PREFACE

The less the gap between the approximation and accuracy the more reliable would be the census data. The approximation in its turn can be expected only when the complete information, though provisional, are available. The Paper 1 is not complete till the Supplement is published. In order to make the total exercise complete the updated information after necessary correction are required to be furnished.

From that point of view the complete information would be available in the Supplement read with Paper 1.

The Provisional Population Totals of Tripura was published as 2,060,189 having 1,057,714 males and 1,002,475 females. After the publication of provisional results an error in compilation of totals at sub-divisional level has been detected. In the Provisional Population Totals Paper 1 an excess figures of 12,838 with 6,474 males and 6,364 females against South Tripura district has been shown. On the basis of the revised figure the total population of Tripura comes down to 2,047,351 having 1,051,240 males and 996,111 females. The difference is in the tune of 0.62 per cent to total population of Tripura as shown in Paper 1.

It is an undenying fact that there is gap between Paper 1 and Supplement as the figures in the Supplement represent revised data after checking of field totals. Of course this gap is due to decrease of population of 12,838 in South Tripura District. Variations due to the said decrease of population would be insignificant had it not affected the totality of the picture even though the figures of West Tripura District and North Tripura District remain unchanged.

Yet it is a blessing in disguise as it has helped us to reach the stage of approximation and it is expected that the gap in between approximation (Provisional Totals as shown in Supplement read with Paper-1) and accuracy (final population figures) would be minimum. In this context the tables on provisional figures published in Paper 1 have been revised on the basis of the revised figures and republished with some changes in the level of presentation of data. Thus the Provisional Population Totals Paper 1 is to be read with the present Supplement to Paper 1 in order to have comprehensive population picture of Tripura. It is pertinent to mention here that the figures published in this booklet are also provisional and subject to variation. The final figures will be available only after scrutiny and editing of the schedules received from the enumerators.

I am very happy to record my appreciation of co-operation received from my staff in bringing out this publication. Particular mention may be made regarding the contribution of Shri A. K. Mukherjee, Officer on Special Duty towards analysis of data.

The report would be incomplete if the valuable co-operation extended by Shri V. P. Pandey, Deputy Registrar General, India and Shri K. K. Chakraborty, Deputy Registrar General, India (C & T) and other staff of the office of the Registrar General, India is not recorded with all my heartiest thanks to them.

The role of Shri S. R. Sankaran, I.A.S., Chief Secretary, Government of Tripura for conducting census operation is to be remembered with reverence.

I owe my whole-hearted gratitude to Shri P. Padmanabha, I.A.S., Registrar General, India for his constant valuable guidance.

