P r e f a c e

This volume consists the data tabulated on full count such as area, houses and household, population by sex, literates, workers and non-workers both for general and scheduled tribe population available in the state of Nagaland. The following tables are presented in this volume.

1. State Primary Census Abstract
2. District Primary Census Abstract
3. Primary Census Abstract for scheduled tribes.

All these tables were prepared based on the Village-wise Primary Census Abstract prepared at the time of editing of Individual slips. It was our sincere effort to present some more tables prepared from the data based on primary Census Abstract but due to some technical difficulties this effort could not find its way and basic data only are opened to the general public. However, those tables will be appearing in a separate volume of Part—II—A—General population Tables. I am sure that the early release of the data collected, analysed and presented in this volume can meet with the needs of scholars, administrators, economists, demographers and other research workers.

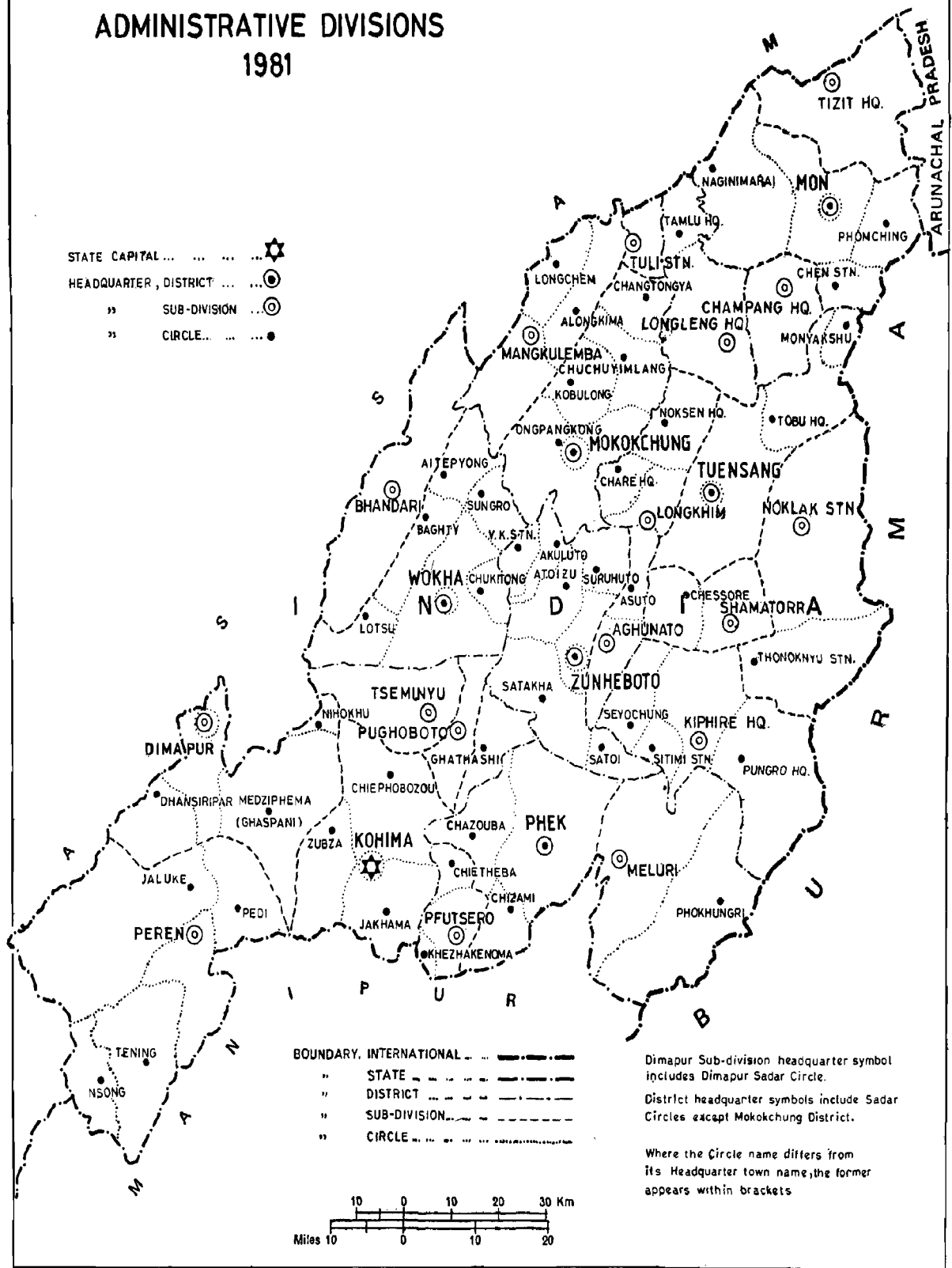

1981

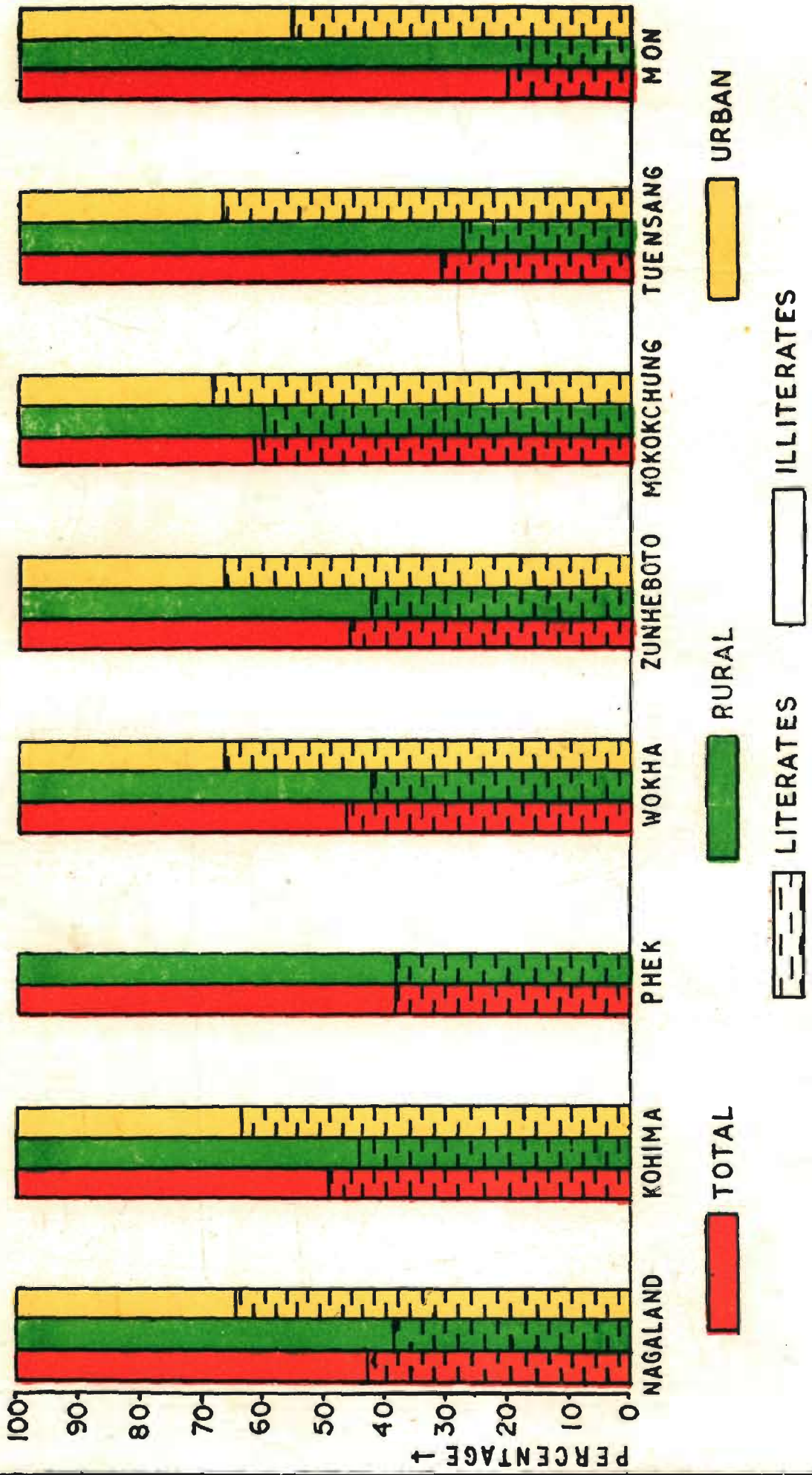
