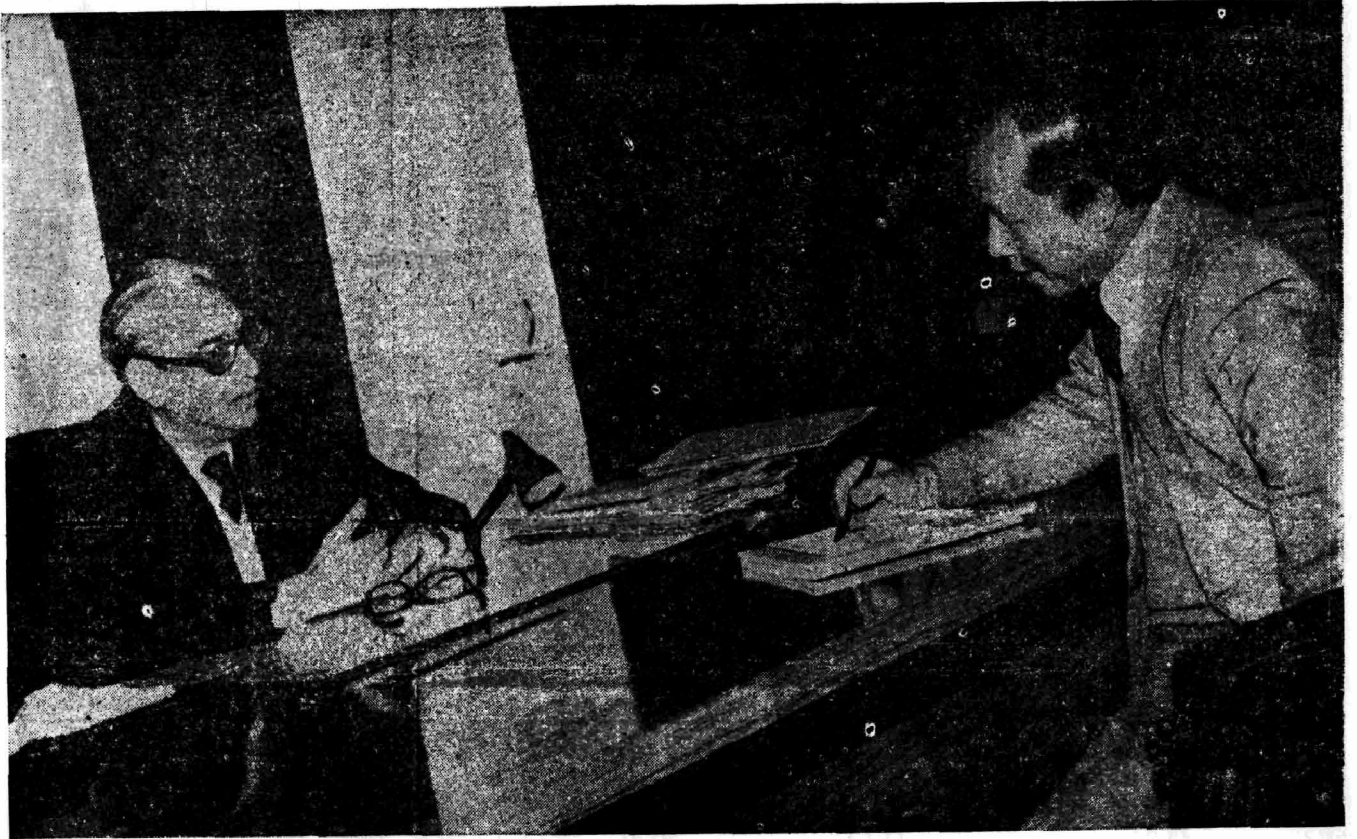

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INTRODUCTION

It may be recalled that in the first publication of the 1981 Census in the form of Paper I of 1981, the Provisional Totals of Mizoram population were presented district-wise, indicating therein distribution of population, sex-ratio, growth-rate, density of population, decadal variations and literacy. These totals were presented in figures as well as in Maps and Charts together with clear explanatory back-ground notes as to how Census works in Mizoram had been carried out.

This publication which is Supplement to Paper I of 1981 contains a more detailed and elaborate information regarding composition of rural and urban population, growth-rate of towns, urban population by size and class of towns, workers and their percentage to total population. It contains Five Tables, and the Primary Census Abstract Part I & II. The Disabled Population by type of Disability has also been included in the Annexure.

The Primary Census Abstract Part I & II reflects the provisional demographic data of 1981 Census relating to Mizoram, indicating therein provisional information on the number of occupied residential houses, number of households, total population, density of population, sex-ratio, percentage of growth-rate, number of literate population with percentage, the working population classified into different categories and non-working population as a separate category is presented upto the district level with male-female break-up showing the urban and rural classifications separately.

It is expected that the figures presented in the present publication will be found useful by various Government Departments and other agencies which are concerned in the overall development of Mizoram.

It also indicates the percentage of urban population to total population for 1971 & 1981 and also the decennial growth rate from 1971 to 1981 of each district showing the rural and urban areas separately. In this Table, the districts have been indicated population-wise

It may be seen here that figures in Column 6 & 10 relating to Chhimituipui District were not available in view of the fact that there was no town in Chhimituipui District in the 1971 Census.

TABLE — 2

This Table indicates the population and growth-rate of Cities, Urban Agglomerations and Towns. The concept of Urban Agglomeration adopted for the 1981 Census is that very often large Railway Colonies, University Campuses, Port Areas, Military Camps, etc. come up outside the statutory limits of the City or Town but adjoining it. Such areas may not by themselves qualify to be treated as Towns but if they form a continuous spread with the Town, they are outgrowths of the Town and deserve to be treated as Urban. Such Towns together with their outgrowths have been treated as one urban unit and called Urban Agglomeration. An Urban Agglomeration may constitute :

(a) A city with continuous outgrowth (the part of outgrowth being outside the statutory limits but falling within the boundaries of the adjoining village or villages.)

(b) One town with similar outgrowths or two or more adjoining towns with their outgrowths in (a) or;

(c) A city and one or more adjoining towns with their outgrowths all of which form a continuous spread.

