FOREWORD

The District Census Handbook (DCH), compiled by the Census Organisation on behalf of the state governments, is one of the most valuable products of the Census. The DCH is constantly referred to by planners, administrators, academicians and researchers. It is *inter alia* used for delimitation of constituencies, formulation of local level and regional plans and as an aid to District administration. The District Census Handbook is the only publication which provides Primary Census Abstract (PCA) data up to village level for the rural areas and wardwise for each city or town. It also provides data on infrastructure and amenities in village and towns, etc.

The district census handbook series was initiated during the 1951 Census. It contained important census tables and PCA for each village and town of the district. During 1961 Census the scope of the DCH was enlarged and it contained a descriptive account of the district, administrative statistics, census tables and a village and town directory, including PCA. The 1971 DCH series was planned in three parts. Part-A related to village and town directory, Part-B to village and town PCA and Part-C comprised analytical report, administrative statistics, district census tables and certain analytical tables based on PCA and amenity data in respect of villages. However, in some states it was confined to district census tables and in a few cases altogether given up due to delay in compilation and printing.

While designing the format of 1981 DCH series some new features alongwith the restructuring of the formats of village and town directory have been attempted. At the some time, comparability with the 1971 data has also kept in view. All the amenities except power supply in the village have been brought together in the village directory with the instruction that in case an amenity is not available in the referrent village the distance in broad ranges from the nearest place where the amenity is available may be given. The restructuring of the format of the village directory and incorporating more exhaustive data on infrastructure aspect particularly in relation to amenities and landuse pattern is expected to further meet the need of micro level planning for rural areas. It is expected to help not only in local area planning but regulating the provision of goods and services as well so as to minimise the regional imbalances in the process of development. A few new items of information have also been introduced to meet some of the requirements of the revised Minimum Needs Programme. Such new items of information as adult literacy centres, primary health sub-centres, and community health workers in the village have been introduced in the village directory with this objective in mind. The new item on approach to the village is to have an idea about the villages in the district which are inaccessible. A new column, "total population and number of households" has been introduced to examine the correlation of the amenities with the population and number of households they served. Addition of two more appendices listing the villages where no amenities are available and according to the proportion of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes population to the total population has also been made with this view in mind.

The formats of the town directory have also been modified to meet the requirements of the Minimum Needs Programme by providing information of a new items. A few statement on civic and other amenities in slums in Class-I and Class-II towns (Statement IV-A) has been introduced with this objective in mind. It is expected that this will help the planners to chalk out programmes on provision of civic amenities for the improvement of slums. The columns on scheduled casts and scheduled tribes population in statement-IV relating to civic and other amenities and adult literacy classes/centres under educational facilities in statement-V are also added *inter alia* with this view. A significant addition is class of town in all the seven statements of the town directory. The infrastructure of amenities in urban areas of the country can be best analysed by taking the class of towns into consideration. The addition of the columns on civic administration status and population in a few statements also serves this purpose.

The format of primary census abstract for the villages and towns has been formulated in the light of changes in the economic and other questions canvassed through the individual slip of 1981 Census.

In order to avoid delay in publication of 1981 DCH series it has been so designed that Part-A of the volume contains village and town directory and Part-B the PCA of villages and towns including the scheduled castes and scheduled tribes PCA up to tahsil/town levels. At the beginning of the DCH a detailed analytical note supported by a number of inset tables based on PCA and non census data in relation to the infrastructure has been introduded to enhance its value. The district and tahsil/police station/C. D. block etc. level maps depicting the boundaries and other important features have been inserted at appropriate places, to further enhance the value of the publication.

This publication is a joint venture of the State Government and the Census Organisation. The data have been collected and compiled in the state under the direction of Shri Daniel Kent, the Director of Census Operations, Nagaland on behalf of the state Government which has borne the cost of printing. The task of planning, designing and co-ordination of this publication was carried out by Shri N. G. Nag, Deputy Registrar General (Social Studies) of my office. Dr. B. K. Roy, Deputy Registrar General (Map) provided the technical guidance in the preparation of the maps. Data received from Census Directorates have been scrutinised in the Social Studies Division at the headquarters under the guidance of Shri M. M. Dua, Senior Research Officer. I am thankful to all who have contributed in this project.

The date incorporated in this volume are mainly collected by the enumerators/supervisors who formed an aimy of enumeration agency under efficient leadership of Deputy Commissioner who was notified as Principal Census Officer, ADC Tuensang as District Census Officer, Addl. Deputy Commissioners in charge of sub-divisions and sub-divisional officers (civil) as Sub-Divisional Census Officers and Extra Asstt. Commissioners and Circle Officers as charge officers. ANALYTICAL NOTE

Definition and Concepts:- In order to understand the meaning of words used in the analysis of data in this publication, it would be necessary to briefly explain the census concept and definitions of various words and phrases used here in :--

Utban area :- The census definition of an urban area is given as below ---

- (a) All places with a monicipality, corporation, cantonment board or notified Area Committee etc.
- (b) All other places which satisfy the following criteria :--
- i) a minimum population of 5,000,
- ii) at least 75% of the male working population should be nonagricultural and
- iii) a density of population at least 400 per km² (i. e. 1000 per sq. mile.

The class of the town in terms of population is categorised according to the following procedure :-

- 1. Class I with a population of 100,000 and above,
- 2. Class II with a population from 50,000 to 99,999
- 3. Class III with a population from 20,000 to 49,999
- 4. Class IV with a population from 10,000 to 19,999
- 5, Class V with a population from 5,000 to 9,999
- 6. Class VI with a population less than 5,000

Rural :- The cadastrally surveyed village with fixed boundaries is taken as a village for the purpose of census in plain areas. In the hill areas, a village is considered to be a collection of houses with certain boundaries having a separate name traditionally recognised by the villagers.

