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PREFACE

The Indian Census Organisation has been tabulating data collected during each decennial census on the twin consideration of their utility to Government and other data users and the feasibility of production in a time-frame and within the available resources. Based on the experience of the previous censuses, there has been constant endeavour to improve the presentation of data and the tabulation plan so that maximum utilisation of the census data is made possible. The Tabulation Plan for the 1991 Census of India has been prepared after consultations with important data users and deliberations in the Advisory Committee on Technical Issues connected with the 1991 Census. Descriptive notes on the tables, their basic purpose and their content have been included along with short notes on the Publication Plan. These details, we hope, will enable the data users to obtain the data required by them conveniently. Admittedly, the scope of tabulation of Census data is limitless, but the focus has always been to produce basic and essential tabulations as quickly as possible and in readily usable form. Therefore, tabulations of very specialised nature have not been presented, but it is hoped that such tabulations could be considered, if need be, within the constraints of time and resources.

In addition to printed publication of tables, it is expected that Census tabulations and other basic Census data would be made available on demand under certain conditions in machine-readable forms such as magnetic tapes, diskettes and CD-ROM etc.

We hope this volume will serve as a Census data users' guide enabling them to appreciate the scope and utility of the tabulations. We look forward to the increasing use of Census data. This Tabulation Plan is a major step towards ensuring such utilisation.

GENERAL NOTE

The schedules canvassed at the 1991 Census are the Houselist, the Household Schedule and the Individual Slip. The schedules are given in Annexures I-III. The "Houselist" schedule was canvassed at the houselisting operations which were conducted in the various States and Union Territories at different points of time during April-September 1990. Another schedule known as the "Enterprise List" was also canvassed during the houselisting operation on behalf of the Central Statistical Organisation for the third Economic Census but the processing, tabulation and dissemination of the Enterprise list data is the responsibility of Central Statistical Organisation. The "Household Schedule" for each and every household and the "Individual Slip" for each individual were canvassed during February-March, 1991. The reference date for the 1991 Census was the sun-rise of March 1, 1991. Alongwith the enumeration, all postgraduates and technically qualified persons were given a schedule to be filled up by them. This schedule was designed by the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research and the data will be tabulated and released by them.

The Houselist schedule contained the identification particulars and use of each Census house, the predominant construction material of wall, roof and floor of the Census house, identification particulars of households, the name and sex of head of household and whether he/she belongs to Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe, whether the household lives in owned or rented house, number of living rooms in the occupation of the household, amenities available to the household like drinking water supply, electricity and toilet; and type of fuel used by the household for cooking. The question on provision of toilet facilities was asked for the first time in rural areas. The enquiry on type of fuel used for cooking was made for the first time in Census. The information on physically handicapped persons which was collected in the 1981 Census has been dropped at the 1991 Census. The information on housing conditions and facilities which was part of the Household Schedule (Part-I) in the 1981 Census has now been transferred to the Houselist schedule. This has been done to avoid

the delay in the processing of these data.

The Household Schedule and the Individual Slip were canvassed at the census count during February-March, 1991. At the 1981 Census, the Household Schedule had two parts. The first part contained information relating to the household and the second part, the Population Record, was a record of individual information on the members of the household. Some of the questions contained in the first part have been transferred to the Houselist at the 1991 Census and thus the Household Schedule of the 1991 Census contains only the individual information on all the members of the household. The questions on the language mainly spoken in the household, number of married couples living in the household, whether the household owns a house or house-site in the village or town of enumeration in case the household is living in rented house and whether the household cultivates land and if the land cultivated is owned or rented or owned and rented and the local name of tenancy in case the land cultivated is rented were dropped at the 1991 Census. The Household Schedule of the 1991 Census contains a list of members of the household and their social, demographic and economic characteristics as abstracted from the Individual Slips.

A few changes have been made in the Individual Slip which is the main schedule of the 1991 Census. These are briefly narrated in the following paragraphs.

(i) It was apprehended that the persons engaged in unpaid work on farm or in family enterprise were not netted as workers in the 1981 Census. To net such persons, at the 1991 Census, it was emphasised in Question 14A and also in the relevant instructions that work includes unpaid work on farm or in family enterprise. The instructions were also elaborated with repeated emphasis on probing enquiries and with various illustrations so as to net the women's work participation.

