
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








CHART SHOWING COMPARATIVE POPULATION SIZE OF THE DISTRICTS OF TRIPURA 1971









PREFACE

This volume of the 1971 Census presents A-Series Tables and the Primary Census Abstract, the basic demographic data of 1971 Census. Each of the tables is explained by a fly-leaf.

The Census Act of 1948 (XXVII of 1948) was extended to Tripura by the Union Territory (laws) Act, 1950 (Act No. XXX of 1950) and the Chief Commissioner, Tripura was vested with the powers of the State Government by the Government of India under the Census Act. In a notification the Government of India fixed the reference date for the 1971 Census at the sunrise of 1st March, 1971. But the mid-term general elections for parliamentary constituencies in the country made it necessary to defer the date by a month. Therefore, the enumeration commenced on 10th March, 1971 and ended on 31st March, 1971 with the reference date fixed at the sunrise of 1st April, 1971. The enumeration in this Census covered all persons who were usually residing in the household during this period. This procedure is termed as 'de Jure' Census. The houseless persons were also enumerated on the night of 31st March, 1971. A revisional round of 3 days from 1st April to 3rd April was undertaken to bring the data upto-date by adding the new born babies or omitting the deceased population. This is the second time in the history of Tripura that census has been conducted independently under the supervision of an officer exclusively for Tripura. The designation of the Census Superintendents of the states and Union Territories were changed to Directors of Census Operations in 1969. The census questionnaires were pretested twice in the field before they took final shape. The first pretest was not required to be conducted in the Union Territories as per Registrar General's instruction. So this was not done in Tripura.

The second pretest was carried on in some selected areas in both rural and urban areas. After discussion with the Directors of Census Operations of various states and other data users in a conference the questionnaires were finalised. The schedules that were ultimately adopted were—

- (1) The houselist schedules
- (2) The establishment schedules
- (3) The Individual Slip
- (4) The population record

A sample of each of this form together with instructions on each is reproduced at the end of this report as annexure.

The first two schedules were canvassed during 1970 as a preliminary phase of housenumbering and house-listing operations and the last two schedules were canvassed during the second operations known as the enumeration.

After finalisation of schedules, these were translated into bengali. The translation in bengali was done by the Director of Census Operations, West Bengal and the same was used in Tripura with minor adjustment to suit local requirement. The schedules were printed centrally at Government of India Press through the Registrar General, India. Both english and bengali forms were used.

The census had to be carried on according to a strict time schedule and a census calendar which was a valuable aid in the planning of a census operation, was prepared for Tripura in consultation with the Registrar General, India. The calendar thus followed is reproduced below.

- (i) Preliminary discussion with the State Government regarding appointment of Census Officers.
- (ii) Arrangements for preparation of uptodate Town/Tehsil/Police Station/Sub-Divisional maps.
- (iii) Preparation of town and village list and Tehsil/Police Station list and assigning of location code numbers to all census units.
- (iv) Preparation of General Village Register and Town Register.
- (v) Collection of area figures from the Survey and Settlement Officer/Sub-Divisional Officers in respect of District/Sub-Division/Tehsil/Police Station/Towns and reconciliation of District total Rural/Urban areas.
- (vi) Notification of Census Questionnaires and instructions in the State Gazette as required by Census Act.
- (vii) Issue of general circulars with the signature of Chief Commissioner explaining the importance of the Census

and requesting all Government official for rendering full co-operation to the Census Organisation.

(viii) Issue of circular to all Sub-Divisional Officers explaining the procedure to be followed in the Census and requesting them for completion of all preliminary work relating to Census as expeditiously as possible.

November, 1969:

- (i) Collection of Administrative statistics from various agencies (non-census data) for Part I of the Town and Village Directories (The consolidation and compilation of the directory will be completed by June, 1970).
- (ii) Delineation of Standard Urban Areas in terms of rural and urban units.
- (iii) Appointment of Sub-Divisional Census Officers and Charge Officers.
- (iv) Constitution of Blocks, Supervisor's Circles and Charges of Charge Officers for the purpose of housenumbering and houselisting.

