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INTRODUCTION

On the 23rd March we had released Paper I of 1981 Census which gives the provisional population totals of the State and information upto the district level only. It contains information regarding the sex-wise total population of the State, growth rate, density of population by districts, decadal variations from 1901 onwards, district-wise percentages of literacy etc.

2. In the supplement to Paper I, which we are releasing right now, we intend to give detailed information at the tahsil level also. Apart from making information available upto tahsil level, the present publication covers much wider field of information like the population and growth of cities/urban agglomeration and towns of various classes in the State, distribution of population according to the size of the town, distribution of main workers by district and also the percentage of main workers to the total population. The main workers have been further split into their various working categories like cultivators, agricultural labourers, household industry and other workers by percentages as well as in absolute figures. In the Paper I, as already stated, we had given figures upto district level, in the present volume same figures will be available down to the tahsil/sub-tahsil level as given in Primary Census Abstract Part-I. In Primary Census Abstract part-II, the break-up of main workers into cultivators, agriculture labourers, household industries and other workers has been given at tahsil/sub-tahsil level and for each urban area separately.

This apart, sex-wise absolute figures of marginal workers and non-workers have also been given in this part separately for rural and urban areas.

3. For the first time after 1931, we have also provided the district and tahsil-wise break-up of the handicapped population in the State and also urban and rural break-up.

4. On this occasion, I would like to express my deep gratitude to Shri P. Padmanabha, Registrar General & Census Commissioner, India for his constant inspiration and guidance which has sustained us all through these massive operations. I am also extremely thankful to the State Government and in particular to Shri K. C. Pandeya, Chief Secretary to the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh and other senior officers of the State Government and field formations who extended their fullest co-operation to us as and when required to make this gigantic task a success. Finally, I shall be failing in my duty if I do not extend my warmest thanks to the Enumerators/Supervisors and also the staff of my own Directorate whose unstinted co-operation made the Census Operations of 1981 a booming success in the State.






COMPARATIVE AREA-DISTRICTS 1981




COMPARATIVE POPULATION - DISTRICTS
1981




DECADAL GROWTH OF POPULATION
1901-81





STATE AND DISTRICTS 1981






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
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**ANALYSIS
OF
THE
RESULTS**

India is the second largest country of the world in terms of the population. It accommodates 684 million people. In other words, India's population consists of 15.5 percent of the world population packed in the land area of 2.5 percent of the world. Himachal Pradesh, a constituent state of the Union of India, accommodates 0.62 percent of the country's population in the land area of 1.69 percent of the country. Apparently, it would appear that Himachal is comparatively in a better position as far the land-man ratio is concerned, but if we probe slightly deeper it is no way in a happy position due to its terraneous land. The rate of growth of population in Himachal Pradesh during seventies has been as high as 22.46 percent or a compound growth rate of 2.25 per annum as compared to the country's compound growth rate of 2.48 percent per annum.

2. The People's Republic of China, the largest populated country in the world has, perhaps, crossed a billion mark in 1980. Until recently China had the highest compound growth rate of 2.53 percent per annum which is even higher than India. Today, reliably it has been able to control growth rate at 1.6 percent per annum. Perhaps, their slogan of 'one child a couple programme' have borne fruits.

3. As already stated in Paper 1 the population of Himachal Pradesh has sprung up to 4.24 million in 1981 from 1.92 million in 1901, thereby registered a growth rate of 120.67 percent in 80 years. As the over-all population increased, density of population has also reached 76 persons per sq. km. compared to 35 persons per sq. km. in 1901. From 1901 to 1951 the density of population had been modest with 34 persons per sq. km. in 1911, 35 persons per sq. km. in 1921, 37 persons in 1931, 41 persons per sq. km. in 1941 and 43 persons per sq. km. in 1951. Ever since, the rate of growth of population has been skyrocketing with 51 persons per sq. km. in 1961 and 62 persons per sq. km. in 1971 and now 76 persons per sq. km. in 1981. The country's growth of population has risen from 77 persons per sq. km. in 1901 to 221 persons per sq. km. in 1981 compared to 32 persons per sq. km. for rest of the countries of the world. This phenomenal growth of population in our country and of the state may,

perhaps, be attributed to sociological as well as economic factors. Late Dr. S. N. Aggarwal of International Institute of Population Studies, Bombay has rightly pointed out that the growth rate is high because of "universality of marriage, lower age at marriage, limited use of contraceptives, low level of literacy, poor level of living of masses and traditional way of life among 80 percent of the rural population".

4. Incidentally, sex ratio for the country has never been favourable to women with a constant decline of female population compared to male right from 1901 onwards till 1971. The females per thousand males in 1901 had been 972. This went on constantly descending when in 1971 it came down to 930 females for per one thousand males. This trend, however, appears to have reversed marginally in 1981 with females registering 935 for per thousand males. Conversely, in Himachal Pradesh in 1901 there were 884 females for per 1,000 males. This steadily went on rising when it reached 988 females for 1,000 males in 1981.