In Mizoram, we have no such Urban Agglomerations.

It may be recalled that in the 1961 Census, there was only one town in the whole of Mizoram, namely, Aizawl for the purpose of Census. In 1971, Lunglei also became another Census town and in 1981, four other places, namely, Kolasib, Serohhip, Champhai and Saiha came to be recognised as towns for the purpose of Census after having fulfilled the criteria laid down for declaring as such.

In India, towns and cities have been classified into six categories according to the size of their populations as below :—

1. Class I	Population	1,00,000	and	above
2. Class II	"	50,000	to	99,999
3. Class III	"	20,000	to	49,999
4. Class IV	"	10,000	to	19,999
5. Class V	"	5,000	to	9,999
6. Class VI	"	Less than		5,000

In Mizoram, we have no town with one lakh or above population. In the 1971 Census, Aizawl was Class III town only, but in 1981, it became Class II town. Lunglei was only Class V town in 1971 but in 1981, it became Class IV town. All the other four Census towns are of Class V category.

Urban Areas are specially defined for Census purposes. Urban Areas in the 1981 Census are :—

- (a) All places with a Municipality, Corporation or Cantonment Board or notified town area :
- (b) All other places which satisfied the following criteria :—
 - (i) A minimum population of 5,000 :
 - (ii) At least 75% of the male working population engaged in non-agricultural (and allied) activity :
 - (iii) A population of at least 400 per sq. km. (or one thousand per square mile).

This Table shows the total population district-wise indicating the Male and Female population separately. It also presents the number of main workers and the percentage of such workers to total population for the 1971 and 1981 respectively, district-wise with the male and female break-up.

In the 1981 Census, workers are classified into three categories, namely, Main Workers, Marginal Workers and Non-workers. Those who worked for the major part of the year i.e. at least 183 days are categorised as Main Workers while those who worked for some time during the last year but not for the major part are treated as Marginal Workers.

PRIMARY CENSUS ABSTRACT - PART I & II

Primary Census Abstract Part - I presents provisional data on information like the total number of occupied residential houses and the number of households showing the rural and urban break-up together with the total population (including institutional and houseless population), density of population, sex-ratio, literates, total workers, break-up of different categories of workers and also the total non-workers by sex both rural and urban.

An occupied residential house is a structure or part of structure with entrance which is used as a dwelling by households. A household means a group of persons who commonly live together and would take their meals from a common kitchen unless the exigencies of work prevented them from doing so. An institutional household may be defined as a group of unrelated persons living together in a common mess like hostels, boarding houses etc. Houseless population comprises of those people who have no fixed place of residence and no regular house to live in, such as beggars, vagabonds etc.

Literate means a person who can both read and write with understanding in any language. A worker is a person whose main duty is participation in any economic activity by his physical or mental work. Main workers are those persons engaged in economic activity regularly for more than 183 days or six months in a year prior to the Census of 1981. Marginal workers are those who worked for some time during the last year but not for the major part. Non-workers are those who had never worked during the last year.

Primary Census Abstract Part II furnishes the information on the total number of main workers and their percentage to total population, total number of cultivators and agricultural labourers showing the rural and urban break-up in the State as a whole as well as in the respective District.

ANNEXURE

DISABLED POPULATION BY TYPE OF DISABILITY

Apart from the Five Tables and the Primary Census Abstract Part I & II indicated in this publication, it has been considered appropriate and proper to include data relating to the Disabled Population in Mizoram by type of disability showing the District, Community Development Block and Town-wise figures. These figures were collected by the Census workers during the Houselisting and Housenumbering Operations which was conducted in October, 1980.

It may be noted in this connection that the data presented here represent those handicapped persons who are totally blind, crippled and dumb. The term 'totally crippled' refers to such persons who have lost their arms or limbs. The loss of either of these, i.e. both arms or both legs would be sufficient for classification as totally crippled. The loss of only one arm or one leg was not classified as totally crippled. There may be cases where a person may unfortunately suffer from more than one of the disabilities mentioned above. In such cases, the intention was to record persons by the greater disability. Care was taken to ensure that there was no double counting in such cases and the same person should not be counted for more than one disability.

