0.0 The figures presented in this booklet give some basic particulars of the population as on 1st April, 1971 as recorded by the 1971 census of India. These figures however are only the crude totals compiled from the abstracts furnished by the census enumerators themselves from the census records. The figures so compiled from the abstract collected from hundreds of enumerators are bound to have their own limitations and are thus purely provisional which can be confirmed only after the census schedules are fully processed in the regional tabulation office. After the final tabulation, apart from providing the primary census data down to every village and enumerators' block of a town, a series of cross tabulations of the census data will be made to present the demographic, social and economic characteristics of the population in a meaningful way such as by sex, broad age groups, educational levels, etc. It is our anxiety to make available to the Government and the people the provisional results of the 1971 census count

as quickly as possible after the completion of enumeration which has impelled us to complete and present this booklet of provisional population figures.

### I—Methodology and Organisation

1.0 The 1971 population census of Goa, Daman & Diu is the first census after the liberation of the Territory in December 1961. Incidentally, the method of conducting the present census was different from the one adopted in 1960 when the erstwhile regime conducted a census on December 15, 1960. In the last census, the 'householder method' was adopted under which the Census Questionnaires or Schedules were supplied to each head of the household who was required to fill-in the data and return the same to the census authorities by a stipulated date. In the present census, the 'cavasser method' was adopted under which a trained enumerator visited each and every household of his area and collected data by personally canvassing the Census Questionnaires with

the head of the household.

1.1 The 1971 Census was conducted in two phases, the first one in February-March 1970 when the house-numbering and house-listing operations were completed, while the second one in March-April 1971 when the actual enumeration of population was undertaken.

1.2 The Union Territory of Goa, Daman & Diu consists of three disjointed land blocks situated in the Western Coast, but separated from each other by a distance of more than 500 kms., and each forming an independent

administrative district. While the Goa district is further sub-divided into 11 talukas, Daman and Diu districts have only one taluka each. At the time of the 1960 Census, the lowest administrative unit for which census data was presented was a "freguesia" in case of rural areas and a town in case of urban areas. However, in the 1971 Census, the basic census data will be presented for each "revenue" village in case of rural areas, and a ward in case of urban towns. The total number of villages and Towns for Goa, Daman & Diu is given in the following table.

(Note: It was too late to adjust the data presented in this paper according to some minor changes in revenue villages made vide Government of Goa, Daman & Diu, Revenue Department, Notification No. RD/LND/213/69-71/11 dated 15th February, 1971. Effort is being made to make the necessary adjustments in future Census publications).

1.3 With a view to ensuring efficient and timely completion of the Census, the Territory was divided into 1156 Rural and 340 Urban Enumerator's Blocks. Work of about 5 to 6 Enumerator's blocks was supervised by one Supervisor. About 1600 persons engaged to work as Enumerators or Supervisors were given a thorough training in

carrying out the various census operations, in specially arranged training classes. Each worker had to attend four training classes. Printed booklets containing detailed instructions on filling in the Census Schedules were also supplied to the Enumerators/Supervisors.

1.4 At the time of 1971 Census the following census schedules were used.

1.5 In order to facilitate location of each structure falling within his block, each enumerator was supplied with a copy of 'Abridged Houelist' which was

prepared on the basis of the original Houelist compiled in February-March 1970. The Abridged Houelist contained the following columns.

There was also a provision in the Abridged Houelist to make a note of new houses that might have come up after March 1970.

1.6 Each enumerator had, in addition, to prepare a notional map symbolically showing therein location of each structure irrespective of whether used for residential purpose or not.

1.7 Originally, the reference date of the 1971 Census was 1st March 1971 (Sunrise), and the enumeration period

was from 10th February 1971 to 28th February 1971 with a revisional round from 1st to 3rd March 1971. However, in view of the preoccupation of Government administration all over the country with the mid-term elections to the Lok Sabha, the census time-schedule was revised as under:

- i) Reference date: ... Sunrise of 1st April 1971.
- ii) Enumeration period: ... 10th to 31st March, 1971.
- iii) Dates of revisional round: ... 1st to 3rd April, 1971.