5. Regarding literacy it is worth noting that at the dawn of the 20th century literacy of our country was just 5.35 percent, male literates being 9.53 percent and female literates 0.60 percent. In fact, an educated woman was a rarity at the beginning of the century. Slowly but steadily we have travelled a long distance in last 80 years bringing out the male literacy to 46.74 percent and the female literacy 24.88 percent. If children with age 4 and below are omitted, over 50 percent of our male population would be able to read and write with understanding and so also one third of the female population of the country.

6. It is difficult to project precisely the literacy of Himachal Pradesh right from 1901 onwards since the State has often changed its contours. However, ever since taking the Census of Himachal Pradesh as a separate unit, the literacy figures are available. In 1961 literacy in Himachal Pradesh was 21.26 percent, male literates being 32.31 percent and female 9.46 percent. During sixties State could make a considerable strides in the field of education bringing literacy percentage in 1971 to 31.96 percent, male literates being 43.19 percent and female literates 20.23 percent, thereby showing an overall growth of 84.92 percent literates during the decade, which

indeed, was the highest in the country. However, the tempo could not be kept in seventies where rate of growth of literates declined to 60.8 percent with 41.94 percent literacy—male literacy being 52.36 and female 31.39.

7. As already stated female poulation in the

State right from the beginning of the century has been constantly increasing leaving a marginal gap between male-female ratio. It was further stated that out of 12 districts in the State, 5 districts have female population higher than male.

Statement-1 shows the tahsils/sub-tahsils in the State having female population higher than male population. District-wise analysis of the tahsils would show that in Chamba district out of 6 tahsils, 5 tahsils have higher male population than the female, but, tahsil Chamba has female population higher than male. In Kangra district with the exception of Khundian and Indora sub-tahsils, all the remaining 7 tahsils have got the female population much higher than male population. As if not to leave any stone unturned, all tahsils of Hamirpur district have female population higher than male. This equally applies to Una district also where all the four tahsils have higher female population than male. In Bilaspur district, Ghumarwin tahsil has higher female population than male and Bilaspur Sadar tahsil and Shri Naina Devi Ji sub-tahsil have higher male ratio, though, the district as a whole has higher female ratio compared to male. In Mandi district the ratio appears to be fifty-fifty, 5 tahsils/sub-tahsils having higher female population compared to male and the remaining 5 having a male population higher than female. In Simla district, Seoni tahsil and Nankhari sub-tahsil have

female population higher than the male. Solan has only Arki tahsil with female population higher than male. Kinnaur has Poo and Sangla tahsils with female population higher than male. Thus Statement-1 reveals that out of 73 tahsils/sub-tahsils in the State, 27 tahsil/sub-tahsils have female population higher than male population. All tahsils/Sub-tahsil of Kulu, Sirmaur and Lahul and Spiti districts have male population higher than female.

8. Statement-2 gives the towns in the State with female population higher than male. It would reveal that out of 47 towns in the State only 4 towns i.e. Yol Cantonment Board, Sujanpur Tira Notified Area Committee, Daulatpur Notified Area Committee and Bakloh Cantonment Board have a female population higher than male population. It is difficult to hazard guess precisely about the reasons nonetheless, apart from being higher female birth rate, lack of job opportunities in rural areas which leads to the migration of male population can be the one of the causes of the higher female ratio in the tahsils/towns given in the Statement-1 and 2 respectively.

9. The comparative all India Urban population of all the States/Union Territories as given in the Table-1 shows that Maharashtra with urban population of 35.03 percent comes first amongst the states followed by Tamil Nadu with 32.98 percent, third and fourth being Gujarat and Karnataka with 31.08 percent and 28.92 percent, respectively.

Rural Urban Composition of Population.

10. Table-2 gives the rural-urban composition of the population in the State. Before we go into detail analysis of the towns, it would be relevant to know the criteria for determining towns. According to Census any place to be called a town must qualify the following criteria :—

(i) must have a population of more than 5,000,

(ii) the density of the population of the town must be atleast 400 persons per sq. km,

(iii) atleast 75 percent of the above population should be engaged in non-agricultural activities.

11. This apart, any Town/Notified Area Committee or Cantonment Board notified so by the Central/State Government is treated as town for census purposes.

