REVIEW

OF THE

CENSUS OPERATIONS OF THE NATIVE STATES

IN

RAJPUTANA.

The Census of 1881 is the first general enumeration of population, which has ever taken place in Rajputana since the commencement of England's connexion with India.

- 2. Copies of the Report of the Census Committee and of all Circulars and Orders received from the Government of India were circulated among Political Officers, who were directed to explain fully to the Rulers of the States, to which they were accredited, the proposed mode of operations in British India, and to consult with them as to how far a similar system could be introduced into their respective States. It was added that the Government of India did not expect to receive the same elaborate details as would be collected in British territory, but that it was hoped that a tolerably accurate computation of the population, even in the wildest and least frequented parts of Rajputana, might be effected. At the same time *kharitas* or Vernacular letters were addressed personally by the Agent to the Governor General to the various Chiefs, in which the intentions of the British Government were described, and co-operation with regard to their own States invited.
- 3. Cordial replies were received from all Ruling Chiefs, who signified their wish to follow as far as possible the procedure to be adopted in British India. At the same time from their replies it became apparent, that in many parts of Rajputana the taking of an elaborate and synchronous Census would be out of the question.
- 4. At first it was resolved that the twelve column Enumerator's Form, as designed for British India, should be used in Rajputana; but, after consideration of the views expressed by some of the Political Officers and on the recommendation of the Census Commissioner, this resolution was abandoned and a Form containing eight heads was adopted.

The following extract contains some simple rules which were suggested by the Census Commissioner for the assistance of the authorities in Native States, and a Memorandum based to some extent upon it was circulated to Political Officers for the assistance of Durbars:—

(a). Considering the administrative machinery at the disposal of most of the Native States, and the character of the persons, who will as a rule

be employed as Enumerators in the villages, and who are not accustomed to preparing returns and filling up tabular statements, as the Patwaris in British territory are, it seems to me advisable that we should attempt as little as possible, and should give them very few columns to fill up, in the hope that those few may be filled up accurately.

- (b). I would not ask that this simplification of the Enumerator's Form should be insisted on, in case any Native State conceives that inferiority of administration is implied by it; but it might be represented to them that many Native States have desired some simplification, that there is an advantage in having one Form for all Native States, as there is for all British districts, and that, however capable their own officials may be, what is needed is to bring the work down to the capacity of the rustic Enumerators in villages, who are liable to become confused by the sight of a large array of columns and a long set of Instructions.
- (c). The Form I suggest, (and which is being adopted in the Central India States) is as follows:—

- I would leave out "Civil condition," "Mother tongue," "Education," and "Infirmities;" none of which columns convey information at all equal in importance to that conveyed by the eight columns I would retain.
- (d). Under "Age," the Enumerator might either enter the number of years, or might state the class to which the person belongs, as Infant (Bachcha) up to 3 years; Boy or Girl (Larka, Larki) up to 15; young man or woman (Jawan) up to 30; (Adher) middle-aged to 45; old man or woman (Buddha, Buddhi) above 45. Sir H. Daly has approved this plan for the Central India States, thinking that the information given in these terms, though rough, will be correct; whereas if the number of years is asked a man of 50 will often declare himself 25 years old.
- (e). Under "Religion," I would simply show Hindu or Mahomedan, except in large central towns where Christians, Parsis &c., may reside. I would meet this case by giving special instructions to the Enumerators in such towns, and would not allude to it in the instructions meant for the rural Enumerators.
- (f). "Caste and Occupation." I would allow any State in which the Census machinery is weak to leave these columns blank. Where they think that the information can be correctly given, the instruction might

be to enter sub-divisions of Rajputs (as Rahtors, Bagheles, &c.,) in Rajput States, of Jats in Jat States, and of Mahomedans (as Sheikh Syed &c.) in Mahomedan States; possibly sub-divisions of Brahmins (as Kanaujia, Gour, Deshist &c.,) might be entered also. But in all other cases the sub-division should not be asked, only the name of the Caste.

