

N. B. In this Chart the population of Mylliem C.D. Block has been shown as 54,612. However, since, Nongthymmai, Mawlai, Pynthor Umkhrah and Madan Rting are not notified towns, they continue to be part of Mylliem C.D. Block from the operational point of view of C.D. Blocks, though these four towns constitute the components of Shillong Urban Agglomeration. If the population of these four towns are added, Mylliem Block will have a population of 1,12,950.

INTRODUCTION

The provisional population totals of Meghalaya was released on the 23rd March 1981 with the release of Paper I of 1981-"Provisional Population Totals - Series 14, Meghalaya". The object of bringing out the booklet was to meet public curiosity and the need of scholars, administrators and planners to know the decadal increase in population, density per Sq. Km., sex ratio and increase in literacy rates etc. For obvious reasons we could not present data beyond the State and district level.

In this paper, which is being brought out as Supplement to Paper I of 1981, an effort has been made to present the data upto the Community Development Block and individual town level. A set of tables giving the total population, male and female break-up, literacy, sex ratio and decadal growth rate for each district, C.D. Block-wise is presented as a supplement to Table I of Paper I of 1981.

Statement 1 gives decadal variation of population with sex ratio since 1901. Statement 2 gives state, district and C.D. Blockwise distribution of population, decadal variation (1971-81), growth rate and sex ratio. Statement 3 gives state, district and C.D. Blockwise distribution of literate persons and percentage to total population. Statement 4 gives districtwise distribution and proportion of main workers, marginal workers and nonworkers to the total population in 1981, Statement 5 gives the percentage of different categories of main workers to total population. The absolute figures of Statement 5 can be seen at Table 5.

In Table 1 of this paper the "Rural and Urban" composition of population is indicated. Against six towns in 1971, there are 12 towns in 1981. The urban population increased from 1,47,170 in 1971 to 2,39,501 in 1981, the percentage of growth during the decade being 62.74%. Rural population also increased from 8,64,529 in 1971 to 10,88,842 in 1981, the percentage of decadal increase being 25.95%. The percentage of urban population to rural population also increased

from 14.55% in 1971 to 18.05% in 1981. In Table 2 the district-wise population and growth rate of cities, urban agglomeration and towns have been presented. Table 3 presents the population size and classification of towns. In Table 4, the distribution of population into main workers, marginal workers and non-workers and in Table 5 distribution of workers into different categories like Agricultural labourer, engaged in cultivator, household industry and other workers is shown. In addition to Table 3, 4 and 5 an all India table showing urban population in States and Union Territories is presented. Thereafter the Primary Census Abstracts in two tables is presented. In addition to these another table showing the district-C.D. Blockwise and townwise disabled population by the type of disability, for Meghalaya is included. The data relating to disabled persons was collected during the houselisting operations in September - October 1980 and considering the urgency for planning for these unfortunate group of persons, the data is presented here in advance.

It may be mentioned that the data presented is still provisional.

It has already been briefly mentioned in the background note of Paper I that Meghalaya State has undergone lots of administrative changes of wide ranging nature. In 1971, when the population count was taken, Meghalaya was a Sub-State within the State of Assam. It had two districts, namely, United Khasi & Jaintia Hills and Garo Hills Districts. With the re-organisation of the north-eastern States, Meghalaya was also constituted into a full fledged State and was inaugurated on the 21st of January, 1972. With the attainment of full-fledged statehood, erstwhile Jowai Subdivision of the U.K. & J. Hills district was upgraded to a district with Headquarters at Jowai in 1972. For comparability's sake, the population of 1971 and 1981 is shown against the two districts that existed in 1971 in the following table.

In 1976, Government of Meghalaya vide Notification No. HPL/399/75-140 dated 9th October, 1976 divided Khasi Hills and Garo Hills into two districts each and the name of the districts were re-designated as East Khasi Hills district with headquarters at Shillong, West Khasi Hills District with headquarters at Nongstoin, East Garo Hills District with headquarters at Williamnagar, West Garo Hills District with Headquarters at Tura respectively. Subsequent to the re-organisation of the districts, four subdivisions viz., Jaintia Border Subdivision (re-named Amlarem) in Jaintia Hills district with temporary headquarters at Jowai, Ribhoi Subdivision consisting of Nongpoh Police Station area with headquarters at Nongpoh in East Khasi Hills District, Mairang Subdivision with that portion of Mairang C.D. Block which falls in West Khasi Hills District with headquarters at Mairang and Baghmara Subdivision in West Garo Hills District covering Dambuk-Aga and Chokpot C.D. Block were created. For administrative convenience and in order to bring the administration nearer to the people, six more administrative units were also created namely Khliehriat comprising of Khliehriat Development Block Area in Jaintia Hills District, Sohra Administrative Unit comprising the whole of Shella-Bholaganj Development Block, parts of Pynursla and parts of Mawsynram Development Block in East Khasi Hills District, Mawkyrwat comprising the Mawkyrwat Development Block in West Khasi Hills District, Resubelpara Administrative unit comprising the 7 Gram Sevak Circles of Resubelpara Development Block and part of Dambo-Rongjeng Community Development Block in East Garo Hills district; Dadenggiri Administrative unit comprising of three Gram