Census House :- A "Census House" is a building or part of a building having a separate main entrance from the road or common courtyard or staircase, etc., used or recognised as a separate unit. It may be occupied or vacant, it may be used for a residential or non-residential purpose or both.

Household :- A household is a group of persons who commonly live together and would take their meals from a common kitchen unless the exigencies of work prevents any of them from doing so. There may be a household of persons related by blood or a household of unrelated person or having amix of both. Example of unrelated households are boarding houses, messes, hostels, rescue homes, jails, etc, which are called "Institutional households". There may be one holds, two member house holds or multi-member households. For census purposes, each one of these type is regarded as a household.

Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes :- There is no scheduled caste in the state of Nagaland as per the Constitution (Nagaland) Scheduled Tribe Order 1970. The Scheduled tribes listed in the Constitution which is also adopted in 1981 census are as follows :--

- 1) Naga
- 2) Kuki
- 3) Kachari
- 4) Mikir and
- 5) Garo.

It may be noted here that the term 'Naga' is a common name of the community as a whole. As many as sixteen sub- tribes have been recorded in the 1981 census under the heading "Naga" which are listed below :---

i)	Angami	ix)	Makware

Literate :- A person who can both read and write with understanding in any language is taken to be literate. A person who can merely read but can not write, is not literate. It is not necessary that a person who is literate should have received any formal education or should passed any minimum educational standard. All children of the age of 4 years or less are to be treated as illiterate even if the child is going to school and may have picked up reading and writing a few odd words.

Workers :- A worker is a person whose main activity is participation in any economically productive work physically or mentally. Work involves not only actual work but effective supervision and direction of work. The following points are also taken into consideration to treat a person as a worker during 1981 census :-

- i) A person who normally works but has been absent from work during the reference period (i.e. during the last one year prior to the date of enumeration) on account of illness, holidays, temporary closure, strikes etc. is treated as engaged in the work he/she would otherwise have been doing but for his/her temporary absence.
- ii) Persons under training such as apprentices with or without stipends, or wages are treated as workers.
- iii) 'A ¹ person' who has, merely been offered work but has not actually joined yet is a worker.
- iv) A fulltime public service or a fulltime political worker, who is also actively rengaged in furthering the political activity of his/her party is streated as a worker.

Workers are further "divided into two categories, viz, main workers and marginal workers.

Main workers :- If a person has done any work at all during the year, he is regarded, as a worker. The main worker and the marginal worker is identified, by the number of days he/she had been engaged in the economic and productive work during the year. If a persons has done such work for 6 month or 183 days or more during the reference, period (i, e. during the last one year prior to the date of enumeration) he is regarded as the main worker.

The person who is main worker may have worked for six months or 183 days or more than one activity. For example he/she may have worked for 3 months in cultivation, one month in gur making and 3 months as an agricultural labourer.

When main activity of a person qualifies him to be treated as a worker he/she is further categorised according to the type of work he/she performs viz, cultivator, agricultural labourer, household industry and other work. The terms are explained below :-- **Cultivators** :— For the purposes of census a person is working as a cultivator if he/she is engaged either as employer, single worker or family worker in cultivation of land owned or held from the Government or held from private person institutions for payment of money in kind or share. Cultivation includes supervision or direction of cultivation. If a person gives out his land to another person for cultivation for money or share of crops and who does not even supervise or direct cultivation of land is not treated as cultivator.

Agricultural labourer :- A person working in another person's land for wages is not treated as cultivator but he is treated as an agricultural labourer.

Household industry :- A person is said to be engaged in household industry if he/she is engaged in some productive, processing servicing or repair of articles or goods such as handloom, weaving, dying, carpentry, bidi rolling, pottery making, bicycle repairing blacksmithy, tailoring etc, and if it is conducted by the head of the household at home or within the village in the rural areas and only within the pricints of the house where the household lives in the urban areas. The industry should not be run on the scale of a registered factory.

Other worker :-- All workers, i.e., those who have been engaged in some economic activity who are not cultivators or agricultural labourers or engaged in household industry are "other worker".

Marginal worker :-- If a person has worked any time, but has not worked for the major part of the year he is treated as a marginal worker. He may be a student or engaged in household duties or, dependent or rentier or beggar or inmate of institution, such as prisoner.

Non-worker :- Non-worker is a person who is not engaged in any economically productive work. Non-workers are categorised under seven broad heads namely household duties, students, rentiers and retired persons, dependents, beggars and inmate of institutions.

BRIEF HISTORY OF THE DISTRICT AND THE DISTRICT CENSUS HANDBOOK

Tuensang is the eastern most of the seven districts of Nagaland. The wild tracts of land on the east of the then Assam Province were brought under administration in 1914 when the Assam Frontier Tracts Regulation of 1880 was extended to this area. In 1957 this area was collectively known as North East Frontier Agency or NEFA in short. Tuensang was apart of it. In December 1957, Tuensang Division of the then NEFA was separated from it and was added to the then Naga Hills to form a new administrative unit known as NHTA or Naga Hills. Tuensang Area.

Tuensang district was one of the then three districts of Nagaland state and they were Kohima, Mokokchung and Tuensang district. In December 1973, the three districts of Nagaland were further divided in seven districts vide Govt. Notification No. APA 18/12/71 (Hq.) dated 19.12.73. Kohima was divided into two-Kohima and Phek, Mokokchung into three-Mokokchung, Zunheboto and Wokha and Tuensang into two-Tuensang and Mon.

Thus the present Tuensang district is one of the seven districts of Nagaland state.

Origin of the name :— Tuensang district is named after the town of the same name and the town is named after the village of that name which situated close by the town. The origin of the name of the village and its meaning is shrouded in obscurity.

The district has sixteen rural circle and one town. The area of Tuensang district is 4228.0 sq.kms out of which 4193.7 sq.kms is rural and 34.3 sq.kms is urban.