1.8 The enumeration of houseless population was undertaken on the night of 31st March while that of sea population, on 31st March and 1st April 1971.

## II—Population and rate of Growth

2.0 According to the *provisional* data, the population of Goa, Daman

2.1 The 1971 population of the territory shows an increase of 36.78% over that of 1960 when it was 626,667. The district wise break up of the 1971 Population is as follows:

2.2 The decadal growth rate (+36.78%) appears to be too high when compared to the all-India growth rate (+24.57%), and also that of the two neighbouring states of Maharashtra (+27.16%) and Mysore (+23.90%).

2.3 It is obvious that a natural rate of growth of population cannot bring about such a rise in the Territory's population in the last one decade, the average birth and death rates of the Territory during that period being 26 and 12 respectively. The increase, then, has to be located in the other factors. Two important factors appear to have contributed to this considerable increase in population. One is the reversion in the trend of emigration of Goa population to Bombay, to other parts of the country, and to other countries (especially the African and South European countries). Liberation brought in its wake new employment opportunities by way of a considerable expansion in government employment, opening of a large number of educational institutions, and also a corresponding expansion in the secondary and tertiary sectors of economy. This, on the one hand, checked to a good extent the trend of emigration, and, on the other, resulted into immigration of population, especially of unskilled labour. The census operations revealed that most of the new development projects have provided employment to labourers from outside Goa. Mining industry has attracted labour from outside Goa. So have the Mormugao Port Trust, the Inland Navigation, the road and building construction activities, etc. It was observed that an overwhelming majority of the unskilled labour engaged on the construction works of the Fertilizer complex coming up in a taluka of this territory was from outside the territory. In other words, influx of population is an important factor contributing to the 36.78% rise in population over the last 10 years.

### III—Sex-ratio

3.0 But the influx of labour has also resulted in addition to the number of incomplete families, though in a different way. Earlier, the families were incomplete due to the males going out of the territory in search of economic pursuits; now they are incomplete due to a large number of labourers (mostly males) coming alone for work here. This has, therefore, reversed the sex-ratio in favour of males from the one in favour of females which existed here for a long time. This is indeed an important demographic change. Till 1960, there used to be an excess of females over males in this territory. This picture has changed for the first time in 1971. The sex ratio since the 1900 Census is indicated in the following table:

3.2 The excess of females over males in the past censuses can perhaps be accounted for by a consistent trend of emigration of males from this territory for jobs, etc. This trend has reversed in 1971, but for the Goa district alone. In case of Daman and Diu districts, there still are more females per 1000 males. In fact, in Goa district also, there are some pockets where there is an excess of females over males. This is seen from the following tables.

**IV.—Density of population**

4.0 It is obvious that the density of population goes up along with the increase of population. The density of population in 1971 is 225 persons per Km<sup>2</sup> as against 169 persons per km<sup>2</sup> in

1960. The districtwise density of population is given below:

**V—Literacy**

5.0 The crude literacy rates i.e. rates calculated on the basis of population including children of age group 0—4 according to the 1971 Census for Goa, Daman and Diu are 44.53% for total population, 54.45% for males and 34.48% for females. The corresponding figures for 1960 Census are:

5.1 The spectacular rise in literacy is perhaps due to the concerted efforts in this direction on the part of the Government which have opened new

schools in almost all the villages of Goa, Daman & Diu. The districtwise total literacy rates are as follows:—

