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## PREFACE

The Provisional Population Totals - Paper I of 1981 and Supplement of Lakshadweep was published after announcing the provisional population on 23rd March, 1981. The Final Population Figures of this Union Territory were released in October, 1982 through Paper 2 of 1981. This paper consists of the Union Territory population and Scheduled Tribe population by persons, males and females and also the disabled population. The booklet - Paper 1 of 1982, is the third in the series. The Final results of 1981 Census which are ready now and have not been released so far are brought out through this paper.

The Paper 1 of 1982 presents the Primary Census Abstract of total population as well as the Special Primary Census Abstract for SC/ST population. While presenting this paper efforts have been made to prize together the principal results of the earlier censuses. The data of the islands have been presented disregarding the rural/urban status. However, much analysis of data have not been made in this paper. The detailed report - Part II A & B General Population Tables and Primary Census Abstract relating to these data will be published shortly.

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### INTRODUCTORY NOTE

The Paper - 1 of 1982 presents the Primary Census Abstract of total population and Special Primary Census Abstract for SC/ST Population. The Primary Census Abstract of the entire population provides data on area, number of occupied residential houses, number of households, total population, Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe population, literate and educated persons, main workers by broad industrial categories viz. cultivator, agricultural labourer, household industry and other workers, marginal workers and non-workers. The special Primary Census Abstract for scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population also gives all the details relating to SC/ST population as provided for the total population excepting the data on area and residential houses. No caste has been scheduled in relation to the Union Territory of Lakshadweep. Therefore, the presentation of special Primary Census Abstract for SC/ST is limited to the ST population only.

### Definitions and important concepts of 1981 Census

2. Before the data are presented in the form of Primary Census Abstract, it would be relevant to discuss briefly the various definitions and concepts of 1981 Census.

2.1. Reference date

The reference date for the 1981 Census was the sunrise of first March, 1981.

2.2. Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe

According to the scheduled castes and scheduled tribes list (Modification order 1956) the inhabitants of Lakshadweep who and both of whose parents were born in those islands are treated as scheduled tribes. There is only one tribe in this territory which has no specific name. No caste has been scheduled in relation to the Union Territory of Lakshadweep.

2.3. Area

The total area figure of the U.T/district is the geographical area furnished by the Surveyor General of India, whereas the area figures of the islands and that of urban area of the U.T/district are based on the data given by the Lakshadweep administration which is the land use area. The total rural area of the U.T/district is derived by deducting urban area from the geographical area. Hence, the total/rural areas of the tahsils will not add up to the U.T/district areas. The uninhabited islands have not been shown in the table. However, the areas of these islands have been included in the rural areas of attached tahsils.

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#### 2.4. Occupied Residential Houses and Households

A "census house" is a building or part of a building having a separate main entrance from the road or common court-yard or staircase etc. used or recognised as a separate unit. A 'Household' is a group of persons who commonly live together and would take their meals from a common kitchen. An 'occupied residential house' may be used wholly as a dwelling or it may be put to other uses also besides being used as a dwelling.

#### 2.5. Literate

A person who can both read and write with understanding in any one language is to be treated as literate. A person who can merely read but cannot write is not literate. It is not necessary that a person who is literate should have received formal education and should have passed any minimum educational standard. Children up to the age of 4 years have been treated as illiterate irrespective of their attending school or not.

#### 2.6. Work

Work is defined as participation in any economically productive activity. Such participation may be physical or mental in nature. Work involves not only actual work but also effective supervision and direction of work.

2.7. Main Worker

A person who has primarily worked for the major period of a year is a main worker. By major period of the year, it is intended to ensure that the person has worked for 183 days or more or in other words worked for six months or more, the reference period being one year preceding the date of enumeration. For seasonal work, working in any season during the reference year should be considered to satisfy the criterion.

2.8. Marginal Worker:

A person who has worked for less than six months or 183 days but worked occasionally during the year before enumeration is considered as marginal worker.

2.9. Non-Worker

A person who has not worked at all during preceding one year from the date of enumeration is a non-worker.

3. The workers have been further classified into following categories.

3.1. Cultivator

A person is a cultivator if he or she is engaged either as

employer, single worker or family worker in cultivation of land owned or held from government or held from private persons or institutions for payment in money, kind or share. Cultivation includes supervision or direction of cultivation.

