious function. Doongas (residential boats) are engaged in large numbers by many inhabitants of Srinagar city who undertake a voyage to the shrine by river Jehlum. Professional cooks set up kitchens in these doongas and prepare dinners and lunches for all the days of the onward and return journey. Others travel by surface route connecting Srinagar with Saloora, a distance of about 14 miles. In the evening musical concerts are organised at various places in the close vicinity of the shrine. Congregational prayers attended by about a lakh of people, hailing from the city and rural areas of Ganderbal and Sonawari tehsils are held in the afternoon of Friday after which people start returning home.

Urs Mirza Kamil Saheb :

Mirza Kamil Begh Khan Badakhsi was the grandson of Mirza Malik Mohammed Khan, Governor of Kashmir during the regime of Emperor Jahangir. He was born in the palace of Emperor Shah -Jahan and was named by him. He is regarded as one of the eminent

mystics of Kashmir. As will be seen from the following paragraphs, he was also a great writer and poet.

The anniversary of Mirza Kamil Saheb, who is also known as Mirza Akmal-ud-Din, the title conferred on him by his religious guide, is celebrated on the 29th and 30th of Zilhaj (the 12 month of the lunar year). About 15,000 people, mostly hailing from the city, assemble at the shrine and recite verses from Quran hymnals in the praise of prophet and saint. As the shrine is situated near the foot of Hariparbat hill in the area where the density of population is very low, no stalls other than those engaged in the sale of confectionary, fruits and hosiery goods are put up during the festival.

Urs Shah Sadiq Qalandar :

Shah Sadiq was a great scholar and a devotee of the Naqashbandi cult of mysticism. He spent many years in meditation and eventually lost control of his wits. At times, when he regained consciousness, he behaved like an orthodox Muslim, attended congregational prayers, observed fasts and engaged himself in the recitation of Quran. On some occasion, he indulged in all prohibited activities like smoking of chars, drinking of wine, shaving of beard and the like. His mausoleum is situated in Wuttalar, a village of tehsil Ganderbal. The festival is celebrated on the last date of Ziqad (11th lunar month) and is attended by thousands of people from the rural areas of Ganderbal tehsil and the city.

New Masjid :

This was built by Emperor Jahangir in 1622 A.D. The mosque is entirely made of chiselled stones and measures 180'x54' and is also known as Shahi Masjid or Pather-Masjid.

TEMPLES

Zishtisher temple

This temple is situated on the top of Koh-i-Sulaiman or Shankeracharya hill. It is said to have been built by Raja Sandiman in 56 B.C. and except for the repairs executed to its roof which developed cracks as a result of an earthquake, the original construction has been maintained to this date.

Butisher temple :

This temple was built by Raja Juluk (1394 B.C. - 1334 B.C.) in Wangat, tehsil Ganderbal Near Narayan Nag. From architectural point of view, the temple is a unique construction and looks as if it has been carved out of a single stone. The ruins of a few other temples are also in its close vicinity.

Temple at Akhara Building - procession of "Chhadi Mubarik" :

The temple is situated in the courtyard of Akhara building at Badshah chowk, Srinagar. Sadhus and Yatris from all over the country and other parts of the world assemble there where from they proceed to perform holy yatra to Amarnath cave in which Lord Shiva appears in ice formation of Shiva Lingam completed on a particular day which is called the day of Darshan. Religious leaders and Sadhus deliver religious speeches and perform religious ceremonies in the "Akhara" temple on the day when "Chhadi Mubarik" the holy mace is carried in procession to Amarnath from Srinagar. Thousands of people witness the procession on this day.

Brief analysis of P.C.A. data

Part - B of this publication contains data collected during the 1981 census in respect of each village and ward/mohalla of a town in the district on such aspects as; area, number of residential houses, number of households, total population with sex - wise break - up scheduled caste population, literate and educated persons, and sex - wise break - up of working population categorised into main workers, marginal workers and non - workers. The information based on the Primary Census Abstract has been summarised in various inset tables giving an insight into the demographic structure of the population of district at tehsil level. A brief analysis of the data incorporated in these tehsils has been attempted thereafter so as to highlight the various demographic changes that have taken place in the rural and urban areas of the district at tehsil level, particularly during the decade 1971 - 81.