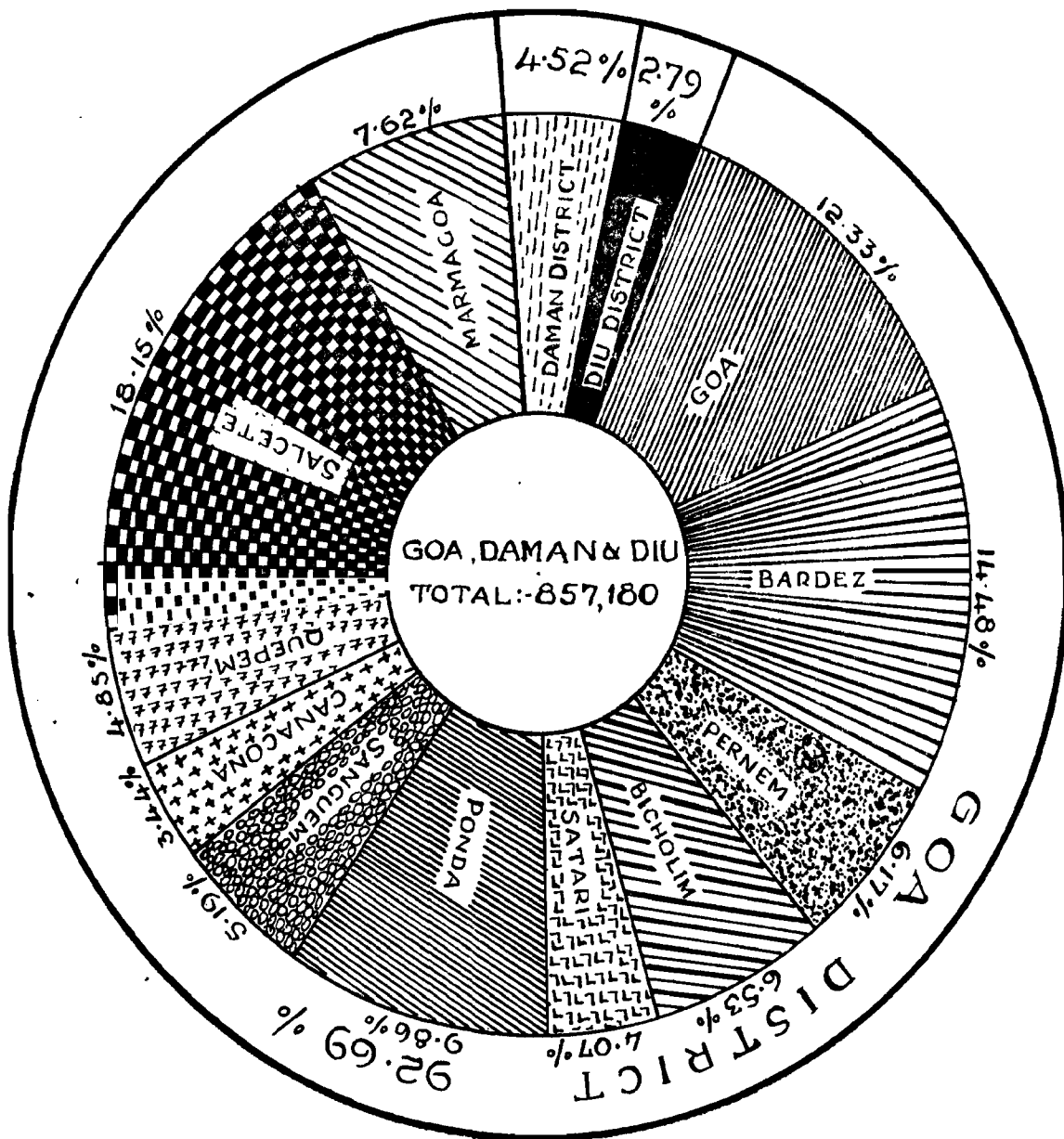

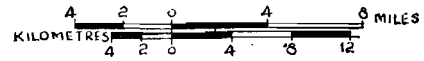