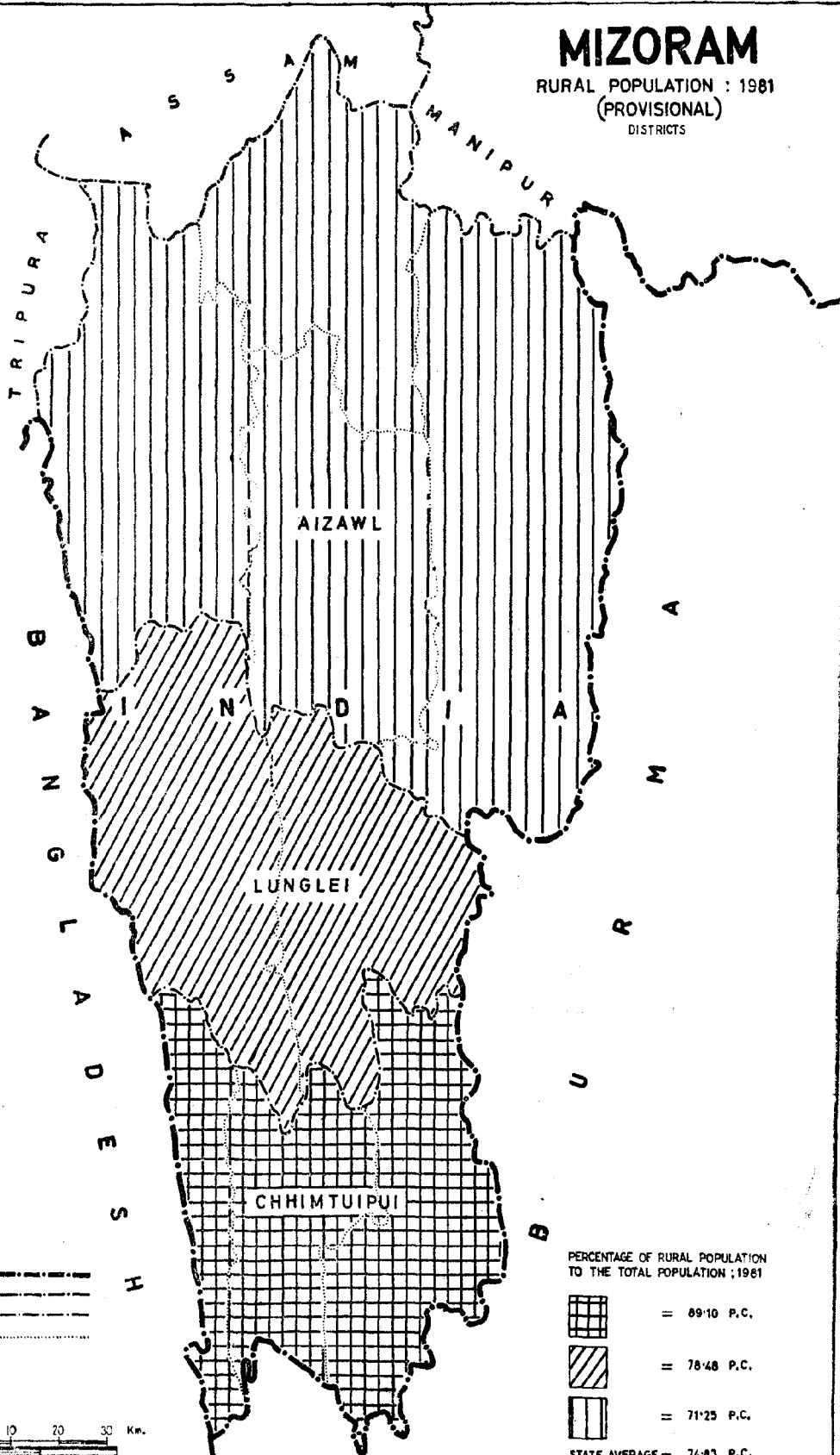

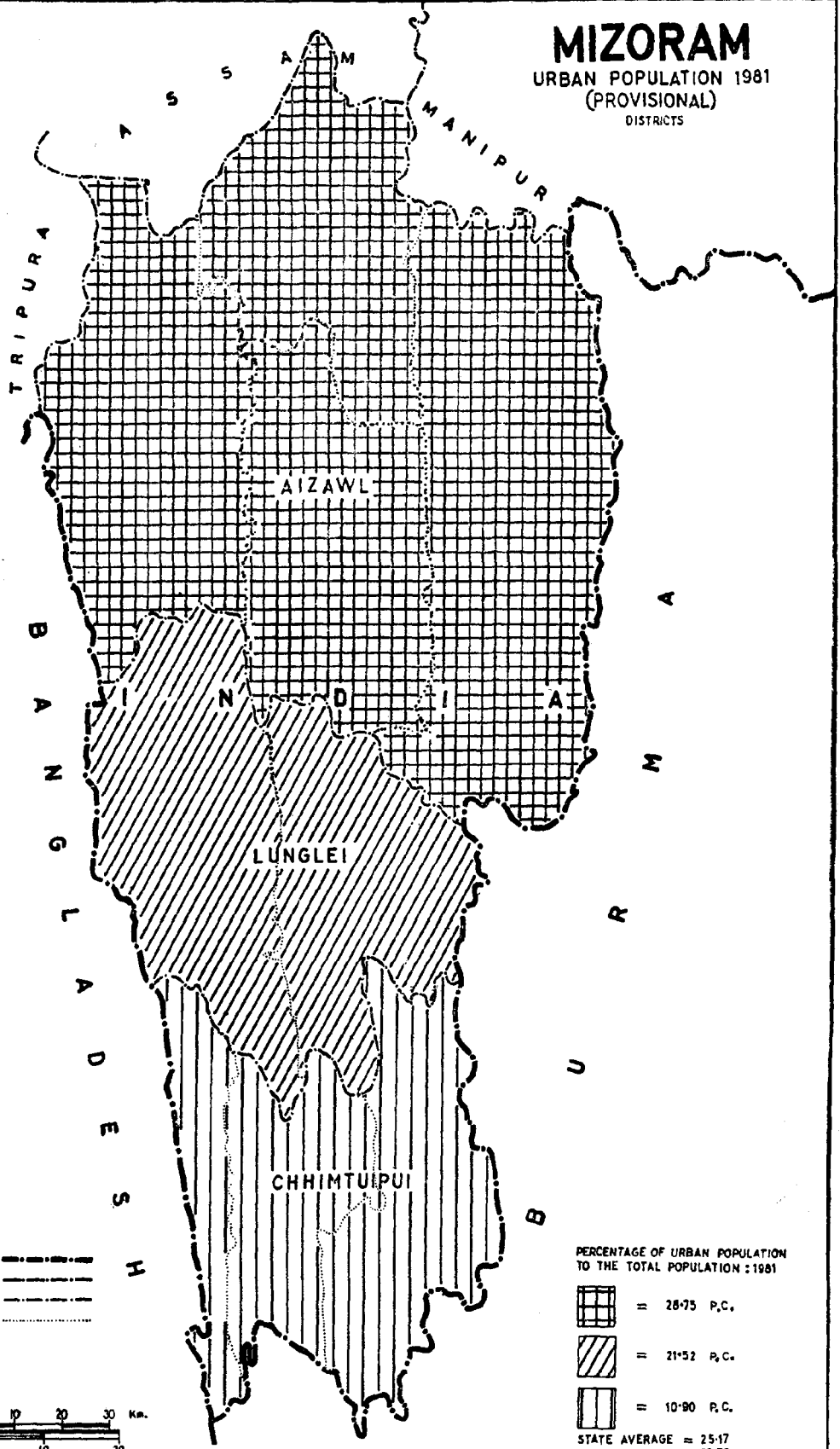