Sevak circles of Resubelpara, Dadenggiri C.D. Block and Selsella C.D. Block and Betasing Administrative unit comprising the area falling in Zikzak and Betasing C.D. Blocks in West Garo Hills District. In view of these administrative changes after the 1971 Census, the question of determining the unit below the district level for 1981 Census became very important. In 1971, Census was taken on the basis of Police Station area in the United Khasi and Jaintia Hills District and on the basis of Mouza area in Garo Hills District. As a result of the administrative changes introduced subsequently, the Police Station areas in the United Khasi and Jaintia Hills District were also re-organised and were distributed between three districts namely Jaintia Hills District, East Khasi Hills district and West Khasi Hills District. Similarly, as a result of the re-organisation of Garo Hills into East and West Garo Hills district, the Mouza areas were distributed partly in West Garo Hills district and partly in East Garo Hills District. Consequently, the data generated in 1971 Census came to have lesser relevance to the realities of the situation.

In order to take a final view a meeting of the Deputy Commissioners and Secretaries of the concerned departments were held in October 6, 1979 with the Commissioner of Divisions in the Chair and inaugurated by the Chief Secretary to the Government of Meghalaya. It was felt in that Conference that since all developmental planning is based on the Community Development Block, in 1981 Census, it would be desirable to take the census on the basis of the Community Development Block areas. After the 1971 Census the Deputy Commissioners of Garo Hills and Khasi

Hills have also suggested making the C.D. Block jurisdiction as the basis of Census division. At that point of time Meghalaya had 24 C.D. Block which are listed below:—

- 1. Laskein C.D. Block, Jaintia Hills.
- 2. Khliehriat C.D. Block, Jaintia Hills.
- 3. Thadlaskein C.D. Block, Jaintia Hills.
- 4. Bhoi Area C.D. Block, East Khasi Hills.
- 5. Mawryngkneng C.D. Block, East Khasi Hills.
- 6. Mylliem C.D. Block, East Khasi Hills.
- 7. Mawphlang C.D. Block, East Khasi Hills.
- 8. Pynursla C.D. Block, East Khasi Hills.
- 9. Shella Bholaganj C.D.Block, East Khasi Hills.
- 10. Mawsynram C.D. Block, East Khasi Hills.
- 11. Mairang C.D. Block, West Khasi Hills.
- 12. Mawkyrwat C.D. Block, West Khasi Hills.
- 13. Nongstoin C.D. Block, West Khasi Hills.
- 14. Resubelpara C.D. Block, East Garo Hills.
- 15. Dambu Rongjeng C.D. Block, East Garo Hills
- 16. Songsak Development Block, East Garo Hills.
- 17. Dadenggiri C.D. Block, West Garo Hills.
- 18. Selsella C.D. Block, West Garo Hills.
- 19. Rongram C.D. Block, West Garo Hills.
- 20. Zikzak C.D. Block, West Garo Hills.
- 21. Dalu C.D. Block, West Garo Hills.
- 22. Chokpot C.D. Block, West Garo Hills.
- 23. Dambuk Aga C.D. Block, West Garo Hills.
- 24. Betasing C.D. Block, West Garo Hills.