- (g). If "Occupation" is filled up, I would recommend that very little detail be given; it might be sufficient to give three classes of occupation, agricultural, trader and artisan, and in any case this should only be filled up for adult males.
- (h). Under "Birth-place," would be shewn whether the person was born in the State, or if outside of it, in what country or district.
- (i). I append a suggested set of instructions to Enumerators which I have drawn up as briefly as possible. Also a pattern form of Enumerators' book. It should contain 100 pages, one for each house, with 8 lines to each page.
 - On one side of the cover the instructions should be printed, on the other the name of the Village, Taluka or Subah, Enumerator, and State Official appointed to supervise him, with the date of the enumeration. It would be useful to print a sample form, for an imaginary house, as a pattern to shew the Enumerator how to fill up each column. The names, castes &c., would differ for each part of the country, so that a different pattern would probably be required for each State or group of States.
- (j). I would not attempt to form blocks of 60 or of any number of houses, except in towns. Some village official, familiar with the place, should if possible be appointed to enumerate every village, whether the number of houses in it be large or small. The number of books required will therefore depend on the number of villages in the State, with a margin over for the towns and for such large villages as may require more than one book. Early steps should be taken to secure the printing and ruling of these books, and their despatch to the State in such time as to admit of their distribution over the villages.
- (k). It would be well to decide, in consultation with the Durbar of each State, whether the enumeration can really be carried out on one night or not. If it can, the preliminary enumeration might begin on the 1st or 15th January, the final Census being taken on the night fixed for all India: but if the machinery is not strong enough to take a Census on one night, then the enumeration, which has to be

extended over several days, should take place as near the Census day as possible; probably the period from the 10th to the 20th February would be most suitable.

Brief instructions to Rural Enumerators in Native States.

- I. Write distinctly in ink.Begin each house on a fresh page.
- II. In column 2, enter the name of each person present in the house: first, the regular residents, then the temporary visitors. Enter the names of persons who are working in the fields, but who will return to the house for meals : not those absent on journeys or employed elsewhere.
 - If the head of the house objects to state the name of a female, do not ask for it, but write 'female' only.
- III. Column 3. Enter 'male' or 'female' against each name.
- IV. Column 4. Here the instructions will depend on which of the two courses mentioned in para. d is adopted.
 - V. Column 5. Enter 'Hindu' or 'Mahomedan' against each name.
- VI. Column 6. If 'Brahmin' ask what kind of Brahmin, as Kanaujia, Deshist &c.; if 'Rajput', ask what kind of Rajput, as Rahtor, Sisodia, Bundela, &c. If of other caste, do not ask any further detail. (Unless special orders are given in Jat or Mahomedan States, as in para. f).
- VII. Column 7. Fill up this column only for adult males; stating whether they are agriculturists, or traders, (as Marwaris, Banias &c.,) or artisans (as weavers, smiths, &c.,) or of no occupation.
- VIII. Column 8. Write the State or country or district, in which the person was born.
- 5. Beyond giving advice and explaining the intended procedure of Government in British territory, Political Officers were neither able nor directed to take any personal share in the actual work of first taking the Census, and afterwards tabulating its results.

From first to last all operations were conducted by the Native States themselves, and in several cases an intelligent interest was shown by Durbars, notably in the case of Meywar, where the Census was considered an opportune occasion for collecting certain statistics necessary for the Land Settlement at present in progress in that State.

Political Officers were, however, requested to obtain from the various States within their Agencies copies of the final results when tabulated.