Tuensang district has 236 inhabited villages. It is populated by some ten tribes or ten tribal language groups and they are Sangtam, Phom, Chang, Khiemnunga, Yimchungre, Konyak, Sema, Tikhir, Chirr and Makware.

During 1971 Census the District Census Handbook of Tuensang district was published where in Mon district was included but the District Census Handbook of 1981 census excludes the Circles falling under the then Mon Sub-division. The publication of the District Census Handbook was first introduced in the country in 1951 census, long before Nagaland attained its Statehood. In 1961 census, attempts were fully made to publish DCH for all three districts of Nagaland but the work had to be dropped in the editing stage mainly because of delay.

The DCH could publish during 1971 census for all three districts in uniform manner and could success in publishing them into three parts such as Part A, B and C and were found very useful guide and reference book for administrators, planners of the state machinery and public bodies. This handbook served as a reference book of the district which helped in the developmental purposes in the district during the decade.

In 1981 census also efforts have been put to publish the DCH for all seven districts in wide range and uniform manner, which will fulfill the demands for statistical bodies of state Government and local bodies. To avoid delay part A & B have been combined in one volume.

The scope of the two parts of this volume are as follows :---

Scope of Part-A :- The District Census Handbook part A contains with village and town directory and the numbers of inset tables based on village and town directory data.

The village directory reveals the general living condition of peasantry and the over all development that has taken place in the district during the decade. The amenities available within each village in the field of education, medical and health, drinking water, communications post and telegraph have been given in column 5 to 10 of this directory. Besides the information relating distance from the nearest town, staple food, power supply approach to village etc are given in columns 11 to 14.

This directory also gives the information regarding the landuse in hectares. Even though the villages in Nagaland are not cadastrally surveyed the approximate area of the different types of land use are being presented in columns 15 to 20 of the directory. All possible efforts have been made to record the places of religious, historical or archaeological interests if any, for each village, in column 21.

Four appendices which have been prepared on the basis of village directory and PCA data are incorporated in this volume with a brief explanation :--

Appendix I :- This appendix shows circlewise abstract of educational, medical and other amenities. From this appendix it appears that almost all the villages in the district have educational facilities of more than one type, like primary, middle and high school/matriculation/secondary school facility while few villages have only one type of educational facility like primary or middle school.

Appendix II :- This appendix relates to the different types of landuse in the non-municipality towns (census towns). But as there is no census town in the district, columns in the said appendix shows nil.

Appendix III:— This appendix relates to the list of village where no facility of educational, medical, drinking water etc is available. This appendix appears as nil because there is not a single village where either of the above facilities are not available in the district. Thus the columns in this appendix are shown Nil.

Appendix IV :— This appendix deals with the circle wise list of villages according to the proportion of Scheduled Tribes (percentages) to the total population by ranges. It appears from this appendix that no villages fall in the lower ranges but almost all the villages in the district fall in the two highest ranges e.g., 36-50 and 51 and above.

Town Directory :- Statement I furnishes the status and growth history of the town at the censuses of 1901 to 1981.

Statement II furnishes the physical aspects and location of the town, 1979. The rainfall and temperature data in maximum and minimum, name and road distance of the state HQ from the town have also been given. The nearest city, rly station and the bus route also are furnished with distance within brackets.

Statement IV furnishes the data relating to civic and other amenities, 1979. It furnishes the Scheduled Caste/tribe population, road length in km, system of swerage and number of latrines of different types, method of disposal of night soil, protected water supply with source of supply, system of storage with capacity in litres and electrification (number of connections) in the town.

Statement V furnishes informations relating to the medical, educational and the recreational facilities during 1979 in Tuensang town.

Statement VI furnishes the information relating to the trade, commerce, industry and bank facilities in the town. It gives the informations relating to the three most important commodities which are exported, imported and manufactured in and by the towns.

Scope of Part-B:— This part of this volume gives the town/village wise primary Abstract with a fly leaf, which includes the informations relating to the total area of the village, occupied residential houses, total number of households, population and its sex wise breakups and also Scheduled castes/tribes, literates and worker population and its different categories like cultivators, agricultural labourers, household industry, marginal workers, other workers and non-worker population and their sexwise break ups. The Primary Census Abstract is known as PCA in the census terminology which has 28 columns.

This part contains the Primary Abstract for Scheduled Castes/Tribes for the district followed by circles and towns. It has 31 columns. It gives the figures relating to the number of household with ST members, (total/rural/urban) sexwise, scheduled tribes literates sexwise (total/rural/urban) total main workers (total/rural/urbrn) of different categories such as cultivators, agricultural labourers, household industry, other workers, marginal workers and non-workers sexwise (total/rural/urban) for district followed by the circles.

Tuensang is eastern most district of Nagaland and all along its eastern side it is bordered by Burma, on the north of Tuensang lies Mon district. It also touches Assam on its east and Mokokchung on the west, on the south of Tuensang lies Phek and on the west are Zunheboto and Mokokchung districts. The district is oblong is shape and stretches north-south.

The entire district is hilly and it does not adjoin any plain area except in the extreme and narrow north. The hills are on the average 1500 metre above the sealevel.

Rivers:— There are two rivers which flow through the district are Tizu and Dikhu. Tizu rises from the southern part of the district and has flown north. After joining northward it turns east and then south-east and joins Chindwin in Burma. Tizu has been fed by Zunki which comes from south and flows east and south-east and joins Chindwin.

The northern part of the district is drained by Dikhu system. It rises in the central part of the district and flows north. At the beginning its name is Yangmun or Yangnyu. It has been joined by a tributary from west and combined flow is known as Dikhu. The Dikhu flows north, then turns west and passes through Mokokchung and Mon districts and flows part Naginimara and later joins the Brahmaputra in Assam.