But certain difficulties cropped up in practical implementation of this decision. Firstly, while reorganising the districts, it appears that C.D. Block areas were not kept intact. For example, almost half of Mairang Development Block fall in East Khasi Hills District and the remaining in West Khasi Hills District. Similarly, certain areas falling in Mawsynram Development Block and Mawphlang Development Block in East Khasi Hills district, were found within the boundaries of West Khasi Hills District. In Garo Hills also three Gram Sevak Circles of Resubelpara Develop-ment Block fall in West Garo Hills District while remaining seven Gram Sevak Circles fall in East Garo Hills District. Again in the re-organisation of the districts, Mouza V of Garo Hills District was tagged to West Garo Hills District whereas the major portion of Mouza V fall very much within East Garo Hills District. Therefore the contiguity in terms of District boundaries was not maintained. This was brought to the notice of the Government and was requested to rectify these anomalies before the time limit set by the Government of India for bringing about changes in the administrative boundaries. Consequent on this, Nongspung areas of West Khasi Hills District falling in Mawsynram C.D. Block in East Khasi Hills District, some portions of Sohiong Lyngdohship which fall in West Khasi Hills district, but come within the purview of Mawphlang C.D. Block in East Khasi Hills District were transferred to East Khasi Hills District in the interest of administrative convenience and as a purely temporary measure. Similarly 68 villages of Mouza V, which were parts of west Garo transferred to East Garo Hills district were Notification No. HPL. 399/75 vide dated 11th October 1979. This partially rectified some of the anomalies that existed in the district boundaries. However 61 villages of Mairang Development Block and 100 villages of Resubelpara Development Block continue to be in East Khasi Hills district and in West Garo Hills District respectively. As a result, instead of 24 C.D. Blocks in Meghalaya, for practical convenience, Mairang East and Resubelpara West portions were also treated as C.D. Blocks from the operational point of view. Nongstoin-Sunapahar is the biggest C.D. Block in the State and because of the lack of infra-structural facilities and difficult terrain, it was thought that a single officer would not be able to effectively supervise the census taking in the area. Therefore, Nongstoin-Sunapahar C.D. Block was divided into three charges namely, Sonapahar, Nongstoin and Khonjoy. Similarly, considering the difficult terrain, Mawkyrwat Development Block area was also divided into two charges - Mawkyrwat Administrative unit and Mawkyrwat C.D. Block. Since Amlarem Subdivision though falling in Thadlaskein Development Block is an independent subdivision, it was also treated as a separate charge. As a result, finally we had 31 rural charges, 16 urban charges and 15 special charges.

Although the Government of India had impressed upon the State Governments the necessity of completing the changes in the administrative boundaries much before the actual preparation for census taking started and fixed the target date on 1st Oct. 1979 yet the State Government decided to re-organise the C.D. Block boundaries and vide Notification No. CDD. 53/77/309 dated 5th Oct. 1980, created six additional C.D. Blocks from the existing 24 C.D. Blocks. To meet this situation we have treated four of the proposed new C.D. Blocks as separate charges and in this category Mawshynrut (Sonapahar), Samanda Amlarem, and Rongara were included. The six new C.D. Blocks which the State Government created with effect from 2.10. 1980 were Amlarem Subdivision of Thadlaskein Block in Jaintia Hills district; Mawkynrew C.D. Block by carving out 14 villages of Mawryngkneng C.D. Block and 55 villages of Pynursla C.D. Block; Nongpoh C.D. Block by carving out 174 villages of Bhoi area Development Block and 61 villages of Mairang Development Block which falls in East Khasi Hills district; Samanda Development Block by carving out the lower portion of Songsak Development Block in East Garo Hills district and Rongara Development Block consisting of the area falling east of Simsang river in Dambuk Aga Development block of West Garo Hills District; Mawshynrut (Sonapahar) Development Block by carving out 220 villages of Nongstoin-Sonapahar Development Block in West Khasi Hills District. While at the

time of houselisting and actual enumeration, we had treated Amlarem, Sonapahar, Samanda and Rongara Development Blocks as separate charges, there was some difficulties in treating Nongpoh and Mawkynrew Development Blocks into separate charges. The data that has been presented for the 30 C.D. Blocks including the ones last mentioned have been generated from the Primary Census Abstract of the Supplement Tables. The extra effort to generate this data for the 30 C.D. Blocks after release of the Paper I of 1981 Census-Provisional Totals, has necessitated some amount of delay in bringing out the Supplement to Paper I. But all these has been done with a view to making Census data in Supplement Tables more useful to Planners, Administrators and academicians.

TABLE 1

RURAL AND URBAN COMPOSITION

The definition of 'urban area' which was adopted in 1971 was followed in 1981 also. Accordingly—

- (i) All places with a Municipality Corporation or Cantonment or notified Town Committee:
- (ii) All other places which has (a) a minimum population of 5000, (b) at least 75% of its male working population is engaged in non-agricultural pursuits, (c) and has a density of population of at least 400 persons per Square Km.

Adopting the above definition of Urban area, the rural-urban composition of population in the State is presented in Table 1. It may be mentioned here that in 1971, there were six towns namely—(1) Shillong Municipality (87,659), (2) Shillong Cantonment (4,730), (3) Mawlai (14,260), (4) Nongthymmai (16,103), (5) Jowai (8929), (6) Tura (15,489).

In 1981, six more towns were added to the 1971 list. They are—(1) Madanrting (6160), (2) Pynthor Umkhrah (10,735), (3) Cherrapunjee (6104), (4) Nongstoin (3876), (5) Williamnagar (4290) and (6) Baghmara (4128). It will be seen that, of the new towns, Madanrting and Pynthorumkhrah (Pynthorbah & Nongkhardot) were rural components of Standard Urban Area of Shillong in 1971. Although the local people and the administration wanted that Cherrapunjee should be replaced by 'Sohra' the name "Cherrapunjee" had been retained because of historical reasons and also because the place has become famous by that name.