The sub - joined table No. 1 gives an account of the distribution of population at tehsil level :

It will be seen that as a result of the bifurcation of the erstwhile Srinagar district in two districts viz; Srinagar and Badgam the 1981 jurisdiction of Srinagar district which at the 1971 Census consisted of 5 tehsils made up of 712 villages, besides 2 towns including Srinagar M.C. has shrunk to 2 tehsils consisting of 175 villages. Of the 175 villages 7 are un-inhabited. The number of towns has however gone to three. The total population returned by both the tehsils of the district

at the 1981 census is 708,328 persons made up of 378,189 males and 330,139 females. Srinagar tehsil is bigger than Ganderbal tehsil both in the size of population and towns within its jurisdiction. The tehsils of Chadura, Badgam and Beerwah which were formerly parts of district Srinagar now form the Badgam district.

Table No. 2 below depicts the decennial changes in the distribution of tehsil-wise population in the district :

The table reveals that the district has registered a growth rate of 25.52% in its population in the decade 1971-81 which does not compare favourably with the growth rate for the State as a whole which stands at 29.69%. Between the two tehsils, however, Ganderbal has returned higher rate of population growth than the State.

What is most striking is that in Srinagar rural the growth rate has come down to (—) 46.60 during the decade 1971-81. This is however, due to the corresponding expansion in the jurisdictional limits of Srinagar M.C. which has recorded a growth of 32.38% in its population during the corresponding period.

From the above table it is evident that out of 168 inhabited villages in the district as many as 48.21% have population in the range of 500—1,999 while 26.79% have it in the range of 200—499 persons. Villages with population less than 200 constitute 18.45% while those with population of 2000 or more persons form 5.95% of the total inhabited villages in the district. There is only one village having returned a population of more than 5,000.

It will be seen that the density ranges of 301—500 and 501+ persons per sq. km. together claim 76% of the total villages of the district, the share of each of these two ranges being 33.33% and 42.25% respectively. There is no village falling in the density range of less than 10 kms. and 11—20 kms. The share in other two ranges viz; 21—50 and 51—100 is indeed negligible. The nine villages shown in the table with density range not known are actually not recognized villages as such. These represent 8 boat blocks and one forest block accorded separate identity during 1981 census enumeration.

It will be seen that in the matter of literacy rate villages in the population range of 500—1,999, 2,000—4,999 and 5,000—9,999 are better placed than those in the lower ranges of population. However, considering the fact that average rural literacy rate for the State as a whole returned at the 1981 Census is 21. 63% which itself is no satisfactory level the rural litracy rate returned even in the villages of aforementioned ranges in the district is far lower indeed corresponding to State rural rate.

It will be seen that Badamibagh Cantonment is placed well above the other two towns in the district in the matter of literacy the rate being higher than the corresponding rate for all the urban areas of the State put together which stands at 45.56%.

Ganderbal stands at the bottom with a literacy rate of 33.75%.

We have already seen that both in the matter of rural as well as urban literacy the district has to make a large leeway to come up to the level as obtained for the State as a whole. Down at the tehsil level the position is still worse in respect of rural part of Srinagar tehsil where the literacy rate has been returned at 13.36% corresponding to 14.24% for the district as a whole.

Ganderbal tehsil which is a smaller tehsil in the district in terms of population is however better placed in rural literacy which is slightly higher than for the district as a whole. As regards urban literacy, Srinagar town stands close to the district average. As between the two sexes, male literacy level far out-weighs the female literacy level in both the tehsils. The differential is however far greater in rural areas than in urban areas.