- (ii) The definition of a literate has also undergone a slight change. Till the 1981 Census, children of aged 4 years and below were treated as illiterates. On the advice of the Ministry of Human Resource Development and the Planning Commission, it has been decided to treat the children of ages 6 years and below as illiterates at the 1991 Census.
- (iii) The question on seeking/available for work has been asked from only non-workers at the 1991 Census unlike from both marginal workers and non-workers as at the 1981 Census. Further, those seeking/available for work will be asked if they had worked before in order to know about the fresh entrants in the labour market.
- (iv) A new question on whether a person is an Ex-serviceman and if so, whether he/she is a pensioner or non-pensioner has been included at the 1991 Census on the request of the Ministry of Defence.
- (v) The migration and fertility questions have been canvassed universally at the 1991 Census. The reasons for migration have been expanded by including two more reasons for migration, namely, business and natural calamities like drought, floods, etc.

Subject to the above changes, the Individual Slip of the 1991 Census follows more or less the same pattern as in the 1981 Census in respect of demographic, social, cultural, economic, migration and fertility questions. These items cover the relationship to head, age, sex, marital status, mother tongue, two other languages known, religion, scheduled caste/scheduled tribe, literacy and educational level, attendance at school/college, economic activity, birth place, place of last residence, reasons for migration, duration of residence at the village or town of enumeration, age at marriage and number of children surviving at present and ever born alive to the ever married women and any child born alive during last one year to currently married women.

Rural-Urban Classification

As in the previous Censuses, the 1991 Census data will be presented for rural and urban areas separately where a Community Development Block is not co-terminus with a tahsil/taluk etc., the data will be provided at Community Development Block level. The basic unit for rural areas is the revenue village which has in most cases definite surveyed boundaries. The revenue village may comprise several hamlets but the entire village will normally be one unit for presentation of data. In unsurveyed villages within forest areas or other unsurveyed tracts each habitation area with locally recognised boundaries within each local administration jurisdiction is treated as one unit.

Urban areas are specially defined for the census purposes. In the 1991 Census the same criteria as in 1981 have been adopted. Urban area in the 1991 Census will be:

- (a) All places with a municipality, corporation or cantonment board or notified town area;
- (b) All villages/compact project areas which satisfied the following criteria:
 - (i) A minimum population of 5,000;
 - (ii) Atleast 75 per cent of the male main workers engaged in non-agricultural pursuits;
 - (iii) A population density of atleast 400 per Km.²

The urban criteria of 1981 varied slightly from that of the 1961 and 1971 censuses. The males working in activities such as fishing or logging, etc. were treated as engaged in non-agricultural activity and therefore contributed to the 75 per cent criterion of the 1961 and 1971 censuses, whereas in the 1981 Census, these activities were treated as on par with cultivation and agricultural labour for the purpose of this criterion. In 1991 Census also, the activities of livestock, forestry, fishing, hunting, plantations and orchards and allied activities have been treated as agricultural activities while applying the test of male working population.

Urban Agglomeration

Apart from town/city, the 1971 and 1981 concept of urban agglomeration is also adopted for the 1991 Census. Very often large railway colonies, university campuses, port areas, military camps, etc. come up outside the statutory limits of the city or town but adjoining it. Such areas may not by themselves qualify to be treated as towns, but if they form a continuous spread with the town, they are outgrowths of the town and deserve to be treated as urban. Such towns together with their outgrowths have been treated as one urban unit and called 'urban agglomeration'. An urban agglomeration may constitute:

- (a) A city with continuous outgrowth (the part of outgrowth being outside the statutory limits but falling within the boundaries of the adjoining village or villages);
- (b) One town with similar outgrowth or two or more adjoining towns with their outgrowths as in (a); or
- (c) A city and one or more adjoining towns with their outgrowths all of which form a continuous spread.

Standard Urban Area

The concept of Standard Urban Area introduced in the 1971 Census has been followed both in 1981 and 1991 Censuses. The essential requirements for the constitution of a Standard Urban Area (SUA) as laid down in 1971 were that:

- (i) It should have a core town of a minimum population of 50,000;
- (ii) The contiguous areas made up of other urban as well as rural administrative units should have mutual socio-economic links with the core town;
- (iii) In all probability this entire area should get fully urbanised in a period of two or three decades.

Certain Standard Urban Areas were determined on this basis in 1971 and some basic data were presented for 1951, 1961 and 1971 for such areas and their components. Similar data were presented for the Standard Urban Areas in 1981. It is proposed to present the similar data for the delineated Standard Urban Areas in 1991 Census also. The idea is to present basic data for these areas for three decades so that the urbanisation process in those areas can be studied. The boundary of SUA as finalised in the 1981 Census has been kept undisturbed in the 1991 Census.