There is a notable change in the jurisdiction of the district during 1971-81. The former Tuensang district has been divided into two such as Tuensang and Mon district. All circles under Mon sub-division of 1971 census and total area of 17860 km² has been transfered to create a new district of Mon. The circles are namely Mon town, Naginimara, Champang, Chen, Phomching, Mon sadar and Tizit. 6 villages which were under Tobu circle during 1971 census have been transfered to constitute a new circle of Monyakshu. The present Tuensang district has sixteen circles and they are Pungro, Kiphire, Sitimi, Seyochung, Chessore, Shamatorr, Thonoknyu, Noklak, Tuensang sadar, Longkhim, Chare, Noksen, Longleng, Tobu, Monyakshu and Tamlu. The district has a town during 1981 but there was no town during 1971 census.

The total population of Tuensang district during 1981 census is 152,322 out of which 140,132 persons are rural and 12,200 persons are urban. The population of all the sixteen circles as well as town have been furnished below :--

People:— Tuensang is the biggest of the seven districts of Nagaland. The district is inhabited by nine tribes or language groups who are the real inhabitants of this district. They are Chang, Sangtam, Yimchungre, Khiemnungan, Tikhir, Phom, Makware, Chirr and Sema.

The total scheduled tribe population of this district is 142,376 out of which 72,838 are males and 69,538 are females out of the total S. T. Population of the district \$,267 persons live in Tuensang town.

Major characteristics of the district particularly in relation to the economic resources :-

The people of the district are all agriculturists and they all live in the villages. Even Tuensang town, according to 1971 census, was not a town because it did not fulfil the conditions of a town. But during 1981 census Tuensang has a town i. e., Tuensang town. Prior to this all the places of the district are rural. They not only live in the villages but their very heart and soul depends on agriculture. They do not have any other economic resources.

Forest :- Tuensang district has no reserve or protected forests but has only unclassified village forests. It is in exclusion of jhum lands which are also covered by small tree, undergrowth and bushes etc.,

The people get all their building materials such as thatch and leaves for roofing, posts and timber, cane, bamboo etc., from unclassified forests and jhum land forests. They also collect their fire wood, honey fodden etc., from these forests.

It may be mentioned here that forests in Nagaland used to be managed by the Forest Department according to Assam Forest Regulation Act, 1891. After the state of Nagaland was formed, Nagaland Forest Act, 1968 was passed and so now the forests including this district are managed according to this Act. Under this Act, the state Government has been empowered to constitute Reserved, Protected and village forests and demarcate them.

There is a Divisional Forest Officer in Tuensang and under him there are Rangers and forest guards who together look into the management of forest of this district.

Minerals and Mining :- Our state remained unexplored for a longtime inspite of the rich mineral deposits we have. So far, the department of Geology and Mining have discovered some important economic mineral deposits which in due course may give a hope for establishing mineral based industries.

The mineral exploration programmes have resulted in the discovery of vast resources of high grade limestone, sizeable resources of coal, multimetal deposits of Chromium-nicket-cobalt bearing magnetite and encouraging prospect of polumetallic sulphate mineralisation. Besides these, deposite of clay, slate, and glass sands have also been discovered.

Coalbelt :- Five coal seams ranging in thickness form 0.40 to 3.19 m had been recorded from Tuensang Coalbelt. Geological mapping has been completed in the Konya sector of Tuensang district.

Limestone deposit :- Extensive limestone occurances have been discovered at a number of places in Tuensang district.

Multimetal deposit iron, chromite, nickel and Cobalt :- A number of deposits of chromium, nickel and Cobalt bearing magnetite in the ophiolite complex of Tuensang district have been discovered. One of these deposits near Phokphur village of this district is under exploration.

In order to undertake the utilisation and exploitation of the vast mineral resources which are now being identified in the state, the Nagaland state Mineral Development Corporation has been registered in 1981 and preliminary steps are now being taken for exploitation of the various minerals in the state.

Land and Land - use Pattern :- Agriculture is the main stay of the people of this district. There is no waste or barren land other than forests. There is sufficient arable land in the district. But the practice of jhum reduces the total arable land available to onefifth if not still less. It is so because the same land is sultivated after about 3 to 10 years. Though there is sufficient cultivable land the rate of production per unit is not good that is why they do not produce food for one harvest to another and often

they suffer from shortage. There are many people who produce food sufficient only for nine to ten months of the year, and they in time of scarcity subsidise their food by taro (Colocasia) apart from millet and maize.

Land Tenure :- All the lands belong to the villagers. Every villages has got its own land surrounding the village. In the village again every clan or khel has got its own land. Thus the land belongs to the clans and so there is no patta or Rayati system. In the clan again, every individual family has got its own land. This family land goes on sub-division itself as the members of the family increase in number. When the land falls short for any particular family, it is made good from the khel or clan land or the village land. If any individual wants to sale or purchase the land, it can be done within/from the same village but not to/from other village.

In case of sale, it is verbally done in presence of some responsible persons of the village. Now adays such sale is generally done in written as many of the people can read and write their own language Such a deed is generally not registered but simply witnessed by responsible villagers. Only in the case of urban and costly properties, it is registered in the court of the administrative officer under whose jurisdiction it falls.

Agriculture :- The main type of agricultural practices in the district is jhum cultivation. The other form of cultivation is terrace. This form of cultivation is practiced in a limited way because everywhere the land form is not suitable for terrace and the facilities for irrigating the terrace are not available everywhere.

In this district the agricultural is still primitive. At present most of the agricultural implements are made of iorn and some are made of bamboo. The common implements are as follows :-

1. Dao 2. Axe 3. Spade 4. Hoe 5. Pick 6. Scraper 7. Sickle 8. Rake 9. Mat 10. Winnowing fan 11. Basket 12. Pounding etc, etc.