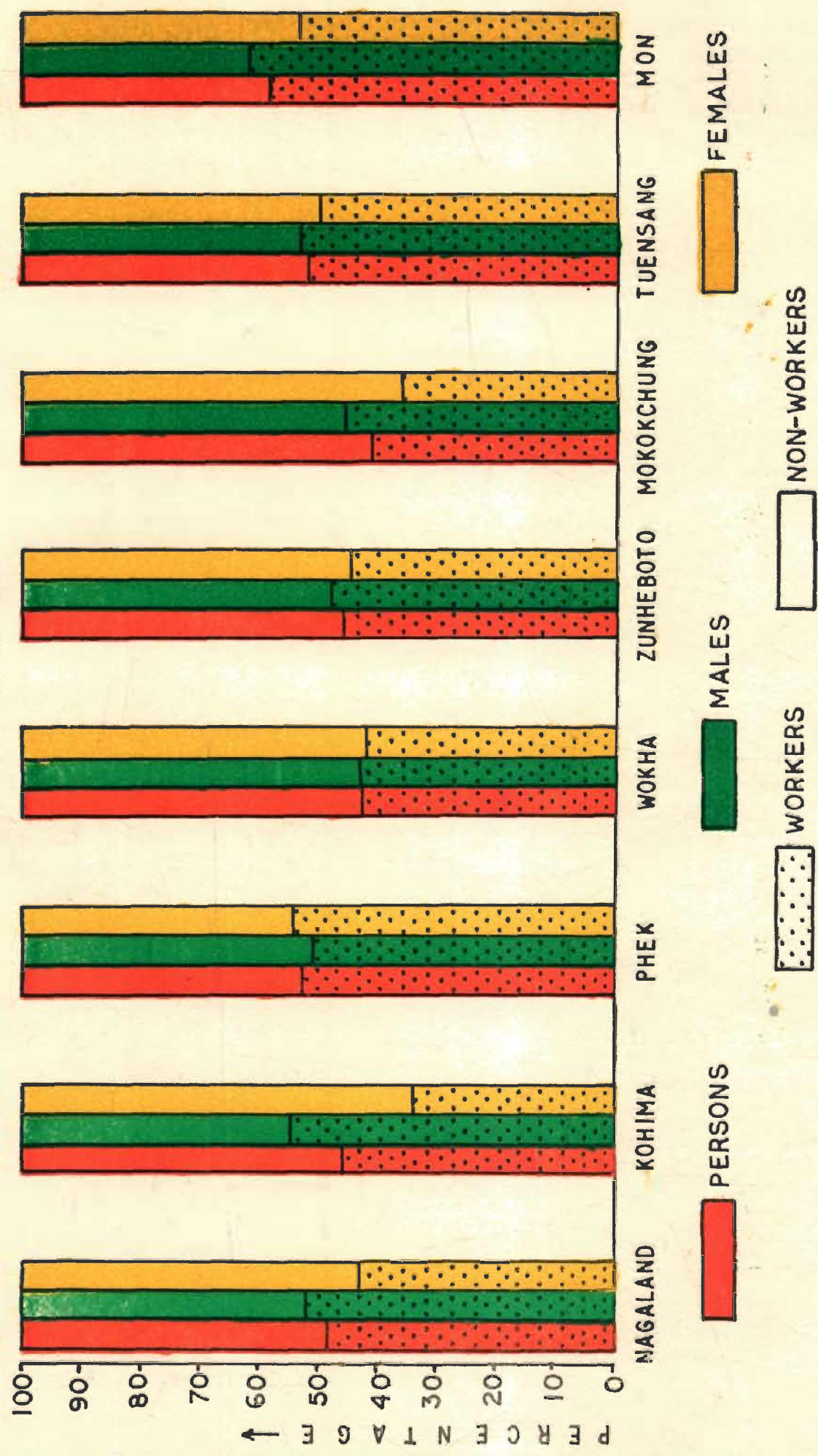


CHART SHOWING THE PERCENTAGE OF WORKERS AND NON-WORKERS TO TOTAL POPULATION

Introduction

1. Introduction.

1.1. This volume contains the basic Census data tabulated on full count. The data are presented in two main tables. (1) Primary Census Abstract (General) and (2) Primary Census Abstract for Scheduled Tribes. The Primary Census Abstract (General) gives the essential particulars relating to area, no. of occupied residential houses, no. of households, total population, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes population, literates, total main workers with its four broad industrial categories, marginal workers and non-workers. This table has been presented in two parts viz. (1) State Primary Census Abstract in which informations are presented down to district level and (2) District Primary Census Abstract where-in the similar informations are presented down to circle and town level. Same types of informations down to village level have been represented in the table village-wise Primary Census Abstract which are being published separately in District Census Hand book series.