- 6. Copies of the final forms of the various States of Rajputana, twenty in number, were sent up to the office of the Agent to the Governor General at irregular intervals, in which as they came in they were entered on forms designed to show the consolidated figures for the whole of Rajputana. From the first it was foreseen that the submission of final forms would be too irregular to justify the creation of a separate establishment for compilation: so the work was carried on by the office of the Agent to the Governor General at its ordinary strength. This forecast proved correct, long though uncertain periods often elapsing between the arrival of the returns of the several States.
- 7. The total population, exclusive of Bhils, is ten millions one hundred and two thousand and forty-nine, of which nearly five and a half millions, the exact figure being 5,461,493, are males, and something over four and a half millions (4,640,556) females. The Bhils, who have not been shown separately as to sex, bring the total population up to 10,268,392.
- 8. The following table gives a comparative statement shewing the total population, as well as by sexes, of 20 States, including the petty Thakurate of Lawa.

9. Owing to a very pronounced repugnance to being enumerated, a repugnance which in some instances led to a disturbance of the peace, no accurate Census could be taken of the Bhil population in the States of Oodeypore, Partabgarh, Dungarpur and Banswara, and the authorities had to be contented with counting houses and allowing an average of four persons to each house. The subjoined table gives the supposed numbers in the four States mentioned above:—

- 10. Until the survey of Rajputana is completed the exact area cannot be determined; but taking it at the approximate figure of 129,750 square miles, the foregoing statistics would show the distribution of the population per square mile to be 79.14.
- 11. The total number of occupied houses is shown at 2,101,451, which gives an average of 4.89 persons per house.
- 12. The population according to Religions (excluding Bhils) appears to be divided mainly as follows:—

Hindus, 4,792,774 males and 4,046,469 females; while Mussalmans, who do not aggregate a million, are divided into 460,453 males and 401,294 females. Christians are put down at 777 males and 517 females; Jains at 195,632 males and 183,040 females; Sikhs 9 males, no females; Parsis 6 males and 1 female; and finally the comprehensive though indefinite term "Others" shews 11,842 males against 9,235 females.

Apparently the last named division must embrace a few Sikhs and Parsis, as, although their actual numbers must be small, the foregoing figures so far as regards them are undoubtedly incorrect.

17. In the States of Jodhpore, Jeysulmere, Bickaneer and Sirohee the final enumeration was not synchronous and was effected chiefly by day; in most parts of Oodeypore also the enumeration had, unavoidably, to be taken by day. In the other States the enumeration was synchronous and was taken at night.

Enumerators and Supervisors were obtained everywhere without difficulty, many coming forward voluntarily for the duty. These were drilled and instructed in their work for several months before the preliminary enumeration was started, and their services were retained till the close of the final Census.

The preliminary enumeration was commenced throughout most of Rajputana generally in the month of January 1881, and the final enumeration took place on the night of the 17th February, operations beginning at about 8 or 9 p.m. and finishing, with few exceptions, early on the following morning.

The agency employed was, chiefly, unpaid, but in some few instances small allowances were made to Enumerators and Supervisors. The expenditure incurred by each State in taking the Census and compiling its results is shewn below:—

MEYWAR AGENCY.

18. The information supplied by the Resident regarding the Census as taken in Oodeypore, Partabgarh, Banswara and Dungarpur is very scanty. He merely mentions that District Officers superintended the actual taking of the Census, that tabulation was performed at the Sadr Office of the respective Durbars, and that the final forms as submitted to the Agent to the Governor General were prepared in his own office.

He adds that a good deal of money was spent by the States, that difficulties were experienced by Enumerators in enquiring into the numbers of families, and that so much excitement prevailed in the Bhil tracts that a Census by polls had to be abandoned.

EASTERN RAJPUTANA STATES AGENCY.

19. The following memorandum and set of rules describe the mode in which the Census was effected in the States of Jeypore, Bhurtpore, Kishengurh, and Kerowlee.

Memorandum.

The Census operations, both preliminary and final, were from first to last conducted by the Native States themselves in accordance with rules and recommendations issued by the Resident for their guidance. A copy of these rules and recommendations, which were strictly followed in all essential points, is appended herewith.

