## Preface

The Indian Census Organisation serves the twin objectives of conducting the decennial cenus and tabulation of the collected data for the government and other users. Keeping in view the users' requirements the Organisation continuously endeavours to improve the presentation of various data collected during the census. The data is made available to the users' in the form of published material.

National Informatics Centre under the Planning Commission, is the premier government organisation with the responsibility of providing Informatics Services to all the Central Government ministries/departments and all the State/UT governments in the country. Towards this end, NIC operates nationwide satellite based computer communication network called NICNET to facilitate information flow from the points of origination to the place of decision making. NICNET connects all the State/UT capitals and district headquarters in the country.

The Primary Census Abstract (PCA) data of 1991 census, covering information on population, area, occupied residential households, literacy and ninefold classification of Industrial Workers etc. at the village/ward level has been computerised using NICNET. In addition to the existing regular publications, the PCA data can now be accessed by the general public on NICNET, and can also be obtained on the magnetic media. The government users at the Central and State/UT level can access the data from their respective NIC installations.

Availability of PCA-1991 data on NICNET brings the user closer to the data. This has opened a new chapter in the openness of information. Computerisation has also helped in reducing delays in data dissemination. The data has been organised so as to facilitate access according to users' needs.

The storage and release of PCA data on the NICNET, through the use of Information Technology, shows that close interaction between Government departments can produce synergistic effect. We believe that this is only a begining and much more Census data would be available on NICNET in the near future. We are confident that users' in general, and those in the government in particular, would benefit through such coordinated efforts.

#### **ACKNOWLEDGEMENT**

Computerisation of Primary Census Abstract (PCA) of Uttar Pradesh Census 1991, consisting of about 43 parameters at the village/ward level, was considered and taken up as a pilot project jointly by the NIC state centre, Uttar Pradesh (NICUPSU) and Directorate of Census Operations, Uttar Pradesh (DCOUP). About 1.4 lakh records of villages/wards were entered and the data was subjected to 15 types of validation checks apart from the reconciliation of computed district totals with the manually compiled totals. The NICUPSU worked for two shifts for one year and about 80 persons from the DCOUP were engaged in data-entry and correction of validation reports. The successful completion of this complex tabulation task is of national importance in the sense that it has made the PCA data of Uttar Pradesh available to the government and other interested institutions, private research scholars in a short time of 15 months.

Subsequently, computerisation of PCA data for all the States/UTs was taken up at NIC Hqrs. in the month of July 1992. Village/Wardwise census data was entered on the computers of NIC State/UT centres by the staff of Directorate of Census Operations. All this data was also subjected to extensive validation checks. NIC State/UT centres worked from 2-3 shifts for entering this vast data. A matching support from the staff of DCO remained available throughout. Electronic mail on NICNET was used to provide clarifications to NIC/DCO staff on various issues. Without this facility it would not have been possible to complete the data preparation task in a short time.

PCA data from all the states was received at NIC, Uttar Pradesh State unit, Lucknow and the tabulation work at all-India level was done there. Without the sustained efforts of the staff of NIC, Uttar Pradesh State Unit, it would not have been possible to process the PCA data in a short time of six months.

NIC staff of GISTNIC division at Hyderabad have put in lot of efforts in data storage on the NEC Computer and develop query based software for data access on NICNET throughout the country.

The officers and staff of NIC who were involved in this job at Headquarters and in State/UT centres are given below. All these officers/staff worked very hard in close association with the DCO staff in the implementation of this project.

## I. NICNET - A National Facility

#### THE CONCEPT

National informatics Centre (NIC) was set up in 1976 with a long term objective of setting up a computer based informatics network for decision support to Governments/Ministeries/Departments, development of data bases relating to India's socio-economic development and monitoring planned programmes. Since 1977, NIC has been playing a catalytic role in creating informatics awareness in promoting and systematising the data collection, organisation, processing and its on-line accessibility. NIC operates a nation wide satellite (INSAT-ID) based computer communication network called NICNET to facilitate information flow from the points of origination to the place of decision making. The network connects 60 Government Departments, 32 States/Union Territories and 450 district centres. NICNET has been used for important Government communications between Centre and States/Districts; like Gulf Crisis, draft VIII five year plan, Budgetary information, Customs and Central Excise notification and election information. The network has a high reliability and availability throughout the year (24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year). NICNET has been connected to Unix-to-Unix Network (UUNET) to provide international electronic mail facility to selected NICNET users.