Percentage of main workers to total population as re-produced in col. 11-13 shows that male and female work participation rate in urban areas generally trails behind that in rural areas. The differential is however marginal. Between the two tehsils the highest rural and urban participation rate for male sex has been returned by Ganderbal tehsil at 57.45% and 51.98% corresponding to 56.90% and 50.62% reported for the district. In case of female rural participation rate, Srinagar tehsil has returned a percentage of 8.69 which is higher than the rate shown for the district which is 6.44% only. In case of urban female participation rate Ganderbal shows 5.43% as against 4.96% reported for the district.

Marginal workers as will be noticed from col. 14-16 of the table constitute 4.78% of the population of the district. At the tehsil level

this proportion is as high as 20.37% for Ganderbal tehsil as low as 1.30% for Srinagar tehsil. It is, however, significant to note that in both the tehsils females account for the predominant proportion of marginal workers. It is a traditional feature of the rural economy that the female folk though primarily engaged in household activities contribute their bit by marginal participation in seasonal economic activities like agricultural operations and household industries. It will thus be seen that the marginal female workers to total female population is 40.32 in Ganderbal tehsil and 2.47 in Srinagar tehsil. Even in urban areas where marginal workers claim relatively much smaller proportion in both sexes the proportion of females outweighs the male proportion in both the tehsils. The proportion of total workers made up of main workers and marginal workers put together is brought out in col. 17-19 of the table. It will be seen that in case of male population the proportion of workers outstrips the proportion of nonworkers in both the tehsils in rural and urban parts. In the case of female population however the rate of non-workers is higher than that of workers except rural part of Ganderbal tehsil.

Analysis of Village Directory data :

The data collected from the revenue and other government agencies regarding availability of various amenities has been tabulated in the main village directory statement. The salient features of this data in broad aggregates is brought out below in the form of inset tables.

The position of availability of various amenities at district/tehsil level is indicated in the following table No. 10 :

The table reveals that out of the total 160 inhabited villages in the district 132 accounting for 82.50% villages have one or the other type of educational institutions like Middle, High or Higher Secondary schools located within the village and this amenity is almost evenly distributed in both the tehsils of the district. As regards medical facility, however only 54 villages have either a dispensary or primary health centre or hospital which makes a meagre proportion of 33.75% of the total villages. Inter-tehsil comparison shows that the proportion of villages covered under this basic amenity is 20.51% and 38.02% in Srinagar and Ganderbal tehsils respectively. Drinking water facility is however, available to all the villages in the district from one source or the other. However protected drinking water supply is available to 103 villages which form 64% of the total number of villages which makes a satisfactory position indeed. In the matter of post & telegraph facility while the proportion of villages covered is 18.75% at the district level, their distribution is not very un-even at tehsil level with the proportion of villages as 12.82% in Srinagar tehsil and 20.66% in Ganderbal tehsil.

In communication the percentage of villages

covered in the district is 49.38%. As will however be seen from the table Srinagar tehsil has 94.87% of its villages covered while the corresponding proportion in case of Ganderbal tehsil is only 34.71%. On the other hand in the matter of approach by pacca roads Ganderbal tehsil exceeds Srinagar tehsil with a proportion of 99.17% villages covered as against only 79.49% in the case of latter. The progress is by far the most significant in the field of rural electrification with 159 villages or 99.38% out of total of 160 villages in the district covered under this amenity. Inter-tehsil position is more or less even with more than 99% villages covered in each tehsil.

The reader may notice some difference in the total number of inhabited villages between inset table No. 1 (Census data) and table No. 10 (non census-data). This is due to the fact that while compiling Census data boat blocks have been treated as villages while in compiling non-census data viz; village directory these have not been treated as villages.

It will be noticed that the position is relatively brighter in terms of the population served by various amenities even in the fields of medical care, post & telegraph offices and communication than what came out in the earlier table in terms of the proportion of villages both for the district as a whole as also at the tehsil level. Of course the proportion of population benefitted is nearly full or substantial only in

the fields of education, power supply, drinking water and approach by pacca road in the tehsil and in the district as a whole. In case of other amenities Ganderbal seems to be better placed than Srinagar.