- (v) Issue of instructions explaining houselisting operations.
- Conference of Sub-Divisional Census Officers and training classes for Sub-Divisional Census Officers, Charge Officers and Supervisors in house numbering, houselisting and establishment schedules.

December, 1965:

- (i) Despatch of Houselists, Establishment Schedules, Enumerator's Abstracts and instruction Booklets to Sub-Divisional Officers.
- Appointment of Enumerators and Supervisors for housenumbering and houselisting operations.
- Drawing up of a training programme for Enumerators and Supervisors for houselisting operation.
- (iv) Publicity of housenumbering and houselisting.

January, 1970: to February, 1970.

Training classes for the Enumerators and Supervisors for housenumbering and houselisting operations including canvassing of Houselists and Establishment Schedules as a practical exercise through training Schedules.

March, 1970:

Publicity for houselisting.

April, 1970: May, 1970

Housenumbering, Houselisting and can-vassing of Establishment Schedules and preparation of Notional maps showing the lay-out of houses and the number allotted to them.

1st June 1970: to 15th June, 1970.

- Arrival of the Houselists and Establishment Schedules at the sub-divisional headquarters.
- (ii) Arrival of these schedules at the headquarters of the Director of Census Operations.

16th June, 1970: July, 1970.

- Recruitment and training of Key Punch Operators and supervisory staff.
- Checking of houselists for completeness, sampling of houselists, coding and punching of Houselists and Establishment Schedules in the Tabulation Office, (Separate programme will be drawn up for setting up of the Tabulation Office and completion of tabulation operation).

July, 1970: August, 1970.

- Preparation of Charge Register, Delineation of blocks and supervisor's circles on the basis of 1971 (1970) Houselists.
- Selection and earmarking of Census Enumerator and Supervisors in each Charge.
- Compilation of Part I (Non-Census Data) of the Village and Town Directories.
- (iv) Preparation of data for A-Series Tables for column other than those which relate to 1971 Census data.
- (v) Distribution of Training Enumeration slips and instructions to each Sub-Divisional Office/Charge/Circles.

September, 1970: to October, 1970.

Detai'ed instruction to be issued formu'ating the training programme of Census Officers at all levels including Enumerators and Supervisors,

- (ii) Conference of Sub-Divisional Census Officers and Charge Superintendents regarding enumeration.
- Training of Sub-Divisional Census Officers and Charge Superintendents for filling up the Individual Slips and Household Forms.
- (iv) Publicity measures.
- (v) Despatch of Individual Schedules, Household Forms, Instruction Book lets, etc. to the Sub-Divisional headquarters.

Reassessment of Blocks and Circles constituted and finalisation of Charge lists November, 1970: and Circle lists by Charge Superintendents and Circle Supervisors respectively.

- (i) Issue of appointment letters to additional Enumerators and Supervisors if required after reassessment of blocks and circles.
- Intensive training of Enumerators and Supervisors including practical exercise in enumeration on training schedules.

- Copying of abstracts of houselist for each Enumerator's block.

Enumeration of houseless population.

1st April to: 3rd April, 1971.

Revisional round of visit to every household by Enumerators.

3rd April, 1971: to

Compilation and reporting of provisional total to the Director of Census Operations by the Sub-Divisional Census Officers.

5th April, 1971. 7th April, 1971:

Communication of provisional total to the Registrar General, India.

8th April, 1971: to 15th Apri!, 1971.

Collection of Enumeration pads and other Census papers from all Charge Officers and despatch of the same to Director of

Census Operations with escort.