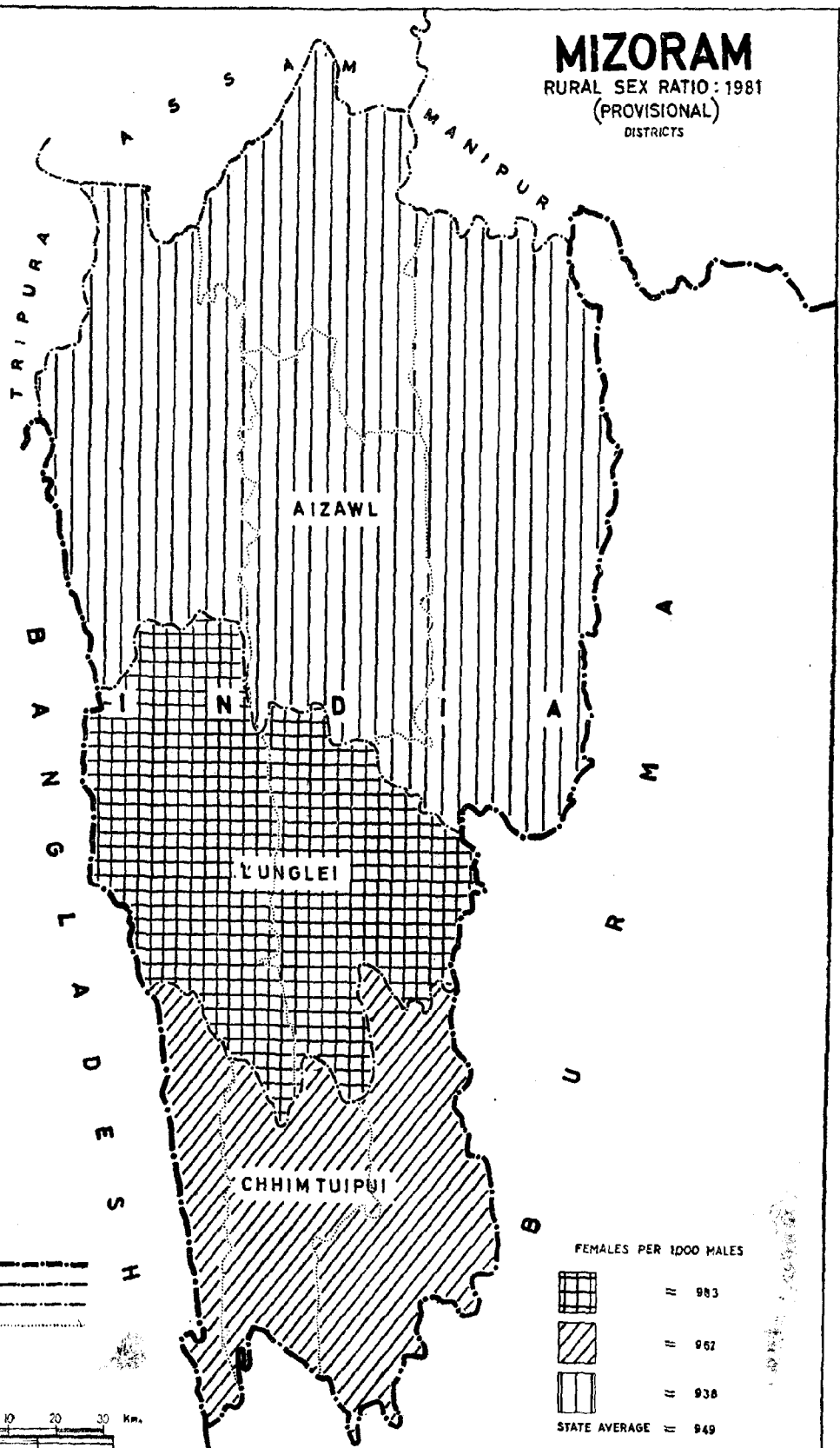

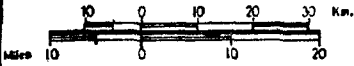

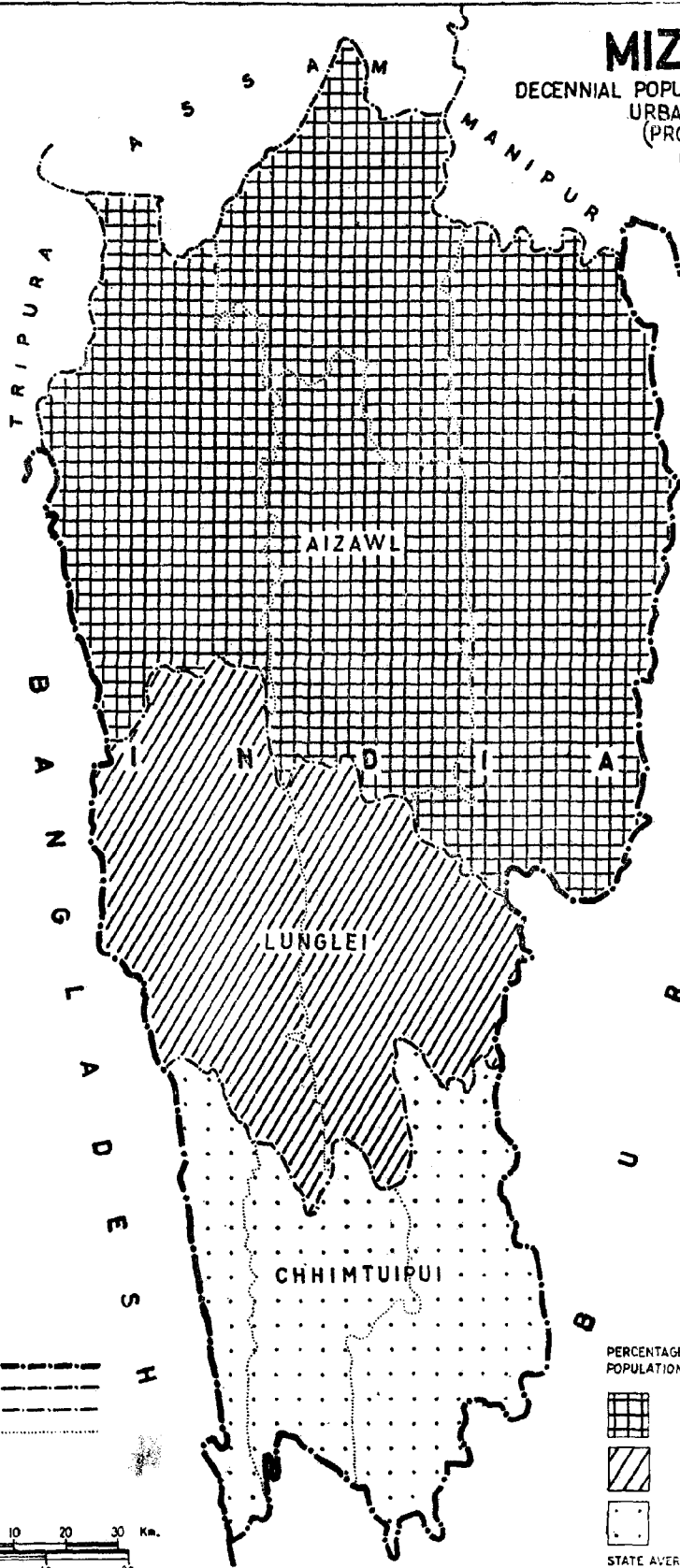