Animal Husbandry :-- Meat being the most important item of curry and beef being the cheapest, every Naga house keeps a few cattle both cows and bulls for breeding purposes and when they are no longer productive they are slaughtered for their meat.

The people of the district also rear pigs and fowls, ducks for their meat and eggs. For cattle and goats and sheep no fodder is generally used but they wildly graze and come back in the evening.

Fishery :- Fishery Development activities in a planned way was first introduced in the state. Dearth of technical personnel has been one of the handicaps for speedy expension of the Fisheries Development activities. However, the department at present supervises the work of the local fish farmers and renders necessary technical guidance for construction of the Fishery ponds with the limited hands. Besides, financial help in the shape of subsidy is being expanded to the deserving fish farmers for construction of ponds and also in supplying fingenlings on subsidy basis. The department of Fishery which looks into fisciculture and grants loan for that is under Agriculture and is looked after by a Fishery Officer under the District Agriculture Officer.

Industry :-- There is a Directorate of Industries in the state and at present there is a district Industries Officer in Tuensang district. He looks after the small industries of this district such as weaving, smithy, carpentry, motor repairing etc, the only industry in the district. The other way it is called Cottage industry. Among different cottage industries the most important ones are weaving, carpentry, black smithy, bamboo and cane crafts, wood carving and decorative works which are discussed below :-- Weaving :-- This is the most important industry because all the people, except few educated people use home-spun cloths. The skirts women use is made at home. Besides these they also make chadar and upper garments at home. In everyhouse every women weaves her own clothes. As a result of this traditional aspect of weaving every woman should know weaving.

Every Naga tribe has got its distinctive design for the clothes, particularly the clothes that women wear. The different design, colour combination, and the spacing and border are so much so that any accustomed eye can differentiate the clothes of one tribe from the other. They also weave the clothes by mixing up the different designs to develop new designs as a result of such admixture and invention of designs, the clothes are more colourful and beautiful.

The loom they use for weaving is a handloom and is technically known as Indonesian Tension Loom. It is so called because this kind of tension loom is found all over Indonesia. This loom is a simple back strap one with continuous horizontal warp consisting of six sticks serving the function of warp beam lease rod, heald stick, beating sword, and extra-warp beam.

Carpentry :— Before 1957 or before the formation of NHTA there was a compulsory subject of carpentry in M. E. School of the state. So all the persons who are educated in this schools know carpentry to some extent. Apart from them there are also some self trained carpenters in the district who are expert in this work. All of them together do a lot of carpentry work, such as house building of timber and planks, furniture making etc. This work may not be their profession but a source of side income.

Blacksmithy :— The people of this district make the iron impliments such as sickles, scraper, daos and hoes which are all time companion of the villagers. They even make muzzle loading guns locally. Dao of this district is very famous.

Basket Making :— Various types of basket are in use in this district. These are mainly used for carrying paddy and other crops as well as other household articles from one place to another. They even make the baskets for carrying firewood and water. There are several types of baskets some are fine and some are course. The finer qualities are sometimes decorative also. The Basket making is common in every house and it is made for individual household use. The basket making is generally a pastime work and sometimes finer workmenship is displayed in it.

Wood Carving :— The people do a lot of wood carving on the pillars of the morungs and dwelling houses. The carvings are generally figuring wild animals, birds, and crocodiles. They also make wooden platter with four legs or single combined leg for taking food there on. For holding dao, a dao-case is also made of wood and often it is decorated.

Pottery :- A large number of people still use earthen pots for cooking, and earthen pots are made locally. The pots are rough coarse and thick but useful. These are not made with the potters wheel but simply with hand and stick. The pots are of different shapes and sizes and are used for cooking storing rice beer etc.

There is no organised industry set up yet in the district.

Trade and Commerce :-- The district being situated in the heart of the hills, on the extreme east of the state of Nagaland beyond which lie the hills of Burma, it is at a disadvantageous position so far trade and commerce is concerned. As it happens in rural areas, as most part of Tuensang district is, there is no banking system except in Tuensang town. There is no place in the rural areas where people can deposit their money and get interest on it, or borrow from it.

Tuensang town, a branch of State Bank of India, a nationalised bank has been opened in 1970. There is a district Treasury at Tuensang and all its receipts and payments are carried through this bank.

Tuensang, the district headquarter, is situated almost in the middle of the district and so it serves as a centre for the whole district. Some of the trade centres are Kiphire, Shamatorr, Longkhim, Tobu etc.

In Tuensang town there is a daily market where food stuffs, meat, fish, eggs, vegetable as well as other necessities of a house are available. There is no other daily market in this district but in all the administrative out posts the people from nearby villages come to sale their produce particularly vegetables, and purchase their needs from the shops. The shopkeepers sometimes bring vegetables and fish from outside and sale it.

Transport :- For long Tuensang district was outside the pale of modern means of communication. When the area was first opened up in 1948 construction of roads started, and the first road was from Mokokchung to Tuensang of course it was then only a briddle path-Later this road was broadened and was made jeepable, but it still remained Katcha. Only in 1968, the Border Road organisation took it up and widened and metalled it and number of buses are at present plying from Tuensang to Mokokchung. Also from Tuensang buses are plying to Shamatorr as well as to Kiphire. At present Tuensang Bus station has got five buses, all 40 seaters. Nagaland State Transport is the state level organisation and is headed by a General Manager with headquarter at Dimapur, Tuensang is under one station Superintendent. Buses ply from Tuensang to Kiphire and transport trucks carrying goods ply from Amguri, Jorhat, Mariani, Mokokchung ete to Tuensang and Kohima to Kiphire.

Brief Analysis of Village and Town Directory and PCA Data Based on Inset Tables

TABLE 1

The above table gives the circle wise distribution of villages according to the availability of different amenities in 236 villages of the district, such as education, medical, drinking water, post and telegraphs, communications, approach by pucca roads and power supply.