In the 1981 Census, the areas which were annexed statutorily to the urban components of SUA from outside its boundary were accommodated within the SUA. The boundary of SUA was also adjusted to bring outgrowths (OGs) of UAs within the limits of the relevant SUA. In all other cases, the SUA boundary was kept constant. But in the 1991 Census, the boundary of SUA has been kept constant and is not being adjusted as was done in the 1981 Census. In the 1991 Census, where the urban spread of UAs has transcended the boundaries of SUAs or the statutory limit of a town has expanded on account of statutory merger of areas lying outside the limits of SUAs, the data relating to such spill-over urban areas and those lying within the SUA boundary will be presented separately in the tables of Standard Urban Area.

PROCESSING OF DATA

In the 1991 Census, a judicious mix of manual and computer tabulations would be used to bring out the data as quickly as possible. Tables on houses and household amenities based on Houselist will be processed on computer on the basis of a 20 per cent sample of Census houses. Primary Census Abstract for the entire population and also for Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe population, table on ex-servicemen, tables on mother tongue, religion and household composition will be based on the manual processing of Household Schedules on full count in the Regional Tabulation Offices. All other tables based on Individual Slip will be generated on the computer. Most of these tables will be based on 10 per cent sample of Individual Slips of all states with a population of 10 million and above and hundred per cent of Individual Slips in the remaining

States and Union Territories. Special tables for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes will also be processed on computer on full count.

Absence of in-house computer in the Census Organisation was a major handicap in the processing of the 1981 Census data. An in-house computer MEDHA-930 which corresponds to CYBER 930-11 has been acquired for the processing of the 1991 Census data. It is also programmed to have four Regional Processing Centres at different locations by the end of 1991. There would be 15 Data Entry Centres each having 2 to 10 data entry systems comprising AT/386 micro-computers with 10 terminals each for handling the massive data entry work of the 1991 Census.

A-SERIES: GENERAL POPULATION TABLES

A-SERIES: GENERAL POPULATION TABLES

A-1 Area, houses and population

This is the basic population table of the 1991 Census which furnishes the population by sex for territorial units at different levels separately for rural and urban areas. Besides population, this table also presents the area (in sq. kms.), density of population, number of inhabited and uninhabited villages, number of towns as well as number of occupied residential houses and households for each of the territorial units. The data are presented upto C.D. Block/tehsil level for rural areas and upto town level for urban areas including urban agglomerations. The area figures for States/Union Territories and districts are as computed by the Surveyor General of India and at lower levels below district the area figures are as supplied by the State Directors of Land Records or other local authorities.

This table has three appendices.

Appendix-1

This appendix shows the 1991 territorial units upto C.D. Block/tehsil level and their constituent units as at the 1981 Census indicating the changes, viz., areas added to and areas taken away from the corresponding 1981 jurisdiction of the units.

Appendix-2

This appendix gives number of villages with 5,000 population and over and their total population and number of towns with

population below 5,000 and their total population. Normally places with population exceeding 5,000 are declared as "town" if they meet the prescribed norms and places with less than 5,000 population are treated as villages. However, certain places with population below 5,000 have also been treated as towns in the Census while certain places with population over 5,000 have not been treated as towns. The number and population of such places are shown in this appendix.

Appendix-3

This appendix gives the number of Houseless and Institutional households and their population out of the total households and their population by sex presented in the main Table A-1. This appendix is presented upto the C.D. Block/tehsil level for rural areas and upto town level for urban areas including urban agglomerations.

A-2 Decadal variation in population since 1901

This table presents the population of territorial units upto district level from 1901 to 1991 and the decadal variation. The population figures for all the previous censuses in this table are adjusted to the 1991 jurisdiction.

This table has an appendix.

Appendix

This appendix gives for each State, Union Territory and district the 1981 area and population according to the territorial jurisdiction in 1981 and the 1981 population according to the 1991 jurisdiction. It also gives area and population according to the 1991 jurisdiction alongwith net increase or decrease of population purely due to the jurisdictional changes.

A-3 Villages classified by population size

This table gives the distribution of villages by population size. It also gives the population of villages in each size class by sex. This table is presented upto tehsil level.