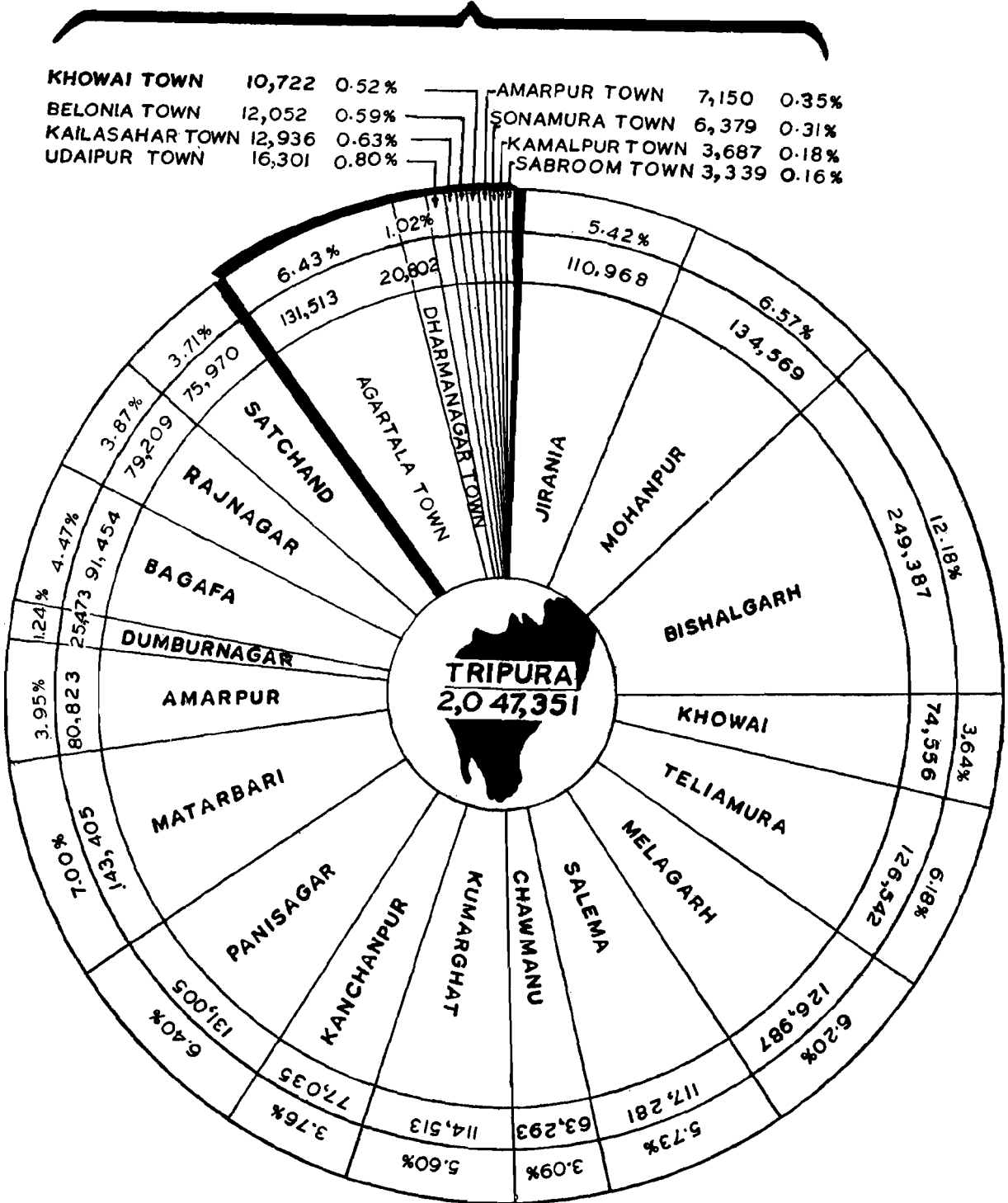

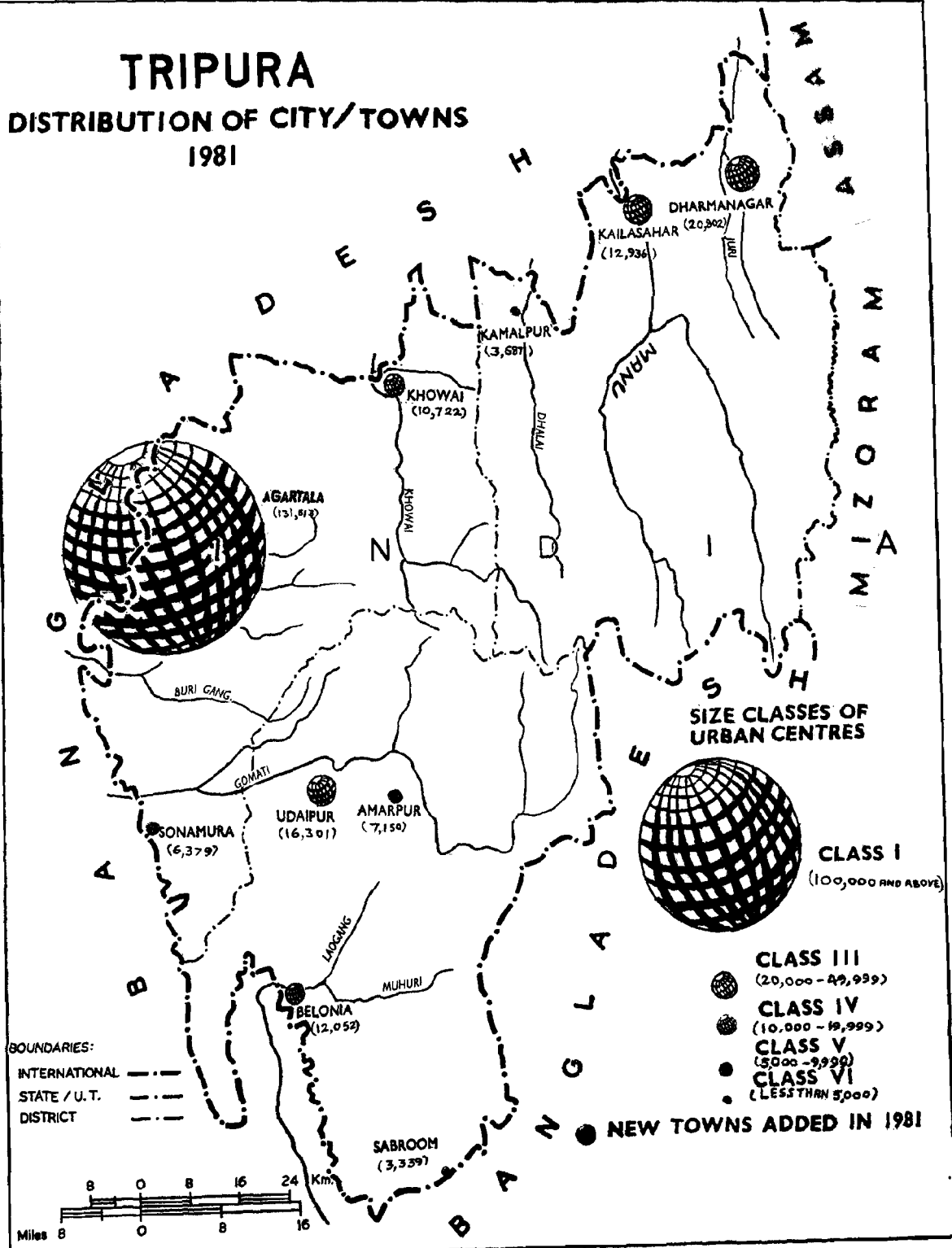

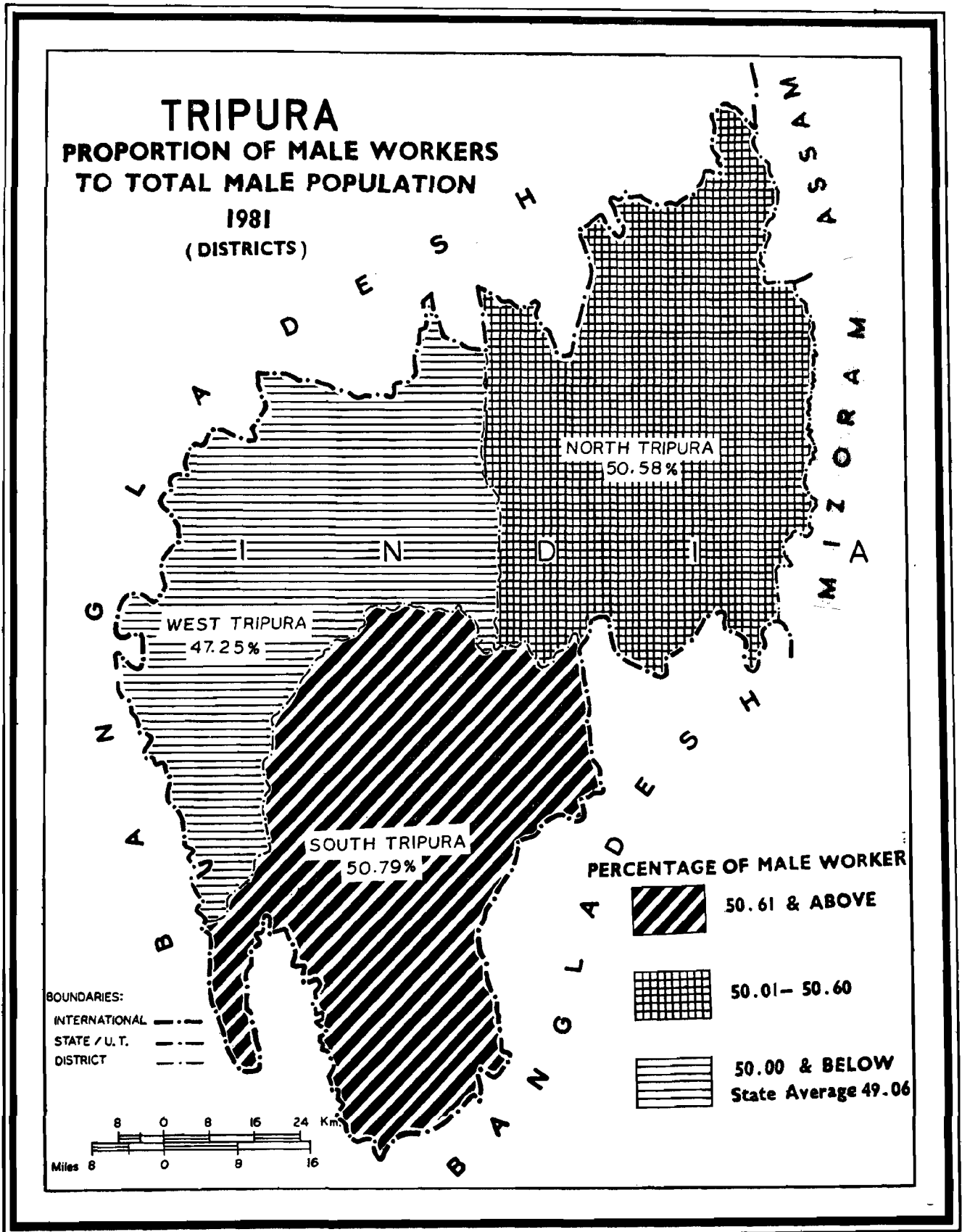
COMPARATIVE POPULATION SIZE OF THE

1981

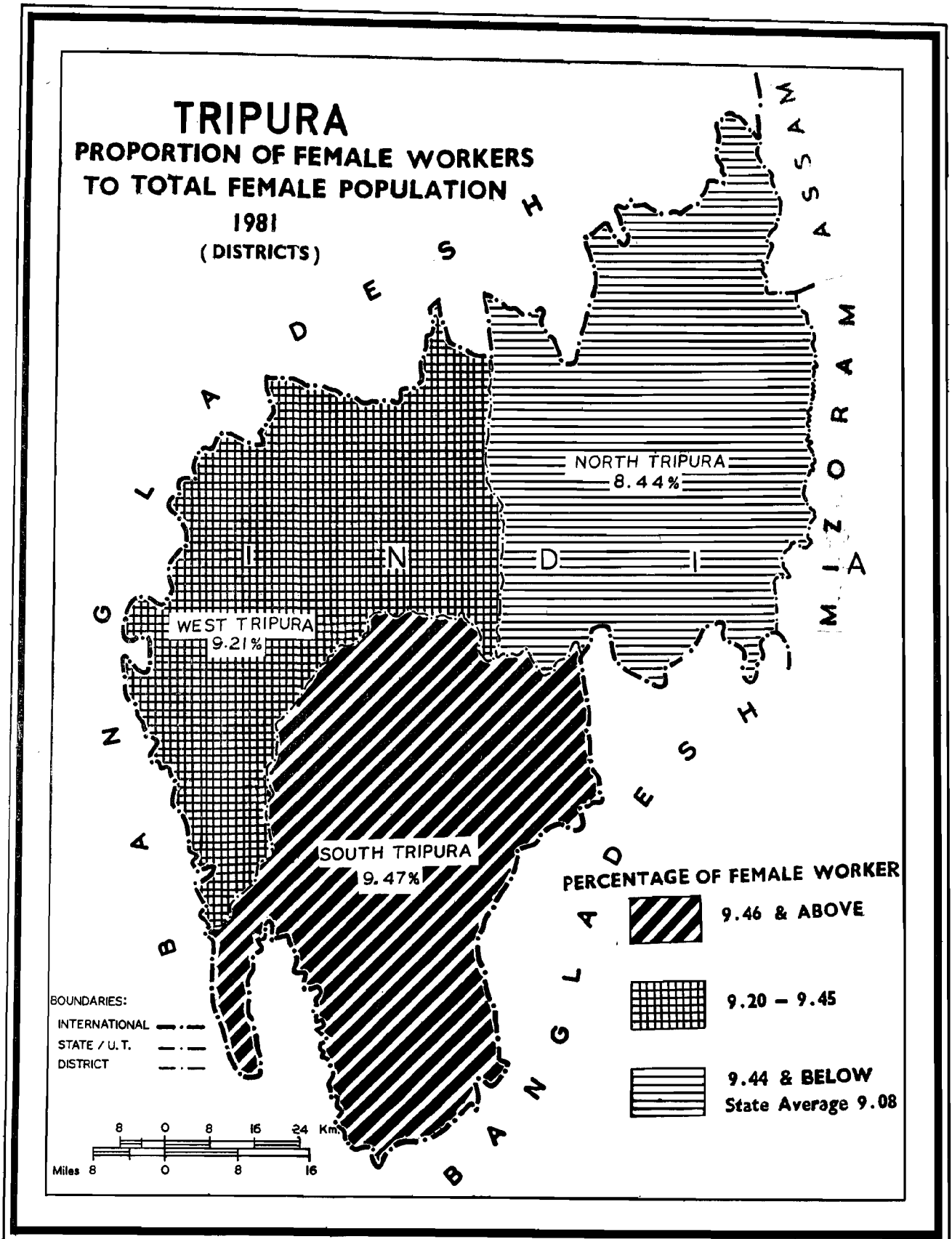

ANALYTICAL NOTE :

1. INTRODUCTION

The second phase of the field work of 1981-Census, took place during the period 9th February to 5th March and the population totals classified along two principal axes, namely sex and literacy, were received at State headquarters on 10th March, 1981. These data were compiled and consolidated successively at charge level, sub-divisional level, district level and state level. In the Census Directorate messages were received from the District Census Officers and contained informations only on sex and literacy status of the population of that district in the format given below :

On the basis of the data contained in these messages, provisional population totals were compiled and the Paper-1 of 1981 published.