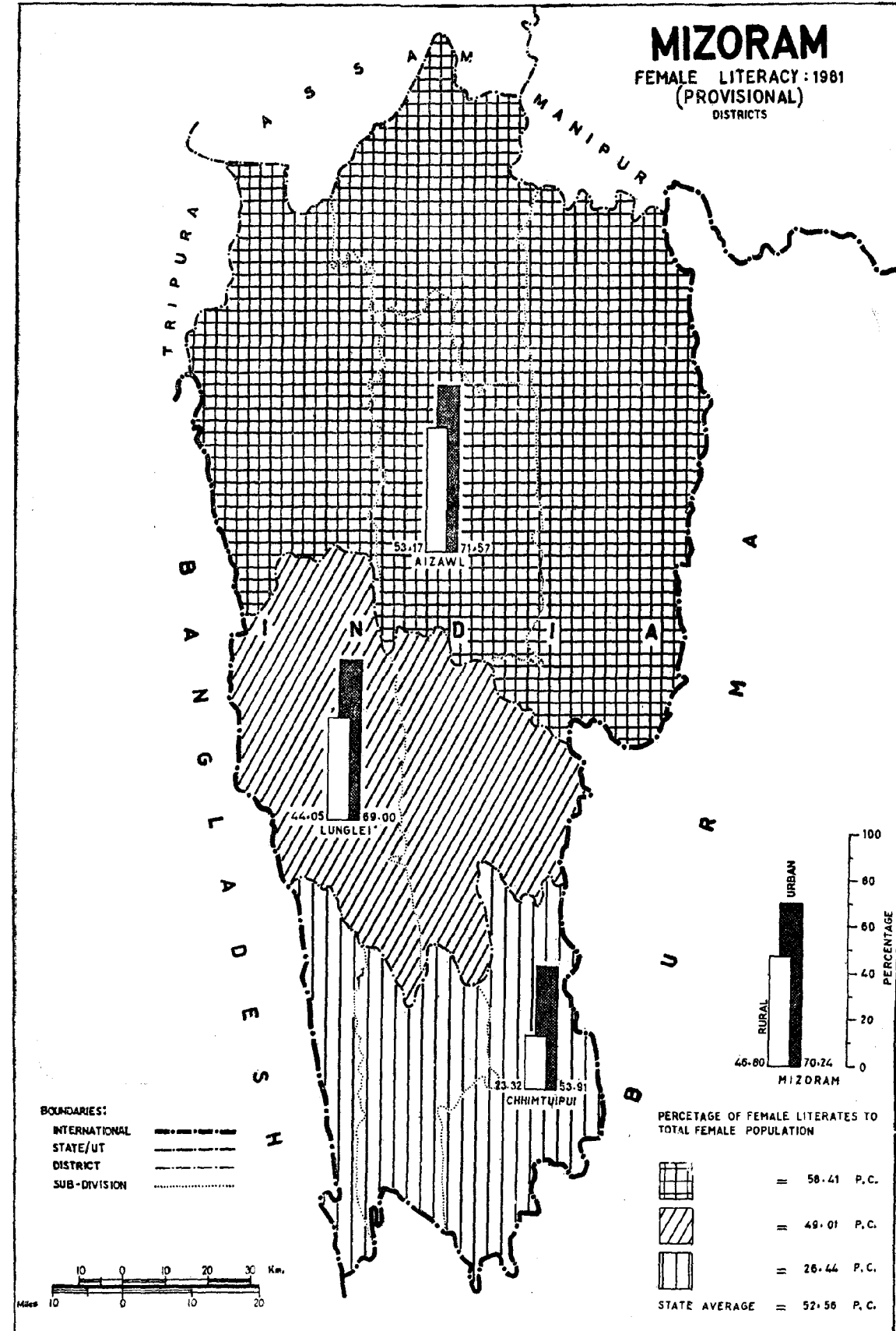


PERCENTAGE OF MALE LITERATES TO TOTAL