The first thing was to carefully determine the boundaries and areas of the Census divisions, and to make special arrangements for the enumeration of Shamlat (joint jurisdiction) localities, the floating and houseless population, and travellers and Railway employés living outside of Railway limits.

The late Maharaja doubted the success of the proposed work in Rajputana, as he had more than once contemplated and partly carried out a similar undertaking in his own territory, but had failed owing to the strong conservatism of the Rajput and his disinclination to make any public declaration of his family surroundings; but owing to the subsequent simplification of the Enumerator's schedule for Rajputana and the change in the Jeypore regime which followed the Maharaja's death in September 1880, these anticipated difficulties were avoided.

A preliminary enumeration was taken in the early part of January 1881; the method prescribed in rules c, and d, of the appended rules being minutely observed: the source from which the enumerating and supervising agency was chiefly drawn were the Revenue and Educational Departments. Land-owners and Zamindars also lent their assistance, but the lower grades of the Police were employed as sparingly as possible. With the exception of the General Superintendent of operations in the Jeypore State, who was specially entertained, and the "Batta" allowance of about 3/10ths of salary paid to Enumerators and Supervisors, the agency employed was wholly unpaid.

The mode of conducting the preliminary enumeration was precisely the same as that adopted for the final Census, and detailed in the appended rules and recommendations.

For the final Census, which was effected at night and was synchronous, the operating staff was the same as that utilized for the preliminary work, supplemented and was similarly unpaid.

There were no special difficulties experienced, and with the exception of the names and other information regarding the female population, which it had been subsequently decided should not be demanded, the schedules and forms prescribed for Rajputana were completed in all their details.

The enumeration on the 17th February commenced generally about 9 p. m. and, with a few immaterial exceptions, was completed early next morning. schedules were at once totalled by the Enumerators. From these "Tahsilwar" statements were prepared and forwarded, with the schedules, to the Durbars for general compilation and tabulation, the strength of the agency employed being gradually reduced as the work narrowed and became simplified. It was the intention of the Durbars to use the "Working register" forms indented for from the Government Press at Allahabad, but as these, which were missent to Erinpoora, did not reach Jeypore till the end of May 1881, the Durbars had, with the Resident's consent, to make the best arrangements they could. The consequence was that, with the exception of the Kishengurh Durbar, who made use of manuscript "Working registers" of their own, the whole of the tabulation was made direct from the "Tahsilwari" abstracts to the village tables, making use of slips and memoranda in place of the prescribed "Working registers;" but as the opening of a central office at Jeypore, with the consent of the Durbars, for the tabulation of the schedules of the several States, afforded the Resident an opportunity of personally supervising the work, it is believed that this departure from the prescribed method was not attended by any unsatisfactory results.

The system of tabulating was that of each tabulator working alone and independently: this was adopted in preference to the alternative course of three or more tabulators working with one reader. Where the "Working registers" were made use of the "stroke" system described in the note which accompanied Circular D. dated 21st December 1880 from the Census Commissioner for India was adopted: in all other cases slips or memoranda, subjected to special scrutiny and check, were made use of for abstracting and collating the figures for transfer to the village forms.

A rough total of the Census results was ascertained in the end of March, and the final forms were completed and forwarded to the Agent-Governor General on the 21st June 1881.

The definition suggested in paragraph 8 of Circular N. dated 19th March 1881 from the Census Commissioner, was uniformly adopted in determining the

classification of towns in contradistinction to villages, and the figures for areas were arrived at from the maps of the Topographical Survey, which had been completed in the States under this Agency.

The Chiefs concerned lent their cordial and willing assistance and evinced throughout an earnest desire to make the work as complete and satisfactory as possible.

Rules.