To ensure accuracy of the census, it was necessary to divide the territory into smaller units. Tripura was not surveyed cadastrally in the past. The cadastral survey was completed in 1969 except a few villages. It was first decided to conduct census on the basis of the new revenue villages. But for certain administrative difficulties, this could not be done. Census was conducted therefore on the basis of the 1961 census villages some of which were old revenue villages and the rest notional villages of the names by which they were known in the localities without any defined or well demarcated boundary. In the meantime the Government of Tripura with effect from 1st September, 1970 divided the one district territory into three districts viz., West Tripura, North Tripura, South Tripura

and the old 45 tehsils into 177. There are 10 subdivisions in Tripura. There were no change in their jurisdiction. The districts were formed by taking three or four sub-divisions wholly as shown below:—

West Tripura District-

- 1. Sadar sub-division
- 2. Khowai sub-division
- 3. Sonamura sub-division

North Tripura District-

- 1. Kailasahar sub-division
- 2. Kamalpur sub-division
- 3. Dharmanagar sub-division

South Tripura District—

- 1. Udaipur sub-division
- 2. Amarpur sub-division
- 3. Belonia sub-division
- 4. Sabroom sub-division

The charges in the administrative divisions were effected after the completion of the 1st phase of the census operation and actual implementation of these divisions was so related that it was not possible for the Census Organisation to conduct census on the basis of the newly created administrative units. Hence the delimitation of the territory was done on the basis of old villages and tehsils on the basis of which 1961 Census was conducted. This was done with the concurrence of the State Government.

As the census taking had to relate to precisely defined boundaries, the whole of Tripura was treated as one district territory divided into 10 sbb-divisions with 45 tehsils (old) and 6 towns as in 1961. For the purpose of census in the rural areas each sub-division was treated as a separate district and a separate code number was assigned to each sub-division. Separate code number was also allotted for each tehsil in each sub-division. In case of urban area the whole territory was treated as one district and code numbers were allotted serially for ail the six towns in Roman numerals. Each tehsil in case of rural area and each town in case of urban area was treated as charge. Tea gardens and cantonments were treated as special charges. In rural area each charge was divided into a number of circles and each circle was divided into a number of blocks. The basis of delimitation was that each block in the rural area should have a population of not more than 750 or 150 households. In urban area each town was divided into a number of circles/wards and each circle/ward was divided into a number of blocks taking 600 persons or 120 households as the basis for each block. In case of special charges like tea garden the system on one block, one circle and one charge was followed.

The sub-divisional officers were appointed as Subdivisional Census Officers in their respective sub-division. The charge officers were selected by the sub-divisional census officers from amongst the gazetted or other officers within their jurisdictions while the supervisors and enumerators were selected from the school teachers and other officials of the State Government.

After the completion of enumeration it was decided in consultation with the Deputy Registrar General, India (Census) to present the figures in different census tables, etc. according to the new administrative unit as otherwise these would be of little use. As the old census villages are to be adjusted with the cadastrally surveyed Revenue villages, Police Stations and the same would take some time, it was not feasible to present the figures below the level of sub-divisions in any of the census tables to be presented with the all-India time schedule.

It became necessary to arrange for training of staff employed for field work and supervisory action regarding the concepts and procedure of census schedules. Two training classes for sub-divisional census officers and charge officers were conducted by the Director of Census Operations in the census Directorate one before the first phase of Census Operations and the other before the second phase. Moreover, the Director of Census Operation went round the sub-divisions to hold training classes. To facilitate training of staff printed booklets containing instructions on housenumbering and houselisting and enumeration were distributed both in English and Bengali.

A mock census for training was also arranged when enumerators were required to fill up census slips and population records and the same were scrutinised and mistakes noticed in them were explained to the field worker in subsequent training classes. After the completion of delimitation of Blocks/Circles/Charges, the work of housenumbering according to the programme was started. In Tripura the Houselist and Establishment Schedules were filled up between 1st April, 1970 and 31st May, 1970. During houselisting operation the enumerators prepared national maps of the blocks under their charge showing inhabited portion of the village together with lay-out of roads, lanes, temples, tanks and other important land marks and also indicating therein the order in which the houses were numbered. The filled in schedules were submitted by the enumerators to the respective charge superintendents through the circle supervisors, who prepared a charge abstract and handed over the same to the sub-divisional census officers. The sub-divisional census officers deposited the filled in schedules together with a consolidated abstract of this sub-division to the census Directorate. From this abstract the population of Tripura was ascertained a few months ahead of actual enumeration.