12. If the census criteria is to be taken into consideration for determination of town, Himachal Pradesh may not have more than 17 towns. But, combining the Government notification and the census definition, there are as many as 47 towns in

Himachal Pradesh as against 36 towns in 1971. Of these, none comes in Class I. Simla is the only town which falls in the category of Class II town. Sundar Nagar in Mandi district and Nahan in Sirmaur district come in the category of Class III towns. Five towns namely Chamba, Kangra, Mandi, Kulu and Solan come in the category of

Class IV towns. Another 9 towns, 3 in Kangra, 1 each in Hamirpur, Una, Bilaspur, Mandi, Solan and Sirmaur fall in the Class V towns. Remaining 30 towns in the State are the Class VI towns. The Statement-3 below gives complete picture of the number of towns by its class size.

13. All 47 towns referred above have aggregate population of 327,162 as against rural population of 3,910,407. In other words, Himachal Pradesh has 7.72 percent urban population compared to 92.28 percent rural population which in 1971 was 6.99 and 93.01 respectively. Here it would be relevant to mention that 24.09 percent of the total urban population of Himachal Pradesh lives in tiny Class VI towns without actually having much urban

characteristics, followed by Class IV towns with 22.17 percent and Class II town with 21.54 percent. Next comes Class V towns with 19.72 percent population and last and the least come Class III towns with 12.49 percent of total urban population. Comparative figures for 1971—81 given in Statement-4, evidently shows that Himachal Pradesh is overwhelmingly a rural state.

14. Out of overall growth rate of 22.46 percent during 1971—81, urban area of all classes registered growth rate of 35.25 percent whereas rural areas registered a growth rate of 21.50 percent. Amongst the urban areas, towns in Hamirpur and Una districts have registered the highest urban growth rate of 331.33 percent and 136.98 percent respectively during this decade. Perhaps, not primarily because of industrial activities or increasing trade and commerce but due to conversion of some villages into towns. Though overall urban growth rate is much higher than the rural growth rate, peculiarly still, some of the urban areas have shown lesser growth rate than the rural areas. This may partly be due to the limited notified urban jurisdictions and consequent over-spilling of the growth of population beyond the municipal limits and partly as already stated due to low level of industrial and commercial activities in these towns. Sundar Nagar and Pandoh towns in Mandi district, in fact, have registered a negative growth rate during this decade. This of course is clearly due to the winding up of peak activities of the Beas Sutlej Project.

15. SIMLA TOWN holds a distinct place amongst all the towns in Himachal Pradesh. Firstly because it is the only Class II town in the State. Secondly, it happens to be the capital of the State with all accompanying advantages and disadvantages. The town with the population of 70,479 has registered a growth rate of 27.29 percent in 1981 compared to a population of 55,368 with growth rate of 29.98 percent during the previous decade. The slight variation between 1961—71 and 1971—81 is mainly because in 1981 figures, combatant population is yet to be added. One can safely deduce that Simla has kept its previous decade's growth rate undisturbed during this decade too. Nonetheless, one apparently would feel that growth rate of Simla is not so impressive compared to overall urban growth rate of 35.25 percent in the state. Cool analysis would show that the high urban growth rate in the state is partly due to the creation of eleven new towns during 1971—81 and not due to growth alone.

Simla town uniquely placed as it is, has a marginal seasonal population also. Apart from governmental activities which has a tremendous bearing on size of the population of the town, it does not have any other activity worth the name. During 1971—81 large number of the Central and State offices have shifted from Simla. Mainly they are Accountant Generals, Haryana and Punjab, part of the Labour Bureau Simla, Controller of Insurance, Government of India, Registrar of Newspapers, Headquarters of Deputy Inspector General, Indo-Tibetan Border Police, Directorate of Fisheries of Himachal Pradesh and shifting of enblock Mahasu district staff to Solan. Figures collected from the concerned departments show that approximately, 3,300 persons were employed in the aforesaid offices. Presuming that about 800 of them were either single or were staying outside the town, still 2,500 employees have shifted from the town with their families. Putting an average size of an Indian urban family at 5 (though for the entire country the average size of the family according to 1971 Census is 5.7), about 12,500 persons have migrated to other parts of the country and the state. As against this, Census of Government employees published by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Himachal Pradesh shows that during 1976—79 only 10.10 percent additional employment has been generated in the Simla town by Government against 12.08 percent employment generated in the entire State during 1971—79. Thus, absolute increase of 15,111 for Simla during 1971—81 appears to be high enough. By way of caution, it may be relevant to add that the population of Simla town with the existing urban jurisdiction may not register much growth in future too due to already almost optimum space utilization. This is corroborated by the fact that the satellite villages which form the standard urban areas of Simla have registered a higher growth rate of 28.28 percent during the decade under review than the growth rate of Simla town. Simla standard urban area has a population of 96,714 with 208 satellite villages.

16. Comparative Population of the top ten cities of India has been given in statement-5.

Distribution of population by workers and non-workers.