- (a) The most important thing to be settled is the form of the Enumerator's schedule.
 - The form proposed for the Census of British India is given at page 16 of the printed papers appended to First Assistant Agent Governor General's letter dated 29th June 1880. But it is not intended that the same form should be adopted for the Census of Native States, or that the arrangements generally should be conducted on the same elaborate scale. The form for Native states may be of the simplest kind practicable, and need not provide for anything opposed to the feelings or prejudices of the people.
 - The form of the schedule when settled upon, which should be done in consultation with the Durbars, should be submitted to the Agent Governor General as soon as possible, with a statement of the method on which it is proposed to conduct the Census operations.
- (b) The first thing to be done, is to prepare a list of the villages and houses and prescribe the territorial limits for the enumeration. The greatest care is required in laying down the areas to form the territorial units, so that there may be no portion of the population omitted.
- (c) When the areas have been defined, arrange the villages into "Supervisors' Circles" and "Enumerators' Blocks" in the proportion of 1 Enumerator for 300 to 500 persons or 60 to 100 households, and 1 Supervisor for every 10 Enumerators, with a Superintendent in charge of the operations in each district. The number of "circles" will vary according to the size of the locality and the extent of the enumerating agency available.
- (d) The Enumerators, Supervisors and District Officers should be selected as soon as possible, and be instructed to have everything in complete working order beforehand.
- (e) It is proposed to have a synchronous general enumeration, on one of the earliest nights in February a few evenings before full moon; but it is not necessary or desirable to put off operations till the last moment. It might be practicable for the Enumerators a few days before the Census night to fill in the schedules with all the information obtain-

- able, confining their work on the night of the Census to checking, correcting and completing; the enumerating agency being, of course, carefully organized beforehand, and care taken that in its distribution no part of the population is overlooked.
- (f.) In filling in the Enumerator's schedule, houses (the unit of the enumeration to be the "house") should be entered as much as possible in order of their proximity. They should be numbered consecutively (by villages) from one Enumerator's list into another until each village is complete. In the case of towns and large villages the Supervisor's circles (600 to 1000 houses) should be distinguished by different letters and separate numbering under these letters.
- (g.) A General Superintendent should be appointed some months beforehand, whose duty it would be to organize and supervise operations generally and under him might be one or two Deputy Superintendents to superintend and look after all arrangements preliminary to enumeration.
- (h.) The Enumerating agency, which will necessarily be large, need not be employed all at once. The preliminary work of preparing lists of houses and making entries in schedules might de done by special official agency, and in such proportion that it might be made available on the night of the Census as part of the supervising agency.
- (i.) The preparation alluded to in Note 4 may be spread over a lengthened period of time, and so need not require a large agency; but the shorter the time the fewer will be the alterations and corrections to be made on the schedules on the night of the Census.
- (j.) In British India it is proposed to take the Census by an unpaid agency generally, by utilizing the services of officers of the various Departments, such as Customs, Education, Police, Vaccination, &c., &c. It is further proposed to employ special village agency and to call upon land-holders to assist. For the enumeration of the lower castes a special agency is to be employed.
 - A similar course to this is practicable in Native States. As the employment of the Police rank and file might be open to misconception and result in some cases of oppression and extortion, it is proposed to exclude this class from the enumerating agency as far as possible.
- (k). It is not expected that the Enumerator's schedule for Native States will be quite as full as that proposed for use in British India, but whatever form may be finally adopted, uniformity is a sine qua non.
- (1). The Enumerator's schedules, or rather the filling in of them is all that the Native States will have to do; the compilation and tabulation of

the *results* in the various prescribed forms will be done *provincially*; the Enumerator's schedules should, therefore, contain nothing which it is not intended to compile or tabulate.

(m). A separate Enumerator's schedule is required for each family.

Precis of recommendations for conducting the Census.