On the basis of the houselisting operation the population of each block was known. After that it had become necessary to redelineate the blocks in both the rural and urban areas ,taking into consideration 750 persons in rural areas and 600 persons in urban areas as the ideal population for each block. It was however not possible to follow this yard stick for the blocks in hilly and inaccessible areas.

The actual count was completed as per scheduled time. Immediately after the revisional round every

enumerator prepared an abstract in respect of his block containing information on the numbers of males and females, scheduled castes and scheduled tribes by sex, literate and illiterate males and females, houseless population by sex, Institutional population by sex and the main economic activities of the population viz., cultivator, agricultural labour, household industry, other worker and non-worker, by sex, and handed over the census records together with the abstract to the concerned supervisor. The supervisors in their turn totalled up the block abstracts and prepared a circle summary which was handed over to the charge officer. The charge officer totalled up the figures in circle summaries and handed over the same to the sub-divisional census officer totalled up the figures for the sub-division and oommunicated the same telegraphically to the Director

of Census Operations. These figures were then communicated to Restgirar General, India telegraphically on the 8th April, 1972. On 20th April, 1972 the provisional totals were released by the Director of Census Operations. A booklet giving the provisional population in the form of six statements were published shortly thereafter.

The terms like 'census house', 'census household', etc. which will be found while going through the tables of this volume have been explained in the respective fly-leaf. During processing of Individual slips in the tabulation office, two code numbers on economic activities were used for coding questions 16(c), 16(d), 17(c) and 17(d). These code numbers are the numbers relating to the industrial classification and the occupational classification.

Two statements are found on the subject. The union table gives information for the state and districts. In the state table, figures are given for each sub-division in a district and city/town in a sub-division. Table A-I is the basic population table for the census and furnishes data for State/District/Sub-division/Town/ Urban Agglomeration for rural and urban areas separately. It presents area in Km2, density of population per Km2, number of inhabited and uninhabited villages, number of towns, number of occupied residential houses, households and population by sex as per 1971 Census. This table is similar to its counterparts in 1961 except for the urban agglomeration. The concept of town group as adopted in 1961 census has been replaced by urban agglomeration. The concept of urban agglomeration will be discussed in the fly-leaf to table A-IV. Another difference in the presentation of state table A-I that will be noticed is that in 1961 census the information was given upto tehsils. time the same has been shown upto sub-divisional level only. The reason for not showing the tehsil in 1971 census is that just before the actual enumeration the state was divided into 3 districts in place of one and the number of tehsils was increased from 45 to 177 with consequential changes in the territorial jurisdiction. So it was not possible to collect the data on the basis

of the new tehsils. The old tehsils on the basis of which the 1st phase of the census was done did not exist. And the presentation of data according to old tehsils would be meaningless. The adjustment of data as per revenue villages and then to Police station is being taken up and will be presented in part C of the District Census Handbook.

Brief account of changes in area of state and district from 1921 to 1971.

The princely state of Tripura, merged with the Union of India on the 5th October, 1949, was constituted into a Chief Commissioner's Province. With the commencement of the Constitution of India on 26th January, 1950 it was converted to a Part C state.

Extensive changes have taken place in the boundary of the Sub-divisions from time to time in the past. Tripura was treated as one district territory upto early 1970. In August, 1970, it was divided into three districts viz., West Tripura, North Tripura and South Tripura with three or four of the existing Sub-divisions completely within each. The state was divided into 177 Tehsils and 871 Revenue Mouzas. In the following table attempt is being made to show the area figures by districts from 1941 to 1971.

The area figures upto 1961 shown in the above table are supplied by the Director of Settlement and Land Records, Government of Tripura. The 1971 area figures are supplied by the Surveyor General of India. The area figures as per Director of Settlement and Land Records, Government of Tripura for the year 1971 are as follows:

Though there was no jurisdictional change of the districts or the state, still there were changes in area figures. Before completion of the cadastral survey recently, there was no dependable method of finding the area figures in Tripura. We may therefore treat the area figures of 1971 as more accurate than those of the

preceeding years. The difference between the area figures for 1971 supplied by the Director of Settlement and Land Records, Government of Tripura and Surveyor General, India may be attributed to the differences in the methods of measurement and computation.