17. Historically, India has been a predominantly agricultural country where population flourished at much higher rate in the fertile Indo-Gangetic Plains and the other river basins of India than the less fertile parts. Himachal Pradesh appears to be no different from this historical fact when we see the density of population higher in the fertile valley districts than the rugged higher altitudes. Una, Kangra, Hamirpur, Mandi and Bilaspur districts which form primarily the fertile valleys of Himachal have a population much higher than rest of the districts which are more terraneous.

18. As already mentioned, Himachal Pradesh is overwhelmingly a rural state and the destinies of the State are intimately interwoven with the lot of the rural population. A discerning look at Statement—6 and Tables 5 and 6 would reveal that out of 41.41 percent main and marginal workers, 23.53 percent are engaged in cultivation and other agricultural operations. In 1981 Census the entire population were categorised into main workers, marginal workers and non-workers. Table 6 and Primary Census Abstract Part-II would show that out of total population of

42,37,569, as many as 14,36,284 are main workers, 318,584 are marginal workers and 2,482,701 are non-workers, thereby comprising 33.89 percent main workers, 7.52 percent marginal workers and 58.59 percent non-workers to the total population of the State respectively. The main workers according to Census definition are the persons who have got work for six months or more than 6 months in a year, any person who has worked for one day to less than 6 months is categorised as marginal worker and people who have not worked at all are treated as non-workers. These figures would show that in Himachal Pradesh effective working force is 33.89 percent of the total population while 7.52 percent have only seasonal work and remaining 58.59 percent people are one way or the other completely dependent on 41.41 percent working population. Having categorised working population into main workers and marginal workers from the total population of the State if we glance at the further division of workers in the various sectors of economy it can be seen that out of 33.89 percent main workers overwhelming percentage of 69.44 are engaged in cultivation and 2.92 percent are agricultural labourers. Only 2.65 percent are engaged in the household industry and 24.99 percent main workers are engaged in other works i.e.

trade, commerce, industry and Government and private services, etc. In 1971 it was 70.64 percent, 4.17 percent, 2.60 percent and 22.59 percent respectively. Overall picture of the main workers would, therefore, show that there has been a marginal shift of cultivators and agricultural labourers to household industry and 'other works' as a consequence marginal increase of working strength in the household industry and the services. This marginal change in the profession would give an indication that with the spread of education and consequent enlightenment, more people have started adopting profession in trade, commerce, industry and services, etc. This, indeed, is a happy trend but the shift from the traditional agricultural profession to industrial and allied activities during the decade under review seem to be very very marginal to change the overall complexion of the population in the State. Even today 72.36 percent of the main workers i.e. the persons who have worked up to six months and more in a year are engaged in agricultural activities. Above conclusions reveal that the State has a very high dependency ratio which is evident from the very fact that 33.89 percent of the State working population has to feed the remaining 66.11 percent population i.e. on an average one earning member has to take the burden of providing sustenance to 3 idle mouths. In a State where effective working population is so disproportionately low the economy can never augur well since few hands

have to feed too many mouths, causing lesser income to the State and lesser per capita income for the people and consequent poorer standards of living. No savings is possible because more resources are to be diverted towards consumption. This situation indicates a typical age structure of the population of the State with broad base and tapering top which demographically is called 'young population' which has all its concomitant problems to the State and the society *inter alia*, mass un-employment etc. Further column 9 of the statement would show that wherever there is higher percentage of literacy, the percentage of non-workers are higher than the districts having lower rate of literacy. Perhaps, the reason can be attributed to the fact that the younger generation spend more time in education and join the working force later than districts where the illiteracy is more and the younger people join work at an early age. The district-wise percentage of cultivators given in Statement-6 shows that Kulu, Kinnaur, Simla, Lahul & Spiti, Sirmaur, Mandi and Chamba districts have higher percentage of cultivators than rest of the districts of Bilaspur, Solan, Una, Hamirpur, and Kangra. It appears that when there is no scope for diversification of activities or no alternative sources of livelihood, people mainly concentrate on the cultivation and whoever is left out of cultivation look for the Government job which come in the category of 'other workers' in the Statement-6.

Physically Handicapped Persons

17. Table-7 gives the tahsil/town-wise distribution of the totally handicapped persons in the State. After 1931 Census this has been attempted for the first time in this census. The table referred above reveals that out of 7,98,062 households in the State with total population of 42,37,569, there are as many as 10,773 totally handicapped persons in the State. Of this, 3,922 are totally blind persons, 2,757 are totally crippled and 4,094 totally dumb. For a population

of 4.24 million the handicapped population of 10,773 is a substantially high number. We have not, however, gone into the reasons of disability while collecting the figures. In absolute terms, Mandi district tops with 1,899 totally handicapped persons, next comes Kangra with 1,697 persons followed by Simla district with 1,493 persons, thereafter comes Sirmaur district with 900 persons, Chamba stands fifth with 862 persons and Kulu comes sixth with 814 handicapped persons. Remaining six districts each having handicapped population below 800.

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