MALE POPULATION

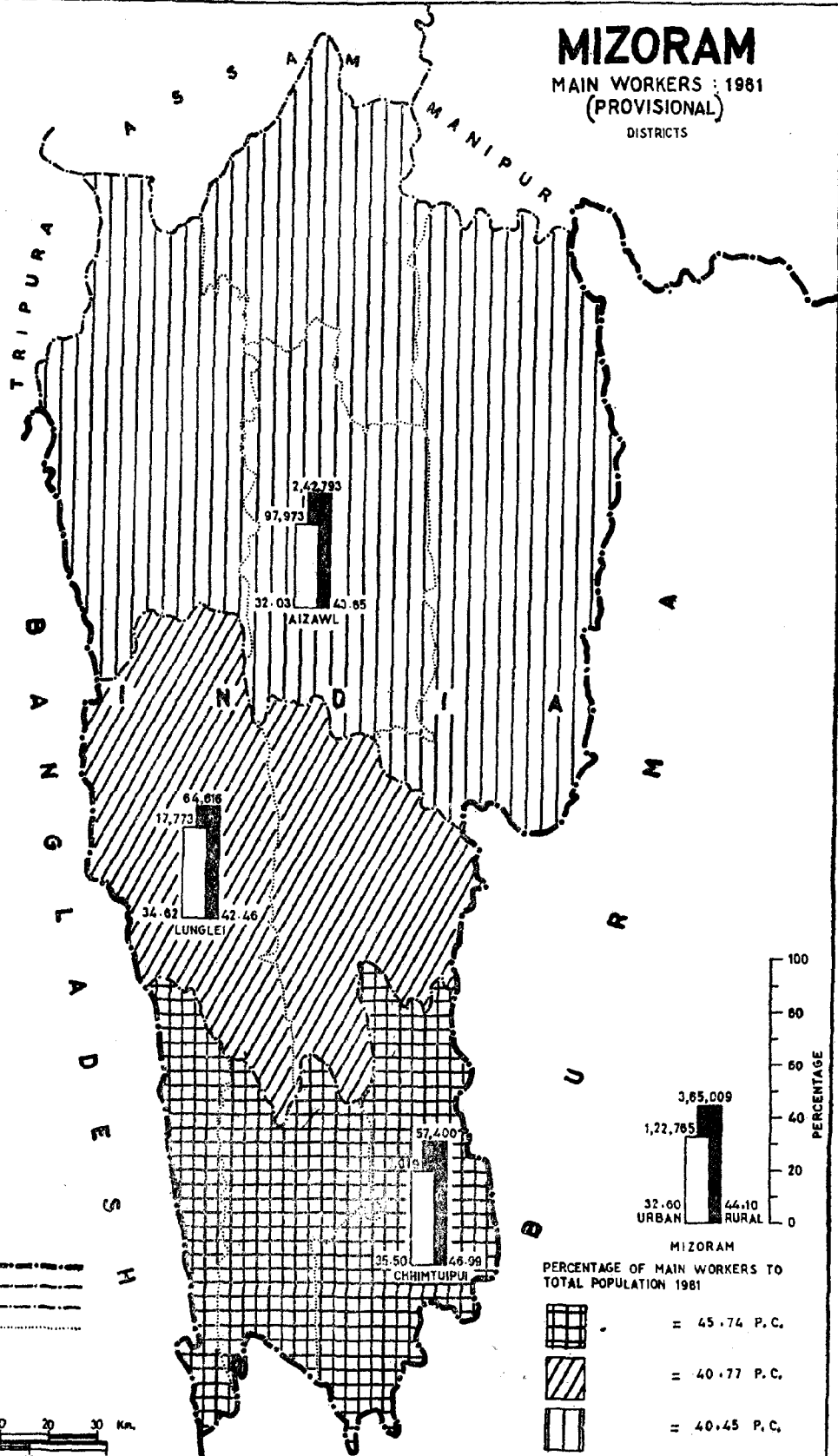

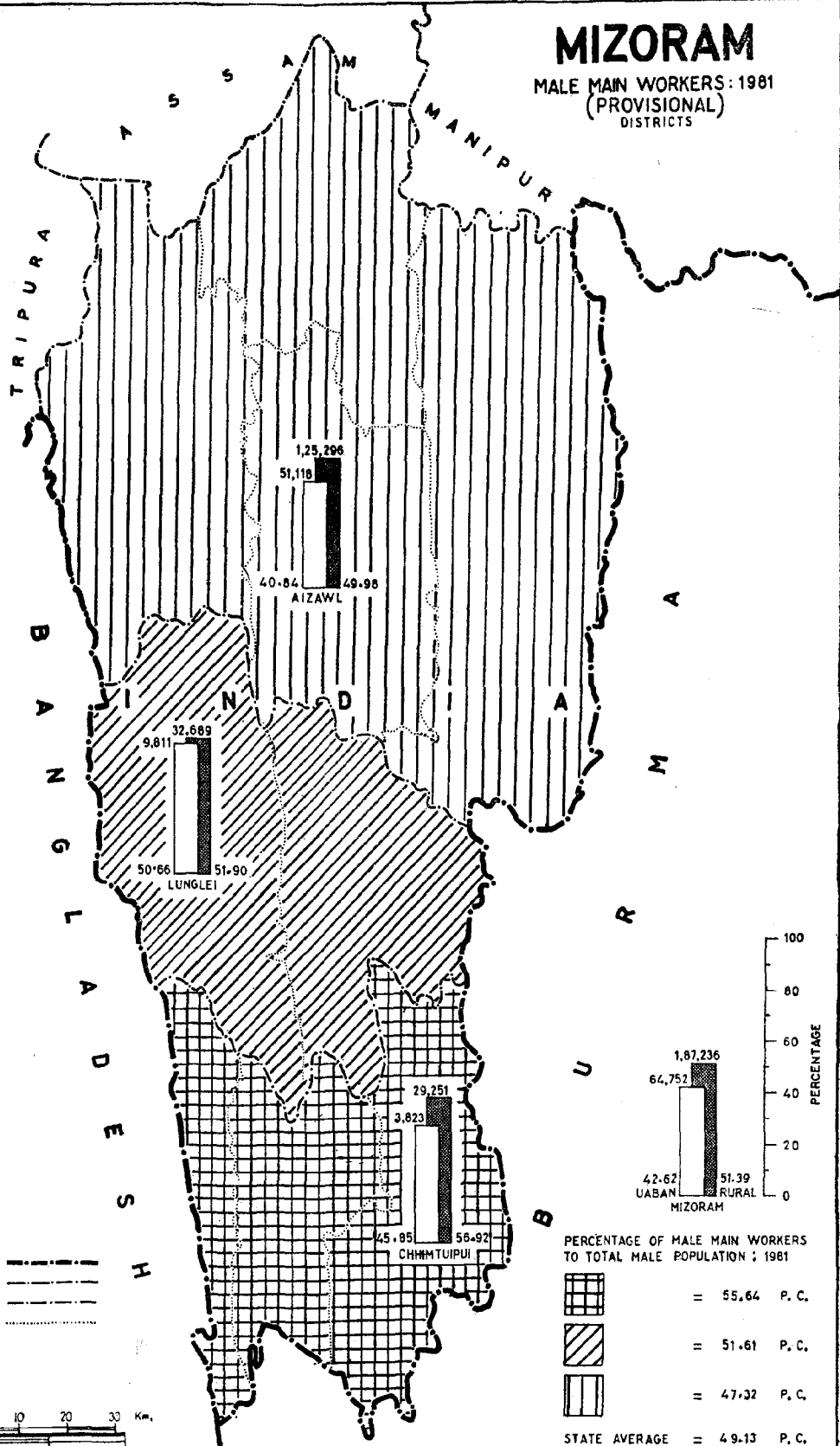