The Urban Population

The definition of an urban unit as was evolved in India for adoption at the 1961 as well as 1971 census was as follows:

- (a) All places with a municipality, corporation or cantonment or notified town area.
- (b) All other places which satisfied
 - (i) a minimum population of 5,000.
 - (ii) at least 75% of the male working population was non-agricultural.
- (iii) a density of population of at least 400 per sq. km. (i.e., 1,000 per sq. mile).

The Director of Census Operations is however given discretion to include some places which have other distinct urban characteristic.

There was only one town i.e. Agartala in Tripura in 1951 Census. In 1961 census, some sub-divisional head quarters were classified as urban on the basis of liberal application of the criteria of having a population of not less than 5,000 persons of which three-fourths of the male worker should have non-agricultural means of livelihood. Accordingly five sub-divisional head quarters other than Agartala were treated as towns. In the 1971 census, no urban area of 1961 census has been declassified nor any new place has been classified as town.

Thus there are in all, six towns in Tripura. They are all small except Agartala. The distribution of town according to size is shown below.

From the above statement it will be seen that from 1901 to 1951 there was only one town in Tripura namely Agartala in West Tripura District. In 1961, five more sub-divisional head quarters were recognised as towns, two each in North and South Tripura Districts and one in West Tripura District. The reason for this increase in the number of towns in 1961 is that the period from 1951 to 1961 coincided with the implementation of the First and Second Five Year Plans and also influx of a substantial number of middle class people from the then East Pakistan who settled in these towns, and places which were originally villages had acquired urban characteristic satisfying broadly the criteria laid down by the Registrar General, India for recognition of urban areas.

The Rural Population

Upto the present census the definition of village in Tripura remained the same as in previous censuses.

A village is defined as a collection of houses bearing a separate name and situated within a defined boundary. For the purpose of census all the known villages as well as the hamlets in the hills and interior which are called 'Parahs' and are only notional villages were treated as a village unit for 1971 census also like the previous census in 1961. Many hill villages of 1961 census were no longer in existence in 1971, due to the migratory habit of the tribal people.

For presentation of data all the Tea Estates have been treated as a separate census village. Where part of a village had been included in urban areas, the rural part of the village was counted as one village.

Inhabited Villages:

The subjoined table gives the number of inhabited villages in Tripura and districts at each census since 1901.

In 1951 Census the figures for inhabited villages were presented tractwise. Tripura was divided into two tracts comprising Sadar, Kamalpur, Sonamura, Khowai, and Kailasahar sub-divisions in one tract and Udaipur, Dharmanagar, Amarpur, Belonia and Sabroom in the other tract. Hence districtwise figures for number of inhabited villages for 1951 census could not be presented.

It is noticed that the number of villages increased steadily from 1901 to 1941. In 1951 there was a fall in the number of villages which is attributable to under enumeration in Khowai, Kamalpur and Amarpur Sub-divisions. During 1961 Census about 52 census villages were included in the urban areas. In 1971, the number of inhabited villages has decreased by 205 from that of 1961. The decrease in the number of

inhabited villages is however possible due to desertion of certain villages in the hills and sprung up of new colonies and inhabited areas. However it would be wrong to attribute all the variation in the above table to these causes only. Another cause may be the failure on the part of the staff to adhere strictly to the definition of a village.

Census House:

A census nouse is a building or a part of building having a separate main entrance from the road or common courtyard or stair case etc., used or recognised as a separate unit. It may be inhabited or vacant. It may be used for residential or non-residential purpose or both

Persons per occupied census houses, etc.:

The number of persons per occupied census house in Tripura is 6 against 6·17 in 1961. Of the districts in the state the number of persons per occupied census house is highest in the West Tripura district with 7 persons and lowest in South Tripura district with 6 persons. In the rural areas of the state, West Tripura leads with 7 persons while South Tripura comes last with 6 persons. In the urban areas there are more persons per house than in rural areas. The number of persons per house is lowest in North Tripura district.