NIC has mainframe computers (NEC-1000) at its Headquarters in New Delhi and three regional centres (Pune, Bhubaneswar and Hyderabad), Super Mini Computers(ND-550) or equivalent at State capitals, Super PC/ATs at the district head quarters.

#### **NICNET - FACILITIES**

- 1. Monitoring of vital socio-economic projects
- 2. On-line retrieval of data
- 3. Optimum uitlization of expensive computer resources
- 4. Emergency Communication Systems
- 5. Sharing latest software tools
- 6. Dissemination of information
- 7. Exchange of messages and information between Central Government, State/UT Governments and Districts through "NICMAIL" as well as "Electronic News Bulletin Board" facilities.

#### **NIC - SERVICES**

At the centre, NIC provides services to various user departments through a number of application divisions which are responsible for developing appropriate

information systems for planning and decision making. NIC teams located in various Government buildings provide total computer solutions to the Government Departments. These services include identification of areas amenable to computerisation, conducting feasibility studies, system design, software development, implementation and training. Application divisions are supported by other infrastructure divisions at NIC Head Quarters. NIC state centres provide similar services to the state government departments. District Centre of NIC fully look after the computing needs of respective district administrations. Implementation and monitoring of a large number of Central government schemes at the block/district level could be successful only because of District Centres of NIC.

#### OTHER ACTIVITIES


New specialized software development for common usage, employing stateof-art technology is an ongoing process at NIC. A local area Network (LAN) has been established at North Block to facilitate Ministry of Finance and Ministry of Home Affairs for Office Automation and local database sharing. System SER-MON has been implemented for Excise Revenue monitoring in 29 Central Excise Collectorates and about 225 divisions spread all over the country. NIC has assisted in the release of quinquennial directory of more then 2 lakh joint stock companies as on March 1990. Processing of all-India small scale industries census data covering 10.55 lakh units has been completed at NIC. An integrated Office Management system for many of the ministers of Central Government and CMs of Kerala, Andhra Pradesh and Haryana has been implemented. Implementation of Employment Exchange Computerisation all over the country for the Ministry of Labour has been undertaken at NIC. The GEOMINE project or Mineral administration has been implemented for Government of Gujarat. Stateof-art GIS concepts were used to develop a Geographic Information System (GISNIC) to enable infrastructural planning in rural and urban areas. Lanc records computerisation has been implemented in 15 pilot districts with active cooperation of the Department of Rural Development. In a number of States NICNET facilities are being availed for treasury computerisation. Computer Aided Design (CAD) group of NIC supports various government and public sector organisations in design informatics. Telematics Division of NIC is the main architect behind the Doordarshan's teletext service. This division has also implemented on-line display of reservation positions on Indian Railways and arrival-departure for Indian Airlines.

Modelling and OR division using Operations Research and simulation techniques have helped a number of government departments with forecasting in their areas of operation. Medical literature of interest is regularly provided to the doctors and professionals by accessing databases of National Library of Medicine.

USA. Training of NIC professionals to keep them updated is an ongoing process. About 10,000 government officials throughout the country are trained on computers every year by Training Division. The division employs, modern methodologies and training aids for training purposes, the latest being the multimedia.

## II. Primary Census Abstract - An Overview

Immediately after the completion of 1991 Census in February-March, 1991, Paper-I of 1991 was brought out on 25th March, 1991 giving the provisional population totals of India and various States and Union Territories. This paper gave a brief analysis of the size, distribution and growth rate of population, density of population, sex composition of population and literacy etc. Two other papers were brought out in August and November, 1991 giving the provisional population totals regarding rural-urban distribution of the population and the provisional population figures regarding workers and their distribution.

The final population figures of India, States and Union Territories, down to the lowest level of administration viz. villages in rural areas and wards in the urban areas are being presented now in the shape of Primary Census Abstract (PCA). The PCA contains information for each state/district/UA/city/town/CD block the area of the unit, the number of occupied residential houses, number of households, total population (including institutional and houseless population), total population in the age group 0-6, the Scheduled Caste population, the Scheduled Tribe population, number of literates, total main workers sub-classified into 9 industrial categories and number of marginal workers and non-workers. The information relating to population, illiterates, marginal workers and non-workers is presented sex-wise also.