- (a). The Durbar is requested to state whether the form of Enumerator's sche
 Form of Schedule dule proposed for the Census in British India is applicable to Jeypore, and, if not, to suggest alterations: additions are not desirable, but possibly omissions may be thought necessary. Uniformity, however, is essential.
- (b). List of all the towns, villages, hamlets and houses in each territorial

 List of towns &c., limit, that is to say, Nizamat, Tahsil, to be prepared. Taluk, or Mohulla, should be carefully prepared, precaution being taken to define the limits of each area, so that nonc of the house-holders or persons within it or on the border may escape enumeration.
 - The *house* is the unit of enumeration, but a separate schedule is required for each family.
- (c). An active intelligent official of high rank to be styled General

 Appointment of General Superintendent should be deputed at once to conduct the Census. It would facilitate matters if two Assistants were also appointed.
- (d). The Durbar should determine the agency by which the Census is

 Determination of Enumerating agency.

 to be made and the General Superintendent in consultation with the State officials at the capital and in the districts, should be empowered to select and train the subordinate staff, which will consist of Supervisors of circles and Enumerators acting immediately under the District officers.
 - The estimated population of Jeypore is at least 1,750,000 persons, for which from 3,500 to 5,800, say 5,000 Enumerators will be required. Some districts may have more educated men available than others. But the whole may be put on an equality by temporary transfers.
 - It is not considered advisable in British territory to employ the rank and file of the Police. Respectable private citizens who can read and write may be called upon to supplement official agency.

Large establishments may be numbered by the head.

Some of the lowe reastes may be numbered in the same way.

- In British India the following officials have in past Censuses acted as Supervisors of Circles: Assistant and Deputy Collectors, Canungoes, Inspectors of Police, Sub-Inspectors of Police, Rural Sub-Registrars, School-Masters, &c. Enumerators may be officials of all kinds—School-masters, Native Doctors, Vaccinators, &c., the qualities required being ability to read and write, and respectability.
- (e.) When the lists of villages and houses are ready the District officers

 Division of State into and General Superintendent, in consultation should arrange them into Supervisor's Circles and Enumerator's Blocks.
 - The block is the work which one Enumerator can undertake. In large towns one man can number 60 to 100 houses containing from 300 to 500 individuals. But in districts where the population is much scattered the block must be only as large as a man can cover carefully in one day. Taking these facts into consideration the Supervisor's circle should not comprise more than ten blocks.
- The actual Census will be taken early in February and on this day alone

 Duties of Supervisors will it be necessary to employ the whole enumerating staff, whose duty will be confined, on the day of Census, to checking, correcting and completing the schedules. Short rules for guidance of Enumerators will be prepared, in consultation with the Durbar, and when a general form is approved, printed or lithographed, and a copy given to each man it will be the duty of each Supervisor to see that the Enumerators under him understand their work.
- (g.) A few spare Enumerators should be attached to each circle to provide for

 Provision of spare casualties.

 Enumerators.
- (h.) The Supervisors of circles and a certain proportion of intelligent Enumerators should be set free from all other duties a few days before the Census to make the preliminary enumeration, that is, to fill in the schedules in readiness for the actual Census itself. This work must be done, or at least gone over finally, late in January 1881.
 - The Durbar may consider it practicable for each Enumerator to fill in his own schedule for submission to and correction by the Supervisor.
- (i.) In Bombay it was found convenient to close the public offices and courts

 Close of Public offices on Census day.

 This example may be followed with advantage.
- (j.) A complete list of professions, trades and occupations, should be drawn List of occupations. up, and, after comparison with similar returns from other States, a general list, approved, be printed or

lithographed in sufficient numbers to provide a copy for each Enumerator.

- (k.) Special care will be required in districts where the population is much scattered. In these cases it may be almost impossible to do the work in a single night or day. The schedules at the preliminary Census must, therefore, be filled in with the utmost precaution, the head of each house being warned that he must carefully note on the Census night, whether the persons entered in the form (which should be read over and explained to him when completed) are all present and whether any persons besides those named are in the house.
 - The Enumerator should then begin his *block* at the earliest possible moment, and go steadily through it even to the close of the next day if necessary, until the work is finished.
 - If possible no head of a family should be allowed to leave his house until his schedule has been passed.
- (l.) The Durbar should determine the proportion of schedules and forms

 Proportion of Hindi and Urdu forms.

 to be printed and issued in each district in Hindi and Urdu.
- (m.) The experience gained in the Census held in the city of Jeypore a few Value of experience gained in last Jeypore Census.

 years ago should be of especial value to the Durbar and Native States generally.
- (n.) The Durbar is not requested to do more than to have the Enumerator's schedule prepared.