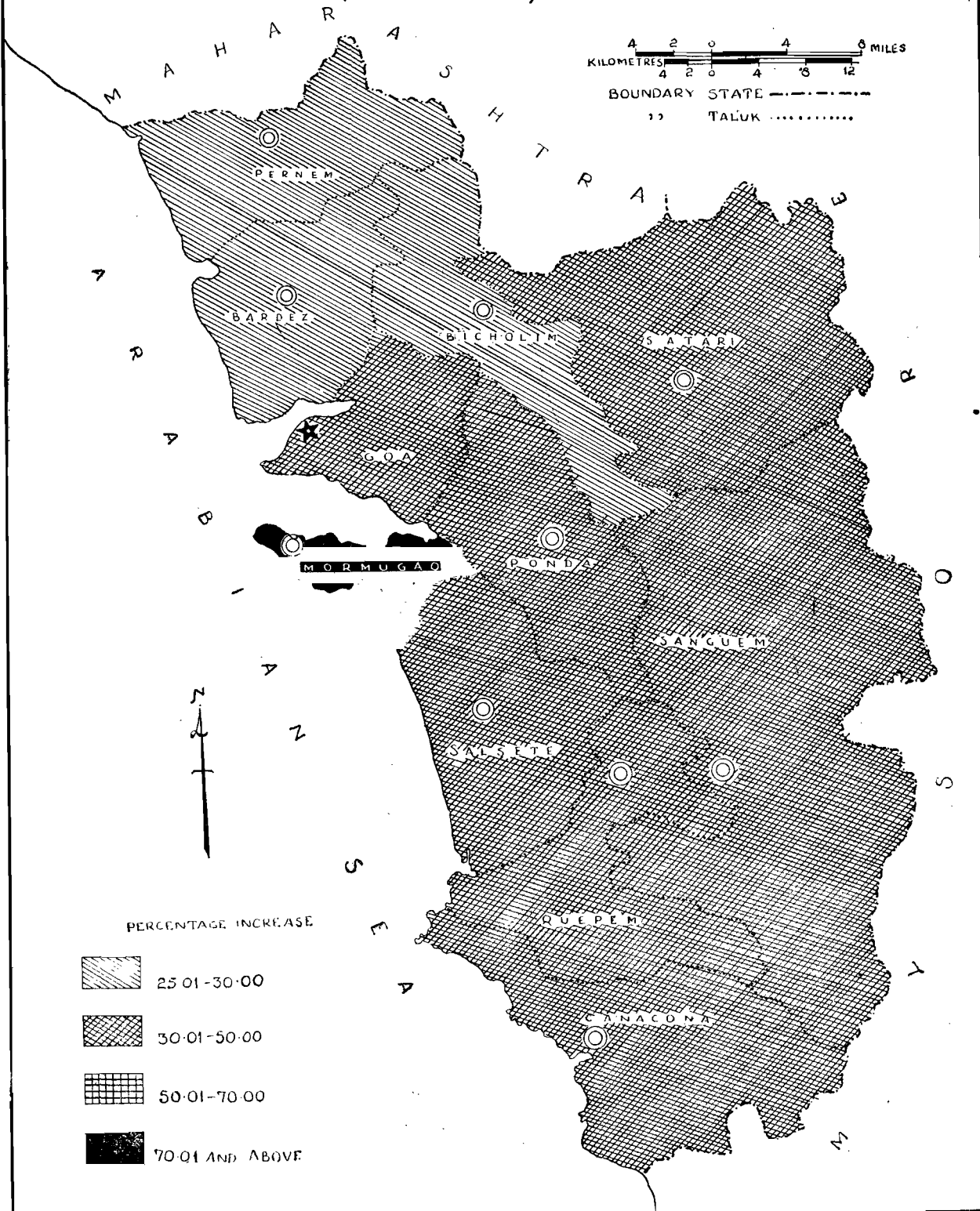





## DECENNIAL POPULATION GROWTH RATES (1961-1971) (PROVISIONAL)