In 1971 Census, Meghalaya had two districts, viz., United Khasi and Jaintia Hills and Garo Hills Districts. With the inauguration of Meghalaya State, Jowai Subdivision of the United Khasi and Jaintia Hills District was upgraded to a district in 1972. Subsequently, in 1976 Khasi Hills District and Garo Hills Districts were also divided into East and West Khasi Hills districts and West Garo Hills and East Garo Hills Districts respectively with headquarters at Shillong, Nongstoin, Tura and Williamnagar. The district headquarters of West Khasi Hills and East Garo Hills have been treated as towns in the census parlance.

Though Nongstoin and Williamnagar do not qualify to be treated as Towns by strict application of the definition of urban area, we have treated them as towns because normally all district headquarters should be treated as towns Baghmara has been treated as a town because it is a notified town area and there is a statutory town. Committee. In case of Tura Town also some

explanation is called for. In 1971 Census, the area which was originally notified as Tura town committee area vide No. TAD/LF/50/26 dt. 7.9.51 was treated as Tura town. However, the Garo Hills autonomous District Council amended the original notification No. GDC/TC/13/811 dt. 5.4.71 and included certain areas in the town committee area. These new areas were not included in the maps and population figures published for Tura town. In 1979, the Government of Meghalaya issued a notification No. MUN. 67/74/130 dt. 13.8.79 constituting a Municipality in Tura Town and included 11 villages (which were outside the Tura Town Committee area) in Tura Town. As such the population of the town shows an extraordinary increase from 15,489 in 1971 to 35,131 in 1981.

In 1971 the urban population is 1,47,170 in the State. In 1981 the urban population is 2,39,501 giving an absolute increase of 92,331 over the decade and the percentage of growth is 62.74%. The rural population has also increased from 8,64,529 in 1971 to 10,88,842 in 1981. In absolute terms the increase is by 2,24,313 persons and the percentage of urban population to total population also increased from 14.55% in 1971 to 18.05% in 1981.

The districtwise analysis is as follows:-

- 1. Jowai town in Jaintia Hills has shown an increase of 3,979 persons over the decade from 8,929 in 1971 to 12,908 in 1981. The decadal growth rate being 44.56% compared to 44.09% in 1961-71.
- 2. In East Khasi Hills, the urban population shot up from 1,22,752 in 1971 to 1,79,168 in 1981. The decadal variation is 56,416 and the rate of decadal variation is 45.95% compared to 19.88% of 1961-71. This abnormal increase is due to addition of 3 new towns, viz., Madanrting, Pynthor Umkhrah and Cherrapunjee. For comparability's sake, if we take the population of Shillong Municipality, Cantonment, Mawlai & Nongthymmai the increase is only 33,490 persons and decadal rate of growth is 27.28%.


In West Garo Hills the urban population is more than double of 1971. The reasons have been partly explained in the beginning. In 1971 it had only one town having a population of 15,489. In 1981 apart from the enlarging of the town area of Tura, a new place-Baghmara has been treated as a town because it has a statutory Town Committee to manage the internal affairs of the Town. This accounts for the abnormal increase in the urban population in West Garo Hills District.

Meghalaya occupies 13th place in the country. Considering that the 14th and 15th place was occupied by the State in the all-India gradation of States according to the urban population in 1961 and 1971 Census respectively, it appears that the process of urbanisation in Meghalaya is slow. However the percentage of urban population to the total population has shown some appreciable increase from 12.48% in 1961 and 13.02% in 1971 to 18.03% in 1981.

As has already been mentioned in Table 1, in Census parlance, a place qualifies to be treated as town if it has a Municipality/Cantonment, a town committee or a local Statutory authority to administer the place and also any of the characteristics namely a population of not less than 4000, density of population of not less than 400 per sq. Km; and 75% of the male working population is non-agricultural.

The concept of Urban Agglomeration adopted for the first time in 1971 Census was an improvement on the concept of Town Group adopted in 1961 Census. The concept of urban agglomeration which was adopted in 1971 has been followed in 1981 Census also. There are different situations in which urban agglomeration are constituted (i) A city or a town with a continuous out-growth (the part of growth being out-side the statutory limits but falling within the boundaries of the adjoining village or villages), (ii) two or more adjoining towns with their out growths as in (i) above, and (iii) a city and one or more adjoining towns with their out-growths which form a continuous urban spread. In case of Shillong Urban Agglomeration, Shillong Municipality constitutes the core city and the adjoining five towns viz., Shillong Cantonment, Mawlai, Nongthymmai, Madan Rting and Pynthor Umkhrah constitutes the towns forming a continuous urban spread. In Table 2 the population of towns in the State has been shown districtwise and classwise. Towns are divided into the following six classes according to population.