MAIN WORKERS : 1981

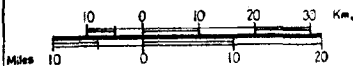

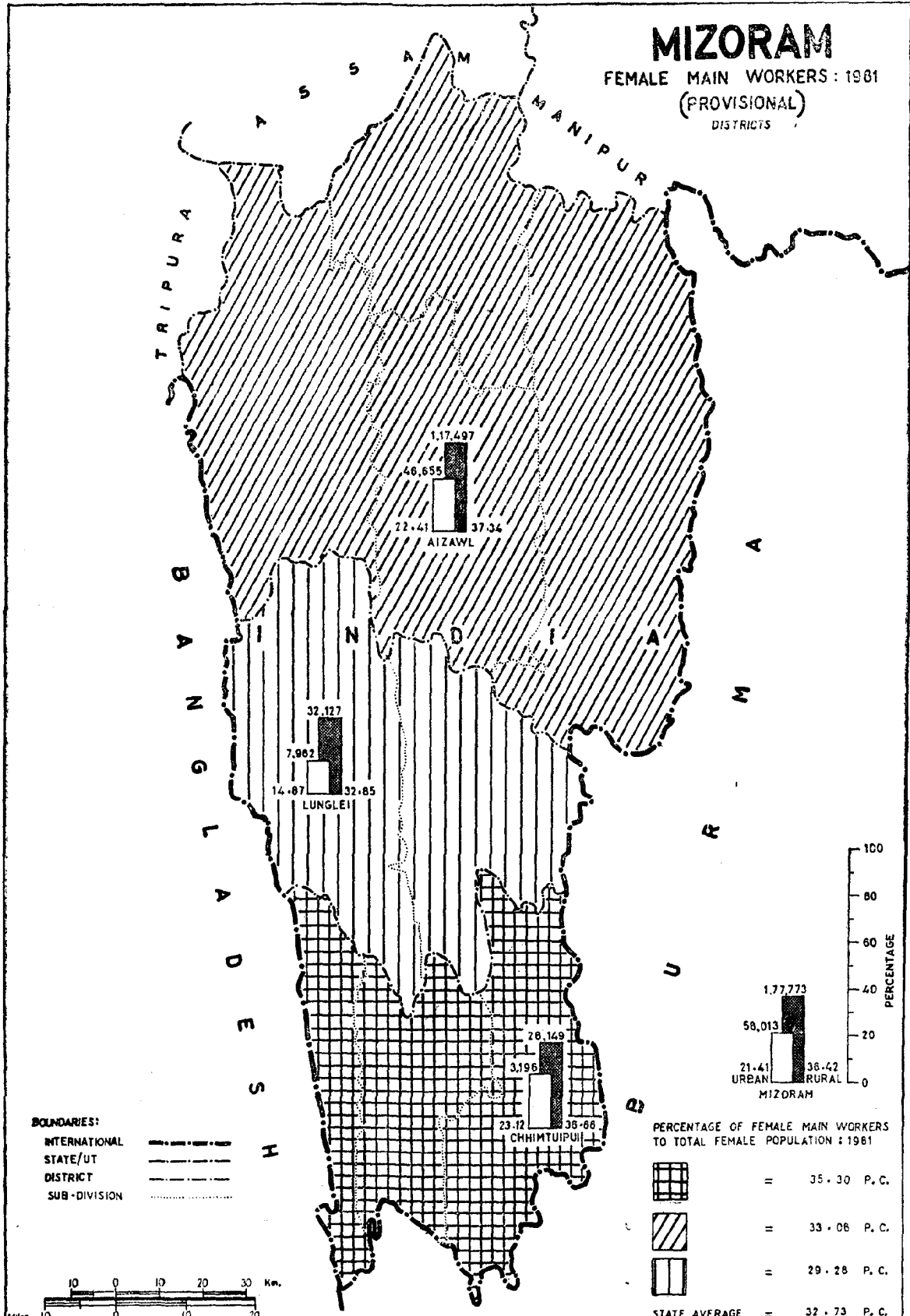