1.2. The Primary Census Abstract of Scheduled Tribes gives the same informations like that of general Primary Census Abstract with an expectation of the area figures and number of occupied residential houses. Particulars relating to literates, total main workers classified under broad industrial categories, marginal workers and non-workers are presented in this table for each circle, town, district of Nagaland in addition to no. of household and population by sex. The Primary Census Abstract for Scheduled Castes of Nagaland could not be prepared due to the fact that no scheduled castes was declared in the President of India Revised and Modified order of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, 1970 and 1976 respectively. The significant features of these tables are explained in the fly-leaf given just before the table.

1.3. Some salient points about the conduct of 1981 Census are summarised below for benefit and easy reference of the readers.

2. The 1981 Census Count.

2.1. Reference date and Census Calender.

The enumeration of 1981 Census commenced on 9th February and completed on 28th February 1981 in Nagaland, the reference date being the Sunrise of 1st March 1981. The houseless per-

sons were enumerated on the night of 28th February 1981. The revisional round was undertaken from 1st March to 5th March 1981. The submission of records from the Enumerators was on 6th March 1981 from supervisors on 7th March 1981, from Charge Officers on 9th March 1981 and from District Census Officers to the Directorate of Census Operations latest by 12th March 1981.

2.2. Provisional Population Totals.

As per the Census Calender of 1981 Census drawn out for this state the Provisional Population Total obtained for this state from Enumerator's Abstract and District Abstract were communicated to the Registrar General on 10th March 1981. The Registrar General consolidated the Provisional Population Total from all the states and union territories and released the All India Provisional Population Total on 17th March 1981. The Provisional Population Totals of Nagaland were released to the press on 25th March 1981.

3. Preparatory Work.

3.1. How the Census Questionnaires developed.

The Census questionnaires were developed in consultation with the Planning Commission, Central and State Government departments, Central Statistical Organisation, various Universities, Research Institutions, scholars and other data users. The various Census schedules were discussed at different conferences and seminars and thereafter the schedules and instructions were finalised which were used at the time of Census.

3.2. Pretest.

The Census questionnaires as adopted for the 1981 Census were required to be pre-tested in the field to examine mainly whether,

- (i) the questions are fully understood and easily answerable by the respondents.
- (ii) the instructions to the enumerators are clear and easily understandable by the enumeration agency, and
- (iii) the time scheduled for can be meticulously adhered to the time of actual field operations.

To examine these aspects, the Registrar General of India directed to all Directors of Census Operations to hold various schedules/questionnaires in the field. Accordingly, the 1st pretest in Nagaland was conducted from 15th September to 30th September, 1978 in five rural and in five urban blocks (enumerator's block) by the members of the staff of the Directorate. The draft schedules were modified and pretested for the second time. The second pre-test was conducted in ten different enumerator's blocks (five for rural and five for urban) from 1st June to 15th June, 1979.

3.3. How the Census questionnaires made final.

Draft questionnaires were developed on the basis of past experience, current needs and international recommendations and these were presented at the first Data Users Conference which was held from 13th to 15th February, 1978. The Data Users Conference was attended by representatives of the user Ministries of the Government of India, of the State Governments, of Universities and other experts bodies and Research Institutions, individual experts and others. Based on these discussions, certain questionnaires were developed which were later tested out in the field. The questionnaires were again exposed to consideration of a wealth of expertise at a second Data Users Conference held from 21st to 23rd December, 1978. Based on these discussions the questionnaires were finalised.

4. Census Schedules.

4.1. Houselisting Operation.

The Houselisting Operation was conducted from 1st May, 1980 to 30th May, 1980. The following forms were canvassed from house to house during houselisting operations by the Enumerators.

- (1) Houselist form.
- (2) Enterprise list.

4.2. Actual Enumerations.

The Actual Enumeration of 1981 Census in Nagaland was conducted from 9th February, 1981 to 28th February, 1981 the reference date being the sunrise of 1st March, 1981. The following schedules as adopted were canvassed during the enumerations from door to door in the state by the enumerators.

- (1) Individual slips (both universal and sample).
- (2) Household schedules.
- (3) Degree holders and Technical personnel schedules.

These schedules alongwith the instructions for filling them up are not given in this publication. But they will be published in Census publication, Part-II-A—General Population Tables. However, a brief introduction of the Census schedules as canvassed in the field and prepared by the enumerators are given in the following paragraphs.

4.3. Houselist.

The schedule was designed to provide a complete list of all Census houses and households in every enumerator's block alongwith the approximate population, particulars of the purposes for which Census houses are used, whether the household is engaged in any enterprise and if any member of the household is physically handicapped.

4.4. Enterprise list

Alongwith the houselist, a separate enterprise list was also prepared as a part of the houselisting operation. The particulars of description of activity, classification, nature of operation, type of ownership, social group of owner, power used for activity and number of persons including paid and unpaid workers in the enterprise were collected in the enterprise list. The enterprise lists were handed over to the Central Statistical Organisation for further processing.

4.5. Individual slip.

Individual slip is the basic schedule canvassed during the 1981 Census. It was divided in two parts (1) Universal and (2) Sample. The universal individual slip was canvassed for each individual throughout the country whereas the sample individual slip was canvassed on sample basis in some particular states. In Nagaland sample individual slips were canvassed for all areas. The universal individual slip embodies sixteen questions which covers (1) name (2) relationship to head (3) Male or Females (4) age (5) Marital status (6) Mother tongue (7) two other languages known (8) religion (9) Whether scheduled castes or scheduled tribes (10) name of caste or tribe (11) literate or illiterate (12) educational attainment (13) attending school or college (14)-(A) worked any time at all last year (14)-(B) if yes in 14-A, did the person work for major part of last year (15)-(A) main activity last year (15)-(B) marginal or secondary work in the last year and (16) seeking/available for work. The sample individual slip embodies six questions which covers (1) Birth place (2) last residence (3) reason for migration from place of last residence (4) duration of residence at the place of enumeration (5) fertility for ever-married women-

and (6) fertility for currently married women. The distinguishing features of the 1981 Census Individual slip as compared to the 1971 Census are (1) The sampling was introduced for the first time at the time of 1981 Census (2) all the questions of individual slip of 1971 Census were canvassed to each individual irrespective of age and sex throughout the country whereas the 1981 sample individual slip was canvassed on the sample basis for some states. (3) Five more questions in addition to 17 questions of 1971 Census were added in the individual slips of 1981 Census, namely (i) Attending school or college (ii) Information of marginal workers (iii) seeking or available for work (iv) Reason for migration from place of last residence and (v) Fertility for ever married women. Whether the individual belonged to scheduled caste or scheduled tribe and the name of scheduled caste or scheduled tribe were clubbed together in one question in 1971 Census whereas they are shown separately in two separate questions in 1981 Census.