The data contained in the PCA has been computerised, using NICNET facilities, for the first time in India and has been stored on the NEC computer of NIC at its Hqrs. in N. Delhi under the GISTNIC scheme. The PCA data is accessible on all terminals of NEC in N. Delhi, State capitals and District Headquarters apart from on GISTNIC booths in the country. Besides, the statewise and the district-wise data would be made available in the Office of the Directors of Census Operations in each state capital through floppies. This has been a major innovation of the 1991 Census.

For the first time, the PCA gives the total population in the age group 0-6 also. This has been necessitated by the definition of literates adopted in the 1991 census. Upto 1981 Census, the question on "whether a person is literate or not" was canvassed for all persons aged 5 years and above. The person was considered as literate if he/she had an ability to read and write with understanding otherwise he/she was considered as illiterate. In the 1991 Census, the basic definition of illiterate persons remained the same. However the question was canvassed only for all persons aged 7 years and above on the request of the Ministry of Human Resources Development.

Till 1981, the PCA did not present the population data for age group 0-4. Consequently, the literacy rates after the release of PCA were being calculated including the population 0-4 giving us the "Crude Literacy Rate". It was felt that "Crude Literacy Rate" did not give a realistic picture of the literacy levels in the country. At the time of 1991 Census, it was decided that the "Crude Literacy Rate" will not be worked out and consequently it was decided to give the figures of the population for 0-6 also in the PCA so that the effective literacy rate could be worked out by excluding the population 0-6 down to the village/ward level.


The presentation of the population figures of 0-6 age group separately in the PCA would also be very useful for the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare for their immunization and Child Health Care programmes.

At the time of 1971 Census, the PCA had given 9 fold industrial classification of workers. However in 1981, the PCA was restricted to only 4 broad categories of main workers viz. Cultivators, Agricultural Labourers, Workers in Household Industry and Other Workers. Nine fold industrial classification was presented in 1981 in detailed economic tables at state/district/UA/city level only. On the persistent demand of data users, a need was felt for the presentation of the 9 fold industrial classification upto the lowest level of administration in the PCA itself for early availability of the industrial classification of main workers. Hence, the PCA in the 1991 Census also presents the 9-fold industrial classification of the main workers by sex.

Till 1981, the PCA data was presented for tehsil/taluk/police station etc. In 1991 Census, the data is uniformly being presented at CD block instead of tehsil/taluk etc. Kerala is the only exception because the villages in Kerala are bigger in size and they cut across CD block boundaries. The presentation of the data at CD block level would go a long way in meeting needs of planning at development block level. This is another major departure in the presentation of the 1991 Census PCA data.

The exact data formats of PCA data used in computerization are given at Annexure-B.


# WORLD POPULATION 1990 - 91




- ± Erstwhile U.S.S.R.

# III. Primary Census Abstract (PCA) - 1991 - Access Points

#### **Data Organisation**

Primary Census Abstract is the Village/Ward wise data covering 43 parameters. The description of data items and their formats has been given in Annexure-C. PCA data has been organised into rural and urban categories. The rural data is village wise which facilitates aggregation at block level. Similarly, the ward wise urban data can be summed up to give information on towns/cities.

In the PCA presentation, blocks include the village wise rural information as well as the Census Towns (CT) and Outgrowths (OG) of towns falling under the blocks. District data is the sum of all blocks falling within the district. The upward aggregation of districts make up the States/UTs and all-India PCA figures. Tehsil or Taluk presentation of PCA has been included in the data access on NICNET.

The data is further organised district wise and there are five files for each district, viz.

- (a) Rural village wise data
- (b) Rural Code Directory
- (c) Urban ward wise data
- (d) Urban Code Directory
- (e) Code Directory for Census Towns and Outgrowths

#### Where one can Access the PCA Data

Office of the Registrar General, India (RGI) have made arrangements to make available PCA data in published form as well as on magnetic media. Data at all-India level can be obtained from the RGI office at N. Delhi and at the state level from the Directorate of Census Operations in various states. The requsite addresses for obtaining the data have been given at Annexure-A.

#### All-India Data

The data is available on floppies, one per district for major states and one per state for minor states and union territories.

The all-India data aggregated at state level, district level and block/town level is available on NIC computers installed in Government of India Bhavans in Delhi. The Registrar General, India has consented to the use of this data, without charge, by the ministries and departments of the Central Government.