By the end of March all papers including working sheets of enumerators and of those at higher levels of the hierarchy have been received. A preliminary scrutiny of these working sheets containing population totals of enumeration blocks classified by sex, literacy and some other socio-economic characteristics has been conducted for finalisation of the figures of this book-let entitled "Supplement to Paper-1 of 1981—Provisional Population Totals".

For compilation of the data presented in this booklet, we had to refer to the working sheets of enumerators and this compilation indicated figures slightly different from those given in Paper-1 of 1981. The revised total population of the State is 2,047,351 as against the figure 2,060,189 announced in our earlier publication. This downward revision is due to detection of computational errors at the time of compilation of figures. Revised total population of the South Tripura District is 535,176 of which 275,104 are males and 260,072 are females.

1.1 In statement—1 below is given the latest available provisional population of Tripura cross classified by sex and literacy.

For the sake of convenience of reference, all the relevant tables of Paper-1 have been revised and reproduced in this publication. As data for each charge are now separately available, table-1 and table-3 have been recast showing figures for each Development Block, Town, Sub-Division and District.

1.2—These figures, though revised in the light of latest available data, are also provisional and subject to revision after generation of Primary Census Abstracts which will take about 10 months time.

The additional data presented in this supplement are on—

- 1) urbanisation, and
- 2) participation in work.

These figures are also provisional and final figures will be available only after scrutiny and editing of individual slips and subsequent compilation.

Consequent upon the downward revision of population figures, the analysis presented in 'Paper-1 of 1981-Provisional Population Totals' would undergo some modification and a brief description of the same is given below.

2. RE-APPRAISAL OF PROVISIONAL TOTALS CLASSIFIED BY SEX AND LITERACY

The analysis made of the sex and literacy composition of the population on the basis of the first set of provisional figures reported in Paper-1 of 1981 will have to be read in the light of the revised figures now available and presented in tables 1 to 4 of this book-let.

In Tables 1 & 3 figures have been presented separately for each Development Block/Town/Sub-Division/including those for the Districts and of the State as a whole. The Block-Town-Sub-Divisional level data are

additional informations presented with the idea of early dissemination of informations to users.

At this stage we do not intend to make any comment on differentials in growth etc. between sub-divisions and at lower levels. But it deserves mention that Khowai Sub-division and Kamalpur Sub-Division, and correspondingly the West Tripura district and the North Tripura district have been affected by transfer of Ganganagar Tehsil of Khowai Sub-Division in West Tripura district to Kamalpur Sub-division of North Tripura district after 1971 census.

Revised provisional population of Tripura is 2,047,351 of which 1,051,240 are males and 996,111 are females. The increase over the previous record at Sunrise of 1-4-71 is 491,009 and not 503,847 as mentioned in Paper-1. The increase is 31.55 percent and not 32.37 percent as given in Paper-1. Growth rate for South Tripura district is 33.89 percent and not 37.10 percent as mentioned in the earlier publication. Slightly higher rate of increase has helped the district to move nearer to the North Tripura district, which is still maintaining its second position.

2.1 Density of population for the State as a whole stands revised at 195 per Sq. Km. The population density for South Tripura is 149 per Sq. Km and is still lower than the same for North Tripura district which stands at 153 per Sq. Km.

2.2 Out of the total increase of 491,009 persons during the decade, 250,114 are males and 240,895 are females. Sex ratio of South Tripura stands revised as 945 females per thousand males in place of 946 mentioned in Paper-1. It is identical to that of 1971 Census.

2.3 At the Census reference time of Sunrise of 1st March, 855,398 persons have been recorded as literates. Crude literacy rate works out as 41.78 percent and not 41.58 percent as reported earlier in Paper-1.

Percentage of literate males has gone up from 40.20 to 51.27, while the percentage for females has increased from 21.19 to 31.77. Rates of increase from 1971 level of literacy rate for males and females are respectively 27.53% and 49.93%.

The revised statement on number of illiterate persons is given below :—

3. URBANISATION

Urbanisation by itself is not a characteristic of the population, though urbanism may be considered as such. Residence in urban area does not automatically lead to development of characteristics referred to as urbanism. This has been found to be particularly true for developing countries like India, where thousands of poor people migrate to cities and towns and lead a frugal life in urban slums.