4.6. Household Schedule.

The household schedule is divided into two parts. The first part incorporates household particulars and the second part incorporates the population record. The Part-I of this schedule gives the information regarding to (1) name of head of household (2) religion of the head of the household (3) whether the head of household belongs to scheduled castes or scheduled tribes (4) name of caste/tribe (5) language mainly spoken in the household (6) whether the household live in owned house or the household owned a house or house-site in the village or town of enumeration (7) predominant construction materials of the house (8) facilities available to the household (9) number of living rooms of the household (10) number of married couples (11) cultivation available in the household (12) local name of tenancy and (13) Population in the household. Most of the items included in the household of 1971 Census were transferred on to household schedule at the time of 1981 Census and were given in Part-I of the schedule.

The Part-II of the household schedule gives the information of each of the individual of the household in regard to the particulars of (1) name (2) relationship to head (3) sex (4) age (5) marital status (6) name of scheduled castes or scheduled tribes if any (7) literacy (8) economic activity and (9) seeking/available for work.

4.7. Degree holder and technical personnel schedule.

This schedule was distributed to each of the eligible individual concerned who was possessing a degree or post graduate degree or a technical diploma or a technical degree or a technical certificate from Industrial Training Institute. The schedule was issued by the enumerator by putting the respective code numbers on the schedule and the persons concerned was asked to fill up the schedule by himself.

5. Maps.

To prevent omissions and duplications in enumeration a proper delineation of the enumerator's block is essential which depends upon the accuracy of the detailed maps available. After updating maps showing administrative boundaries of all districts and showing the location of each village within the circle maps, notional maps for every village in rural areas and ward in urban areas were prepared. Layout sketch of every enumerator's block showing the code numbers were allotted to each enumerator to identify the area at the time of Census taking. All the buildings or houses under the enumerator's block were located in the layout sketch. The notional map and the layout sketch served as a frame for the clear demarcation of the enumerator's jurisdiction and enabled the enumerators to cover every household in each building or house in their respective block.

6. Rural and Urban areas

6.1. The Census data are presented for rural and urban areas separately. A unit chosen for the Census enumeration was a village recognised by the district authorities while for the urban areas, the Census unit was principally the town. Thus according to Census traditions the entire data collected was divided into rural and urban separately.

6.2. Definition of Town.

The urban criterion of 1981 was the same as in 1961 and 1971 Censuses. However, the males working in activities such as fishing, logging etc. were treated as engaged in non-agricultural activity in 1961 and 1971 Censuses, whereas in the 1981 census these activities are treated as on with cultivation and agricultural labourer for the purpose of this criterion. Places which satisfied the following empirical tests were considered as towns.

- (a) All places with a municipality, corporation or cantonment or a notified area.
- (b) All other places which satisfied the following criteria.
 - (i) A minimum population of 5,000.
 - (ii) At least 75% of the male working population was non-agricultural and
 - (iii) A density of population of at least 400 per sq. km. (i. e. 1,000 per sq. mile).

6.3. The Director of Census Operations was given some discretion in respect of some marginal cases in consultation with the state Government to include some places as towns that had other distinct characteristics and to exclude underserving cases.

6.4. In consultation with the Deputy Commissioner and the state administrative authority the Director had prepared lists of rural and urban areas separately and sent to Registrar General, India for consideration as to towns. In addition to old three towns i. e. Kohima, Dimapur and Mokokchung, the headquarter of Wokha, Zunheboto, Tuensang and Mon have been considered by the Registrar General and treated as towns for the first time in 1981 Census.

7. Urban Agglomeration.

In 1961 Census a concept of 'Towns group' was adopted which was finally shaped as 'urban agglomeration' in 1971 Census with the introduction of certain requirements of contiguity. The concept "urban agglomeration" as adopted in 1971 Census has also been accepted for 1981 Census. An urban agglomeration is a recognition of not merely a core town but also of the area where the urban influence extends. An urban agglomeration is by definition a continuous urban spread consisting of core towns and its adjoining urban out growth which may be either urban or rural. The following are the different situations, in which urban agglomerations could be constituted.

- (a) a city with a continuous outgrowth (the part of outgrowth being outside statutory limits but falling within the boundaries of adjoining village or villages).
- (b) one town with a similar outgrowth or two or more adjoining towns with their outgrowths as in (a) above; and
- (c) a city and one or more adjoining towns with their outgrowths all of which form a continuous spread.

In Nagaland, no urban agglomeration could be constituted in 1981 Census.

8. Standard urban area.

The new concept of Standard Urban Area introduced in 1971 was also followed for 1981 Census. The essential requirements for the constitution of a Standard Urban Area are :

- (1) It should have a core town of a minimum population of 50,000 (ii) the contiguous areas made up of other urban as well as rural administrative units should have mutual socio-economic links with the core town and (iii) in all probability this entire area should get fully urbanised in a period of two or three decades.

The comparable data would be collected continuously for three Censuses. Only Dimapur town had been selected for this purpose. Accordingly the necessary data have been collected for this purpose in 1981 Census also. More detail in this regard will be discussed in our publication Part-II A-General Population Tables of 1981 Census.

9. House numbering and houselisting.

The main aim of Census is to count each and every individual without omission or duplication. To achieve this, all the houses irrespective of residential or non-residential in the country were numbered on the door or wall of the house in a systematic way. It has already been discussed earlier that a layout sketch for every enumerator's block was prepared wherein the location of all the building and houses with their numbers were indicated. With the help of this layout sketch, the living place of every household in respect of residential houses and all the houses in respect of nonresidential houses were numbered. As per the numbers allotted in the houses irrespective of residential or non-residential their entries had thereafter been made in the standard form of houselist. Alongwith the house numbering and houselisting all the enterprises were also listed in a separate schedule of enterprise list.

10. Enumeration agency.

With the help of the houselists, the Census Organisation was in a picture to determine the actual number of Census enumerators and supervisors for actual enumeration. A population of 600—750 or a households of 150—200 was allotted in a form of enumerator's block to each of the enumerators and to supervise the works of every 4—6 enumerators a supervisor

was drawn mostly from the school teachers. The school teachers were drawn mostly as enumerators and supervisors only because of the fact that the schools are widely spread out in the country side and the teacher is a respected individual in the village, commanding the confidence of the people and can thus succeed in getting correct response to the Census questionnaire. Above the supervisors, Charge Officers, Sub-divisional Census Officers, Additional District Census Officers, District Census Officers, Principal Census Officers and finally the Director of Census Operations of the state were attached with the work of Census taking.