### 3.2. Agricultural Labourer

A person who works in any person's land for wages in money, kind or share is regarded as agricultural labourer. He or she has no risk in cultivation but he or she merely works in another person's land for wages. An agricultural labourer has no right to lease or contract on land on which he/she works.

### 3.3. Household Industry

It is an industry which relates to production or processing or servicing or repairing conducted by the head of household himself or herself or by the members of the household at home or within the village in rural areas and only within the premises of the house where the household lives in the urban areas. A large proportion of the workers in a household industry should consist of members of the household including head. The industry should not be run on a scale of registered factory which would qualify or has to be registered under the Indian

Factories Act.

3.4. Other Workers

All workers i.e., those who have been engaged in economic activities during the last one year, who are not cultivators or agricultural labourers or in household industry are 'other workers'. The type of the work that comes under this category includes factory workers, plantation workers, those in trade and commerce, business, transport, mining, constructions, all government servants, municipal employees etc. In fact, all those who worked in the field of economic activity other than cultivator, agricultural labour or household industry are 'other workers'.

2. Lakshadweep is a single district Union Territory comprising 27 islands. Of these 10 islands are inhabited and 17 are uninhabited. Because of the geographical isolation and for administrative convenience the islands have been grouped into four and each group forms a Tahsil. Thus, there are four tahsils viz. Minicoy, Andrott, Kavaratti and Amini. The subjoined statement gives the names of inhabited and uninhabited islands in the District/Tahsil.

3.1. While the three decades of 1941, 1951 and 1961 had more or less uniform decennial growth rate, the decade of 1971 recorded an abnormal increase. Again the rate has come down during 1981.

3.3. The above statement reveals that the largest populated island in all the censuses is Andrott except during 1951, the smallest being Bitra. The islands Kadmat, Kiltan, Chetlat and Bitra have retained the same rank from 1951 to 1981. But the island Minicoy which was the largest populated island during 1951 has changed its position to the second place during the latter Censuses. Agatti island improved its rank from 6th to 5th during 1971 and retained the same position in 1981, whereas Kalpeni went down from 5th to 6th rank in 1971 and remained in the same rank in 1981. Kavaratti island has gone up to 3rd rank in 1981 pushing Amini island down to the 4th place. During the decade 1971-81 Bitra island has recorded the highest growth rate followed by Kavaratti island, whereas Kalpeni island has the lowest.

#### Urban Population

4. Among the total inhabited islands three islands viz. Minicoy, Kavaratti and Amini were classified as census towns for the first time during 1981 Census. Hence, 46.28% of the total population of this territory constitute Urban Population. Among the S.T. Population only 44.68% represent the urban population.

#### Households

5. There are 6,637 households in the Union Territory, of which 5,906 households are having Scheduled Tribe members. The proportion of households with Scheduled Tribe members to the total households is 88.99%. The average size of the households is 6.06 as against 5.99 during 1971 Census. The number of Scheduled Tribe members per household is 6.39 which is slightly higher than the general population average. The subjoined statement gives the number of total households, households with Scheduled Tribe members and average size of the households in the islands.

8.2. Amini island has the highest density and Kadmat has the lowest. Kavaratti island has improved its position from 8th rank in 1961 to 2nd in 1981. However, density of population has increased in all islands considerably over the decade.

9.1. The sex-ratio of ST Population is higher than that of general population in all the decades from 1961 to 1981. The general trend of data is towards the disproportion of sexes in the case of general population and it is leading to a balancing position in respect of ST Population. 9.2. The Highest sex-ratio is seen in Minicoy during 1961,1971 and 1981 Censuses. The lowest sex-ratio is in Bitra during 1981 and 1961 Censuses, whereas Kavaratti has the lowest during 1971.

#### Literacy

11.1. Among the total population 24.39% are workers, of which 19.75% are main workers and 4.64% are marginal workers. In the case of S.T. Population 22.81% are workers with break up of 17.95% as main workers and 4.86% as marginal workers. Hence, the total workers and main workers of S.T. are less by about 2 points than the total population. But the percentage of marginal workers to S.T. is slightly higher than that of general population. The following statement gives the percentage of workers relating to total population and S.T. 11.2. The highest percentage of total workers in both total population and Scheduled Tribe population are seen in Agatti island. In the case of main workers the highest participation rate is seen in Bitra closely followed by Agatti. The maximum marginal workers are found in Kiltan island. The lowest percentage of total workers is in Minicoy, whereas participation rate of main workers is the lowest in Kiltan island. The least number of marginal workers are found in Minicoy.