Nevertheless, it is necessary to classify the population as Rural and Urban, since it helps in assessing the differential in the socio-economic and demographic characteristics of the population. Residence in rural or urban area is accepted as a basic information for stratification in socio-economic and demographic studies, because our experience has proved that this is a variable on which many of the characteristics depend and we can fall back on them when we are under an incapacity to pin-point and use variables which affect the phenomenon under observation in a more definite way.

Moreover, study of urbanisation is important because of the following two reasons :—

i) certain benefits may flow from the urban centres functioning as a catalytic agent for economic progress, and

ii) Urban centres may present certain socio-cultural and economic problems requiring prompt attention and careful management.

3.1. The word 'urban' refers to areas and the definition adopted for it in Indian Census is as follows :—

(a) All places with a municipality, corporation or cantonment or notified town area.

(b) All other places which satisfy the following criteria :

- (i) a minimum population of 5,000.
- (ii) at least 75 percent of male working population engaged in non-agricultural (and allied) activity.
- (iii) a density of population of at least 400 per Sq. Km.

This is precisely the definition adopted in 1981 Census.

The fairly strict definition of an urban area had started to be adopted in India from the 1961-Census, before which it was left entirely to the discretion of the local authorities.

3.2 The urban criterion of 1981 varies slightly from that of 1961 and 1971 census in that working in activities like fishing, logging etc. has not been treated as non-agricultural activities this time for the purpose of testing whether 75% of male working population is non-agricultural. To that extent the definition has become a bit stringent compared to that of 1971.

3.3 A term which appears in urban classification and in supplement tables 2 and 3 of this publication, is "Urban Agglomeration". For this the 1971 census concept has been adopted and the same is indicated below :

"Very often University campus, military campus etc. come up adjoining a town but out-side its statutory limits. Such areas may not by themselves qualify to be treated as towns, but they are out-growths of the town and form a continuous spread with the town".

Such towns together with their out-growths are to be treated as one urban unit and called 'Urban Agglomeration'. There is no such unit in Tripura.

3.4 In 1971, besides Agartala Municipality 5(five) other sub-divisional head-quarters were treated as urban for the purpose of census. In the mean time, those 5 sub-divisional head-quarters which were considered as urban from census point of view, alongwith the remaining 4(four) sub-divisional head-quarters have been declared as 'Notified Areas'. Accordingly, all the 9(nine) sub-divisional head-quarters besides the Agartala Municipality have been taken as urban in 1981.

3.5 In supplement table-1 is given Rural-Urban composition of the population along-with percentage of urban population in 1981 and 1971. Percentage of urban population is 10.98 in 1981 and the same was 10.43 in 1971. Supplement Table-A of this booklet gives the total population, the urban population and the percentage of urban population for each State and Union Territory. It will be evident from the table that the percentage of urban population in Tripura is lower than the same for all the States of India except for Himachal Pradesh where 7.72 per cent of total population reside in urban area. It is also seen that among the Union Territories only Arunachal Pradesh and Dadra and Nagar Haveli is lagging behind Tripura in urbanisation.

It has been noted in the foot note of the Supplement Table A that in the presentation figures for Assam and Jammu and Kashmir have been excluded. This has been done notwithstanding availability of projected urban population of these two States, because urbanisation is very much dependent on socio-economic factors and can not be adequately taken care of in projections. It may also be mentioned here that small variations in the total population indicated in this table with what was published in Paper-1 will be noticed in few cases because figures now presented are those arrived at after checking of field totals. In absolute numbers, the total urban population of the State is 224,881 of which 148,614 i.e. about 66% reside in West Tripura district, 15 percent people of West Tripura district reside in urban areas while these percentage for North Tripura and South Tripura districts are respectively 6.92% and 7.26%.

In the following statement decade variation for rural and urban population of Tripura since 1901 is shown.

It is evident from the above statement that out of a total increase of 1,874,026 persons since the beginning of this century, more than 88% have been absorbed in rural areas. Simply this feature of population distribution warrants serious consideration for rural development.

A more detailed analysis of the absorption of this increased population in rural sector is necessary for better appreciation of the situation.

3.6 Supplement table—2 presents data on population and growth rate of Cities and Towns. From the data it is evident that Agartala town has registered maximum growth followed by Dharmanagar, Kailasahar, Udaipur, Khowai and Belonia in that order.

