NATIONAL INDUSTRIAL CLASSIFICATION (N. I. C.)-1987

(As published by Central Statistical Organisation and adopted by the office of the Registrar General, India for the Industrial Classification of economically active population)

INTRODUCTION

Ind istrial Classifications are used in the classification of economically active population, in the presentation of statistics of industrial production and distribution, labour statistics and economic data like national income, etc. Comparability of statistics available from various sources on different aspects of economy and the usability of data for economic analysis, demand standardisation of the system of Industrial Classification.

The Industrial Classification used in the population censuses differed from one census to another and till the 1951 Census, it was generally an amalgam of industrial and occupational features.

In the 1961 Census, the Indian Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC) evolved in 1958 by the Directorate General of Employment and Training was used. There has been a variety of Industrial Classifications in India such as Labour Bureau's industrial classification of factories, Standard Industrial Classification evolved by Central Statistical Organisation, etc. While attempts have been made in several cases to bring these classifications in line with the I.S.I.C., these have produced different versions depending on the nature of the respective needs. Nation I Industrial Classifications, 1970 was evolved in 1970 by Central Statistical Organisation (C.S.O.) to bring these classifications in line with I. S. I. C.—1969 issued by the United Nations Statistical Office (UNSO). This classification was adopted by the Office of the Registrar General, India during 1971 and 1981 Censuses with suitable modifications.

Since 1970, when NIC-70 was evolved, the structure and organisation of industries have undergone considerable changes resulting, inter-alia, in substantial diversification and or changes in the product-mix of the establishments as also in the technologies of operation. In view of this C.S.O. included revision of NIC-70 as one of the components of their Plan Scheme on 'Standardisation of Classification' and appointed a Steering Committee consisting of representatives of National Sample Survey Organisation, Department of Industrial Development, Office of Development Commissioner, Small Scale Industries, Planning Commission, Directorate General of Commercial Intelligence and Statistics, Indian Bureau of Mines, C.S.O., Directorate General of Employment and Training, Referve Bank of India, I.A.M.R. and Federation of Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industries, etc. to revise NIC. The Steering Committee decided to set up a sub-committee consisting of the representatives of RBI, NSSO, IAMR, Deptt. of Industrial Development, Office of the Development Commissioner, Small Scale Industries to prepare a draft of the revised NIC. The Preliminary draft of NIC-87 prepared by the sub-committee was widely circulated to concerned departments/organisations for their comments. The Steering Committee finalised NIC-87 after considering the comments received from various departments/organisations.

Some of the main features of NIC-87 are furnished below :

1. The NIC-87 groups together economic activities which are similar in terms of process type, raw material used and finished goods produced. The classifications does not make any distinction according to type of ownership (except in case of forestry where the distinction is considered to be of considerable economic importance) or type of economic erganisation.

2. The NIC-87 incorporates some of the major revisions contained in the I. S. I. C.—1969, e.g., transfer of 'Restaurants and Hotels' from 'Services' to 'Trade'; clubbing of Banking, Insurance, Real Estate and Business Services; transfer of Vateri-

nary Services from Agricultural Services to Medical and Health Services; treating Sanitary Services among Community Services, etc. as was done in NIC-70.

3. A new titling system for different levels of economic classifications etc. as recommended by the U. N. Statistical Office was adopted. The one-digit level constitutes the Section, the two-digit level the Division and the three-digit level the Group.

4. There has not been any major change at one-digit level. The economy remains divided into 10 Sections with special Section X for the activities not adequately defined in Sections 0-9.

5. There are now 73 cc des at two-digit level as compared to 66 in NIC-70. Divisions 35 and 36 have been combined into One Division 35-36 in NIC-87. The eight additional divisions which have been included in NIC-87 are listed below:—

6. There are 462 Groups at three-digit level in the revised NIC-87 as against 385 in NIC-70. The increase at the three-digit level has been mainly due to the need to expand and split the ex isting activities which have since become important.

7. In ISIC-68, repair services were shown under household and personal services instead of manufacturing. In NIC-70 circulated by C.S.O., these repair activities were provided for in two places: as separate groups under division 'Y' giving the option to have these activities either under division 3 (as major group 39) or under division 9 (as major group 97) according to the convenience or requirements of the users. While adopting the NIC-1970, the office of the Registrar General, India assigned Major Group 39 to 'repair services' under Division 2 & 3 in order to provide comparable data with 1961 census. In the revised NIC, however, these activities have been placed only at 97 and division 39 has been created to account for the establishments engaged predominantly in the repair of capital goods, i.e., the repair of machinery/equipment which are investment goods in nature. As such, there is no scope of shifting division '97' under section 2 & 3 in the revised NIC-87. The office of the Registrar General, India has adopted revised NIC-87 without making any modification in this. However, care will be taken at the processing stage by merging the data of Division 97 with Section 2 & 3 in order to provide comparable data with the earlier censuses.

Statistical finit and rules of classification

The basis of classification being the nature of economic activity carried out in an establishment it follows that the unit of classification is taken as the establishment. The term "establishment" is defined as an economic unit, which is engaged in one or predominantly one economic activity (as identified by the activity codes in NIC-87) at a single physical location under single ownership control of a firm or enterprise, which may have more than one establishment engaged in different activities at the same location or the same activities in different locations. Each estiblishment is to be counted separately and classified appropriately. Where a single physical establishment is engaged in one or more than one activity it would be desirable to treat each of the component technical units as a separate establishment but where it is not possible to separate technical, ancillary or welfare units from the parent establishment, the establishment will have to be classified into one or the other groups in the classification according to the major activities of the establish

ment. The major activities of the establishment should be measu-r ed with regard to the value added by production of different products and services, or net revenue derived from various activities. Where such assessment is not possible, classification may be done in terms of gross revenue attributed to the products, or services of the establishments, the number of persons employed for various activities.