11. Training

In an operation of the nature of a population Census, nothing is more important than the intensive training of the enumeration agency from the level of principal Census Officers down to the level of enumerators. Complete training of the huge army of the enumeration personnel was a challenging task. The various concepts of the Census questionnaires were to be correctly understood by every single enumerator in particular and by whole enumeration agency in general. To achieve the goal of this purpose Census conference and seminars were organised by the Census Commissioner of India where Directors and Deputy Directors and Asstt. Directors of Census Operations were trained. In turn they trained the members of the technical staff and the Additional District Census Officers who further gave the training to the District Census Officers, Sub-divisional Census Officers and Charge Officers. They also imparted the intensive training to the enumerators and supervisors with the help of Charge Officers. Trained technical hands were deputed to the field at the time of actual Census taking to help the Principal Census Officers and Charge Officers supervising the work in the field and help them in sending the Provisional Population totals in time. The Deputy Directors and Assistant Director were also sent to the field for training and vigorous supervision.

12. Processing of Census Data.

12.1 After the houselisting Operations, all the houselists were edited in this Directorate itself and sent to the Data Processing Division of Registrar General's Office, New Delhi for mechanical processing.

12.2 After the actual enumeration, all the schedules were collected and checked according to their respective code numbers. All the individual slips were edited, matched and processed manually for preparation of Primary Census Abstract. The household schedules were also edited and processed for religion and language data in this Directorate itself. After processing, both individual slips and household schedules of Nagaland were sent to the Data Processing Division of Registrar General's Office for mechanical processing.

ANALYTICAL NOTES TO PRIMARY CENSUS ABSTRACT

Introduction.

The final population figures of 1981 Census after pre-P. C. A. editing and scrutiny of the contents in individual slips and thereafter the matching and cross checking of enumerators' working sheets and the household schedules were arrived and compiled in Primary Census Abstract at different levels ranging from the enumerator's block to the state level. In this publication Primary Census Abstracts were prepared at the state, district, circle and town levels showing rural and urban break-up. It also gives the information of area in sq. kms, number of occupied residential houses, number of households, total population, scheduled tribes population, literates, total main workers, marginal workers and non-workers. The total main workers are further categorised into four broad categories, such as, (1) cultivators (2) agricultural labourers (3) Household Industry—manufacturing, processing, servicing and repairs and (4) other services unlike in 1971 Census where the information were given in nine industrial categories. The Primary Census Abstract figures give information separately for general population and for the scheduled tribes population. Both the Abstracts carry almost the same set of demographic particulars. Since there is no scheduled castes available in Nagaland no table has so far been prepared for scheduled castes. The General Primary Census Abstract has been compiled in the form of State Primary Census Abstract and District Primary Census Abstract. In State Primary Census Abstract, the data are presented down to district level only while, in District Primary Census Abstract, the data are presented down to circle and town levels. In the Scheduled Tribe Primary Census Abstract also the data are presented for the state, district, circle and town levels.

1.2. The population figures contained in village and Block Primary Census Abstracts are to form part of District Census Handbooks showing similar information. Hence, they are not mentioned here.

2. Area

2.2. The area figures in sq. kms. for the state and its districts are supplied by the Surveyor General of India. The area figures of rural areas of administrative units of the state are not available. The area figures of urban units are furnished by the local authorities. The area figures for the rural areas are derived by subtracting the urban figures attained for the state and the districts from respective total area figures. The area figures therefore, could not be reproduced in this publication for rural areas below district level.

3. Occupied Residential Houses.

3.1. A "Census House" as defined in 1981 Census is a building or part of a building having a separate main entrance from the road or common courtyard or stair case etc. used or recognised as a separate unit. It may be occupied or vacant. It may be used for a residential or non-residential purpose or both.

3.2. Houses are classified as per their actual use, e. g. as residence, workshop, shop, office, medical institute, educational institute, religious institute etc. Some houses are used fully for residential purpose and some are fully for non-residential purpose and some are used partly as residential and partly as non-residential purposes. The houses where one or more persons are found to be residing (irrespective of the houses are being used fully or partly as a residence) are classified as occupied residential houses.

3.3 Considering the above definition of occupied residential Census Houses, all the occupied residential houses for respective units have been shown in columns 5 of the Primary Census Abstract. This includes even garages, depots, shops, etc. if one or more persons (may be driver,

chowkidar etc.) were found to be residing at the time of Census enumeration. But, on the other hand, the Census houses are not considered as occupied residential houses where the houses were found locked and the occupants remained away during the period of Census taking. Further, the occupied residential houses have been considered to be treated as one if a single household occupies a group of Census houses within an enclosed fence which has one main entrance. Though the definition of a Census house fulfils to be considered them as separate houses, the singleness of use (i. e. all the houses in the compound have been used by the same household for residential purposes has been considered to be treated as one single house only.

4. Household

A household as defined in 1981 Census is a group of persons who commonly live together and would take their meals from a common kitchen unless the exigencies of work prevented any of them from doing so. According to the definition of household in 1981 Census, the household group is divided into three groups (1) the normal household (2) the institutional household and (3) the houseless household. Households where related persons are staying together and fulfil the criteria of the definition of Census Household are treated as normal household, again the households where unrelated persons live together and satisfy the definition of Census Household are treated as institutional household. Further, the households where persons whether related or unrelated are staying together without any Census house (defined earlier) satisfying the definition of Census household are treated as houseless household. There may be one member households, two member households or multi-member households. For Census purposes each one of these types is regarded as a 'household'.

4.2. The following statement shows the number of households for every one hundred occupied residential houses and density of household separately for total, rural and urban areas for the state and its seven districts.

4.3 There are 100.01 households per 100 occupied residential houses in the state. More households than the total number of houses have been observed only in urban areas of Kohima district. Rest all the districts of Nagaland have household equal to the number of houses they have.

4.4. There are 9 households per square kms. on an average in the state. The highest density of 13 households is in Mokok chung district followed by Kohima district with 12 households per square kms. are recorded amongst the districts of Nagaland while the lowest density of 7 households is recorded equally in the districts of Phek, Wokha and Tuensang. The pattern of density of household reflects in a way the general economic condition and the development of township in the area.

4.5. The highest density of 465 households per square kilometre in Zunheboto district is followed by Kohima with 343 amongst the urban areas of the state. The lowest density of 76 households per square kilometre is recorded in the urban areas of Tuensang district.

5. Total Population.

5.1 Total population includes Institutional and Houseless population also. It depicts the actual number of population available in the state as well as the other units of the state.

5.2. The following statement will give the comparable data of our country as well as its states and union territories in regard to area, population, sex ratio, density and growth rate of population between 1971—81 of India, states and union territories separately for rural and urban areas.