Tuensang district has 236 inhabited villages, of this 230 villages in the district or 97.46 percent have got educational facilities of one type or other. Similarly another 40 villages or 17.80 percent have got medical facilities of one type or other, 234 villages or 99.15 percent have got drinking water facilities, 17 villages or 7.20 percent have post and 'telegraph and communication facilities, 18 villages or 7.63 percent have got approach by pucca road facilities and 53 villages or 22.00 percent have got power supply facilities.

Circle wise in Pungro, Kiphire, Sitimi, Seyochung, Chessore, Noklak, Longkhim, Noksen, Longleng, Tobu and Tamlu circle have got 100 percent of educational facilities and except in Tuensang sadar and Monyakshu circle in all the circles have 100 percent of drinking water facility.

Post and telegraph facility is nil in Pungro, Sitimi, Seyochung, Noklak and Tuensang sadar circle, communication facility is nil in Pungro; Sitimi, Seyochung, Chessore, Thonoknyu, Noklak, Tuensang Sadar, Noksen, Longleng, Manyakshu and Tamlu circle. Similarly, this table shows the facilities available and not available in the circles relating to the remaining amenities such as approach by pucca road and power supply.

TABLE 2

The table 2 deals with the proportion of rural population served by different amenities. There are 236 inhabited villages with the population 104, 126, out of which 99.85 percent of rural population are

served by educational facilities, 27.76 percent by medical, 99.74 percent by drinking water facility, 13.54 percent by post and telegraph, 8.53 percent by communication, 8.73 percent by approach by pucca road and 30.38 percent by power supply facility. This table also gives the circle wise proportion of population served by all these amenities.

This table reveals that the highest proportions of population are served by educational and drinking water facilities in the circles/district followed by power supply, medica¹ and post and telegraph facilities and lowest proportions of population are served by communication and approach by pucca road i. e. 8.53 percent and 8.73 percent respectively.

TABLE 3

Table 3 deals with the distribution of villages having certain amenities arranged by distance range from the places where these are available.

As already stated in proceeding pages, there are 326 villages in the district of this 6 villages do not have educational facilities. Out of these 2 villages have this facility within a distance range of less than 5 kms, 1 village have this facility within the distance range of 5-10 kms, 2 within the distance range 10 kms and above and 1 within the distance "unspecified".

194 villages do not have medical facility of these 46 villages have the medical facility within the distance range of less than 5 kms, 40 villages have this facility within 5-10 kms, 81 villages have within 10 kms and above and another 27 villages have this facility within the distance range "unspecified".

Similarly 2 villages do not have drinking water facility but 1 have within the distance range of 10 kms and above and other have within the distance range "unspecified" 219 villages do not have this facility of these 31 villages have this facility within the distance range of 5-10 kms, 130 villages have this facility within the distance range of 5 villages have this facility within the distance range of 10 kms and above, and another 35 villages have this facility within the distance range unspecified.

219 villages do not have communication facility but have this facility within the distance ranges of less than 5 kms, 5-10 kms, 10 kms and above and within the distance range "unspecified".

TABLE 4

The above table deals with the distribution of villages according to the distance from the nearest town and availability of different amenities. In the district 2 villages which are within 5 kms distance from the nearest town, of this all 2 or 100.00 percent have the educational facility within the village itself. 1 village or 50.00 percent have niedical, all 2 villages of this range are having drinking water and power supply facility. None of these 2 villages have post and telegraph, communication and approach by pucca road facilities.

9 villages fall within the distance range of 6-15 from nearest town of this 8 villages have educational facility with 88.89 percent, 3 have medical with 33.33 percent, 9 or 100 percent of villages within the range have drinking water facility, 2 villages or 22.22 percent have approach by pucca road facility and 6 or 66.67 percent of villages have power supply facility.

55 villages fall within the distance range 16-50 kms from the nearest town, out of these 53 or 94.64 percent of villages have educational facility, 9 or 16.07 percent of villages have medical, 55 or 100 percent of the villages have drinking water facility, 7 or 12.50 percent have post and telegraph facility, 8 or 14.29 percent of the villages have communication facility, 12 or 21.43 percent of villages have approach

by pucca road facility and 21 or 38.00 percent of the villages have power supply facility 147 villages in the district fall within the distance range 51 kms and above from the nearest town, out of these 145 or 98.64 percent of the villages have educational facility, 26 or 17.69 percent of the villages have medical facility, 147 or 100.00 percent of the villages have drinking water facility 10 or 6.80 percent of the villages have post and telegraph facility, 9 or 6.12 percent of the villages have communication facilities, 1 village or 0.68 percent have approached by pucca road facility and 24 or 16.00 percent of the villages have power supply facility.

23 villages fall within the distance unspecified. The distance of these villages recorded unspecified as the distances of these villages from the nearest town are not available in the village directory. Out of these 23 villages 22 or 95.65 percent of the villages have educational facility, 3 or 13.04 percent of the villages have medical, 21 or 91.30 percent of the villages have drinking water, 3 or 13.04 percent of the villages have approached by pucca road facilities.

Out of 236 inhabited villages in the district, 230 or 97.40 percent of the villages have educational, 42 or 17.80 percent of the villages have medical, 234 or 99.15 percent of the villages have drinking water, 17 or 7.20 percent of the villages have post and telegraph and communication facilities and 53 or 22.00 percent of the villages have power supply facility.

TABLE 5

Table 5 deals with the distribution of villages according to population range and amenities available. There are as many as 129 villages having a population upto 499 of them 125 villages have educational facility in the village itself, 18 villages have medical, 129 villages have drinking water facility, 4 villages have post and telegraph facility, 10 villages have communication and approached by pucca road facility and 17 - villages have power supply facility.