Class I—a population of 1,00,000 and above. Class II—a population of 50,000 to 99,999. Class III—a population of 20,000 to 49,999 Class IV—a population of 10,000 to 19,999. Class V—a population of 5,000 to 9,999.

and Class VI-any town having less than 5000 population. In 1971, Meghalaya did not have even a single town which qualified to be treated as a city although Urban Agglomeration having a population of 1,22,762 qualified to be treated as a city. In 1981, for the first time Shillong Muni-

cipality, in its own right qualifies to be treated as a city having a population of 1,07,673. However, since Shillong Municipality is a part of the Shillong Urban Agglomeration, the entire Shillong Urban Agglomeration has been treated as a Class I city. There is no Class II towns in the State. The second town in terms of population is Tura in West Garo Hills District which qualifies to be treated as a Class III town. Jowai Town with a population of 12,908 qualifies to be treated as a Class IV town which was a Class V town in 1971. Cherrapunjee with a population of 6,104 qualifies to be treated as a Class V town and the remaining towns viz., Williamnagar, Baghmara and Nongstoin are treated as Class VI towns. It has already been mentioned that Pynthor-Umkhrah, Madan Rting in Shillong Urban Agglomeration, Williamnagar, Baghmara, Nongstoin and Cherrapunjee are treated as towns for the first time in 1981. While Shillong Urban Agglomeration as such shows an appreciable increase from 19.88% in 1961-71 to 40.99% in 1971-81, yet Mawlai, Nongthymmai and Shillong Cantonment has shown a decrease in the growth-rate in 1971-81. The decadal growth rate of Jowai Town which was 44.09 % in 1961-71 has registered a slight increase in 1971-81 (45.56%). In case of Tura Town the phenomenal increase in the decadal growth-rate is due to the enlargement of Tura Town Committee area by the addition of 11 villages viz., (1) Sangsanggiri (2) Chunmati, (3) Songgitalgiri, (4) Reservegittim, (5) Dakopgiri, (6) Matchakholgiri, (7) Chiranggiri, (8) Migonggiri (9) Chasanggiri Poultry Farm, (10) Boldorenggiri and (11) Rongkhon, by the Government vide their notification No. MUN, 67/74/98 dated 8th June, 1978.

It will also be observed that the lion's share of actual increase in urban population has been cornered by Class I town-Shillong Urban Agglomeration. Out of a total increase of 92,331 urban population, Shillong Urban Agglomeration alone accounts for 50,312 with six towns. For comparability's sake if we take the population of six towns which existed in 1971, then the increase in absolute terms is 57,038 and percentage of growth being 38.76.

In this table, the towns in the State has been arranged in descending order of population size. Shillong Urban Agglomeration having Shillong Municipality as core city and five adjoining towns of Shillong Cantonment, Mawlai, Nongthymmai, Madanrting and Pynthor-Umkhrah has been treated as the city and class I town. The other towns in descending order are Tura, Jowai, Cherrapunjee classed as III, IV, and V respectively. Williamnagar, Baghmara and Nongstoin are clubbed together as Class VI.

Compared to 1971, the proportion in size to total urban population has fallen in 1981 which is mainly due to addition of six more new towns. Tura town has shown an extra-ordinary increase because of the enlargement of town committee area while constituting the Tura Municipality.

Since Cherrapunjee, Williamnagar, Baghmara and Nongstoin are new towns treated as such for the first time in 1981 decadal growth rate has not been indicated.

However, if we take into consideration the population of the villages which now constitute these new towns and compare them with the 1971 population, it will throw sufficient light on growth rate of each individual town.

- 1. Madarting: (6/2/685). of 1971 had a popution of 3013 of which 1569 were males and 1444 were females. In 1981, the population of the town rose to 6160 of which 3158 are males and 3002 are females. The decadal growth rate is 104.45%. Expansion of the town, growth of institutions and new settlers in the area are the possible reasons for the extra-ordinary increase.
- 2. Pynthor Umkhrah: consists of Pynthorbah (6/2/756) and Nongkhardot (6/2/757) of 1971. In 1971, the population of Pynthorbah was 1,666 of which 945 were males and 721 were females and that of Nongkhardot was 3937 of which 2161 were males and 1776 were females. Thus the total population of these two villages in 1971 was 5603 of which 3106 were males and 2497 were females. Compared to this the population of Pynthor Umkhrah in 1981 is 10,735 of which 5748 are males and 4987 are females. The decadal growth rate is 91.59%. Expansion urban facilities have induced more and more people to settle in this area making it a residential area.

3. Cherrapunjee (Sohra):

Cherrapunjee, with 400 inches of annual rainfall is considered one of the heaviest rainfall areas in the world is being treated as a town for the first time in 1981. In 1971, the constituent villages were treated as independent villages and as such the very word 'Cherrapunjee' disappeared in the census reports. The local people call Cherrapunjee as Sohra and the Government of Meghalaya have also named the administrative unit formed around Cherrapunjee as "Sohra Administrative unit". However from historical reasons and since the place is world famous as 'Cherrapunjee' a marriage of convenience has been adopted and the town named as Cherrapunjee (Sohra). In 1971, the following villages were mentioned as collectively known as 'Cherrapunjee'.