3.7 At the census towns are classified as follows :

Supplement Table-3 shows distribution of urban population among the towns of different size classes alongwith the number of towns in each class. A study of that table at once reveals that Class-I Town, in which there is only one, namely the head-quarter City Agartala, account for more than 58% of the urban population. In 1971 this percentage was higher at 62%.

Total urban population of Tripura vis-a-vis that of Agartala town in different censuses since 1901 is given below :—

It is seen that till 1951 Agartala was the only urban area and its population accounted for 100 per cent of urban population. In 1961 its share dropped to 53.28% due to coming up of new urban areas while in 1971 its contribution to the total urban population increased to 61.75 per cent. In 1981 four new urban areas have come up and its share has again decreased to 58.48%.

There is no Class-II town in Tripura, while there is one Class-III town, 4 Class-IV towns, 2 Class-V Towns and 2 Class-VI Towns. In 1971, there was no town in the categories of Class-II, Class-III and Class-VI.

Class-III Towns contribute 9.25%, Class-IV Towns' share is 23.13% and contribution of Class-V and Class-VI towns are respectively 6.02% and 3.12% to total urban population in Tripura.

Out of the total addition of 62,521 people in the urban areas about 50% are in Class-I Town. Statement-5 below distributes the additional urban population among the different size classes :—

4. WORKING POPULATION

At the census every individual is categorised by his economic characteristic or participation for work in different sectors of economy. Collection of correct information on economic questions is more difficult than those on demographic, social and cultural items. This is particularly so in Indian States where the economy is not so well organised/institutionalised.

Different concepts/definitions have been tried in different censuses and at each census we have endeavoured to improve on the basis of experience of short comings of previous definitions. The aim is to get as realistic a picture as possible keeping comparability with data of previous censuses for enabling study of changes over time and space.

4.1 In 1981 Census, the work concept of 1961 and 1971 as opposed to the income concept of 1951 and earlier censuses has been adopted. But the questions are different and the criterion for classification of persons as workers is changed. In the 1961 and 1971 different approaches, namely, usual status and current status, were adopted. While in 1961 reference period was of one year and one fortnight respectively for seasonal and for regular (non-seasonal) work, in 1971 those were one year and one week respectively. In 1981 Census the usual status approach is adopted uniformly for all workers.

To make the changes in concept through the last three decades a bit more clear, we can say that

(a) In 1961 a person qualified as a worker if he had worked regularly during the last season or if he had worked at least for a day in regular (non-seasonal) work during the preceding fortnight.

(b) In 1971 Census a person was treated as a worker only if he spent his time mainly in work or if he worked at least for a day in regular (non-seasonal) work during the preceding week.

(c) The dichotomy of worker/non-worker of 1961 and 1971 Census is discarded at the 1981 census and instead a trichotomy is adopted. The three categories into which individuals will be classified on the basis of data of this census are :—

(i) Main workers who worked for the major part of the year i.e. at least 183 days.

(ii) Marginal workers who worked for some time during the last year but not for the major part.

(iii) Non-workers who had never worked during the last year.

Obviously, this has been done keeping one eye on the necessity of comparability over time and the other eye on the necessity of getting as realistic a picture as possible.

The definitions adopted in 1951 and earlier censuses, when income was taken as the

criterion for classification, are given below for information of the reader.

1951 Census : Every one was indentified as 'self supporting person' or 'dependent' and dependents were sub-classified as 'earning dependent' or 'non-earning dependent'.

The criterion for being treated as self supporting was receipt of an income sufficient at least for his own maintenance.

1941 Census : Every person was labelled either as 'independent worker' or a 'partly dependent worker' or as 'wholly dependent'.

A worker who contributed in cash or kind towards the support of the household without being definitely capable of supporting himself was treated as partly dependent.

1931 Census : Population was divided into the following three classes :—

(i) 'Earner'—an individual with permanent and regular work for which return was obtained in cash or in kind.

(ii) 'Working dependent'—a person who assisted with work of the family and contributed to its support without actually earning any wage.

(iii) 'Non-working dependent'—was one who did not work or had no occupation.

1921, 1911 and 1901 : Persons were treated as 'Actual Workers' or 'dependents'.

Actual worker group included all persons who did work or carried on business and those who lived on house rent, pension etc.

4.2 At this census every person was asked if he worked any time at all last year and if his answer was in the affirmative it was ascertained whether he worked for the major part of the last year. Those who have worked for the major part of the last year have been taken as main workers and district-wise distribution of these persons is given as Supplement Table-4.

Out of the total of 606,153 main workers, 515,746 are males and 90,407 are females. In terms of percentage we can say that about 85.09 per cent are males and the rest are females. In 1971 these percentages were 91.56 and 8.44 respectively. Percentage of female workers in 1981 has increased in comparison to that of 1971 census.