This table makes rather an encouraging reading. It will be noticed that more than 90% of the villages where medical care, communication or post & telegraph facilities are not available within the village itself fall within a distance of less than 5 kms. from places where these facilities are available. Even for the bulk of the remaining small proportion these facilities are available within a distance of 5—10 kms. and 10 kms. above. It is thus clear that practically all the basic amenities are available to most of the rural population of the district within a distance of less than 5 kms. of their villages of residence if not within the village itself and the proportion of population who have to walk a distance of more than 10 kms. to avail of post & telegraph amenity medical care negligible indeed.

The table below gives the distribution of villages according to distance from the nearest town and the availability of different amenities :

It will be seen that distance from the nearest town does not seem to have any major effect on the provision of various amenities in the villages except for medical care, post & telegraph and to some extent communication facilities where the villages placed at a distance of more than 51 kms. seem for good reason to have received relatively better attention than those placed nearer a town. However, the

difference in the proportion is not as substantial as one should have expected and this might possibly be due to a relatively less proportion of population inhabiting the more distant villages.

As will be readily observed the population size of the villages has a direct bearing on determining the position of various amenities with more populated villages expectedly attracting more attention than less populated villages. The highest beneficiaries are obviously the villages with a population of 5,000 and more in the field of practically each basic amenity and the least proportion is of those with a population of less than 500 particularly in the field of Medical care and Post & Telegraph facilities where the coverage of such villages is less than 21% and 7% respectively.

The table below indicates the staple food in the majority of villages in each tehsil :

placed in terms of the proportion of culturable area to the total area, Srinagar having only a slight edge over Ganderbal. But in the matter of percentage of irrigated area to total cultivable area Ganderbal tehsil stands far ahead of Srinagar tehsil.

Brief analysis of Town Directory data

Separate data in respect of urban population structure, civic finance, the availability of various amenities has been compiled in the main town directory tables I to VI. For facilitating a brief commentary and assessment of the progress made by urban population some of the important statistics have further been sub-divided in table Nos. 17 to 22.

The sub-joined table No. 17 indicates the figures relating to urban population its percentage variation, density and sex-ratio :]

As can be seen from the table Srinagar district has made substantial progress towards urbanization, the position having been consistently so during the last three decades. The proportion of urban population in the district has increased to 80.50% in 1981 as against 66.31% in 1961.

The corresponding proportion for the State as a whole has increased to 21.05% in 1981 as against 16.66% in 1961. The pace of urbanization in the district during the decade 1971-81 has however been on the higher side as

compared to the State. As regards density of population, in the absence of area figures for the State urban for 1961 and 1971, comparable picture is only available for 1981 indicating that urban density of population per sq. km. in Srinagar district is higher than what it is for the State as a whole. In the matter of urban sex ratio however, the district compares favourably with the State, both showing increase in 1981 over the past decades. The pace is some how equal in the case of district and the State, although in both the cases it still continues to be adverse to females.

Table No. 18 below is intended to identify the towns added or declassified during the 1971-81 decade :

It will be seen that over the last 10 years Ganderbal has come to be recognised as a new town while there has been no declassification of any town previously recognised as such. In this way the number of towns in the district has gone up from 2 to 3.

It will be seen that both in per capita receipt as well as expenditure Badamibagh Cantonment is far a head of other two towns in the district. While bulk of per capita receipts in Badamibagh Cantonment come through "other sources" the bulk of per capita expenditure goes on "public health convenience". Per capita expenditure on public institutions is negligible.

It will be seen that Badamibagh Cantonment with a total population of 11,227 and 13.36 hospital is placed better than Ganderbal N.A. or Srinagar M. C. which has 1.09 and 3.03 hospital beds per thousand population. The total strength of beds per thousand population at the district level works out to 3.19 which is far from the corresponding position in the case of Badamibagh Cantonment.