WESTERN RAJPUTANA STATES AGENCY.

20. Marwar:—All the principal Thakurs were required to take the Census of their estates at their own expense. In the Khalsa or State villages an "enumeration tax" at the rate of 1/- per twenty houses was levied to pay the Hindi writers specially engaged as Enumerators. Brahmins positively refused to pay this tax, and the Durbar yielded to their remonstrances, but all other classes paid without raising any difficulties. The people of some 500 villages, the revenue of which has been alienated for charitable purposes, were enumerated under the superintendence of an official specially selected for the purpose. 126 villages devoted to the maintenance of the Zenana, and the members of the Ruling family were placed under the charge of Maharaj Kishore Singh and Bhopal Singh, brothers of the Maharaja of Jodhpore.

The villages assigned to Durbar officials and protégés of the Court were entrusted to writers chosen by the Dewan of the State. The Hakims, or District officers, were specially told off to superintend the enumeration of the towns at their respective head-quarters, and also of the small land-holders not represented by Vakils at the capital of the States.

The city of Jodhpore itself was divided into 105 groups of houses, and 100 Hindi writers, servants of the State, were employed in counting the inhabitants. In this State the Census was not synchronous and was everywhere taken in the day time, owing to the strong objection of the people to a nocturnal visitation. Some little coercion was found necessary in the case of certain Kaim Khanis of Parbatsar and Didwana, who objected to the counting of the members of their families. The Durbar consider that the results are tolerably successful in spite of "the novelty "of the process (because Census of Marwar was never taken before), the disin-"clination of the people to undergo such an ordeal, the separate and detached agencies employed with but little control over them, the general superstition of "the people and their repugnance to the payment of a tax trifling in itself."

- 21. Malani. This small district, which is under our direct management, was enumerated by four paid Munsarims assisted by "Mahajuns." The work was completed in four days, 14th-17th February, at an aggregate cost of Rs. 571-13-3.
- 22. Sirohee. In this State the number of Enumerators was limited and a certain number of villages was allotted to each. Consequently here, too, the Census was not synchronous. Rs. 282-5-3 was spent on account of establishment and 150 for stationery. The number of Bhils and Grassias in the Bhakar "pargana" had to be ascertained indirectly through people of the adjoining villages.
- 23. Jeysulmere. Beyond furnishing returns no incidental information has been given by this State.

HARROWTEE AND TONK AGENCY.

24. Census operations in the three States in this Agency were conducted much in the same way. To disarm suspicion and to familiarize the staff with their duties a preliminary Census was taken by the District officials assisted by the Patels and Patwaris of the different villages, and before the final enumeration houses were numbered and Enumerators' books filled in. On the night of the 17th the books were checked by the officials, permanent and temporary, who were specially told off to this task. Final testing and compilation were carried on by special officers at the head-quarters of the respective States.

Boondee. In this State the preliminary Census was taken by 40 "Raj" officials each assisted by two men. For the final enumeration 310 persons with 320 subordinates including torch-bearers etc. were entertained. The results were tabulated by 35 persons and 6 subordinates up to the end of June 1881, when 25 officials and 3 subordinates were retained to fair the final returns. The total cost exclusive of the pay of permanent officials was Rs. 2217.