The overall crude participation rate in regular work (main worker) recorded in 1981 census is 29.61 and is higher than that recorded in 1971, when it was 27.79. These rates

are termed 'crude' because the denominator of the quotient contains the total population including children under 15 and old people above 60 years of age. More refined rates will be available at a later stage after getting age-distribution of workers.

The growth of overall participation rate during the intercensal period (1971-81) is 6.55 per cent when we look at the differential by sex, we see that while the percentage of main workers among males has gone down from 49.43 to 49.06, the same for females has gone up from 4.83 to 9.08. The rate of growth of participation rate for males is $\frac{(49.06-49.43)}{49.43} \times 100 = -0.75\%$ and the

same for females is $\frac{(9.08-4.83)}{4.83} \times 100 = 87.99\%$

Overall participation rate as well as the same for each sex separately, is highest for South Tripura, with North Tripura and West Tripura district coming respectively in second and third position.

4.3 Supplement Table-5 presents data on distribution of Main Workers by Cultivators, Agricultural Labourers, Household Industry and Other workers. The data has been obtained from replies to a economic question in which every one was asked to declare his main activity last year. Out of 606,153 Main Workers of the State; 264,094 have been recorded as Cultivators, 144,910 have been recorded as Agricultural Labourers, 9,836 have been reported to be working in Household Industry and the remaining 187,313 have been shown as 'Other workers'.

In terms of percentage we can say that 43.57% are Cultivators, 23.91% are Agricultural labourers, 1.62% are in Household Industry and 30.90% are 'Other Workers'. In 1971 these percentages were respectively 54.41, 19.96, 1.40 and 24.23. The decline in percentage of cultivators and a shift from cultivation to agricultural labour for the State as a whole as well as in almost all the districts is at once apparent. An increase in percentage of 'Other Workers' is also apparent, particularly in West Tripura and North Tripura districts. North Tripura data tempts one to say that the shift of cultivators is not to agricultural labour but to 'Other Workers'.

4.4 While the concept of work in 1961, 1971 and 1981 varied, we expect that main

workers of 1981 will correspond to workers of 1971. In Primary census Abstract-Part-II, provisional data on marginal workers are available, but its classification by type of activity is yet to be obtained. In absence of that data we can not get sector-wise corresponding figures for 1961 and 1981 because 'workers' of 1961 is expected to correspond to the 'main workers and marginal workers' of 1981.

Nevertheless, under certain broad assumptions, we can consider that combined percentage of cultivators and agricultural labourers (in case of 1981 census, percentage among main workers) reflect the true picture in each census and data for different censuses are comparable so far as the combined percentage is concerned. Under this assumption we may try to get a picture for Tripura at different points of time and the same is presented in the statement below :

1951 and 1961 censuses recorded similar percentages of workers in agriculture sector while 1971 showed an increase and the 1981 census has shown a decline. The decrease in the percentage of cultivators is steady from 1961 and the increase in the 1951-1961 decade is perhaps due to the very well known difficulty of that census in carrying the relevant concept to field in time and subsequent edit instructions favouring an over-estimation of cultivators.

4.5 A picture of increase in absolute number of cultivators and Agricultural labourers is given below.

The table speaks for itself. The only explanation that may be necessary is for the very high variation during 1951-61 decade and the corresponding low variation in 1961-71 decade. These fluctuations may again be attributed to the special circumstances of 1961 Census when edit instructions were to the effect that 'where economic activity was recorded against cultivation, agricultural labour and household industry and if there was no indication of which among them formed the main activity, cultivation should be treated as the main activity.'

4.6 Final figures can be compiled only after editing and matching of the data collected, and this will take a few more months. At this stage, some basic information of Primary Census Abstract, which is an adjunct of the A. Series—General Population Table, have been presented separately for each Development block and Town.

Primary Census Abstract-Part I table contains information on area, population, density, sex-ratio, growth rate and literacy; while Part II table contains information on workers and non-workers.

Due to the very provisional nature of the data of these Abstracts we refrain from making any attempt at intra-district or inter sub-division comparison. However, an attempt may be taken to bring out briefly the broad Rural-Urban differential in economic characteristics since the same for other socio-cultural characteristics have already been discussed earlier.

In urban areas 26.66 per cent of total population are main workers while in rural areas the percentage is higher at 29.97. The percentage is higher in rural areas separately for each sex. The picture was similar in 1971 also when 28.20 per cent of rural people and 24.25 per cent of urban people were found as workers.