5.3. In every 1000 population of India 767 are living in rural areas and 233 are living in urban areas. In other words 77 per cent of total population of India are living in rural areas and 23 per cent are living in urban areas. Nagaland occupies the 21st place of rank in population among the states of India. There are only 1.13 persons in Nagaland in every 1000 population of India. The highest population is observed in Uttar Pradesh with population distribution of 161.80 per 1000 population of India and lowest in Sikkim with 0.46 persons among the states. The highest distribu-

tion among the Union Territories is observed in Delhi with 9.08 and lowest in Dadra and Nagar Haveli with 0.15 persons.

6. Scheduled castes and scheduled tribes.

6.1. The constitution of scheduled castes/scheduled tribe order followed in 1971 Census has been followed in 1981 census also. There is no scheduled castes listed in the order for Nagaland. The exclusive details of scheduled tribes in Nagaland are reproduced in the fly-leaf to Primary Census Abstract of scheduled tribes.

The Statement—3 above gives the percentage distribution of members of Scheduled Tribes in rural and urban areas to total Scheduled Tribes population. It is revealed that the Scheduled Tribe population is much concentrated in rural areas like general population of the State. Out of 100 Scheduled Tribe population, 90.23 are found in rural areas and 9.77 are found in urban areas. percentage of female 90.65 in rural areas is higher than

that of males (89.82%) and vice-versa in case of urban areas. Phek district being the rural areas entirely has been left out for comparing point of view amongst the districts. Among other 6 districts, Tuensang recorded the highest percentage, 94.19 and lowest 85.02% recorded in Kohima district in the case of rural areas. The vice-versa situation recorded in the case of urban areas.

The above Statement—4 gives the percentage of Scheduled Tribes to total population and their distribution among the districts. It is revealed in the statement that all other districts except Kohima (65.53%) have the higher percentage of the Scheduled Tribes to the total population than that of the state average of 83.99%. Zunheboto district

recorded the highest percentage of 95.24 of Scheduled tribes to the total population among the districts. Again while distribution the 100 members of Scheduled tribes of Nagaland among the districts Kohima recorded the highest members with 25 and lowest recorded in Wokha district with 8 persons.

The Statement—5 above gives the information regarding percentage of members of Scheduled Tribes in rural and urban areas to total population by sex. Total 83.99% of total population of Nagaland are belonging to Scheduled tribe population. It is noticed that the Female percentage of 88.56 is comparatively higher than that of the male (80.05%). It is also revealed that the concentration of scheduled tribes population is much higher in rural area with 89.70% than that of urban areas with 52.91%. Among the districts, Zunheboto district recorded the highest percentage of scheduled tribes with 95.24% to the total population while the lowest recorded in Kohima district with 65.53%. The same distribution has also been observed in rural areas among the districts. Mokokchung district has recorded the highest percentage (79.19) of scheduled tribes to total population in the case of urban areas among the districts while the lowest percentage (36.54) recorded in Kohima district. Phek district does not have any urban areas.

7. Literacy and Education

7.1. Column 16, 17 and 18 of the State as well as District Primary Census abstract give the number of literate by sex for each unit.

Definition of Literate.

7.2. A person who can both read and write with understanding in any language is to be taken as literate. A person who can merely read but cannot write, is not a literate. It is not necessary that a person who is literate should have received any formal education or should have passed any minimum educational standard. All children of age of 4 years or less are treated as illiterate even if the child is going to a school and may have picked up reading and writing a few odd words.

7.3. The following statement shows the percentage of literates to total population by sex separately for rural and urban areas of the state down to circle and town level.

7.4. From the above statement it is noticed that the percentage of literates to the total population (including 0—4 age group population) in Nagaland as recorded in 1981 Census is 42.57 against 27.40 per cent in 1971 Census and 17.91 per cent in 1961 Census. A good progress in literacy during the last two decades has therefore been noticed in the state. Among the 7 districts of Nagaland the highest percentage of literacy of 61.78 is recorded in Mokokchung district followed by 48.94 per cent in Kohima district while the lowest percentage of literacy of 19.89 is recorded in Mon district. Mokokchung district with 61.78%, Kohima district with 48.94%, Wokha district with 45.60% and Zunheboto district with 45.59% have their literacy rate higher than the state literacy rate of 42.57%. The other three districts are having their literacy rates below the state average.

7.5. The urban literacy of 64.23 per cent is obviously higher than the rural literacy of 38.59 per cent in the state due to the fact that the urban areas of the state have the better facilities for education and have better opportunities for educated per-

sons for absorption in services and business. The highest urban literacy rate of 68.10 has been observed in Mokokchung district amongst the districts while the lowest is recorded in Mon districts with 55.41 per cent. Again Mokokchung district has recorded the highest literacy of 60.45 per cent among the districts of Nagaland in the case of rural literacy. The lowest percentage of rural literacy has also been recorded by Mon district with 16.49 per cent.

7.6. The highest literacy among the districts for both male and female with 65.95 and 57.18 per cent respectively have been recorded by Mokokchung district as against state average of male and female literacy of 50.06 and 33.89 per cent respectively. While the lowest of such literacy with 26.45 per cent for males and 12.35 per cent for females have been recorded in Mon district.

7.7. The following statement will show the percentage of literacy of Scheduled Tribes to total Scheduled Tribes population separately for total, rural and urban down to the circle level.

It is noticed that the literacy of Scheduled Tribes (40.32%) in the state of Nagaland is slightly less than the general literacy of the state by 2.25 per cent. The general literacy of Nagaland is 42.57 per cent as recorded in 1981 Census. The highest literacy of Scheduled Tribes among the districts of Nagaland is recorded in Mokokchung district with 61.77 per cent for total, 60.19 per cent for rural and 70.75 per cent for urban and the lowest percentage of 15.61 for total, 13.50 for rural and 48.08 for urban have been recorded in Mon district. It is observed that Mokokchung district has progressed its literacy rate much higher than that of the other districts of the state. Again Mon district has recorded its literacy rate much lower in comparison with the other districts.

8. Workers and non-workers.

8.1. In 1981 Census the working force of the people has been devised in more detail so that those who use these data have the type of information they want. In 1981 Census every person was asked what his main activity was. In other words, he was asked how he engaged himself in the reference period. All persons were divided into two broad streams of their activity namely, (1) workers and non-workers. The data are collected in details of work done by the people with reference to last year i.e. one year prior to the day of enumeration. The concept will be more clear if we elaborated what is meant by 'work' and what the 'reference period' is.