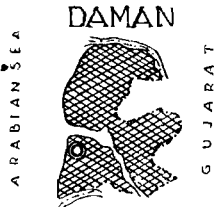

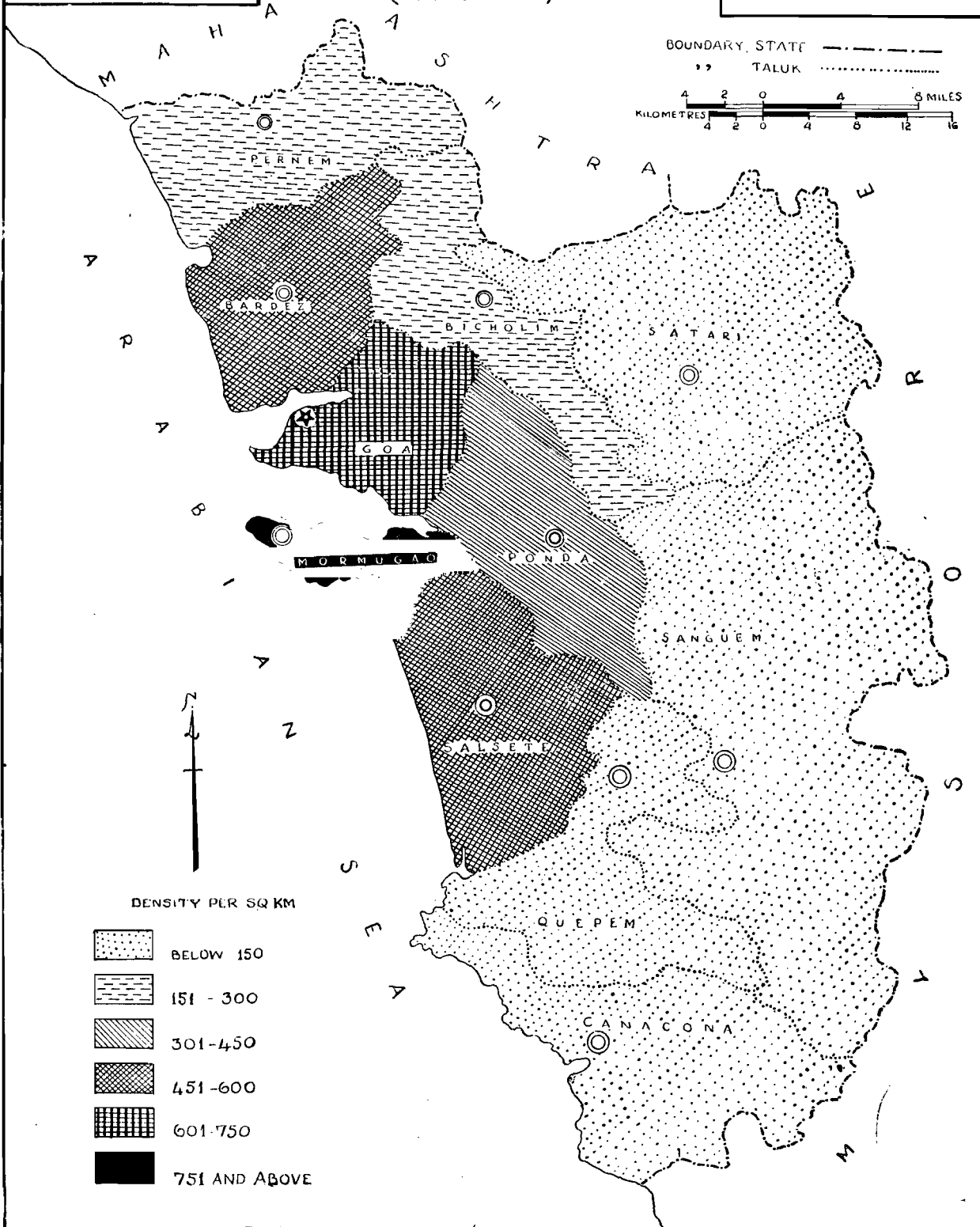