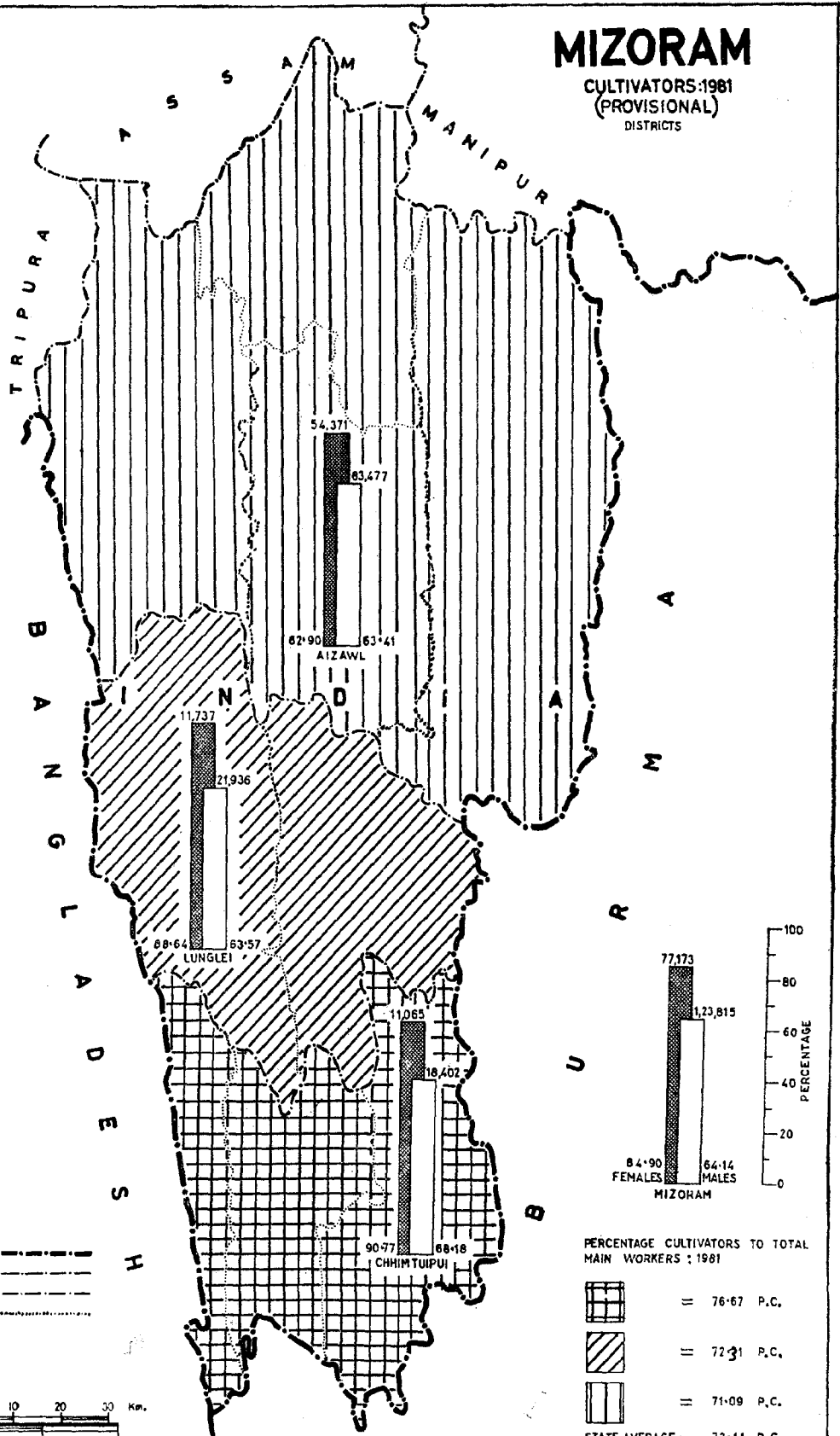

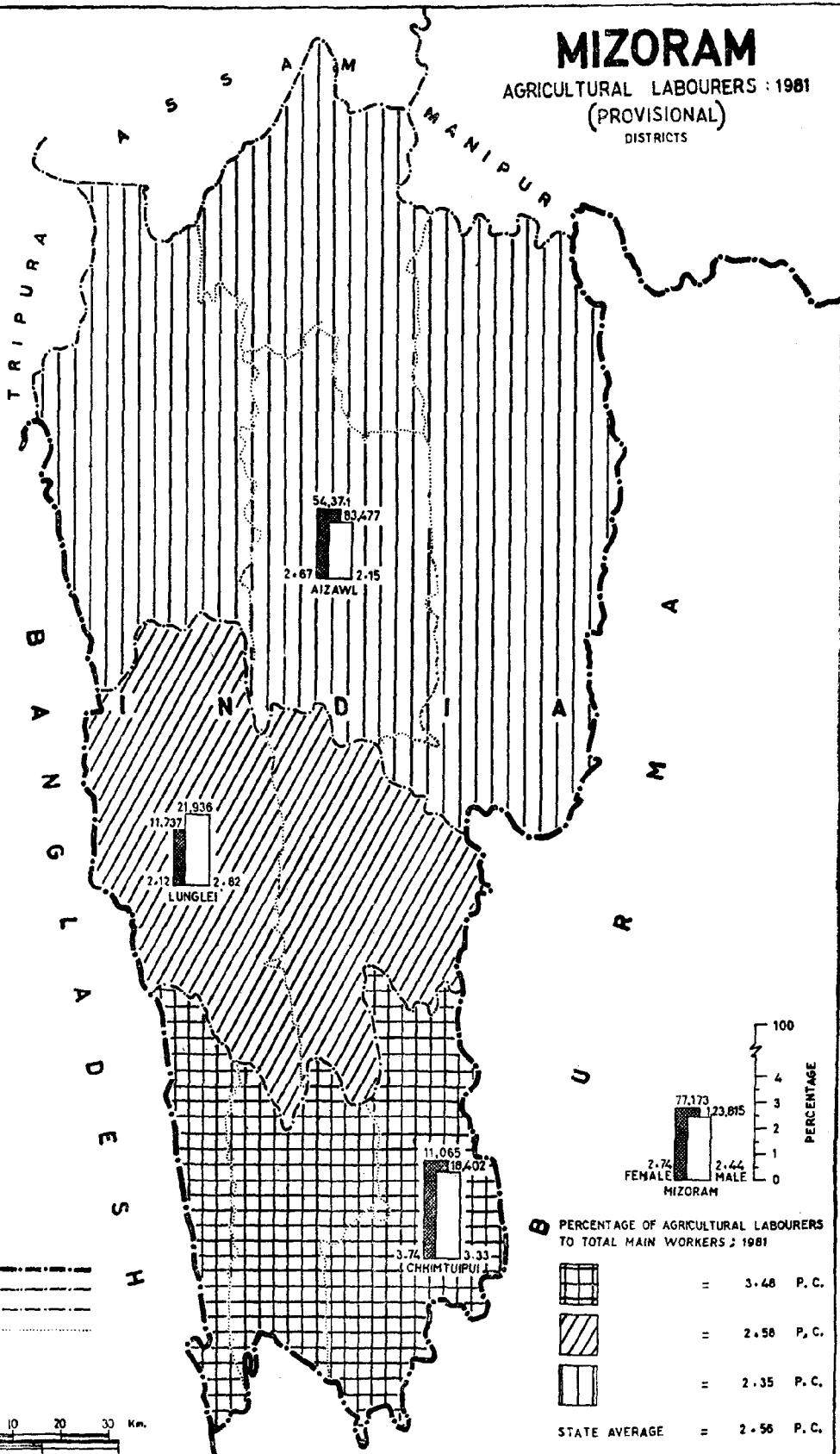