8.2. Definition of works.

Work may be defined as participation in any economically productive activity. Such participation may be physical or mental in nature. Work involves not only actual work but also effective supervision and direction of work. On the basis of the definition of work the data are collected from each of the person available in the respective jurisdiction, irrespective of age or sex.

8.3. Reference period.

While canvassing the Economic question of the series of the Census questionnaire during Census enumeration, the reference period was considered for one year preceding the date of enumeration. Certain types of work such as agriculture, household industry like gur making, etc. are carried on either through out the year or only during certain seasons or parts of the year, depending on local circumstances.

8.4. Certain important points that need special emphasis are the following and strictly followed by the enumerators at the time of enumeration.

8.4.(i). A person who normally work but has been absent from work during the reference period on account of illness, holiday, temporary closure, strike *etc.* was treated as engaged in the work he/she would otherwise have been doing for his/her temporary absence.

8.4.(ii) Persons under training, such as apprentices with or without stipends or wages, were also treated as workers.

8.4.(iii) Persons who had just received offering letter and not joined in the work till the date of enumeration were not considered as workers.

8.4.(iv) If a person was primary engaged in non-economic activities and partly helped in the family economic activity, such person was also treated as worker.

8.4.(v) A person who merely received an income out of rent, pension, begging, royalty, dividends, *etc.* without participating in any productive work were not treated as worker. Similarly, a person who is doing household duties, and might have produced something only for domestic purpose without earning money out of it, was treated as non-worker.

8.4.(vi) For an under trial prisoner enumerated in a jail, he/she was recorded for the work he/she was doing before he/she was apprehended. Similarly, for a person temporarily in a hospital or a similar institution he/she was recorded for the kind of work he/she was doing before he/she was admitted into hospital or institution. But for a convict in a prison or for long term inmates of penal or charitable or mental institution detained for 6 months or more, the person's previous work was not recorded and he/she was treated as non-worker.

8.4.(vii) A full time public or social service worker who is actively engaged in public service activity or a full time political worker who is also actively engaged in uplifting the activity of his/her party was recorded as a worker.

8.5. From the above explanation it is now clear that the enumerators had to consider whether one had done any work sometime during the last year. Obviously, the enumerator had to ask some probing questions specially to those who were not regular worker irrespective of age and sex. Some people generally work in the fields in sowing, harvesting or other seasons on their own land or as labourers on some one's land. If these questions are not put properly they would have been recorded as non-worker.

8.6. During 1971 Census, distribution of workers was given in 9 broad categories (with two sub-categories of workers engaged in manufacturing, servicing and repairs in category) viz., I-cultivators, II-agriculture labourers, III-forestry, fishing, hunting, plantations, orchards and allied activities, VI-Mining and quarrying, V(a)-Household industry, V(b) Manufacturing, processing, servicing and repairs other than household industries, VI-construction, VII-Trade and commerce, VIII-Transport, Storage and communications and IX-Other services. During 1981 Census, due to change in the concept of worker, the workers have been classified as Main workers and Marginal workers and are presenting main workers in four broad Industrial categories, viz, I-cultivators, II-Agricultural labourers, V(a)-Household Industry and rest of Industrial categories (III, IV, V(b), VI, VII, VIII and IX) as other workers. Data for marginal workers are being presented without their distribution according to broad Industrial categories.

8.7. Main worker.

The persons categorised as main workers are those who were engaged in their economic activities for 183 days or more. In other words, the person, engaged in an economic activity for 6 months or more was categorised as main worker. Some persons might have worked 183 days or more in more than one activity. For example, a person might have worked for three months in cultivation, two months in household industry and two months as an agricultural labourer. In such case, though the person was engaged in one activity of work for less than six months, all his works in different types had been considered and treated him as a main worker. The main activity of workers is classified into four categories, viz, cultivator, agricultural labour, household industry and other worker. The census terminology of the above categories are enumerated below.

8.7.(i) Cultivator.

According to the terminology a person is considered to be treated as cultivator if he/she is engaged either as employer, single worker or family worker in cultivation of land owned or held from Government or held from private persons or institution for payment in money, kind or share. Cultivation includes suspension or direction of cultivation. Cultivation involves ploughing, sowing and harvesting and production of cereals and millet crops such as wheat, paddy, jowar, bajra, ragi, etc and other crops such as sugarcane, ground nuts, topioca etc. and pulses, raw jute and kinder fiber

crops, cotton etc. and does not include fruits growing, vegetable growing or keeping orchards or groves or working plantation like tea, coffee, rubber cinchona and other Medicinal plantation. It also does not include a person who has given his/her land to other person for cultivation for money, kind or share and does not even supervise the land. Similarly, a person working in another person's land for wages in cash or kind or a combination of both is not treated as cultivator.

8.7.(ii) Agricultural labourer.

A person who works in another person's land for wages in money, kind or share without any rusk in the cultivation and has no right of lease or contract on land is treated as Agricultural labourer.

8.7.(iii) Household Industry.

Household Industry is defined as a industry conducted by the head of the household himself/herself and or the members of the household at home or within the village in rural areas and only within the precincts of the house where the household lives in urban areas. The larger proportion of workers in a household industry should consist of members of the household including the head. The industry should not run on the scale of a registered factory which would qualify or has to be registered under the Indian factory act. The industry was not considered as household industry though it fulfilled the definition of household industry as mentioned above if the establishment was run with power engaging 10 or more persons and without power engaging 20 or more persons. The household Industry can use machinery and power like steam or electricity to run it. The industry should involve processing, servicing, repairing or making production, manufacturing and selling goods. But it should not be confined to buying and selling alone. Persons engaged in such establishments for more than 6 months in the refered period were considered to be recorded in their activity of work in household industry at the time of canvassing Individual slips during actual enumeration and those number of persons are shown in columns 28 to 30 of the P.C.A with sex break up. The data also include the persons even if they worked without any remuneration or were engaged as apprentices in another's household industry carried on by a household of which they were not members.

8.7.(iv) Other workers.

All the persons who were categorised as workers and who were not included either in "Cultivators" or in "agricultural labourers" or in "household industry" were put as 'other workers'. The type of workers that come under this category of

'other workers' include factory workers, plantation workers, those in trade, commerce, business, transport, mining, quarrying, construction, political, Social work, all government servants, municipal employees, teachers, priests, entertainment artists, etc. In other words, all the industrial categories of workers except categories I, II and V(a) have been clubbed together and put in this category of other worker.

8.8. Marginal worker.

The term "Marginal workers" is a new addition in the 1981 Census. According to Census definition the marginal workers are those who work any time at all in the year preceeding the enumeration but have not worked for a major part of the year, *i.e.*, less than 183 days or 6 months.