In 1981, Sder-Kariah, Nongrim and Mawpunkyrtiang have been added to the villages that existed in 1971 while constituting the town. Though very near, the Mawmluh-Cherra Cement factory, staff quarter of the factory, PHE and MSEB have not been included in the town because they do not constitute a continuous urban spread. The population of Cherrapunjee is 6104 in 1981 of which 3071 are males and 3033 are females. The percentage of increase in population is 24.52%.

4. Nongstoin:

Nongstoin, the district headquarters of West Khasi Hills came into existence since 1976. The administrative buildings spread between Nongstoin village (6/2/216) and Pyndengrei (6/2/209) of 1971 Census. The total population of the villages now included in Nongstoin town was 1737 in 1971. The present population is 3876. The decadal

growth rate is 123.14% and in absolute terms 2139 persons.

5. Williamnagar:

Williamnagar, the headquarters of the East Garo Hills district is composed of Kusimkolgiri (5/4/338), Kolmesolgiri (5/4/339), Simsanggiri (5/4/353) of 1971 and two new villages, namely Ampangdamgiri and Warimagiri. The population of the first three villages in 1971 was 485. With the establishment of district headquarters, the

population of Williamnagar is 4290 in 1981.

6. Baghmara:

Baghmara was constituted a town committee by the Garo Hills District Council vide GDC-G/ BR/B-Town Committee/69/2377 dated 19.11.74 which was modified vide their Notification No. GDC-G/BR/B-Town Committee/69/236 dated 21.3.75. As per this notification, the following villages fall within the ambit of the Town Committee area in 1971 Census.

In Table 4 we present the total population of the State and for each district; its break-up into male and female; number of main workers, (Male and Female) and the percentage of main workers to the total population for 1971 and 1981.

As in previous censuses, in 1981 also economic questions were canvassed. People were classified as workers and non-workers. Workers have been divided into four broad categories in 1981 (i.e. C/AL/HHI/OW) whereas in 1971 workers were divided into 9 categories. In 1981 also all the categories of workers of 1971 have been covered under 'Other Workers' which are (a) Livestock, Forestry, Fishing, Hunting, Plantations, Orchards and allied activities; (b) Mining and Quarrying, (c) Manufacturing, Processing, Servicing and Repairs carried out otherwise than as Household Industries; (d) Construction (e) Trade and Commerce; (f) Transport, Storage and Communications and

(f) Transport, Storage and Communications and (g) Other Services.

A worker is defined as a person who participate in any economically productive activity. Such participation may be physical or mental in nature. Work involves not only actual work but also effective supervision and direction of work. From this definition, the difference between the concept of a worker accepted in 1971 and that of 1981 is not easily discernible. But taking into consideration the reference period, the concept of a worker in 1981 Census slightly differs from that of 1971. In 1971, a person was categorised as a worker even if such a person's contribution to work was extremely marginal. In case of regular employment in any trade, profession, services, business or commerce, a person was considered as a worker if he was employed during one week preceding the day on which he was enumerated. In case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, etc., if a person puts in an hour's work a day during the major part of the working season, such a person was considered basically and economically an active worker. In 1981 the reference period is one year preceding to the date of enumeration. Certain types of work such as agriculture, household industry like gur-making etc., are carried out through-out the year or only in a certain season or part of the year depending on local circumstances. In such cases we took the broad time-span of the agricultural seasons preceding the enumeration.

The economic questions, however, are different in the 1981 Census. The 'work' concept of 1961

and 1971 Censuses, as opposed to the 'income' or 'economic independence' concept of the earlier censuses is adopted for 1981 Census. But, the criterion for classification of persons as workers is changed. While in the 1961 and 1971 Censuses different approaches, namely, usual status and current status, were adopted with reference period of one year and one week for seasonal and for regular work respectively, at the 1981 Census the usual status approach is adopted uniformly for all work. In the 1961 and 1971 Censuses classification as worker or non-worker was made through different criteria. In 1961 a person qualified as a worker if he had worked regularly during the last season or if he had worked at least for a day in regular (non-seasonal) work during the preceding fortnight. At the 1971 Census a person was treated as a worker only if he spent his time mainly in work or he worked at least for a day in regular (non-seasonal) work during the preceding week. The dichotomy of worker/non-worker of 1961 and 1971 Censuses is discarded at the 1981 Census and instead a trichotomy as main workers, marginal workers and non-workers is adopted. For main worker the time criterion of engagement in work for the major part of the year, i.e. at least 183 days is adopted while those who worked for some time during the last year but not for the major part are treated as marginal workers. Those who had never worked during the last year are non-This trichotomy partially permits a comparability of 1981 Census economic data with that of 1971 as well as 1961. The main workers of 1981 Census can be expected to correspond to the workers of 1971 and the main workers and marginal workers of 1981 together to correspond to the workers of 1961.