The man-woman ratio of the population of Tripura is 943 females per 1,000 males. This ratio has increased from 932 in 1961 to 943 in 1971. This ratio is highest in West Tripura district and lowest in North Tripura district. Comparing rural and urban areas this ratio is higher in rural than the urban areas which is natural in

our country, as the male folk comes to the town for pursuit of livelihood.

The percentages of rural and urban population comes to 89.57 and 10.43 for Tripura. This marked a slight improvement over the corresponding urban figure of 9.02 in 1961. Percentage of rural population is highest in South Tripura and lowest in West Tripura. The reverse picture is seen for urban area in these two districts. If urbanity is considered as the index of non-agricultural activity, then West Tripura district fulfils this qualification.

Density of population is influenced by various factors like climate, fertility of soil, general economic development. The highest density in West Tripura district may be attributable to one or more of these factors.

APPENDIX III

HOUSELESS AND INSTITUTIONAL POPULATION

Fly-Leaf

This appendix furnishes figures for the number of houseless and institutional households together with the houseless and institutional population separately. In all Census tables, this population has been included in the total population. This appendix is similar to the 1961 census appendix, except the inclusion of two new items viz., the number of houseless and Institutional holuseholds. This appendix shows figures for the state, district, sub-division and the towns/urban agglomeration and further distributes them according to sex, and living in rural and urban areas.

Houseless population

Houseless persons are those who do not normally reside in houses e.g., numbers of wondering tribes, beggars, boat-dwellers, etc., But due to permanent habitation in boats in Kashmir, boat-dwellers are not treated as houseless persons in that state.

Institutional population

Institutional population means only inmates of institutions like Boarding, Barracks, Hospitals, Jails, Hostels, Camps, Asrams, Missions, Hotels (excluding their normal resident staff if any and semipermanent boarders, if any in Boarding houses).

On the night of 31st March, 1971 Enumerators took a round of their areas to record particulars of houseless persons. During revisional round from 1st April to 3rd April also any houseless persons who stated that he had not been enumerated before was also recorded.

The number of such persons and their households come to 357 and 137 respectively in Tripura. The number of such people during 1961 census was 139 only.

The number of Institutional population in Tripura during 1971 census is 10,065 with 910 households. The 1961 census gave this population as 4,775.

Fly-Leaf

This table is similar to that of 1961 and furnishes data on the population and variation of population from 1901 to 1971 for each district. This is a very important table as it gives the growth of population from decade to decade and in the absence of reliable vital statistics, this table forms the main source of estimation of population.

Adjustment of Population, 1901 to 1971

To ensure comparability, the figures furnished in this table for previous censuses have been adjusted wherever possible to correspond with the administrative set up as on 1st April, 1971. The one district territory was divided into three districts viz., the West Tripura district, the North Tripura district and the South Tripura district in August, 1970 with 10 subdivisions. While forming the districts, no sub-division has been split up and the entire sub-divisions have been included into one or the other district. In 1961 Census the figures for this table were presented by sub-divisions. The population figures for 1901 to 1961 were rebuilt on the basis of the population of the sub-divisions.

A statement showing percentage variation of population from 1901 to 1971 is given below.

The figures cannot be presented for each district as separate figures for each sub-division are not available. One striking point emanating from the statement is the decline in the growth of population during the decades 1921 to 1931, 1941 to 1951 and 1961 to 1971. In the past the land hungry people from the neighbouring districts of British Bengal and Assam came to settle in Tripura due to the liberal settlement policy followed by the Tripura Darbar. The low increase of population during the decade 1921 to 1931 may be due to the less inmigration of people from the neighbouring districts of British Bengal and Assam.

The high increase in the following decade was due to the development of Tea Industry and the influx of settlers to reclaim and cultivate these fallow lands in Tripura. The low increase during 1941—1951 may be attributed in part at least to the imcompleteness of the census in 1951. The antisocial activities in the hill prevented the enumerators to go in the interior. There was an abnormal increase during 1951-61 which was due to the large influx of refuges from East Pakistan due to communal disturbance there and other causes. Another striking point is that the pace of growth is faster in urban than in rural areas.