8.9. Non-workers.

Columns 37 to 39 of Primary Census Abstract show the information of non-worker with sex break up. According to 1981 Census a person was treated as non-worker if he/she was not engaged at all in any economic activity during the reference period. A person was considered as non-workers at the time of Census taking if he/she was engaged in (1) Household duties or (2) a student or (3) as dependent or (4) as Retired persons or Rentiers or (5) as Beggars *etc.*, or (6) as Inmates of Institution or (7) as other non-workers during the reference period. A brief definitions of the above seven categories of the non-workers by which the persons were treated as non-workers are given below.

8.9(1) Household Duties.

All the persons who were engaged in unpaid home duties and who did no other work at all during the reference period were treated as 'Household duties'.

8.9(2) Students.

All full time students and children attending school without doing any work, partly or marginally, during reference period were considered to be treated as 'students'.

8.9(3) Dependents :

Persons who were dependent on others and were engaged neither in economic activity nor any other categories of non-workers during the reference period were treated as 'Dependents'. Practi-

cally all the children under age group 0—4 were included in this category. All the children not attending school, persons disabled permanently for work due to illness or old age and abled bodies persons who could not be categorised in any other categories of 'Non-workers' but were dependent on others were treated as 'Dependents'.

8.9(4) Retired persons or Rentiers.

A person who has retired from service and was not engaged again in any economic activity or a person who spent the reference period as a rentier or he was living on agricultural or non-agricultural royalty, rent or dividend or any other person of independent means for security which he/she did not have to work was included in this category.

8.9(5) Beggars, etc.

This category of non-worker covered beggars, vegrants or cases such as persons without indication of source of income and those with unspecified source of subsistance who were not engaged in any economically productive work.

8.9(6) Inmates of Institutions.

The persons who regarded as convicts in jail or inmates of penal, mental or charitable institution, even if such persons were compelled to do some work such as carpentry, weaving, vegetable growing, etc. in such institution, were considered to be enumerated as 'Inmate of Institution'. Persons were included in this category if they were in such institution for six months or more.

8.9(7) Other Non-workers.

All other non-workers who were not considered to be included in any of the other categories of non-worker discussed above and were seeking job, were treated as "other non-workers".

8.10. The data for non-worker as a whole have been presented in Primary Census Abstract. The data separately for each category of non-worker have not been shown in this table. However, the same information may be found in table B-22 which will be published separately in our publication part-III-A-General Economic Tables.

8.11. The following statement shows the percentage distribution of population in workers and non-workers.

8.12. The working force of Nagaland has been recorded in 1981 Census to 48.23 per cent as against 50.75 per cent of workers to total population in 1971 Census. A 2.52 per cent of workers to total population has been decreased during the decade mainly due to the increased rate of school going children and to some extent increasing of educated unemployed. The highest percentage of 58.66 of workers among the districts has been recorded in Mon district and lowest of 41.47 per cent has been recorded in Mokokchung district. The highest rank in the case of marginal worker with 58.03 per cent to the total population has been occupied by Mon district while the lowest rank with 41.01

per cent has been occupied by Mokokchung district. The percentage of total main workers to total population is 47.53 for the state. Against 0.70 per cent of total marginal workers to total population of the state the highest percentage among the districts with 1.26 has been occupied by Kohima district whereas the lowest with 0.08 per cent has been recorded in Tuensang district.

8.13. The following statement shows the percentage of workers and non-workers of Scheduled Tribes to total Scheduled Tribe population of Nagaland and its seven districts for total, rural and urban separately.

In the above statement it is noticed that 47.76 per cent of total Scheduled Tribes population of the state are recorded as workers out of which 47.03 per cent are 'total main workers' and 0.73 per cent are 'marginal workers'. The rate of Scheduled Tribes working force for rural and urban areas of Nagaland are 50.12 per cent and 25.12 per cent respectively. The highest rate of workers of Scheduled Tribes among the districts is recorded in Mon district with 58.41 per cent and the lowest

rate 40.20 per cent is recorded in Mokokchung district. Mon district with 58.41 per cent, Phek district with 52.32 per cent and Tuensang district with 50.96 per cent have their working force of Scheduled Tribes higher than that of the state while Mokokchung district with 40.20 per cent, Wokha district with 41.93 per cent, Zunheboto district with 45.57 and Kohima district with 45.66 per cent have their working force of Scheduled Tribes lower than that of the state.

GENERAL

The data presented in the Primary Census Abstract are the basic data for preparation of the series of Census tables of 1981 Census which is presented in 39 columns. The data contained in the Primary Census Abstract cover specified jurisdictions down from block level to the state/district level with rural-urban break-up. The Primary Census Abstract mainly provides the data for total, rural and urban break-up of specified jurisdictions i. e. state, district, circle, town and village levels and covers the (1) area figures in square kilometres (2) number of occupied residential houses (3) number of households (4) total population (5) Scheduled Tribes population, (6) literate population (7) total main workers (8) marginal workers and (9) non-workers. In this publication, the data presented down to circle and town level only. The presentation of the above informations in 39 columns in the abstract are divided into three broad groups. In the first group, the serial number of the specified jurisdiction, name of the place and rural urban separation have been covered in columns 1—3.

In the second group of the abstract, columns 4—6 cover the information of area in square kilometres, number of occupied residential houses and number of households respectively.

The third group starting from column 7 onwards comprises the chief socio-demographic aspects giving sex-wise information separately for total population with a break-up of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes, literates, workers and non-workers.

Columns 7—9 of the abstract show the total population of the specified area by sex. This population includes the institutional and houseless population also. Columns 13 to 18 give the scheduled tribes and literate population by sex. Column 19—21 give the data for total main workers by sex. The total main workers have further

been divided into four broad categories. They are (1) cultivators (2) agricultural labourers (3) household industry—manufacturing, processing, servicing and repairs and (4) other workers. The category-wise data by sex are given in columns 22 to 33. The data for marginal workers which has been shown for the first time in 1981 Census are given in columns 34 to 36. Non-workers have been clubbed under columns 37—39 giving sex-wise details.

SCHEDULED TRIBES

This is newly introduced in 1981 Census to be incorporate in this publication to facilitate the urgent need of the data to the planners, demographer, economists and other data users. This table corresponds to the table C—VIII part—B of 1961 and 1971 Censuses. This table gives the data for scheduled castes and scheduled tribes separately by number of households, literates, broad industrial categories of main workers, marginal workers and non-workers for total, rural and urban separately which is prepared manually on full count. There is no scheduled castes in Nagaland as per the Constitution (Nagaland) Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes Modified Order of 1976. According to this order the following tribes are listed as Scheduled Tribes in Nagaland.