These questions were canvassed in Q. 14A to 15B of the Individual Slip. While deciding whether a person is a worker or not, certain important points were kept in mind and they are—(1) a person who normally works but has been absent from work during the reference period on account of illness, holiday, temporary closure, strike etc., was treated as engaged in work. (2) Persons under training such as apprentices with or without stipends or wages were treated as workers. (3) A person who is merely been offered work but has not actually joined yet was treated as a nonworker. (4) A man or woman who is engaged primarily in household duties such as cooking for any household or a boy or girl who is primarily a student even if such person helps in the family's

economic activity, if he or she is not a full-time worker was treated as a non-worker. (5) If a person is primarily engaged in some primary economic activity in the major part of the year, but also attends to some household chores, he is categorised as a worker. (6) Pensioners and persons who receive rent as their source of livelihood were treated as non-workers. (7) A woman who is engaged in household duties but is also doing some economically productive work like rice pounding for sale or domestic service for wages etc., was treated as a worker. (8) Full time public or Social Service worker who is actively engaged in public service activity or full time political workers like members of Parliament, State Legislature, local authorities etc., were also treated as workers. Against the total number of 446,828 workers in 1971, the total number of workers in 1981 stands at 587,158. The increase in absolute terms is 140,330 during the decade and the percentage of increase works out to 31.41%. In 1971, the percentage of workers to total population was 44.17%.

In 1981 the same percentage is maintained. From the total of Table 4 it will appear that the percentage of workers to total population for each district both of males and females has maintained a uniform rate. There is no serious deviation from the rate of percentage for 1971. In some of the districts, e.g. East Khasi Hills District, West Khasi Hills District, the percentage of workers in 1981 slightly falls short of 1971. This might be because of the fact that in 1971 a worker meant any person who was in some economically productive activity even if it was for one week preceding the date of enumeration; whereas in 1981, the figure tabulated in Table 4 is of only those workers who have worked for the major part of the year i.e. for not less than 183 days of the year, and thus excludes the marginal workers. Jaintia Hills District, East Garo Hills District and West Garo Hills District have registered a slight increase in the percentage of workers to the total population in 1981 compared to 1971.



In this table an attempt has been made to present the distribution of workers into cultivators, Agricultural labourers, workers engaged in Household Industry and other workers. determining a worker, the procedure followed in 1981 was - each person was asked whether he had worked any time at all during the preceding year. If he said 'Yes' then he is a worker and if the answer was 'No' he would be a non-worker falling into any of the following categories-- (1) person engaged in Household duties, (2) Student, (3) Dependent, (4) Rentier or Retired person, (5) Beggar, (6) Member of an Institutional Household and (7) Others. If he is a worker - then it was ascertained whether he worked for the major part of last year. If the answer was 'Yes', then he was treated as a main-worker; if the answer was 'No' then the person was categorised as marginal worker. Thereafter the main worker was asked as to his main activity which could be Cultivator, Agricultural labourer, engaged in Household Industry and if he did not fall into any of the three he was classed as other worker.

Out of a total 5,87,158 workers, there are 3,73,180 cultivators constituting 63.60% of the working population. In the male-female break-up, the percentage of male cultivators is 59.08% and that of females is 70.67%. Therefore the major portion of female workers seem to be engaged in Cultivation. Compared to the percentage of cultivators to total workers in 1971 there is an uniform fall in 1981. Though there is no change in the scope of the word 'Cultivators' yet it appears that unlike in 1981, an illustrative list was not given in the instruction booklet in 1971. This may have resulted in the treating of those engaged in cultivators and hence the higher percentage of cultivators to total workers in 1971. The concept of 'cultivation' has been restricted to growth of

- (1) Cereal and millet crops like Paddy, wheat, Jowar, Bajra, Maize, Ragi, Barley, Gram, etc.
- (2) Pulses like Arhar, Moong, Masur, Urd, Khesari etc.
- (3) Fibre-crops like raw cotton, jute, mesta, sunhemp, etc.

- (4) Oil Seeds like sesamum, groundnut, rape, mustard, linseed, castor etc; and
- (5) Sugar cane among the cash-crops only.

Accordingly, rubber, coffee, tobacco, pepper, cardamon, cashewnut, bananas, grapes, orange, cinchona and medicinal plants, betel nuts, flowers, potato, tapioca, sweet potato, chillies & spices, vegetables, turmeric which are the major crops of Meghalaya has been excluded from the purview of the word 'cultivation'. This partly explains the uniform decrease in the percentage of cultivators in 1981 for all the district. In 1971 there were 3,08,978 cultivators of whom 1,76,144 were males and 1,32,834 were females.