There are 102 villages within the population range of 500-1,999, of these 100 villages have educational facility 21 villages have medical, all the 100 villages have drinking water facilities, 11 villages have post and telegraph, 6 villages have communication, 7 villages have approach by pucca road and 33 villages have been electrified.

Remaining 5 villages in the district have the population range between 2000-4999. All of them have educational and drinking water facilities and 3 villages have medical, 2 have post and telegraph, 1 have communication and approach by pucca road and 3 villages have been electrified.

TABLE 6

The table 6 deals with the main staple food in the majority of the villages in each circle. As can be seen from this table the staple food of the district as a whole has been rice although in Pungro and Seyochung circle the staple food is millet jobstear, maize and maize respectively which is supplemented by rice which mostly imported from outside.

TABLE 7

Table 7 indicates the growth, density and sex-ratio of urban population in the district in relation to the state during the last four decade.

Tuensang district, which has only one town during 1981, has a percentage of urban population of 8.01 percent. Urban population, of the state was 1.94 percent, 5.19 percent, 9.95 percent and 15.52 percent respectively during the last four censuses commencing from 1951 to 1981. The aforesaid figures show

the highest urban growth in the state, 15.52 percent compared to the rest of the censuses. The density of population of the urban area of the district during 1981 census is 356 population per sq. kms. In respect of state the density of urban population per sq. km. being 399 in 1951, 728 in 1961, 1,230 in 1971 and 1,105 in 1981 census.

Sex ratio in urban area in the district of 1981 is 658. In respect of state the sex ratio per 1,000 males is 739, 628, 472 and 688 in 1951, 1961, 1971 and 1981 respectively.

TABLE 8

Table 8 deals with new town/towns declassified in 1981 census. Tuensang town is the new town which has been created during 1981 census, which has a population of 12,200 persons.

TABLE 9

This table deals with per capita receipt expenditure in the towns of the district.

The civic status of the town is T.C, (town committee). The receipt and expenditure columns are indicated 'NA' as the information is not available.

TABLE 10

Table 10 gives the number of schools per ten thousand population in town of the district. In Tuensang town the Higher Secondary/Inter/PUC/Junior college per 10,000 population is 0.82, Secondary/Matriculation and Middle schools are 1.64 and Primary schools are 4.10.

TABLE 11

Table 11 deals with the number of beds in medical institution in town. Tuensang town has number of beds in medical institutions per 1,000 population to the extent of 6.97.

TABLE 12

Table 12 deals with the most important commodity manufactured, imported and exported in the town. Tuensang town manufactures timber and carving products, exports handloom goods of cotton, silks and wool and imports rice, dal, fruits and vegetables.

TABLE 13

Table 13 deals with population, number of villages and towns in the district in 1981 census. As can be seen from the table the population of the district as on the sunrise of 1st March, 1981 has been 152,332, male population being 80,498 and females 71,834. As elsewhere in the state, the district is predominantly rural and of the aforesaid total population 140,126 persons live in the rural areas compared to the urban population of 12,200 in the district. The entire population is spread over in 236 villages and the urban population settle in one town of the district. There is no inhabited village in Tuensang district.

Table 14 deals with the decadal change in the distribution of population with rural/urban break up and percentage variation there in.

The aforesaid table indicates that Tuensang district had population 173,003 including the population of present Mon district. The population of Tuensang district in this table is during 1971 census is 108,863 excluding the population of the circles/villages falling under Mon sub-division i.e. 64,140 persons.

The aforesaid table indicates that Tuensang district has a net addition of 43,469 persons during the decade under reveiw there by registered overall growth rate of +39.93 percent during the decade where as rural population has registered a growth rate of 28.72 percent.

Circle wise growth rate during the decade is highest in Kiphire circle (87.25%) followed by Shamatorr circle (53.92%), the growth rate of Manyakshu circle is lowest (-3.80%) during the decade because the population is seen decreased in some of the villages in this circle in 1981 census.

The growth rate of Tuensang sadar circle is low (-16.91 percent) during 1971-1981, it is because of the reason that the population of during 1971 census is more in Tuensang sadar circle and has become less in 1981 census as Tuensang H.Q. (village) of 1971 Census has been merged with Tuensang town during 1981 census. But in other circles considerably increase of growth rates have been recorded during the decade.

TABLE 15

The table 15 deals with the distribution of villages by population ranges in the district. There are 50 villages comprising 21.19 percent of the total villages in the district which have less than 200 population, 79 villages comprising 33.47 percent of the total villages in the district have a population ranging between 200-499, 102 villages with 43.22 percent of the total villages have a population ranging between 500-1,999 and other 5 villages with 2.12 percent of the total villages have a population ranging between 2,000-4,999.

TABLE 16

The table 16 deals with the proportion of scheduled tribe population to total population in the villages. In Tuensang district there is not a single village having no Scheduled tribe population. All the 236 villages of the district have been distributed according to the percentage range of Scheduled Tribe population. There are 3 villages in the district comprising 0.42 percent of the total villages have S.T. population one each between the percentage range of 5 or less, 26-35 and 36-50.

There are as many as 233 villages comprising overwhelming percentage of 98.74 percent in the district having scheduled tribe population.

The table 17 gives the proportion of Scheduled Tribe population in towns of the district. Tuensang district has only one town with 12,200 population out of which 8,267 persons are scheduled tribes com-

TABLE 18

Table 18 gives the literacy rates by population ranges of the villages. There are 50 villages with population of less than 200 persons in each village which has a combined literacy rate of 34.15 percent. Another 79 villages in the population range of 200-499 have a literacy rate of 28.49 percent. Next 102 villages in the population range of 500-1,999 have a literacy rate of 26.52 percent and another 5 villages fall in the population range of 2000-4,999 have a literacy rate of 25.82 percent. The total rural literacy rate of the district is 27.37 percent.

The table 19 deals with the literacy rate for towns. The literacy rate for Tuensang town is 66.27 percent.