PCA data stored on NEC, the mainframe computer of NIC, can be accessed on NEC terminals and GISTNIC booths throughout the country with the help of standard queries built within the access software. It will not be possible to capture the data from this computer directly. The details of access techniques and standard queries have been given in a subsequent chapter.

#### State/UT Data

Directorate of Census Operations (DCO) in the States/UTs have with them data of respective states on floppies. DCOs are authorized to make available the States/UTs data to the prospective customers on request. All the DCOs would shortly have computers for copying the data for disseminating purposes. However, the DCOs setup not having computers at present can avail local NIC services for making floppies. The state PCA data would remain stored on the DCO computers for analysis work.

The State/UT PCA data would be stored on NIC State/UT centre computers throughout the country for the use of State/UT government departments. Whereas the data would be available for analysis and other usage of the State/UT departments, the authority to provide data in State/UTs vests in the Directorate of Census Operations.

#### **District Data**

DCOs, on demand, from the district administrations, would provide district data for storage on the district computres of NIC. District Centres of NIC would service the needs of district administration without parting data to anybody. Although each district should have PCA data of its own, however, the DCOs, at their discretion, may provide data for more than one district to the district centre of NIC depending upon its use.

## IV. Accessing PCA Data on NICNET

GISTNIC (General Information Service Terminal—National Informatics Centre) is a general purpose on-line information service available on NICNET. GIST group of NIC, located at Regional Centre Hyderabad, identifies the public domain data and manages its storage on NICNET. Presently the following databases are available on the network. Data from all these databases can be accessed on NEC terminals using a Menu-driven user-friendly software.

- 2. District Profiles
- 3. District Level Economic Indicators
- 4. District Level Population Projections
- 5. General Information Guide
- b. University Education Guide of India

Census 1981 data was released by the office of RGI in the year 1987 and GIST group subsequently stored it on NICNET. This data can be accessed on NICNET using CEN database. The difference in Census 1991 PCA data stored on the network is the increase in number of parameters and availability of standard queries on which the data is normally accessed by users. The following gives an account of how Census 1991 data can be accessed on the network.

After logging onto NEC the following should be typed against the system Prompt:

After a Welcome Banner we get the Main Menu as follows:

Selection of (1) STATE OR (2) DISTRICT gives the following sub-menu: (SM-1)

#### DATA IS REQUIRED FOR:

1. TALUK/TEHŠIL ETC. 2. BLOCKS 3. TOWNS 4. QUIT

#### ENTER OPTION.

Selection of option (1) from SM-1 viz. TÁLUK/TEHSIL the system asks for the following information.

#### ËNTER STATE NAME OR (Q) UIT OR PRESS <RETURN> FOR HELP:

Desired state name, in capital letters, can be entered at this stage. Spelling mistakes in state name will again flash the above message. The user can press <RETURN> for help. By doing so the names of states and the corresponding code number would be displayed on the screen. The user can then enter state code for accessing the data. After validation of state code the system further enquires.

#### ENTER OPTION

- 1. RURAL
- 2. URBAN
- 3. QUIT

On selecting either of the RURAL or URBAN options the Tehsilwise queries Menu as per LIST - A is displayed on the screen for actual data access. The user can select any query and feed range of values required for selective accessing. The upper value can be left blank to access complete data on a particular query.

Selection of option (2) from SM-1 viz. Blocks also requires the user to enter the state name. However, the rural and urban option is not asked and the user gets a display of queries as per LIST - A.-

Selection of option (3) from SM-1 viz. Towns gives information on towns in the states. In this option after entering the state names a display of queries as per LIST - B is obtained.

Selection of option (3) from the Main menu viz. Village, also asks for state name and subsequent to this the system interrogates:

### VILLAGES REQUIRED WITHIN:

- 1. STATE
- 2. DISTRICT

Since we have selected the village option of the Main Menu, the software helps us to reach village level query menu by going through state, district, Tehsil/Block, etc. The query menu here is as per LIST - A.

The query software requires the user to enter all names in capital letters. Online help has been provided at required places to obtain a total list of names of States, Districts, Tehsils, Blocks and villages. At every stage of the menu, exit points have been defined and are displayed. With the selection of Blocks, Tehsils, Towns, the word village in LIST - A is replaced with the required selection.