Compared to 44,131 persons returning as Agricultural labourers in 1971 of whom 25,894 were males and 18,237 were females, there are 58,236 Agricultural labourers in 1981 of whom 33, 154 are males and 25,082 females. The increase in absolute terms is 14,105 persons, 7,260 males and 6,845 females over the decade. While there is a slight increase in the percentage of Agricultural labourers for the State, West Khasi Hills, East and West Garo Hills districts, there is a slight fall in Jaintia Hills & East Khasi Hills districts.

The number of persons engaged in Household Industry is 6,403 of whom 3,278 are males and 3,125 are females. There is no appreciable increase during the decade. Except for East Khasi Hills and East Garo Hills where some increase in percentage is shown and Jaintia Hills district where the percentage has fallen, the overall position remains almost same.

Against 88,845 persons classed as 'other workers' in 1971, there are 1,49,339 in 1981. The increase is 60,494 over the decade and the percentage of increase is 68.09. It will also appear that there is appreciable increase in the number of other workers for all the districts in 1981 as compared to 1971. Expansion of administrative organisation, industrialisation and expansion of development activities have also attracted a sizeable population of wage earners and this may have contributed to the increase in other workers category. Coal mining in the Bapung-Khliehriat area of Jaintia Hills may have also partly contributed to the extra-ordinary increase from 6% in 1971 to 20.61% in 1981 in that district.







APPENDIX — II

Ever since the creation of Meghalaya State, important administrative reorganisations have been effected from time to time. Jaintia Hills District was the first District to be carved out from the United Khasi and Jaintia Hills District in 1972 vide Notification No. HPL. 26/71/43 dated 21st Febuary 1972 and came into being on the 22nd Feb. 1972. In 1976, a wholesale administrative reorganisation was carried out in the State. Khasi Hills District was bifurcated into East and West Khasi Hills Districts vide Notification No. HPL. 49/76/171 dated 12th October, 1976 and the two districts came into being on the 28th day of October 1976. Similarly, the erstwhile Garo Hills District was also bifurcated to carve out East Garo Hills District and West Garo Hills District vide Government Notification No. HPL. 399/75/140 dated 9th October 1976 and the two districts came into being from the 22nd day of October 1976.

Besides the creation of the four districts, four subdivisions and six administrative units were also created with a view to bringing the administration nearer to the people. Jaintia Border Subdivision with temporary headquarters at Jowai was created vide notification No. HPL. 398/75/88 dated 9th November 1976 and came into existence on the 12th day of November 1976. Subsequently, the subdivision was re-named as Amlarem Subdivision with headquarters at Amlarem. Mairang Subdivision in the west Khasi Hills District with headquarters at Mairang was created vide Government Notification No. HPL. 49/76/193 dated 8th November 1976 and came into effect from 10th November 1976. The area of Mairang Subdivision was subsequently modified by temporarily transferring villages falling in Nongspung Syiemship and Sohiong Lyngdohship vide Government Notification No. HPL. 256/79/4 dated 6th October, 1979 to East Khasi Hills District. Baghmara Subdivision in West Garo Hills district was created vide Government Notification No. HPL. 399/75/ 157 dated 3rd December 1976 comprising the areas of Dambuk Aga and Chokpot Blocks and came into being on the 7th day of December 1976. Ri-bhoi Subdivision in East Khasi Hills District was created vide Notification No. HPL. 49/76/221 dated 3rd January, 1977 and came into being from the 5th January, 1977. The sixth administrative units came into existence from 14th August 1976. Khliehriat in Jaintia Hills District comprising the areas of Khliehriat C. D. Block was created vide Notification No. HPL. 398/75/63 dated 10th August, 1976. Sohra Administrative unit in East Khasi Hills district, comprising the whole of Shella Bholaganj C. D. Block and parts of Mawsynram and Pynursla Development Blocks created vide Notification No. HPL. 49/76/116 dated 10th August, 1976. Mawkyrwat Administrative unit in West Khasi Hills District comprising the major portion of Mawkyrwat C. D. Block and seven villages of Nolikata Circle of Mawsynram Block was created vide Notification No. HPL, 49/76/117 dated 10th August, 1976. Resubelpara Administrative unit in East Garo Hills District comprising Resubelpara Development Block and Kharkuta Assembly Constituency was created vide Notification No. HPL. 399/75/129 dated 10. 8. 1976. Dadenggiri Administrative unit comprising of Dadenggiri and Selsella Development Blocks was created vide Government Notification No. HPL. 399/75/127 dated 10th August 1976. Similarly Betasing Administrative unit in West Garo Hills Distirct comprising Betasing and Zikzak Community Development Blocks was created vide Notification No. HPL. 399/75/128 dated 10th August. 1976.