Tonk. The preliminary Census of the six districts in this State was taken by a separate establishment of 15 clerks per district, the proportion of permanent to temporary hands employed being two to one. In the outlying districts these

establishments were superintended by the "Amil" and the "Peshkar," and at head-quarters by the Nazim and Naib Nazim. For the final enumeration 500 men, each having two assistants, were employed, of whom 300 were specially entertained. Compilation was carried on at Tonk by 40 officials under two Supervisors. This staff was broken up at the end of August, when four clerks were retained to revise the Returns. Excluding the pay of permanent officials the total cost amounts to Rs. 2204-10-8.

Shahpoora. The preliminary Census was taken by "Raj" officials assisted by Patels and Patwaris. The final enumeration was carried out by the same Agents assisted by 85 private persons of education who were invited to assist. The total cost exclusive of permanent "employés" amounted to Rs. 483-3-9.

Throughout the three States no particular difficulty was encountered, except that in parts of Boondee a rumour gained currency, that Government were trying to ascertain how many able bodied men were available for despatch to Afghanistan.

KOTAH ADDITIONAL AGENCY.

25. The preliminary enumeration of Kotah was completed by the end of January and was taken by the "Patwaris," superintended by the District Officers, whose work in turn was tested by the Revenue Superintendent and his Assistant, the Political Agent himself while in camp taking every opportunity of examining the papers of Enumerators.

The final Census took place on the night of the 17th February, the State having previously been divided into circles and blocks. Beyond eight Moharrars no establishment was specially entertained for the task of enumeration, but for the work of compilation at head-quarters paid agency had to be largely resorted to.

The Political Agent is of opinion that the Census was carefully and accurately taken.

Sujangarii Assistancy.

26. Owing to the comparatively thin population of Bickaneer and the backwardness of education, it was found impossible to take a synchronous Census in this State. The work of enumeration was carried out by "Patwaris" and Hindi "Gumashtas."

Their work was tested and tabulated by a special office, organized at the capital under the superintendence of the Head Officer of the Revenue Department.

The total charges on account of enumeration and tabulation amounted to Rs. 5123.

In many instances objections were raised against the Census; but these were overcome by judicious explanations.

DHOLPUR ADDITIONAL AGENCY.

- 27. The preliminary enumeration was commenced in the latter part of January and finished early in February.
- 800 Enumerators were employed, each having a block of about sixty houses Patwaris, Mutsadis, and other State officials were employed in enumerating. These were under 280 Supervisors, composed chiefly of Civil and Military officers of the State and gentlemen volunteers.

For the final enumeration Enumerators and Supervisors were strengthened by respective additions of 90 and 225 persons. All these persons were carefully drilled and instructed beforehand. The final Census began about 9 p. m. on the 17th and was over by 5 a. m. next morning.

The returns were examined and tabulated at the tahsils, from whence they were sent to the office of the Regency Council for final test and compilation.

No specially paid agency was employed.

ULWUR AGENCY.

28. For the preliminary Census in this State 473 Enumerators, each having blocks varying from 25 to 60 houses, were employed. One Supervisor was told off to every 12 or 13 Enumerators. For the the final Census 1290 Enumerators and 431 Supervisors were employed, and it was taken between 9 p. m. and 4 a. m.

The enumeration cost Rs. 1623-8-0, and tabulation 2273-4-2. In the latter part of the Census more paid agency had to be used than in the former, as the Revenue officials could not be spared from their own duties in the collection of the Revenue.

JHALLAWAR AGENCY.

29. The towns and villages were divided into Charges, Circles and Blocks in November 1880. Correct lists of all villages, hamlets and Police outposts were made out and given to Tahsildars, who were apointed Superintendents of their respective tahsils. Patwaris were made Supervisors of their own circles, and "Bannias" and other intelligent inhabitants were made village Enumerators. In the district of Shahabad, where a settlement is in progress, the Surveyors were made use of as Enumerators. On the night of the 17th the Enumerators' books were checked by the staff above described which was further strengthened by teachers and scholars of District schools. The results passed successively through the Supervisors and the Superintendent to Head-quarters, where the returns were finally tabulated. No specially paid agency was employed.