Changes in the proportion of Sexes

The population of rural Tripura is 89.57 per cent of the total population. The above table indicates that 23.69 percent of the rural population of Tripura are in the villages having a population of 500—999 each. Only 1.17 per cent of the rural population are in villages having population of 5,000 to 9,999.

Coming down to district level the picture remains almost the same. Only in the North Tripura district there is no village having population 4,999 and above. It would be observed that there is no village with a population of 10,000 and above in this state.

The outstanding feature revealed by this table is that 40.54 percent of the total rural population of Tripura are concentrated in 83.86 percent of villages of the size having less than 500 people. Coming to

the district level the same trend is observed in all the districts. More than 44 percent of population live in 14.71 per cent of villages having population size 500—1,999.

adjoining urban outgrowths or two or more physically contiguous towns together with continuous well recognised urban outgrowths, if any, of such towns.

In fact, there was no town gruop in Tripura during 1961 Census. The formation of urban agglomeration comes in for the first time in 1971 Census. Only one town viz. Agartala is covered by the concept of urban agglomeration.

It may be seen from the statement that for the first time in Tripura, Agartala has qualified to be treated as class I town considering the population of its outgrowth. The adjusted population figures for Agartala urban agglomeration could not be calculated for the previous Censuses.

The boundaries of Agartala Municipality have remained the same since it was constituted. Only recently after the 1971 enumeration, its area has been extended. It may also be seen that three towns namely,

Radhakishorepur, Belonia and Kailasahar have attained a higher class in 1971 Census. Although the heading of the statement is changes in the classification of towns from 1901 to 1971, the five towns which were newly recognised as such in 1961 have also been shown to present a complete picture.

FLY-LEAF

This is a new table introduced in 1971 census. This table furnishes data on civic status, area in km², density, occupied residential houses, houseless and institutional population, total population sex, population according to the last two censuses relating to standard urban area and each of its component units (both urban and rural).

Standard Urban Area (S.U.A.)

Standard urban area (S.U.A.) represents spatially contiguous territory of urban-rural settlements and effectively tackle the problem of furnishing data in respect of urbanisable areas in the next three decades or so outside the jurisdiction of the existing towns. Since the administrative boundaries of statutory towns changed from time to time, the comparability of data from census to census was difficult in the past. S.U.A. will have a fixed area covering a large core town as well as the adjoining areas delineating contiguous rural and urban areas which are or likely to be under intensive influence of the core town. The core town will generally have a population of 50,000 or above. S.U.A. may have any or all of the following characteristics.

- (a) Predominant Urban Land Use.
- (b) Intensive inter-action with the urban centres as reflected in commutation for the purpose of work and secondary education facilities; extension of City Bus service; sale of commodities like milk, dairy products, Vegetables (other than those transported by rail or truck-haul) and purchase of food grains, cloths and general provisions, by the consumers directly.
- (c) Anticipated urban growth as a result of locational decisions relating to industry, market, transport, and communications, administrative and servicing functions.
- (d) Existence of big villages with a large proportion of working force engaged in non-agricultural industrial categories.

On the basis of population as per 1961 census Agartala is the only town to have standard urban areas. The town and country planning organisation of the Govt. of Tripura and the census Directorate jointly on the basis of the above definition determined the areas to be included in the standard urban areas for Agartala town. The following revenue villages have been selected as the S.U.A. of Agartala town.

I—Cultivators, II—Agricultural labourers, III—Livestock, Forestry, Fishing, Hunting and Plantations, Orchards and allied activities, IV—Mining and quarrying, V—Manufacturing, processing, servicing and repairs (a) Household Industry (b) other than Household Industry, VI—Construction, VII—Trade and commerce, VIII—Transport storage and communications, IX—Other services, X—Non-workers.

The category III of 1961 census has been divided into two categories viz., Category III—Livestock, Forestry, Fishing, Hunting and plantations, Orchards and allied activities and category IV—Mining and Quarrying. The 1961 census category IV of household industry is included in category V of 1971 census treating it as a sub-category.