A-4 Towns and urban agglomerations classified by population in 1991 with variation since 1901

This table gives all the towns including urban agglomerations of 1991, their population by sex since 1901 and its decadal variation. The towns/urban agglomerations are arranged in descending order of their 1991 population and are shown under the six population size classes: I-Population over 100,000; II-Population 50,000 to 99,999; III-Population 20,000 to 49,999; IV-Population 10,000 to 19,999; V-Population 5,000 to 9,999; and VI-Population less than 5,000. Data are also presented under urban agglomerations for each of their constituent units. The table, therefore, shows the trend of population growth of each town/urban agglomeration since the beginning of the century.

This table has four appendices.

Appendix-1

This appendix gives the new towns of 1991 which were not treated

as towns in 1981 and also the towns of 1981 which have been declassified as rural in 1991. For the new towns the area as of 1991 and for the declassified towns the area as of the 1981 Census are presented. The population of these areas in 1981 and 1991 are also shown in the appendix. This appendix shows the change in rural/urban status of places between 1981 and 1991.

Appendix-2

This appendix gives places with less than 5,000 population treated as towns for the first time in 1991 and their area and population.

Appendix-3

This appendix gives towns of 1981 with population less than 5,000 which have been declassified as rural in 1991 and their area and population in 1981.

Appendices 2 and 3 indicate the change in rural/urban status of places with less than 5,000 population from 1981 to 1991.

Appendix-4

This appendix gives the list of towns which have undergone change in area between 1981 and 1991, their area and population at the two censuses, with reason for changes in area.

A-5 Standard Urban Areas

This table gives for Standard Urban Areas and their rural and urban components, the area, density, number of occupied residential houses, number of households and the population by sex at the 1991 Census and also the population at the 1961, 1971 and 1981 censuses. This table also gives the Houseless and Institutional

households and their population in such areas. The table also gives similar data for the spill over urban areas of the Standard Urban Area (SUA) in case urban agglomeration or town/city has transcended the boundary of SUA due to statutory annexation or linkage of out-growth with urban area within SUA. The table thus shows the population growth of the SUAs for the three decades from 1961.

Union/State Primary Census Abstract

The Union Primary Census Abstract will give data at State/Union Territory and district level, while the State Primary Census Abstract will include data at State/Union Territory, district, tehsil, C.D. Block and town level.

The Primary Census Abstract gives for each territorial unit the number of occupied residential houses, households, the total population, the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe population, literates, main workers by nine broad industrial categories of main activity, marginal workers and non-workers by sex. It, therefore, indicates the basic socio-economic characteristics of the population for the territorial units.

The Primary Census Abstract will also be prepared for total Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribe population separately at C.D. Block and tehsil level in rural areas and at town level in urban areas.

For the first time, the population in age group 0-6 will also be presented sex-wise. This will enable data users to compute more realistic literacy rate, as the 1991 Census has treated all persons below 7 years of age as illiterate at the time of counting.

Urban/Village Primary Census Abstract

This abstract gives the same information as available in the Union/State Primary Census Abstract for villages and wards of towns. The villages and towns will be arranged according to the Community Development Blocks. Apart from tehsil total, total for Community Development Block falling within the tehsil or part of the Community Development Block falling in the tehsil will also be presented. The population in the age-group 0-6 will also be indicated by sex.

Urban Primary Census Abstract has an appendix also.

Appendix

The appendix to the Urban Primary Census Abstract gives at urban enumeration block level the total population and Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe population.

Most of the B-Series tables are based on a 10 per cent sample of Individual Slips. However, there will be 100 per cent data entry of workers engaged in household industry (HHI) and other work (OW), marginal workers and non-workers seeking/available for work in order to provide more reliable and detailed data at lower levels. As such, some of the B-Series tables on these characteristics will be on full count.

It may be noted that B-Series tables will be brought out in two stages. In stage I, tables based on a 10 per cent sample of Individual Slips would be brought out and in stage II, the tables based on full count would be brought out. Tables to be brought out in stage I have been indicated by the word 'S' to denote sample within brackets after the table number. Tables to be brought out in stage II have been indicated by word 'F' to denote full count, added in brackets after the table number.

In the presentation of the economic tables some standard groupings of population characteristics have been adopted.