TABLE 20

The table 20 deals with the literates workers, non-workers, Sche luled Caste/Tribes population in the district.

The total rural and urban scheduled tribe population in the district are 93.45%, 95.70% and 67.76% respectively.

Circle wise Monyakshu circle has the highest percentage of Scheduled tribe population with 99.65 percent follows by Chessore circle with 99.15 percent, Sitimi circle with 99.12 percent and Seyochung circle with 99.09 percent.

Tamlu circle has the lowest percentage of Scheduled Tribe population comprising of 87.24 percent.

The total literacy in the district is 30.49 percent, rural literacy being 27.37 percent and urban literacy 66.27 percent. The total male literacy percentage in the district and the percentages of rural/urban breakup are 30.49 percent, 27.37 percent and 16.27 percent respectively. The percentage of female literacy in the district and rural/urban breakup being 36.98 percent, 33.30 percent and 72.49 percent respectively.

Circlewise, Chare circle has highest percentage of literacy among the rural areas in the district with 50.65 percent followed by Sitimi circle with 36.78 percent. Tuensang town has the percentage of literacy to the total population to the extent of 66.27 percent.

The lowest percentage of literacy is recorded in Monyakshu circle i. e. 12.08 percent. The remaining circles have the total male/female literacy percentage as follows :--

Pungro circle 23.23 percent, out of which 31.92 percent as male and 13.94 percent is female, Kiphire circle 35.39 percent out of which 43.91 percent male and 25.33 percent female, Seyochung circle 30.60 percent, of this 40.87 percent male and 20.05 percent female, Chessore circle 22.99 percent of this 30.80 percent male and 15.28 percent female, Shamatorr circle 23.78 percent out of which 32.61 percent male and 14.45 percent female, Thonoknyu circle 13.81 percent of this 20.04 percent male and 7.14 percent female, Noklak 19.81 percent of this 25.13 percent male and 14.07 percent female, Tuensang sadar circle 28.72 percent of this 32.99 percent male and 23.82 percent female. Longkhim circle 35.99 percent, of this 41.21 percent male and 30.71 percent female, Noksen 32.34 percent, of this 36.50 percent male and 28.15 percent female, Longleng circle 30.88 percent, of this 34.88 percent male and 26.32 percent female, Tobu circle 15.51 percent, of this 21.38 percent male and 8.49 percent female, Tamlu circle 36.21 percent out of which 42.18 percent male and 29.77 percent female.

The total percentage of main worker in the district is 51.81 percent out of which 53.38 percent is rural and 33.69 percent is urban.

The highest rural percentage of working population including marginal workers has been recorded in Monyakshu circle i. e. 69.65 percent followed by Tobu circle with 65.57 percent. Circlewise percentages of main workers, marginal workers, total workers and non-workers in total/male/female are also given in this table.

The percentages of workers are higher than that of non-workers in Pungro, Kiphire, Sitimi, Seyochung, Chessore, Shamatorr, Thonoknyu, Noklak and Tobu circle and remaining circles such as Tuensang sadar, Longkhim, Chare, Noksen, Longleng and Tamlu the percentages of non-working population is higher than that of working population. In Tuensang town the percentage of working population is higher than that of the non-working population i. e. 33.79 percent and 30.93 percent respectively.

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PART—B PRIMARY CENSUS ABSTRACT

PRIMARY CENSUS ABSTRACT Fly Leaf

In this part basic population figures in respect of each village in case of rural areas and for each ward in case of urban areas have been presented in 28 columns for each circle/town separately. In census terminology this statement is called primary census Abstract.

This Abstract can be divided into following five parts for column wise illustration :---

(a) The first part contains two columns, eg., columns 1 and 2, code number assigned to each village within each circle and for each ward within the town and name of each village within each circle and name of town/ward within the urban area.

(b) The second part of the Abstract relates to the information pertaining to the total area, number of occupied residential houses, number of households, sexwise distribution of population, sexwise population of scheduled castes/tribes and literacy figures for each village within the circle in the rural areas and for each ward incase of urban area. The total area in column 3 has been given for the town only but the same could not be furnished for each village within each circle as the villages in the district are not cadestrally surveyed. The total numbes of occupied residential houses in column 4 excludes the vacant houses and other houses which are used for non-residential purposes and the information is based on the Abridged Houselist of 1981 on enumeration. The number of households in column 5 has been distributed sexwise in column 7 and 8 of the Abstract for each village and urban ward which also included houseless and institutional population.

(c) The third part of the Abstract contains column 9 to 12. The columns 9 and 10 are kept blank as there is no scheduled casts population in Nagaland as per Constitution. (Nagaland) Scheduled Tribe Order, 1970. In columns 11 and 12 the sexwise population of scheduled tribes have been presented. The sexwise literacy figures have been presented in columns 13 and 14.

(d) The fourth part from columns 15-26 deals with working population. In columns 15 and 16 sexwise main workers have been given where as from columns 17-24 the figures relating to the main workers into four broad categories of workers have been presented. These categories include workers engaged as cultivator, Agricultural labourers, Household Industry and remaining workers which fall under the industrial classification in category III, IV, V (b). VI to IX under the heading "Other workers". It may be noted that the particulars about these categories of workers are not being presented in the primary census Abstract itself separately, however, the same has been presented in table B-3 of Part-III of our publication. In columns 25-26 sexwise particulars of marginal workers have been presented. This category of workers are other then the main workers and are engaged in economic pursuits for only some part of the year.

(e) The fifth part contains with the non-working population who are dependent on others. The informations have been presented in columns 27-28 of this statement.

The definitions of all the categories of workers, non-workers and other items of the Abstract are given in the analytical note of this book.

The District Primary Census Abstract has been presented first and thereafter the Abstract in respect of each circle have been presented by rural and urban units separately.