In the Union Primary Census Abstract figures are presented down to the district level separately for rural and urban population. The State Primary Census Abstract shows figures down to the sub-division/town. Similar information in respect of individual villages will be found in the District Census Hand book—Part A.

Occupied census House:—Attention is invited to fly-leaf to Table A-I.

Household:—A household is a group of persons who commonly live together and would take their meals from a common kitchen unless the exigencies of work prevented any of them from doing so.

For the state as a whole there are 112 households for every 109 occupied residential houses. In all the districts and the state the excess of household over occupied residential houses is more prominent in urban areas than in rural areas. In other words census household tend to coincide with occupied residential houses to a greater degree in rural areas than in urban areas. This shows the extent of congestion in living condition is more in urban areas than in rural areas.

Among the districts West Tripura stands at the top with density of households 28 per km². In the rural as well as in urban the same pattern is noticed. The high urban density in West Tripura is due to the density in Agartala town which is the Capital town of the state.

The percentage of scheduled castes for the state as a whole comes to 13·12 to total males and 13·09 to total females in the rural area as against 6·34 to total males and 6·21 to total females in the urban areas. Coming to district the percentage of scheduled castes to total males in rural areas is highest in West Tripura district. Among the town Radhakishorepur is the highest in case of males and females both.

The percentage of scheduled tribes to total males in rural and urban areas is 31.73 and 3.52 respectively for the state and for females the figures are 32.13 and 3.23. Coming to district, South Tripura is the highest in both males and females for rural areas.

The number of literate and educated persons in Tripura per 100 is 30.98 in 1971 as against 20.20 in 1961. In respect of male and female literacy the number of literate and educated males per 100 males is 40.20 in 1971 against 29.60 in 1961 and the number of literate and educated females per 100 females is 21.19 in 1971 against 10.20 in 1961.

The highest literacy is found in North Tripura district (32·17) while it is the lowest in South Tripura district (26·69). While North Tripura district (29·8) has the highest percentage of literacy, South Tripura,

district (24.6) has the lowest amongst the rural areas of the state. In North Tripura district 39.2 per cent. males are literate which is the highest in rural areas of state while 34.4 per cent males are literate in South Tripura district. Female literacy is highest in the rural areas of North Tripura district (19.9) while the lowest is found in South Tripura district (14.2)

West Tripura district has the highest Literacy (65.6) amongst the urban population of the state while South Tripura district (57.5) is the lowest. The same pattern is noticed in case of male population in urban areas. In case of female literacy in urban areas North Tripura district is the highest.

Literacy rate is substantially higher in towns than in villages. Amongst the towns Agartala town urban agglomeration has the highest literacy (65.6), 73.7 per cent of males and 50.8 per cent of females are literate.

The percentage of worker to the total population of the state as a whole comes to 28. Among the male population, it is higher *i.e.*, 49 as against 5 among females. It is also to be noted that the percentage of worker is higher in rural areas than in urban areas.

Cultivator and agricultural labourer constitute the most predominant section among workers. Out of 49 per cent male worker, 37 per cent are engaged either as cultivators or agricultural labourers. The corresponding figures for female population are, that out of 5 per cent of female worker 3 per cent are engaged either as cultivators or agricultural labourers. The percen-

tage of worker is highest in North Tripura district. A look into the table would reveal that the percentage of female worker is also highest in North Tripura district. A possible explanation may be the presence of a large number of tribal people and the people belonging to Manipuri Community in this district. The female participation rate is generally higher among these people.

The overall sex ratio defined as the number of females per thousand males comes to 92 for workers, 1,774 for non-workers. It would be observed that the state sex ratio among total population is 943 which varies between 944 in rural areas to 935 in urban areas. Sex ratio among the total workers of the state is 92 which varies between 89 in rural areas to 121 in urban areas. The highest sex ratio (539) among the various categories of workers is located in category (III), fol-

lowed by (140) in category V (a) and by (135) in category IX. The lowest sex ratio (9) is found in category (VIII).

Detailed account of the worker and non-worker and the occupation in different categories and also the details of the non-workers can be obtained from the general economic tables which are presented in past II-B of Tripura publication.