DESCRIPTION OF HOUSEHOLDS

- Single person household.
- 2. Nuclear family: a couple with or without unmarried children.
- Supplemented nuclear family: a nuclear family plus one or more unmarried, separated or widowed relatives of the parents, other than their unmarried children.
- 4. Subnuclear family: a fragment of a former nuclear family. Typical examples are the widow with unmarried children, or the widower with unmarried children, or siblings-whether unmarried, or widowed, separated, or divorced-living together.
- 5. Supplemented subnuclear family: a group of relatives, members of a formerly complete nuclear family, plus some other unmarried, divorced, or widowed relative who was not a member of the nuclear family. For example, a widow and her unmarried children plus her widowed mother-in-law.
- 6. Collateral joint family: two or more married couples between whom there is a sibling bond-usually a brother-brother relationship-plus unmarried children.
- 7. Supplemented collateral joint family: a collateral joint family plus unmarried, divorced, or widowed relatives. Typically, such supple-

- mental relatives are the widowed mother of the married brothers, or the widower father, or an unmarried sibling.
- 8. Lineal joint family: two couples between whom there is a lineal link, usually between parents and married son, sometimes between parents and married daughter.
- 9. Supplemented lineal joint family: a lineal joint family plus unmarried, divorced or widowed relatives who do not belong to either of the lineally linked nuclear families; for example, the father's widower brother or the son's wife's unmarried brother.
- 10. Lineal collateral joint family: three or more couples linked lineally and collaterally. Typically, parents and their two or more married sons, plus the unmarried children of the three or more couples.
- 11. Supplemented lineal collateral joint family: a lineal collateral joint family plus unmarried, widowed, separated relatives who belong to none of the nuclear families lineally and collaterally linked, for example, the father's widowed sister or brother, or an unmarried nephew of the father.
- Others: those not covered in any type mentioned above at Sl. No. 1 to 11.

Educational level -- Illiterate, literate but below matric, matric but below graduate, technical diploma or certificate not equal to degree, graduate and above other than technical degree, technical degree or diploma equal to degree or post-graduate degree.

Duration of residence -- Less than 1 year, 1-4 years, 5-9 years and 10 years and above.

D-1 Population classified by place of birth

This table gives the distribution of population by place of birth and sex. Here, place of birth is classified as place of enumeration, elsewhere in the district of enumeration, other districts of the state, other states, outside India in specified countries of Asia, Europe, Africa, Americas and Oceania. In the district level tables, the data for individual countries will not be printed. Those born within India are also grouped by current rural/urban status of the place of

birth. The data are presented for total, rural and urban areas at state and district levels.

This table corresponds to Table D-1 of the 1981 Census.

D-2 Migrants classified by place of last residence and duration of residence in place of enumeration

This table is the basic table on migration by place of last residence showing intra-district, inter-district, intra-state and inter-state migratory streams and migration from abroad by sex and duration of residence at the place of enumeration at state level.

Places of last residence are grouped as within the district of enumeration, in other districts of the state of enumeration, other states in India or outside India in specified countries of Asia, Europe, Africa, Americas and Oceania. The migrants within India are classified by rural/urban status of last residence. The data are presented separately for the rural and urban areas of the state. The migrants have been classified by different durations of residence at the place of enumeration. The durations of residence in this table are less than 1 year, 1-4 years, 5-9 years, 10-19 years and 20 years and above. This table corresponds to Table D-2 of the 1981 Census.

This table presents the same information in format of Table D-5 for migrants from rural areas of other states to urban areas

of the state of enumeration and corresponds to Table D-7 of the 1981 Census. The table also presents similar data for each city with a population of one million and over.

Appendix 4

Statement IV

This statement gives the scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population and civic and other amenities available for each town in 1989. The road length,

system of sewerage, number of different types of latrines, method of disposal of night soil, source and capacity of protected water supply, fire fighting services and number of various types of electricity connections are presented in this statement.

Statement IV-A

This statement gives for each notified slum of each town the available civic amenities in 1989. The population, paved road length, system of sewerage, number of different types of latrines, method of night soil disposal, number of tap points/hydrants supplying protected water, number of electricity connections of different types are the details given in this statement.

Statement V

This statement gives the medical, educational, recreational and cultural facilities available for each town in 1989. Number of hospitals and dispensaries, number of hospital beds, number of medical, engineering and other colleges, polytechnics, vocational training institutions, junior colleges and schools for various levels, adult literacy centres, working womens' hostels, stadia, places of entertainment and libraries are given in this statement.

Statement VI

This statement gives the trade, commerce, industry and banking aspects for each town. The important commodities manufactured, imported and exported, number of banks and agricultural and non-agricultural credit societies are given in this statement.
